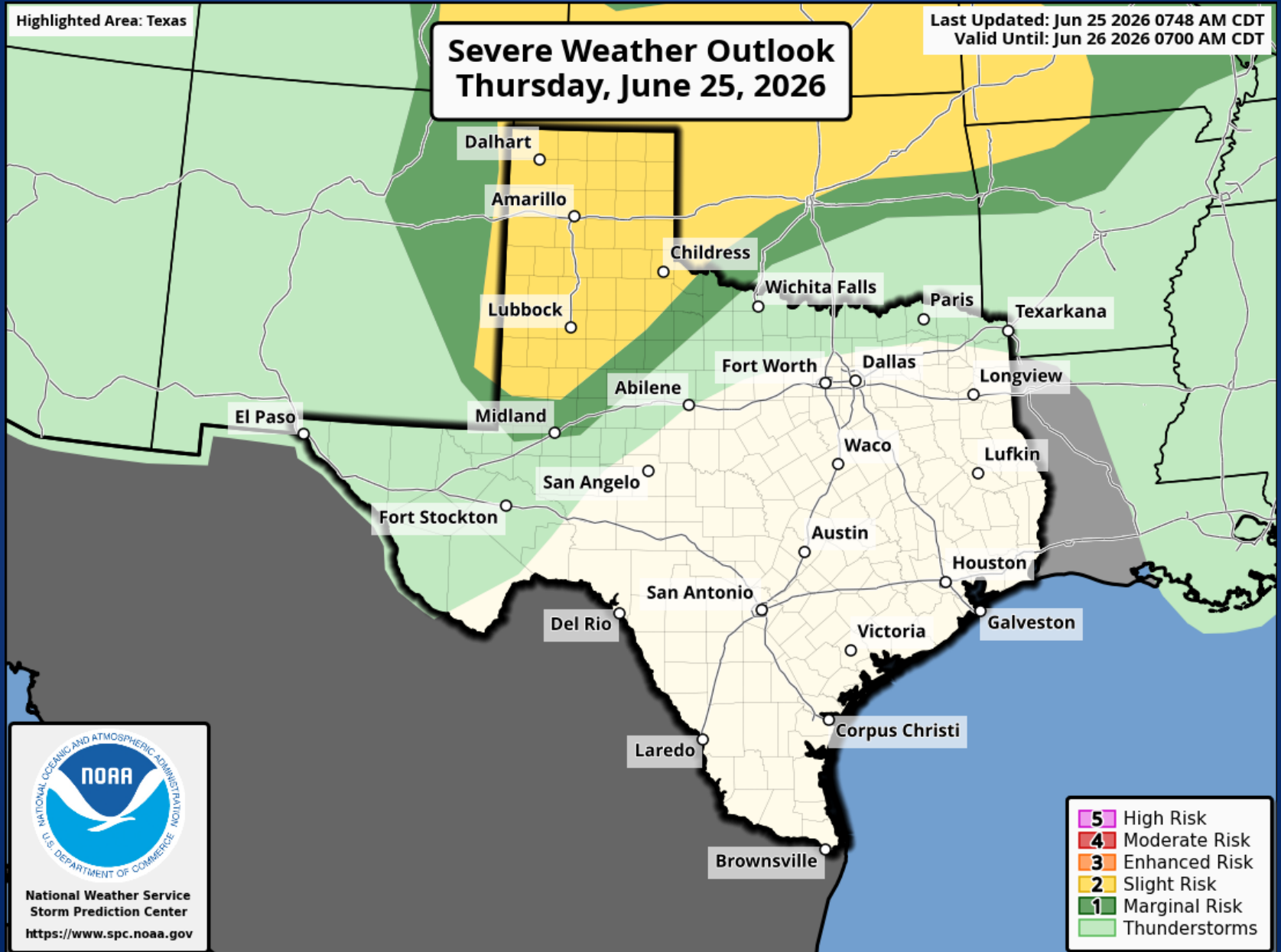

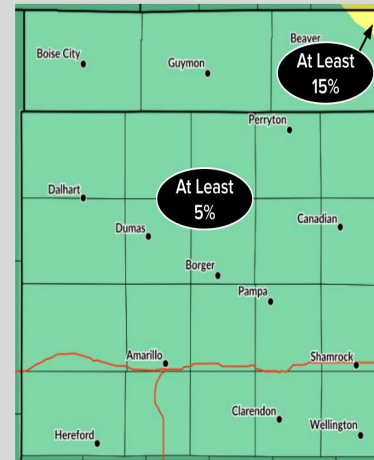

Information & Preparedness

- Heavy rain potential is highest across the NE corner of the Panhandles

- Heavy rainfall could lead to flooding of roads and homes, and lead to new rises on creeks/bayous.

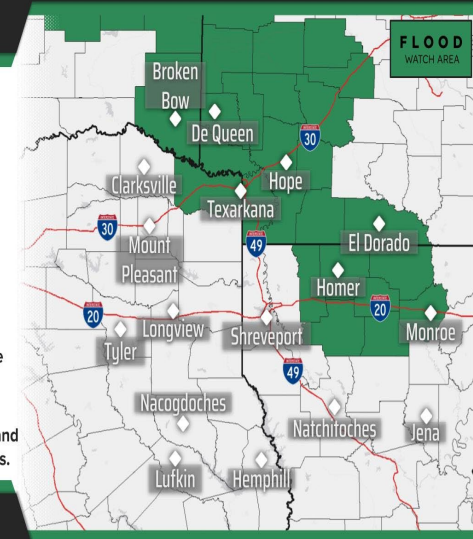

A Flood Watch remains in effect through 1 PM this afternoon for McCurtain County Oklahoma, Bowie County Texas, Southwest Arkansas, and portions of North Louisiana. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms may redevelop over these areas this morning, and will be capable of producing heavy rainfall over already saturated soils, which may lead to additional flash flooding.

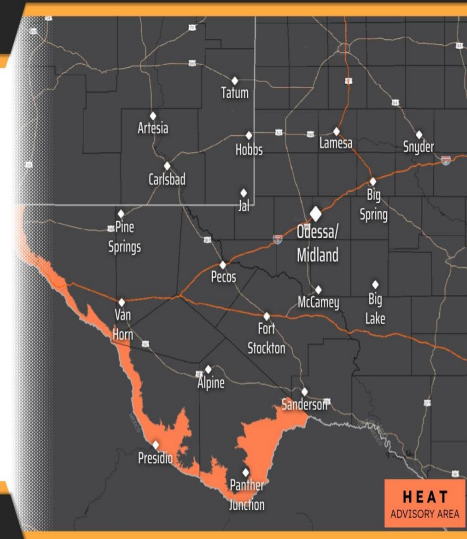

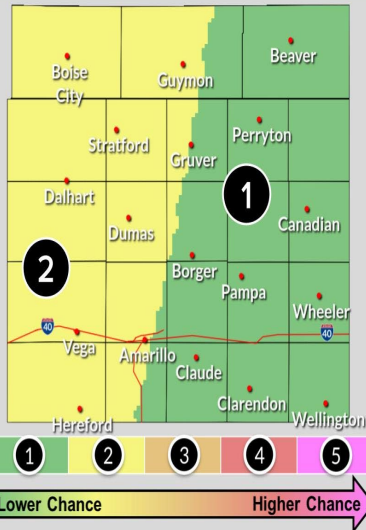

A rinse and repeat weather pattern remains in place, allowing for widespread triple digit temperatures to continue. Temperatures are forecast to top out between 107 and 113 degrees along the Rio Grande and Presidio Valleys. As such, a Heat Advisory is in effect for these locations this afternoon and evening. Though the rest of the forecast area is not under a Heat Advisory, it is still expected to be hot elsewhere. Be sure to drink plenty of fluids and take frequent breaks under shade if outside!

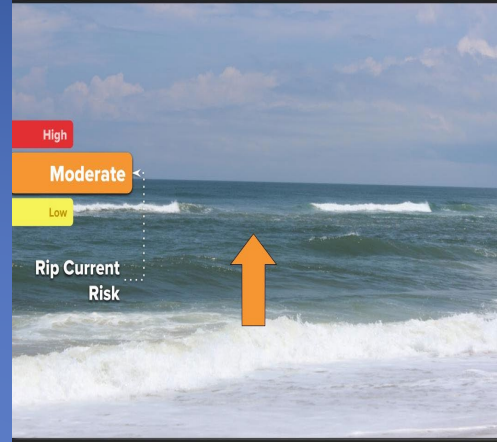

Best chances for severe storms are across the western Panhandles today. This potential hinges on how far east storms will survive as they move out of New Mexico through the evening. Any activity that can survive will be capable of large hail and damaging wind gusts upward of 75 mph.

Moderate Risk of Rip Currents

Can You Spot a Rip Current?



Clue: Waves are *not* breaking & water is often darker



Lower Texas beaches



Life threatening rip currents are possible and may appear suddenly.



Rip currents can sweep even the best swimmers away from shore into deeper water!

Always remember to swim near a lifeguard and heed the guidance of local officials.

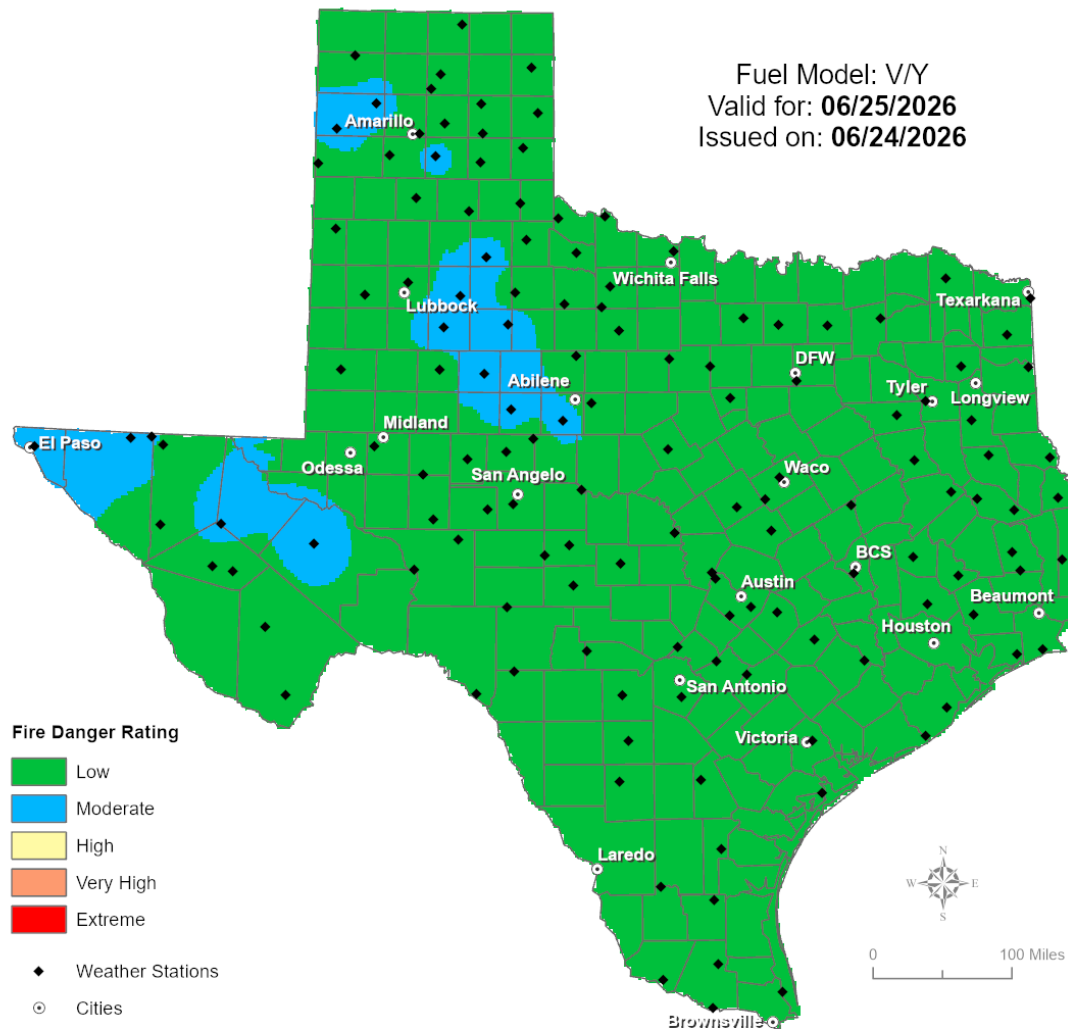

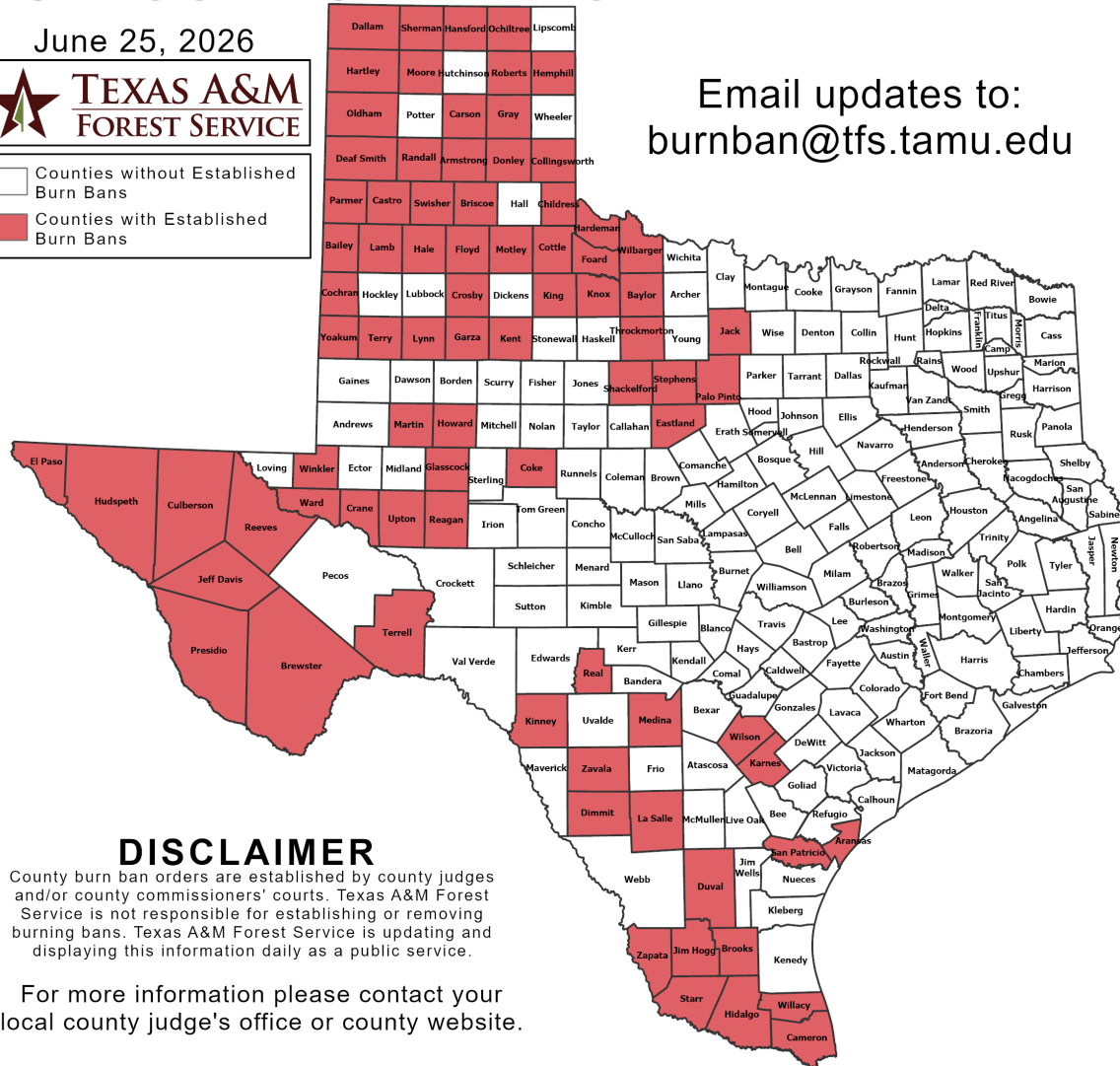

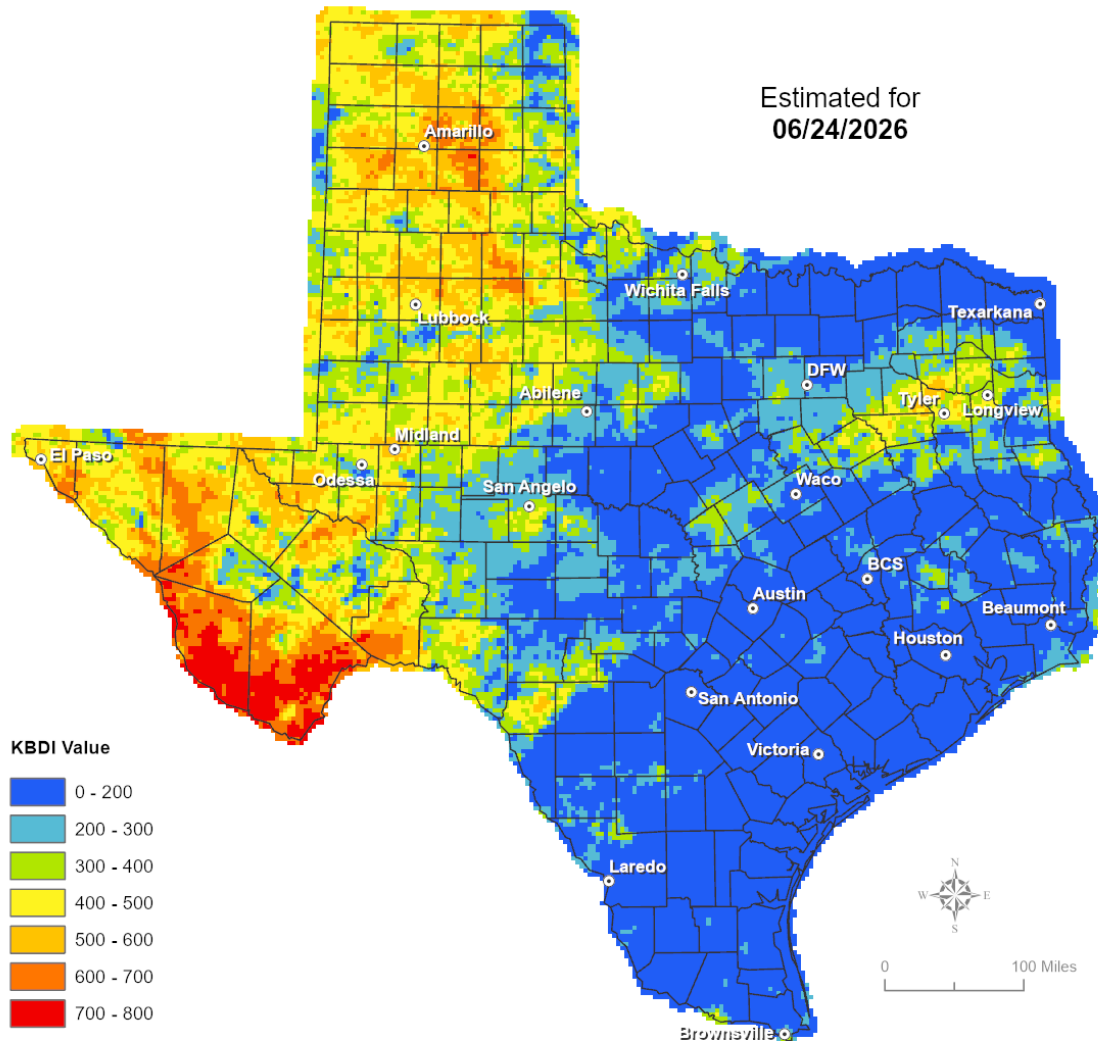

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

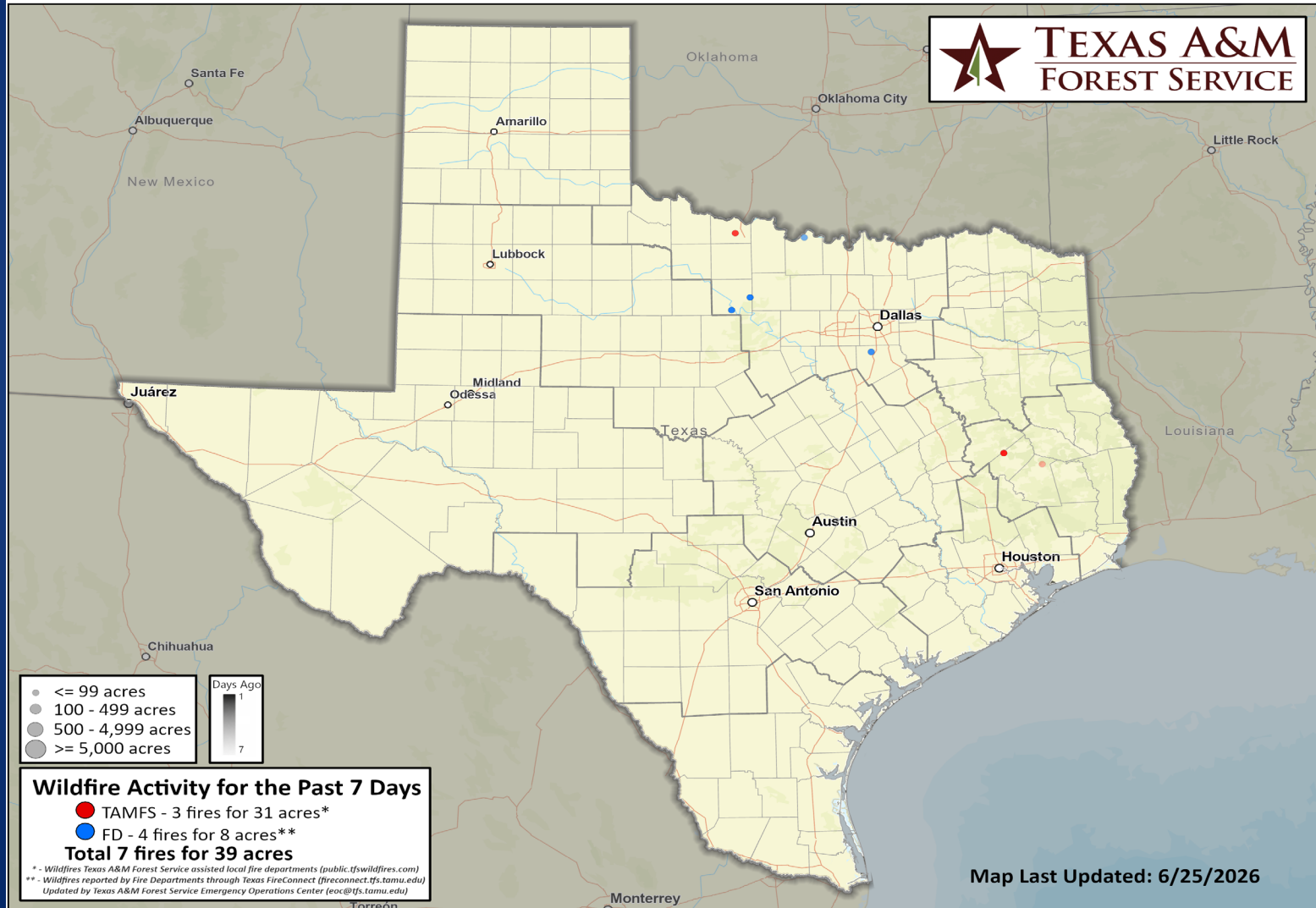
