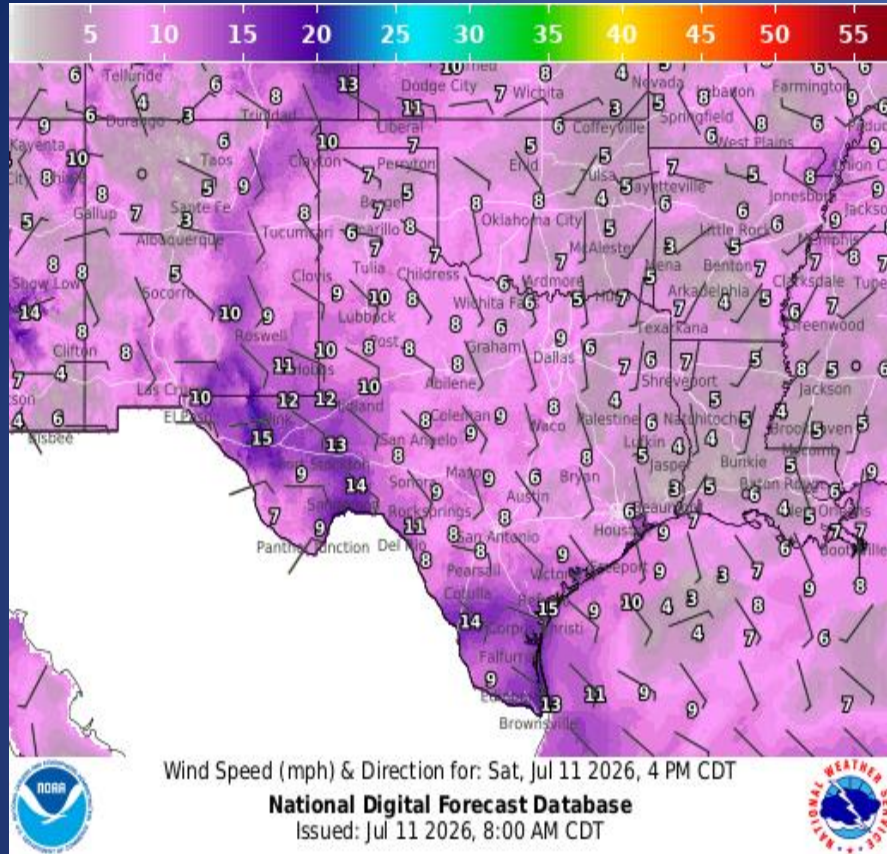

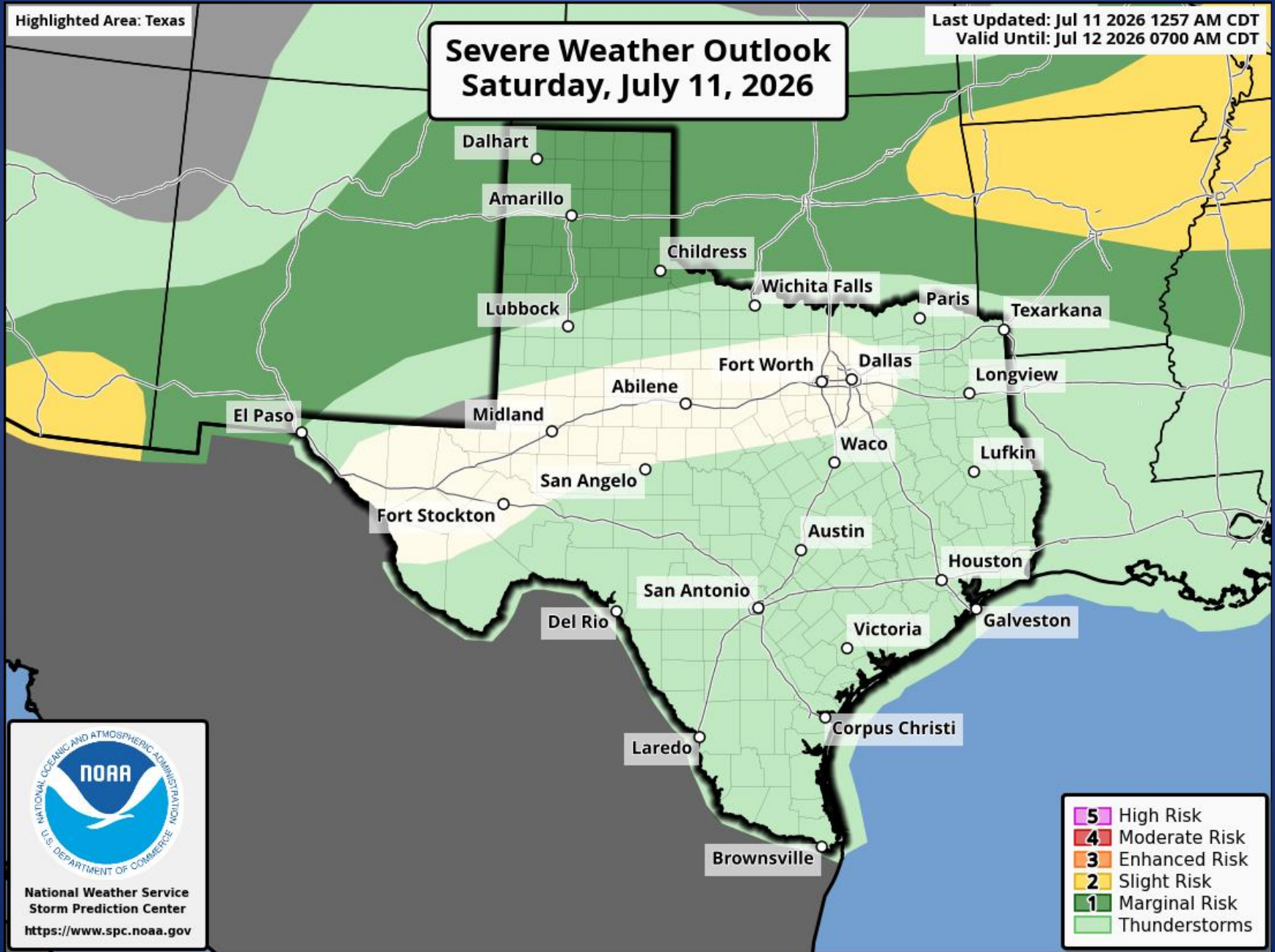


Wind Speeds

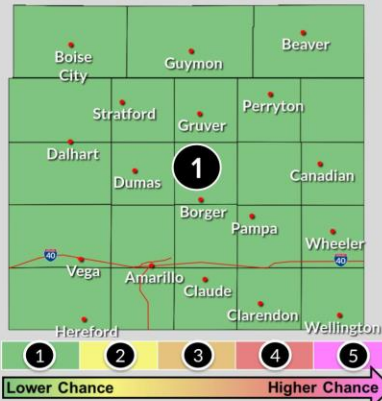

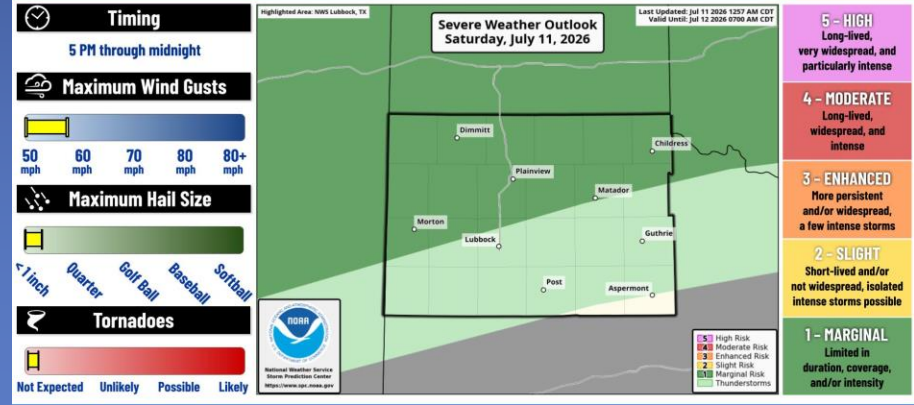
What You Should Do

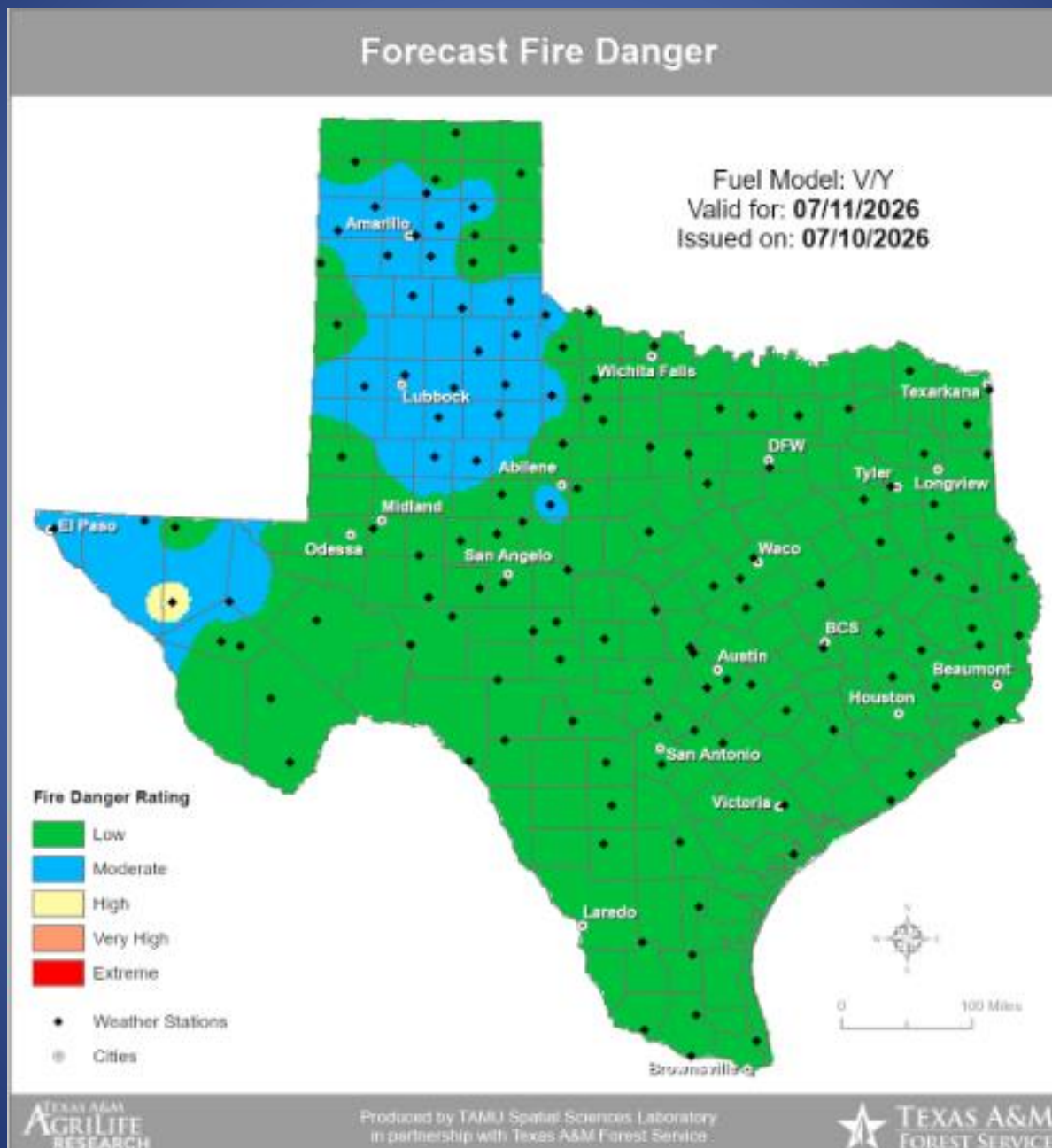


A few strong to marginally severe storms may develop later this afternoon and evening. Wind gusts of 50+ mph and brief downpours are possible.

Fire Danger Forecast



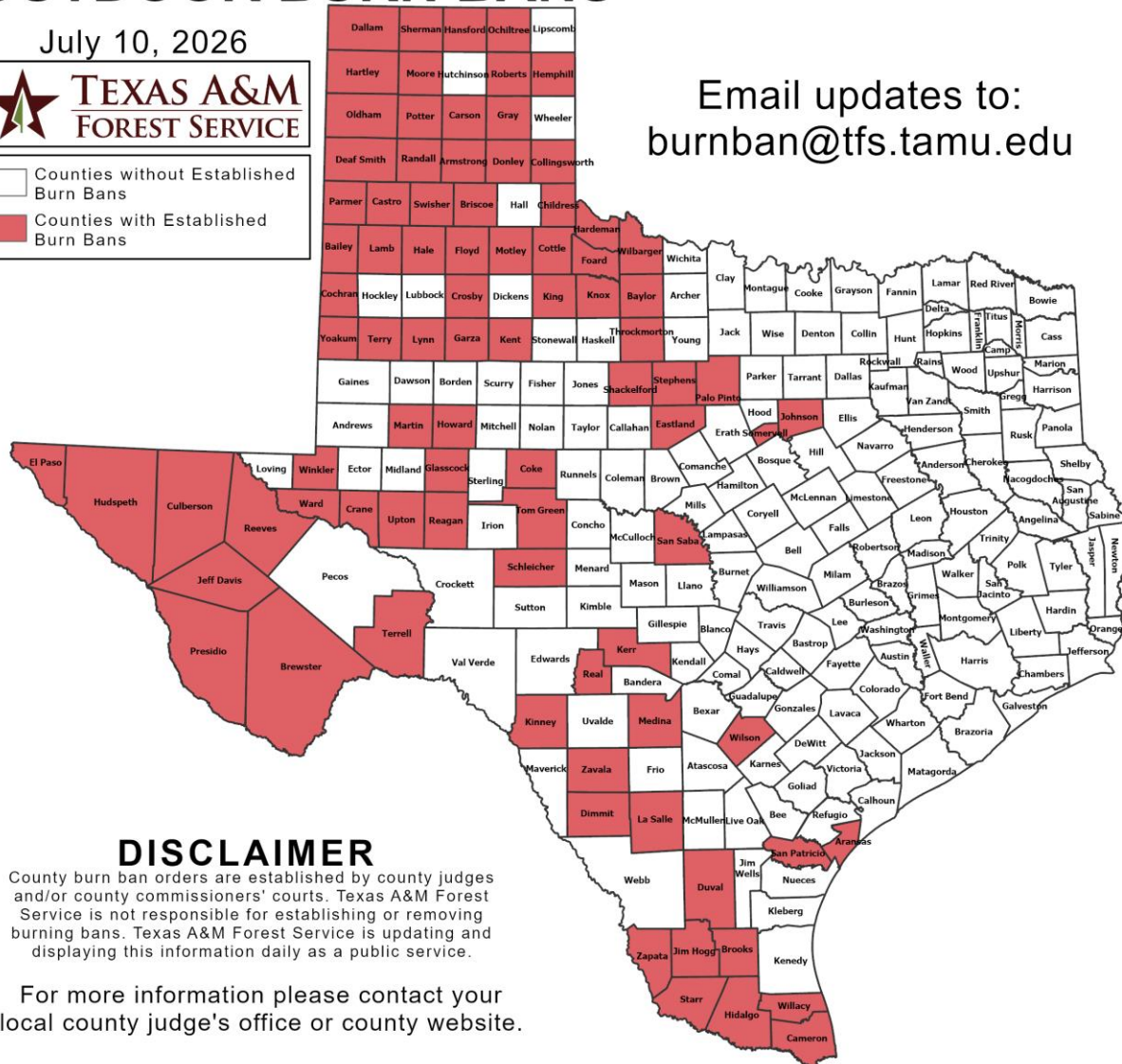

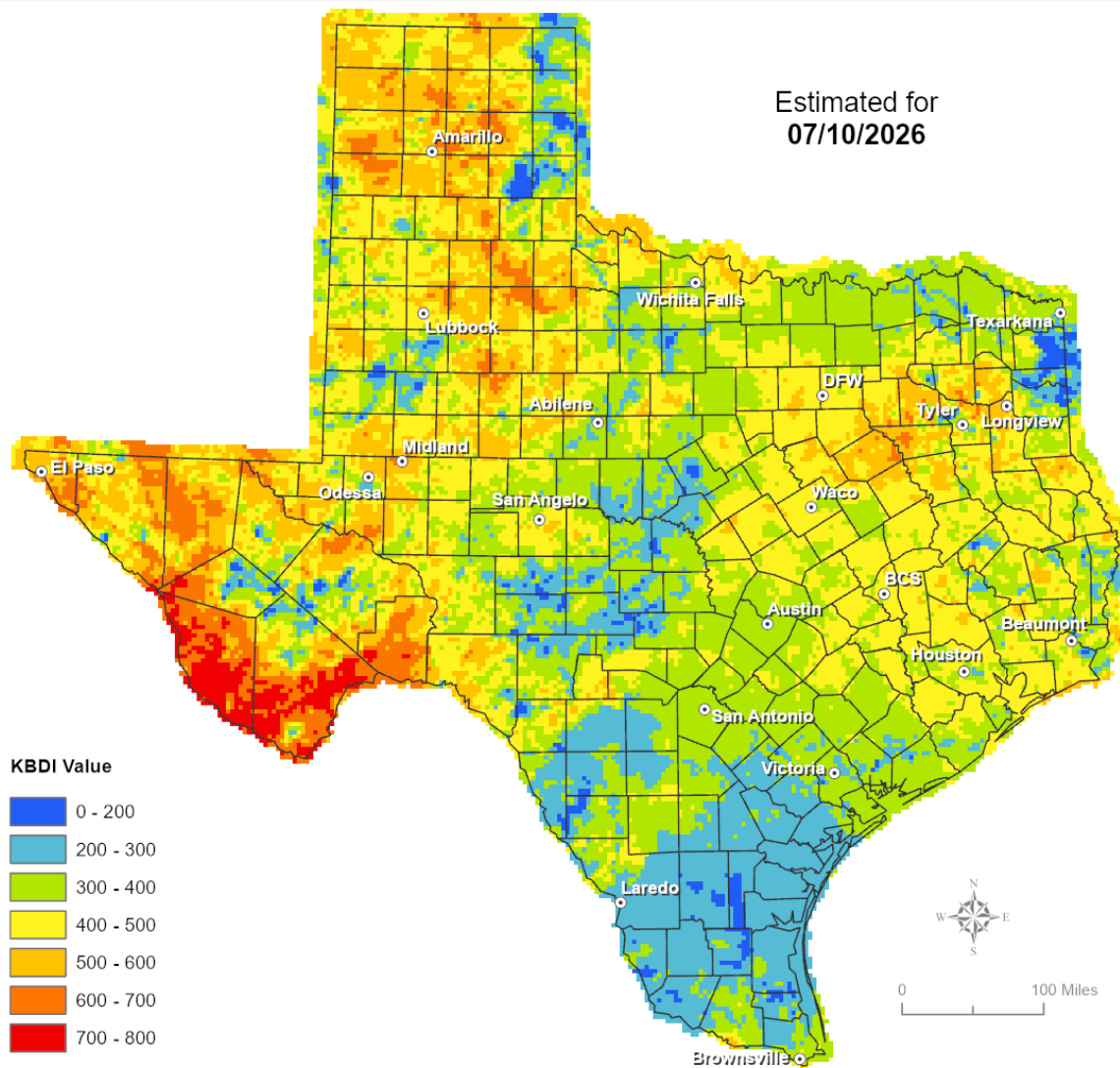

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

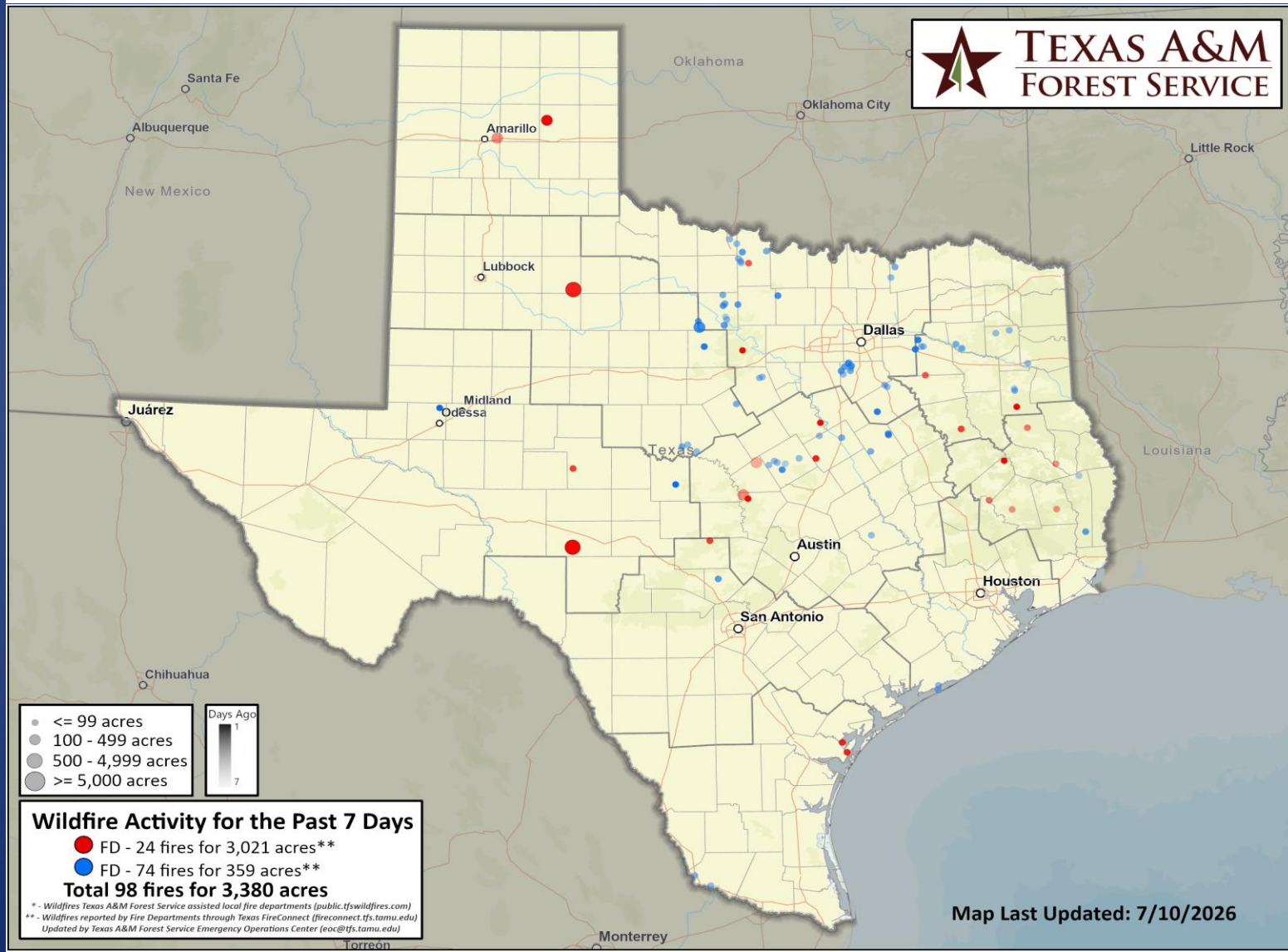
Keetch-Byram Drought Index

Report of 741 fires (+7) and 107,394 (+1,467) acres have been burned this year. There are 86 (No Change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 137 (+21) counties with an average over 400.
