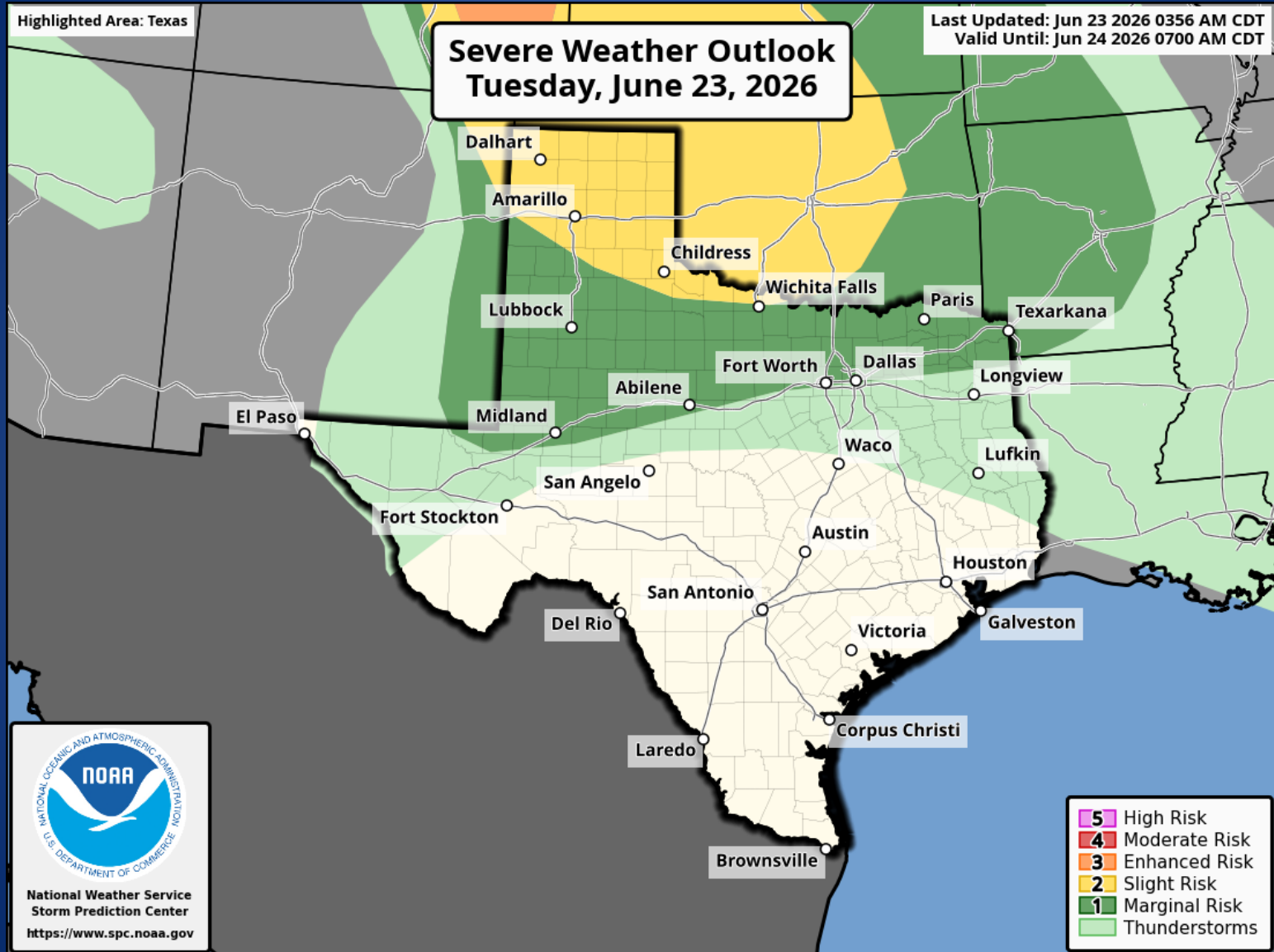

A few storms may be strong, with gusty winds, frequent lightning, heavy rainfall, and localized flooding possible. Otherwise, expect another hot and humid afternoon with highs in the 90s and heat indices near 100-106 degrees. Make sure to take frequent breaks in the shade!

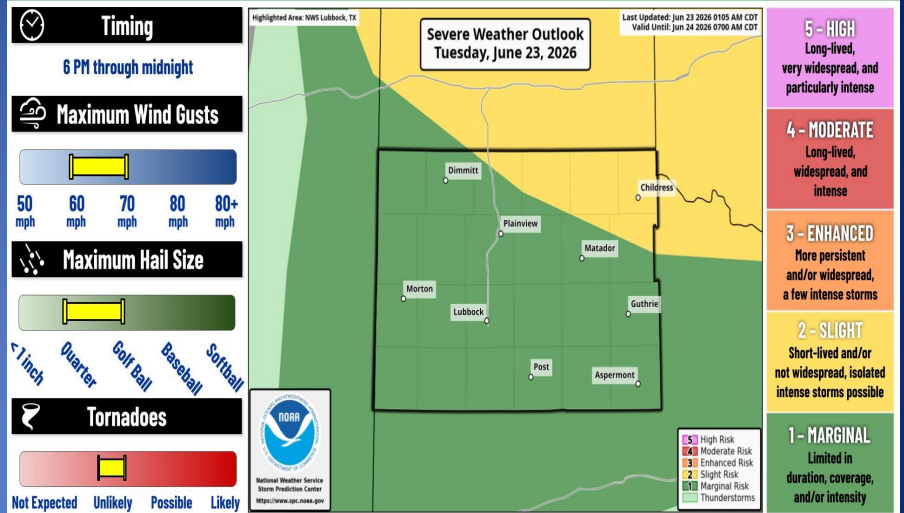

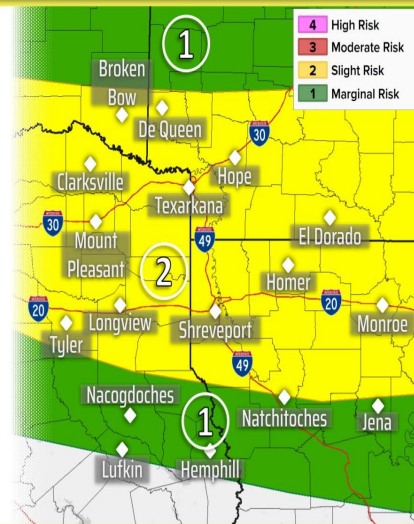
Amounts

- Rainfall amounts of 2-4 inches, with isolated higher amounts of 5+ inches, will be possible through tonight.

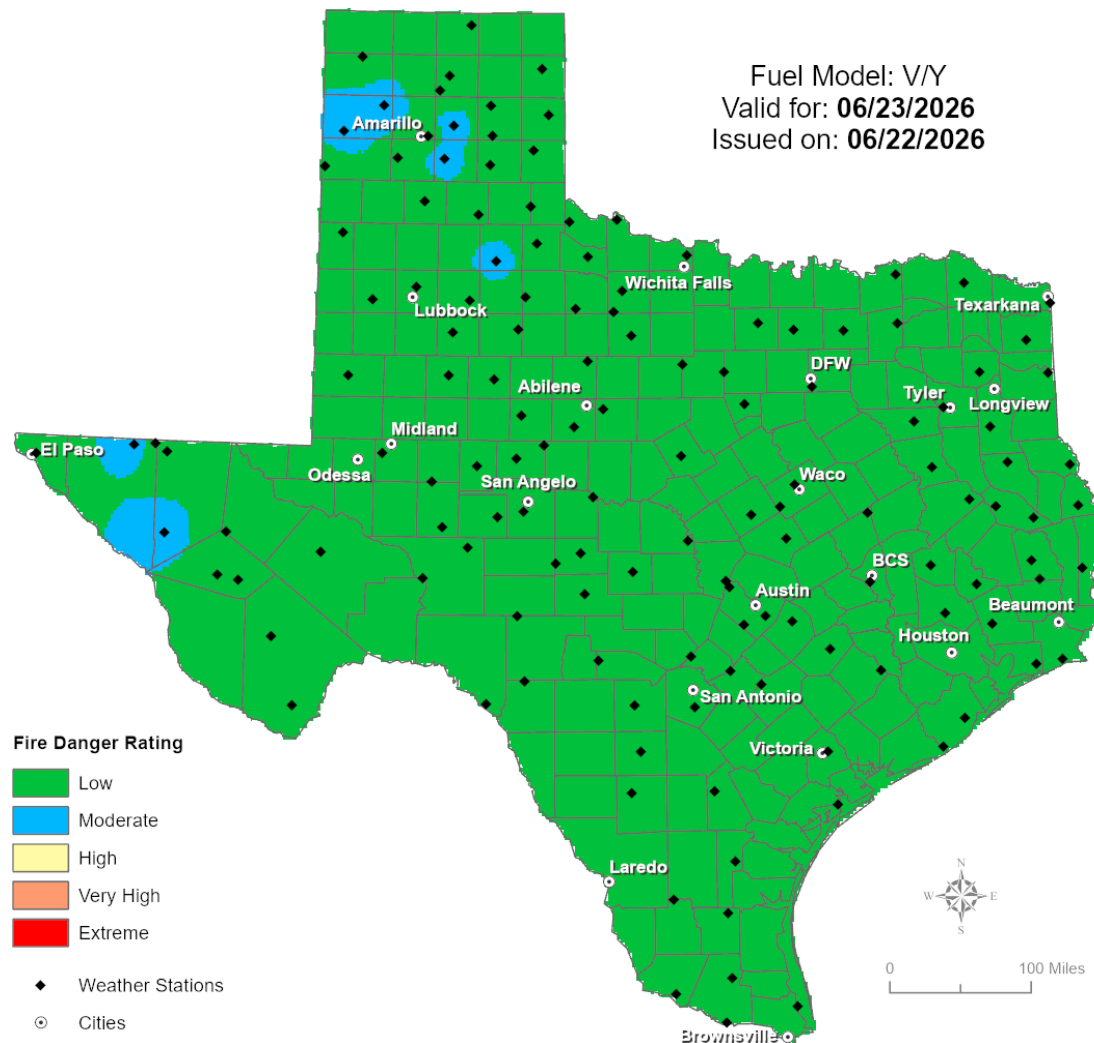

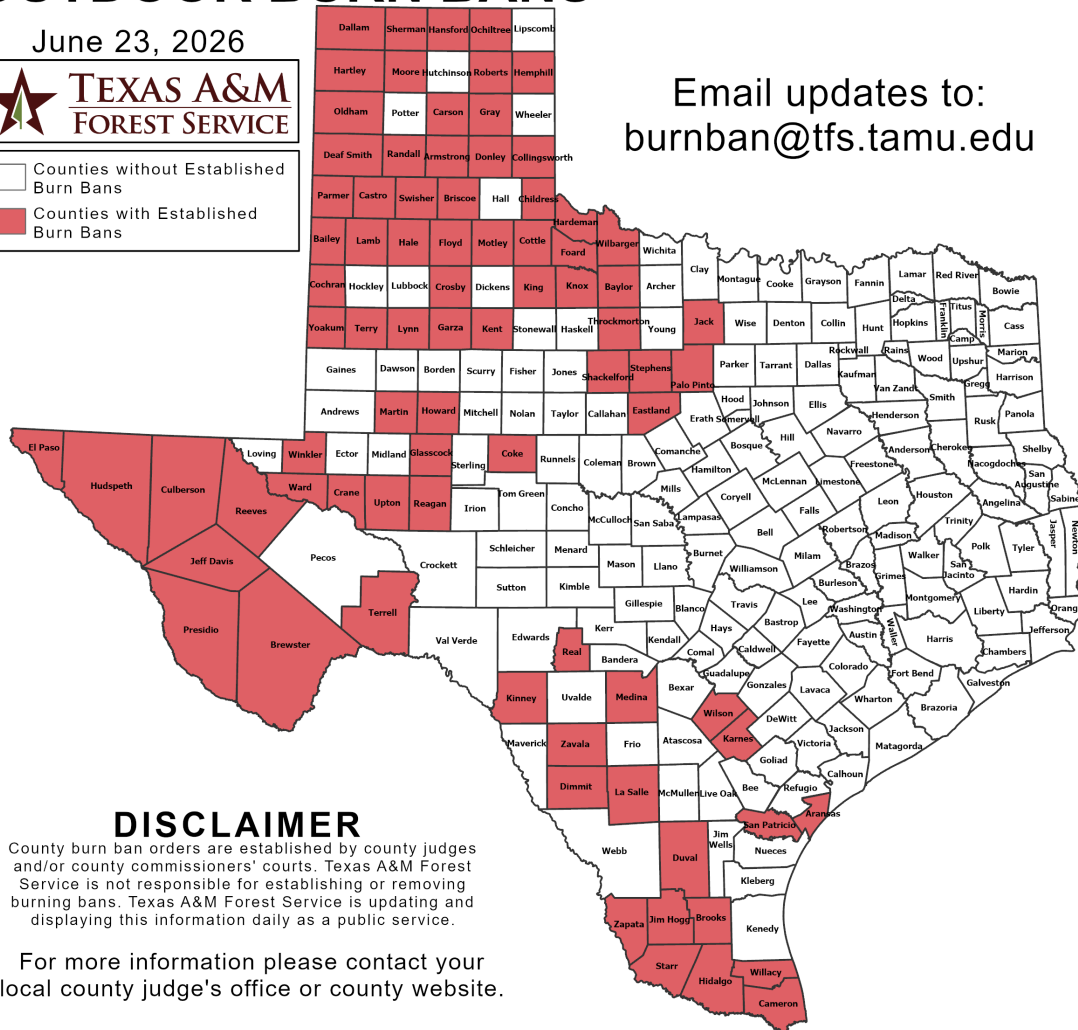

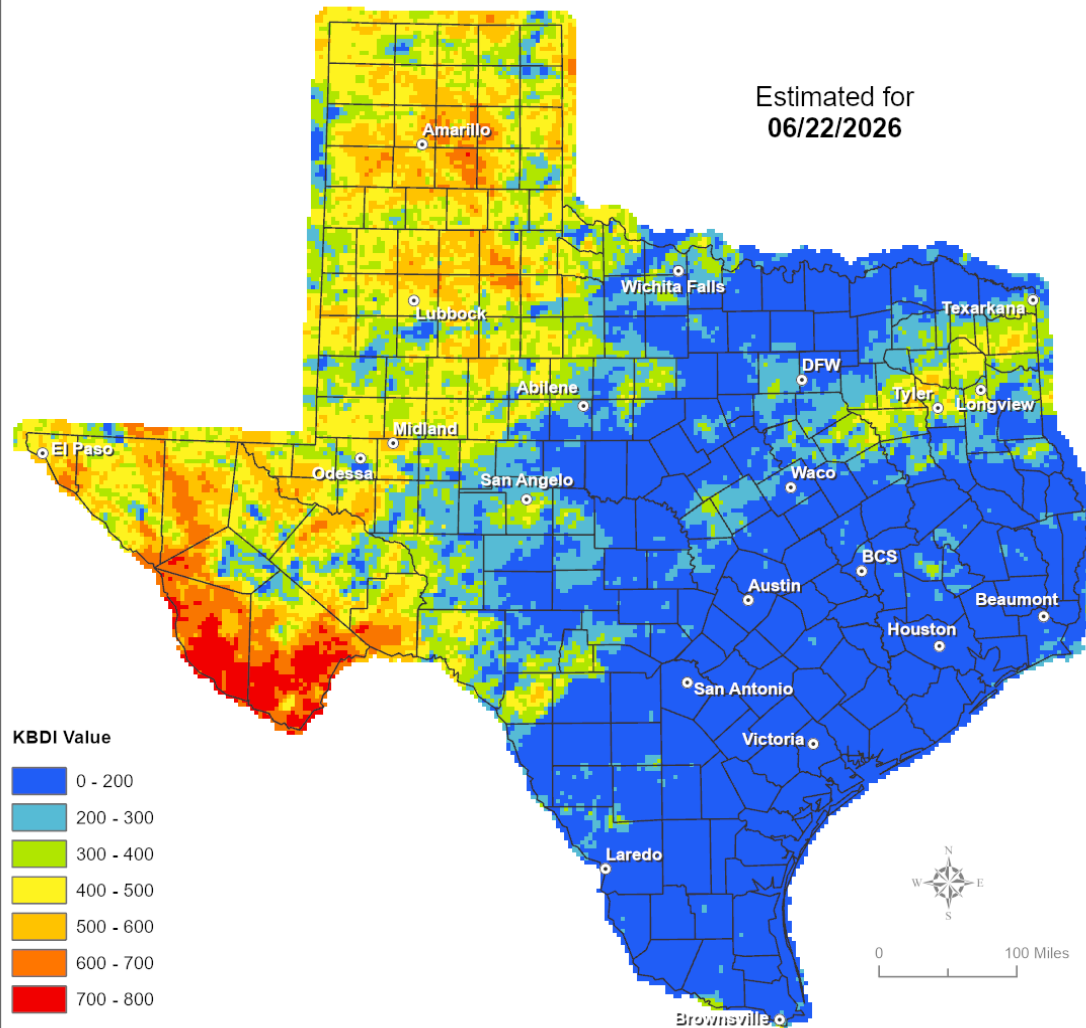

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

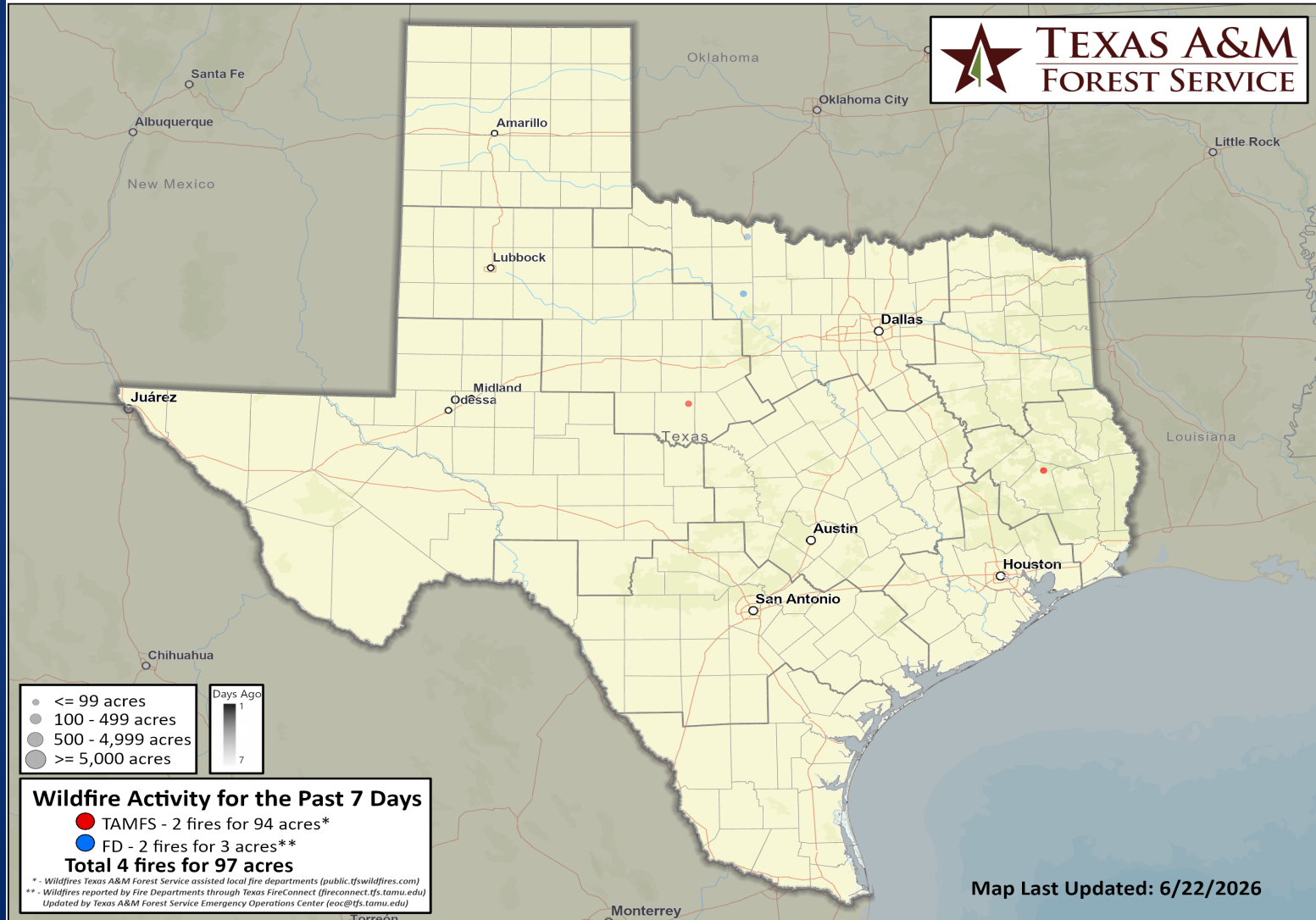
