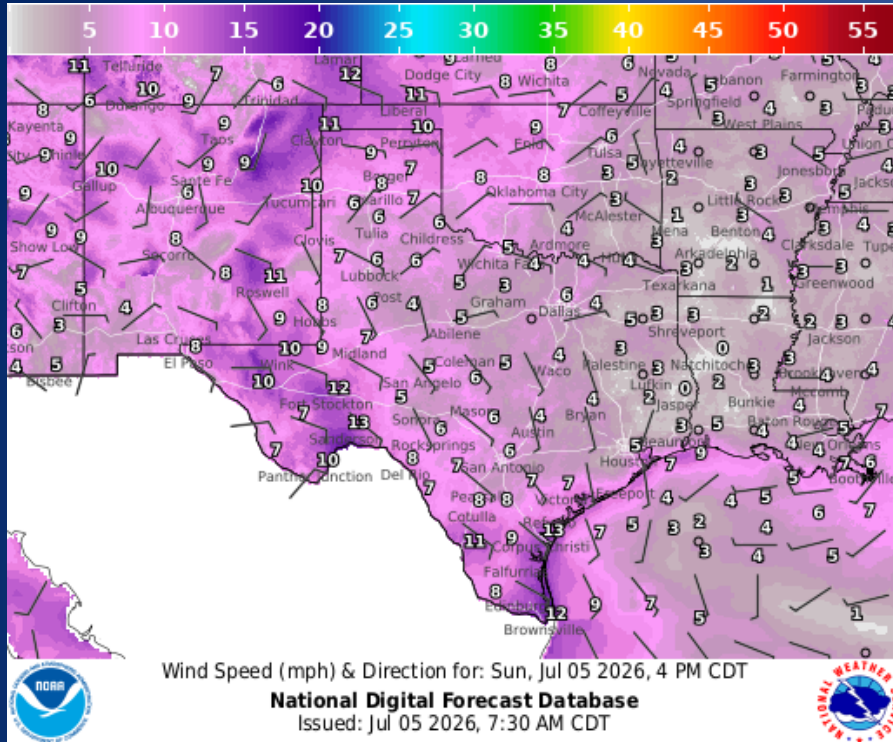

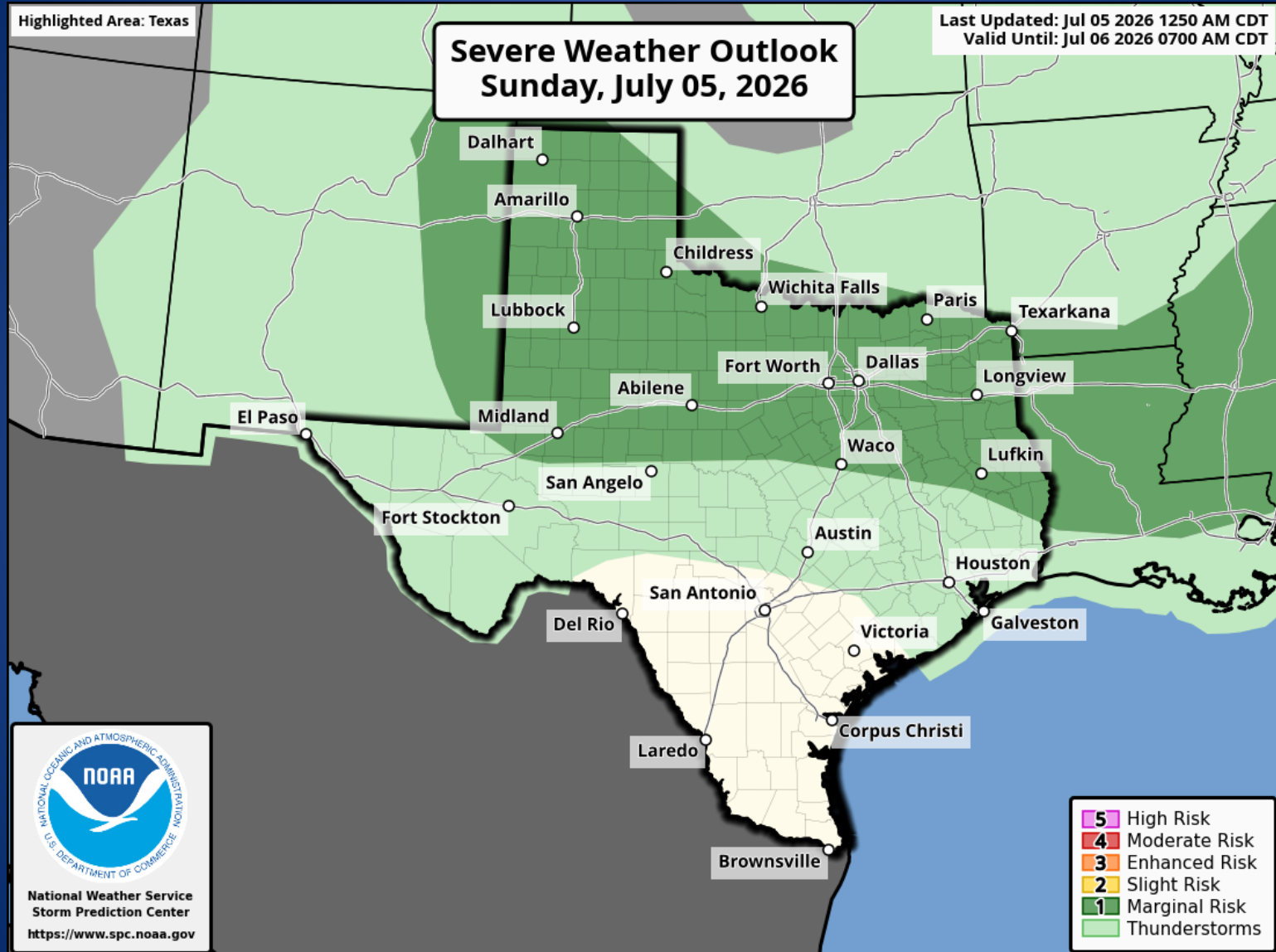

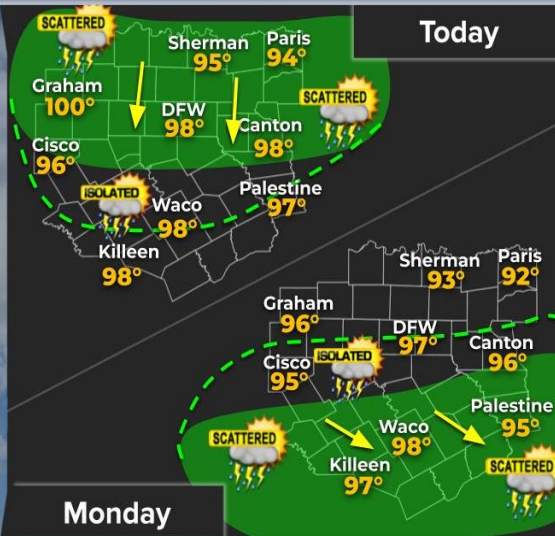
An upper-level disturbance will bring isolated to scattered storms to North and Central TX today and Monday.

Skies will be generally cloudy.



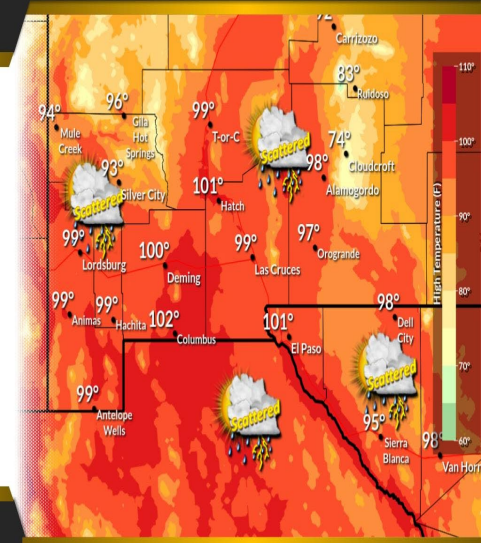
Temperatures across the lowlands hover around the upper 90s and the triple-digit mark.

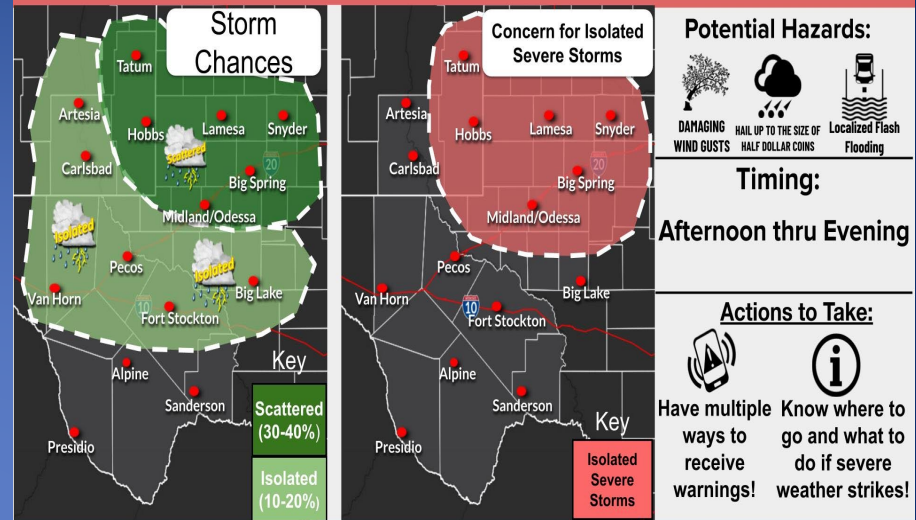

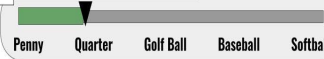

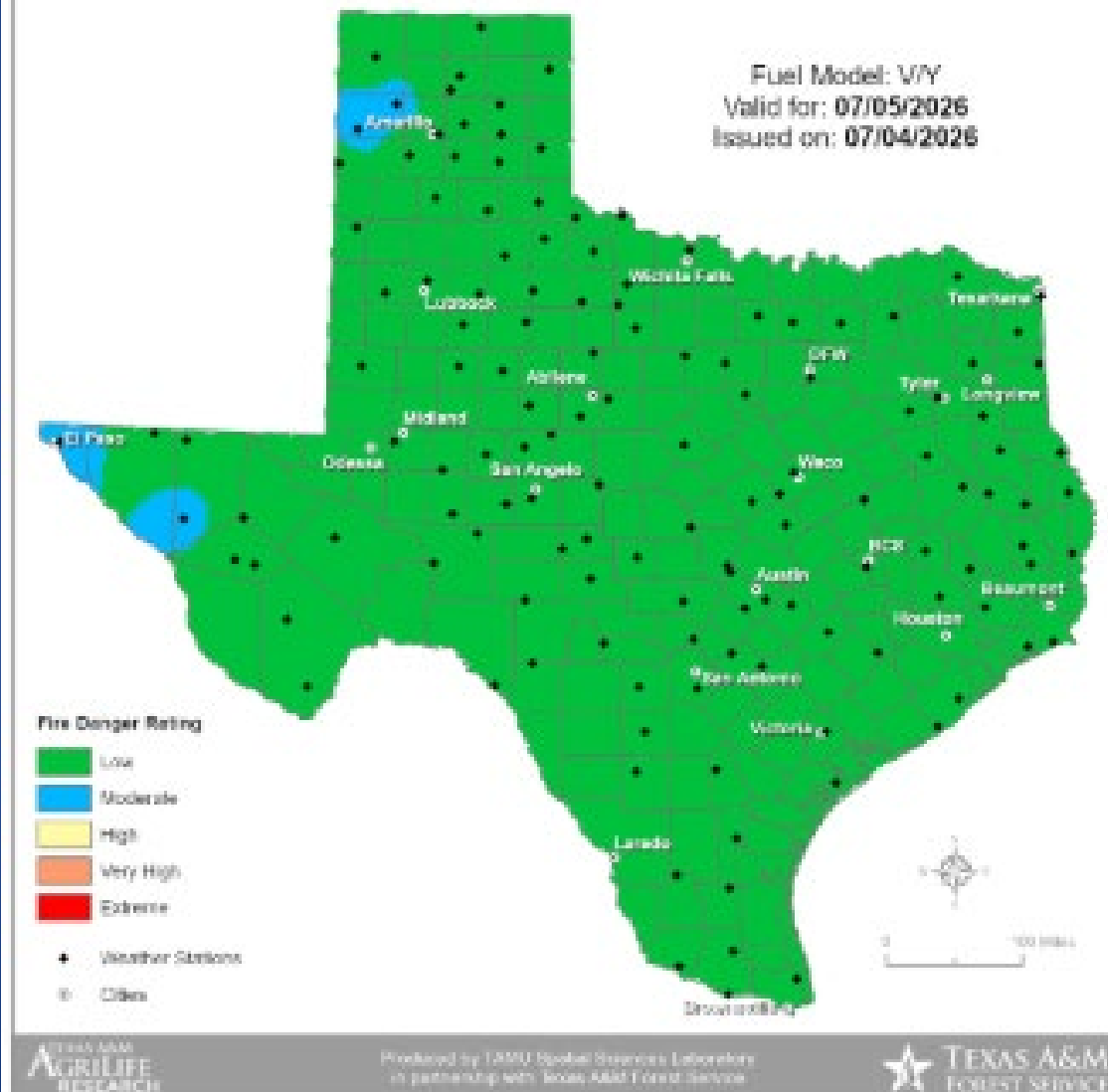

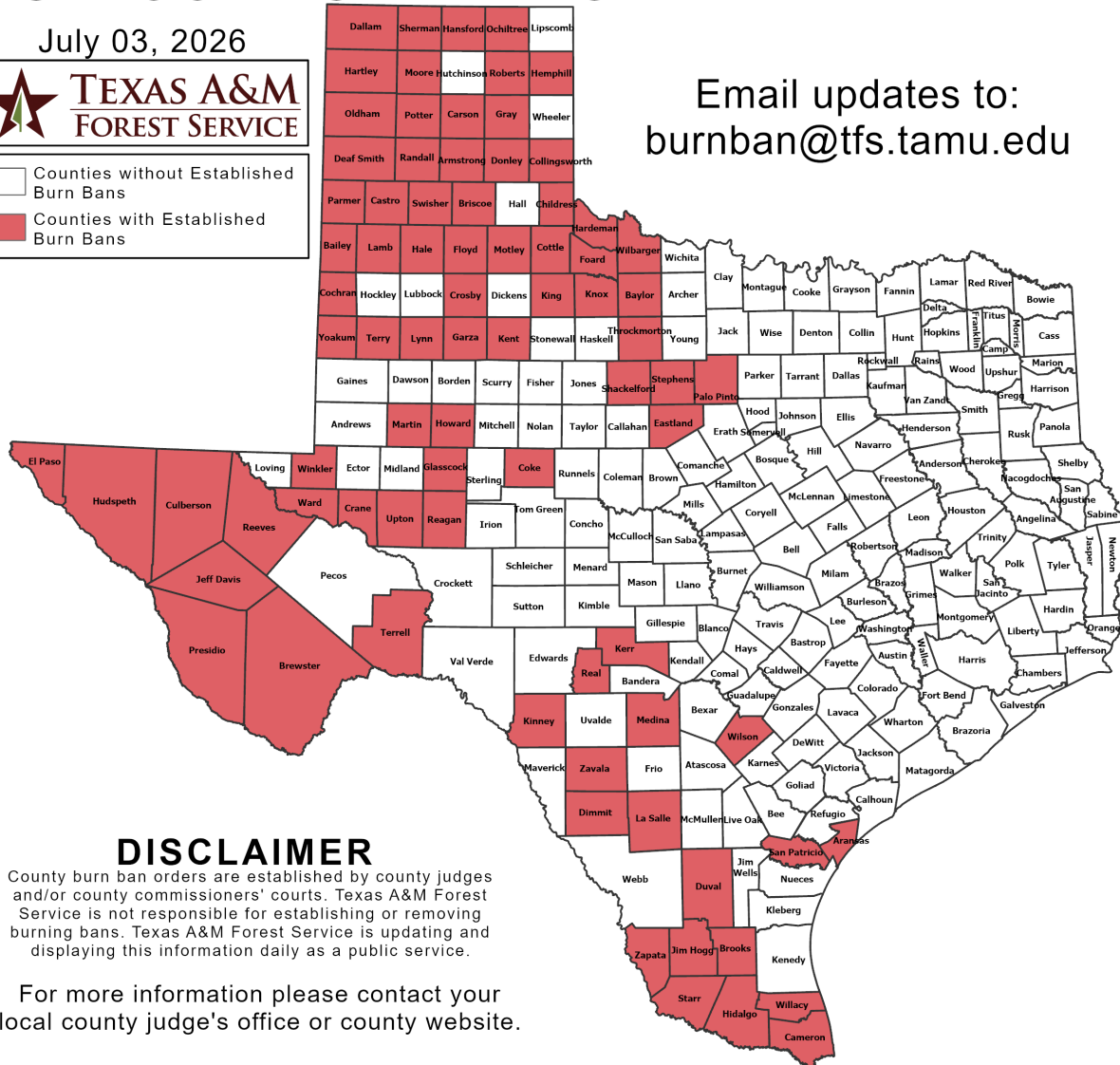

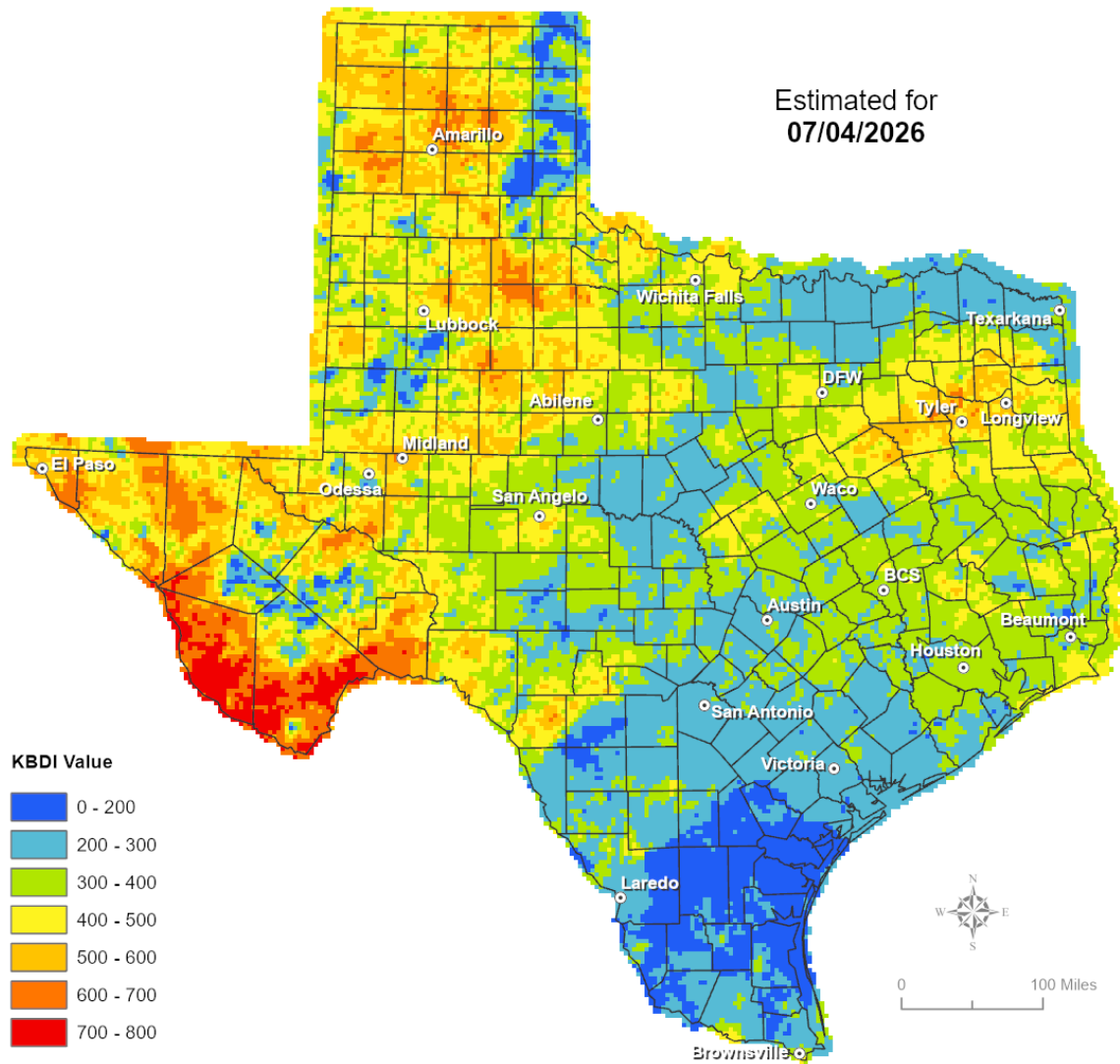

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

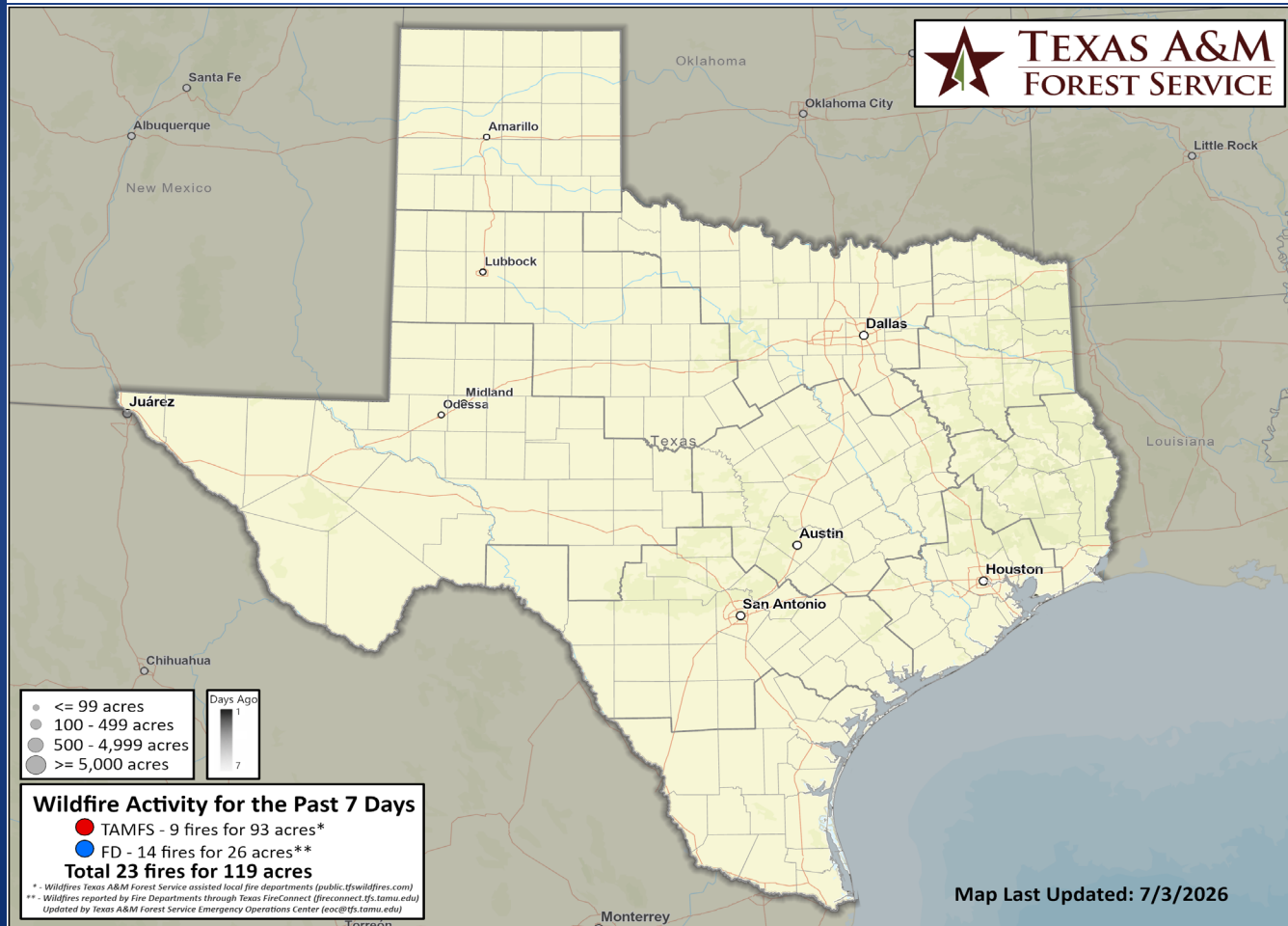
Keetch-Byram Drought Index

Report of 717 fires (No Change) and 104,509 (No Changes) acres have been burned this year. There are 81 (No Change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 92 (+12) counties with an average over 400.
