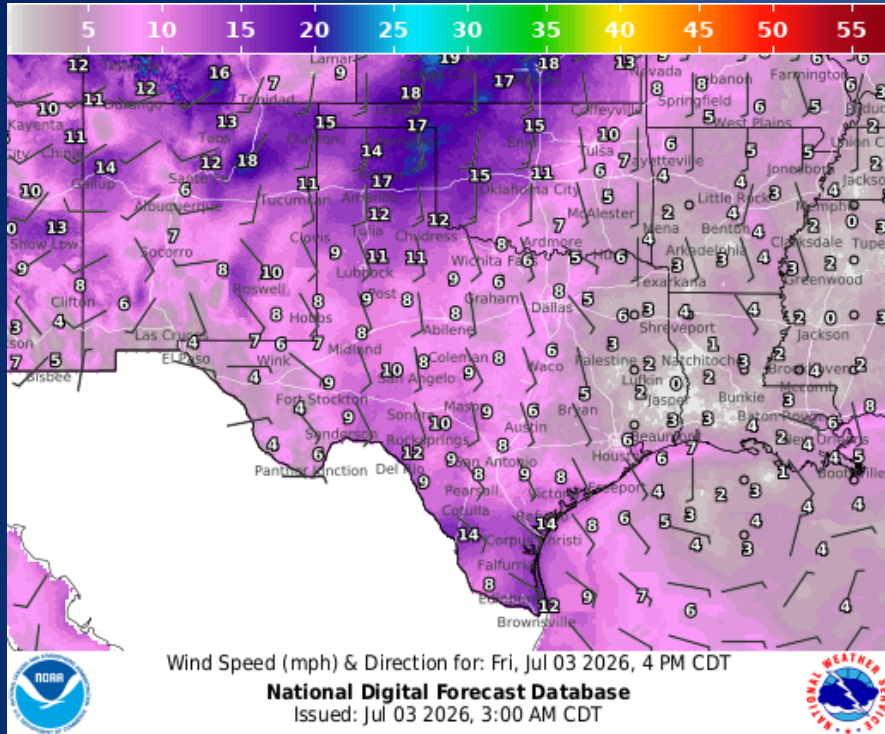

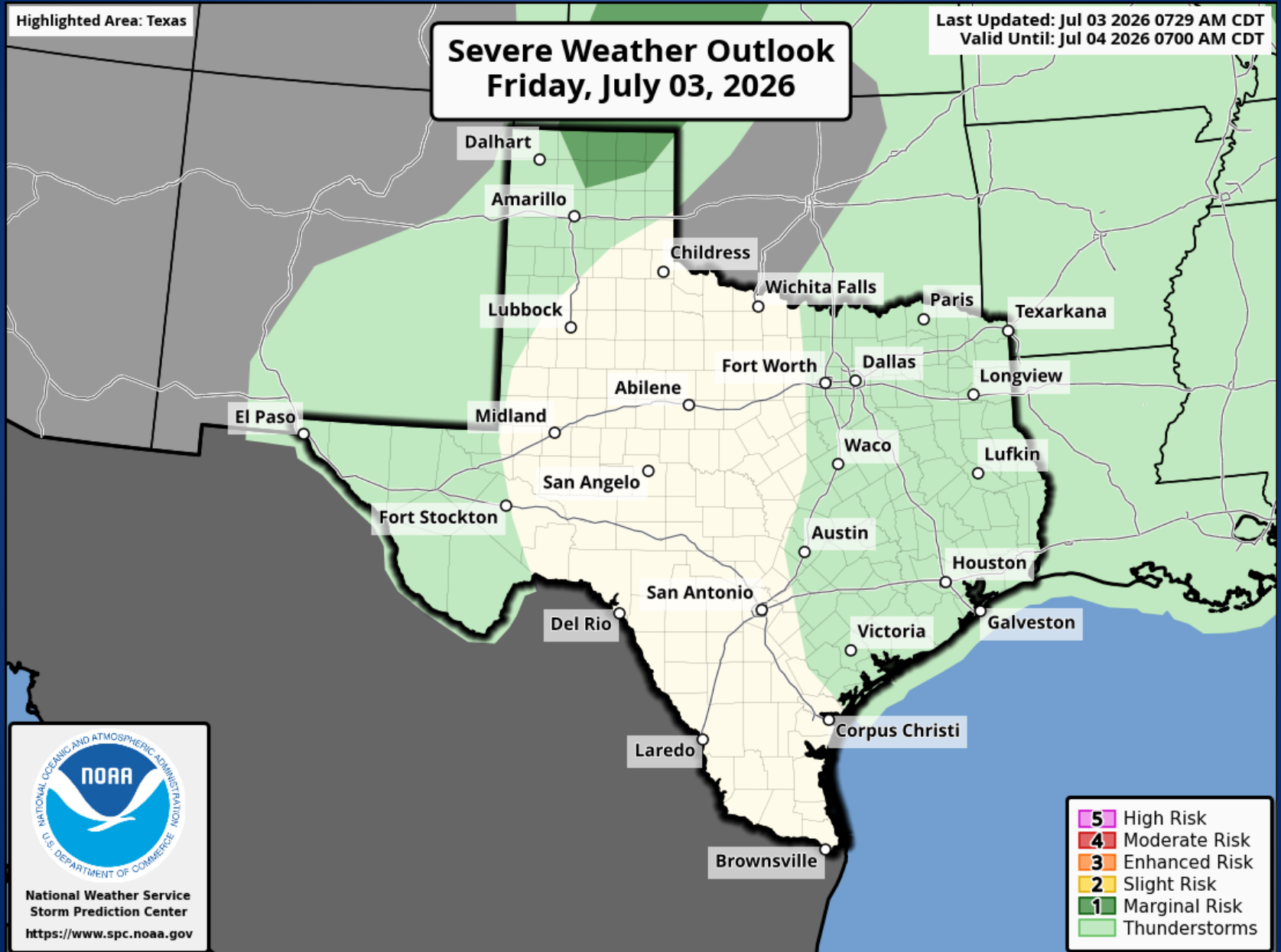

Severe Thunderstorm Potential Today

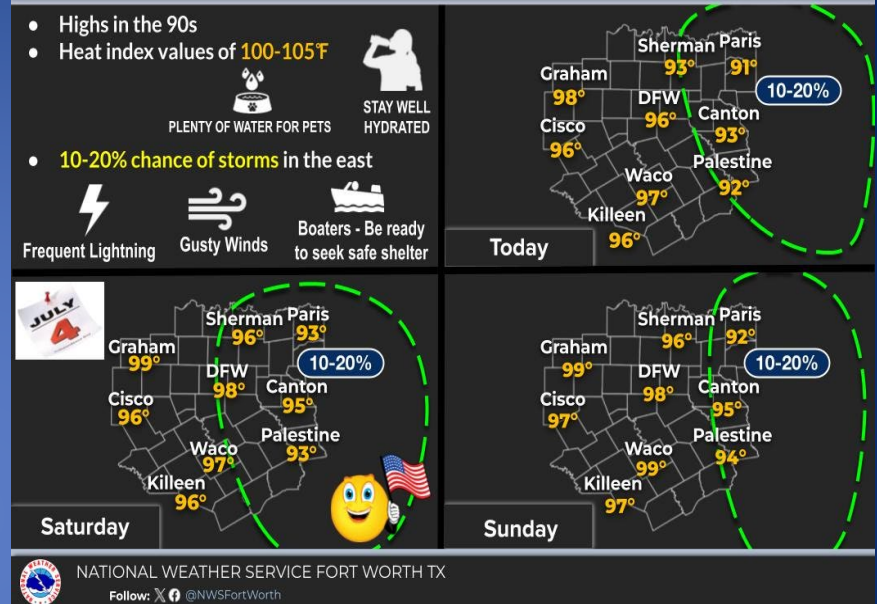

There is around a 10-20% chance for thunderstorms to develop across portions of the northern and central combined Panhandles. If thunderstorms can develop, there is a low chance for a strong to severe thunderstorm. The primary hazard will be damaging wind gusts up to 70 mph, but cannot rule out large hail up to the size of ping pong balls.

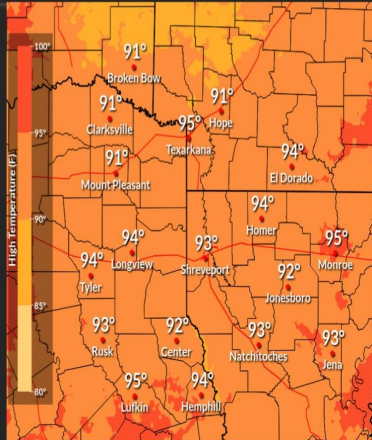


Seasonably hot weather is expected this weekend with highs in the 90s and maximum heat index values in the 100 to 105 degree range. 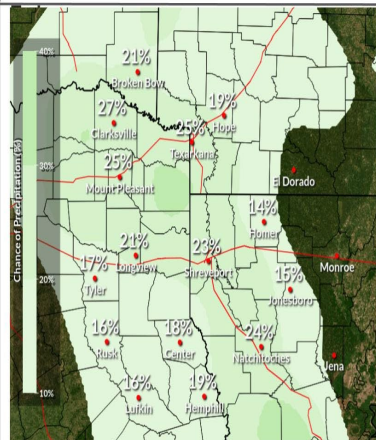

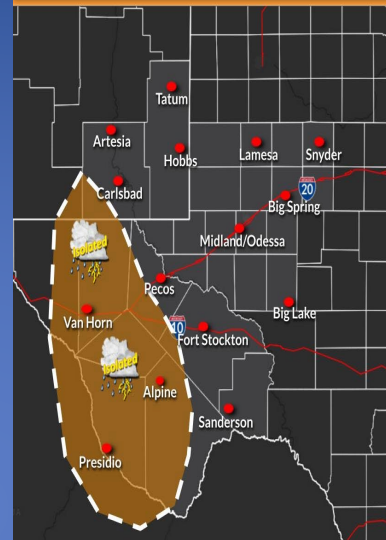

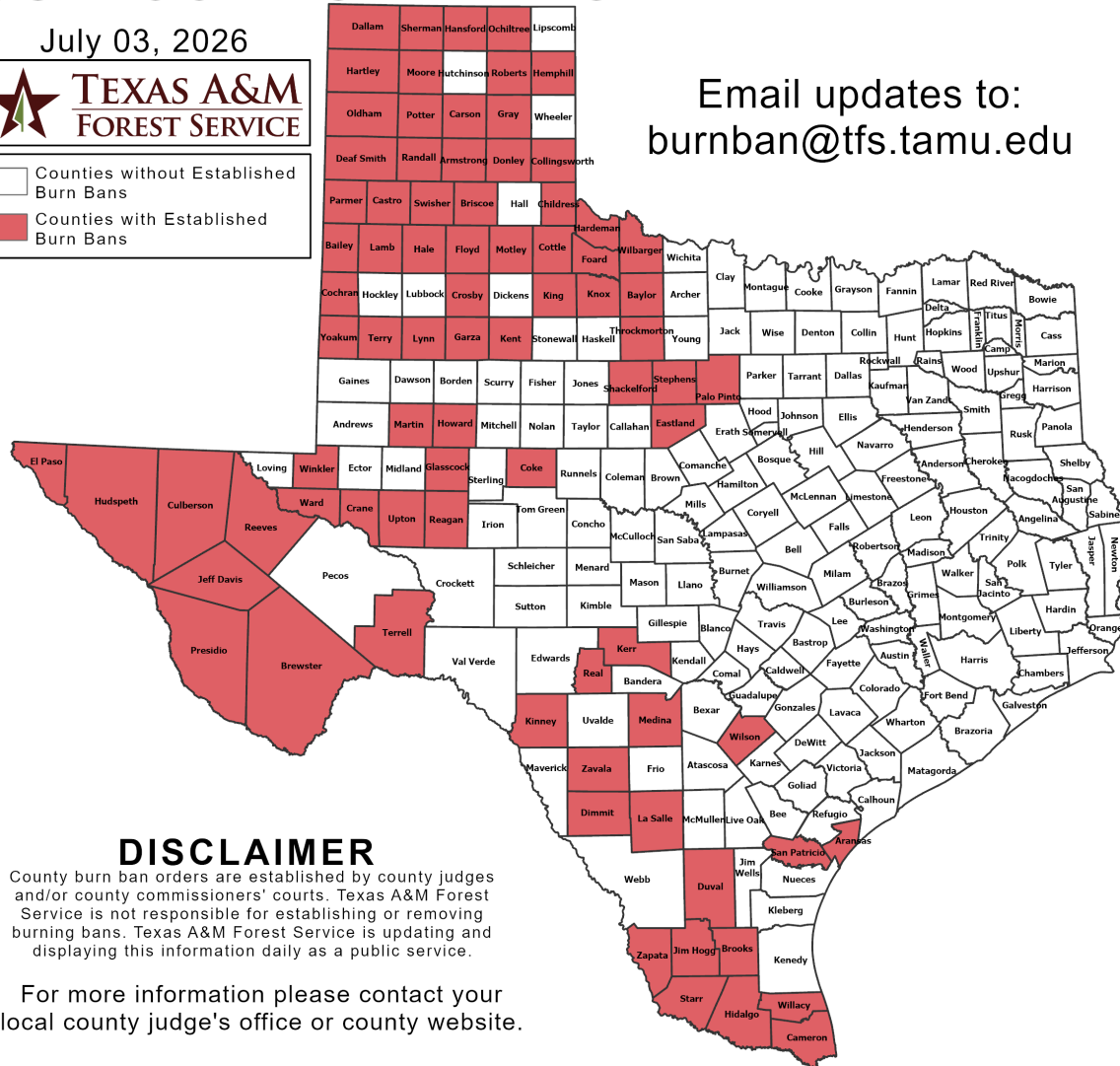

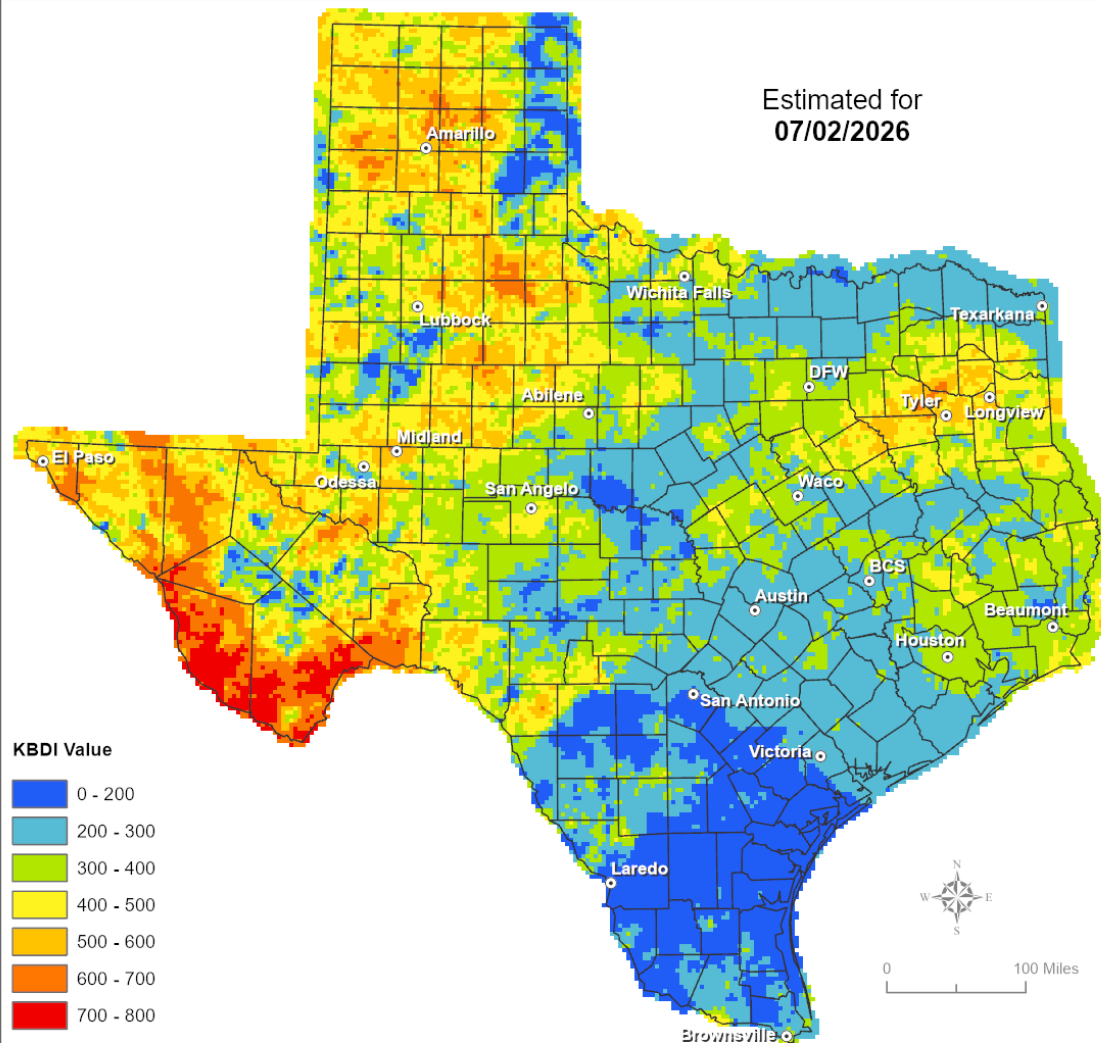

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

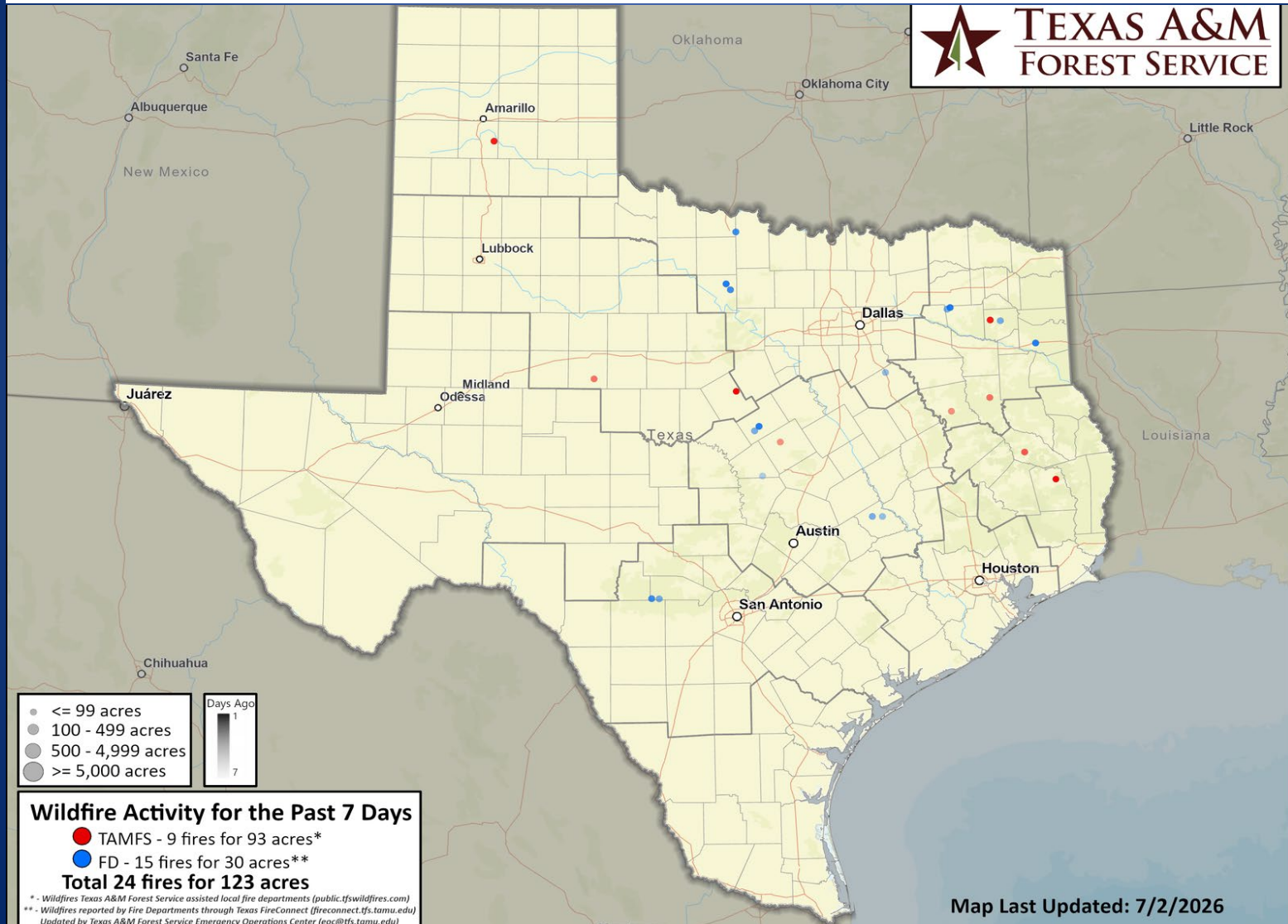
