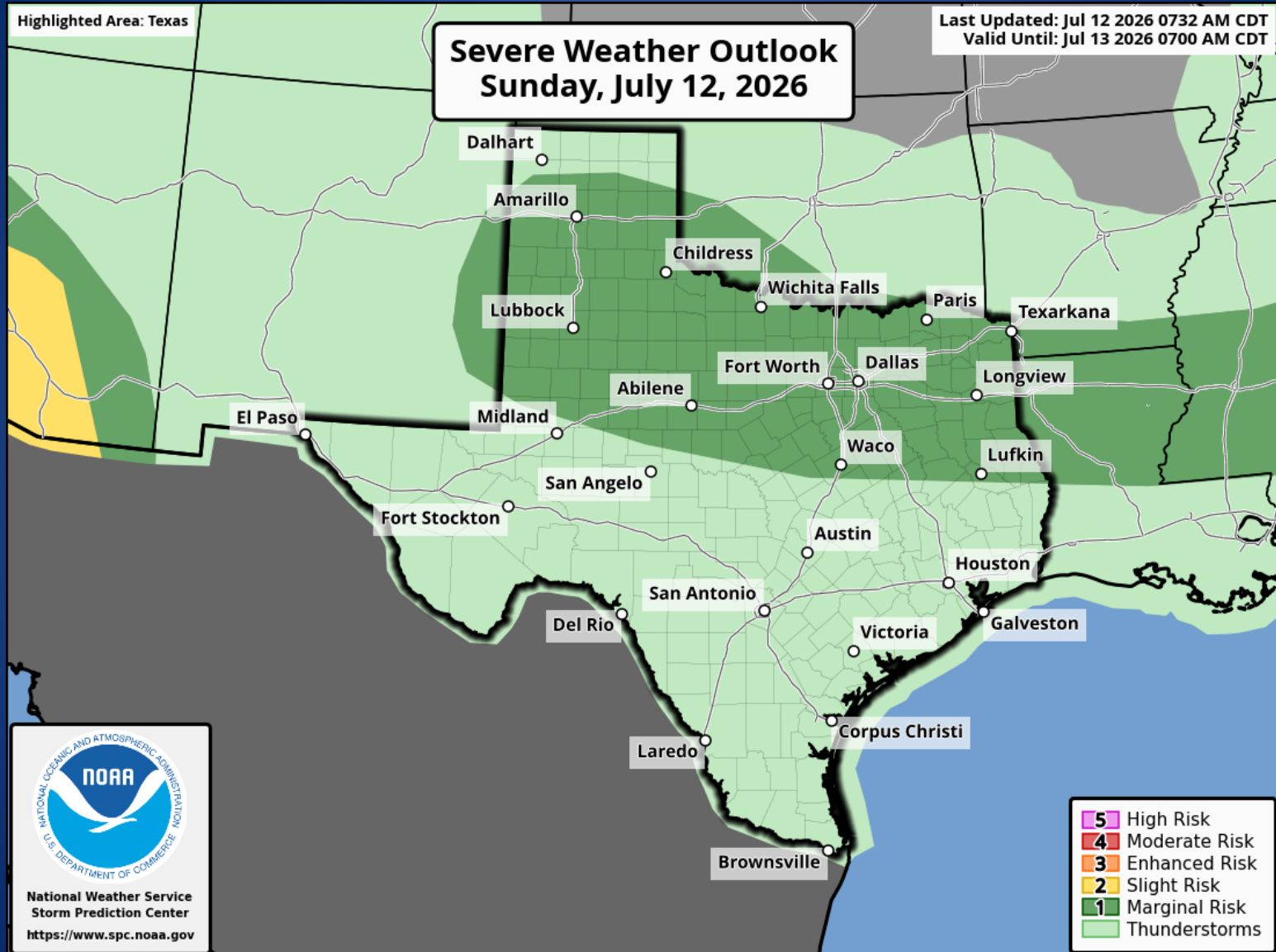

Scattered showers and storms will impact much of the region today, continuing into tonight. Rain amounts will be hit or miss, but areas that do see storms will receive locally heavy rainfall due to efficient rain rates and slow storm motions, resulting in an isolated flood threat. Never drive into water of unknown depth. Remember to Turn Around, Don't Drown. Strong, gusty and erratic winds in and nearby storms will be hazardous to those outdoors, especially if boating on area lakes. Keep an eye on the weather today!

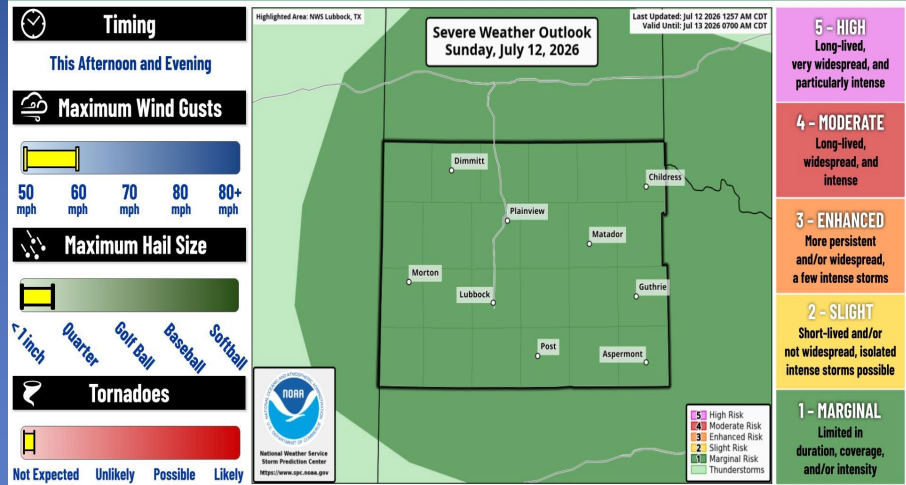

Key Points

Overview

Disturbances rounding the edge of an upper ridge up north will provide lift for several rounds of isolated to scattered rainfall through the week

What We Know:

- Medium to high chance (40-90%) of isolated to scattered showers/storms for much of the area beginning Sunday afternoon through Thursday
- Best odds will generally be south of the I-20 corridor
- Multiple rounds of heavy rainfall may cause localized flash flooding.

- Exact coverage and timing?

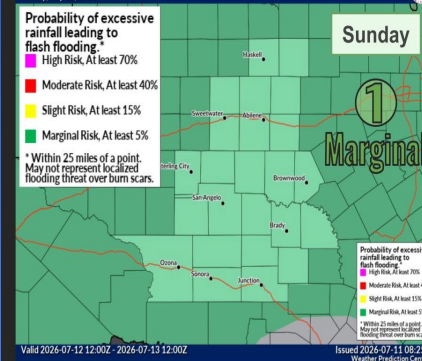

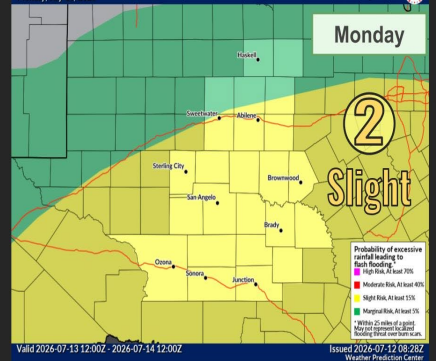
Excessive Rainfall Outlook Today and Monday

Day 2 Excessive Rainfall Outlook Sunday, July 12, 2026



Key Messages
→ There is a Marginal Risk for excessive rainfall across all of west-central Texas Sunday and a slight risk for Monday. Locally heavy rainfall may lead to flash flooding-especially in urban and flood prone areas. Along with the heavy rainfall, gusty winds will accompany the stronger storms.

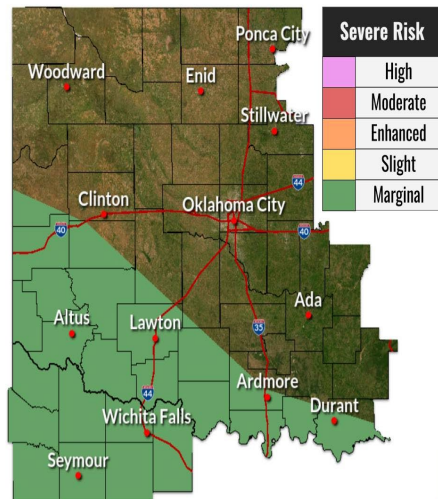
Have outdoor plans this week? Pay attention to the forecast! Aside from below normal temperatures, increased rain chances are on tap this upcoming week. The potential for occasionally heavy rainfall may pose a risk of localized flooding, especially on Tuesday. Keep posted!

Scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop each afternoon and evening today and Monday. Due to a moisture-rich environment, and slow movement of these storms, some may produce locally heavy rainfall and flooding. In addition, gusty winds will accompany the stronger storms.

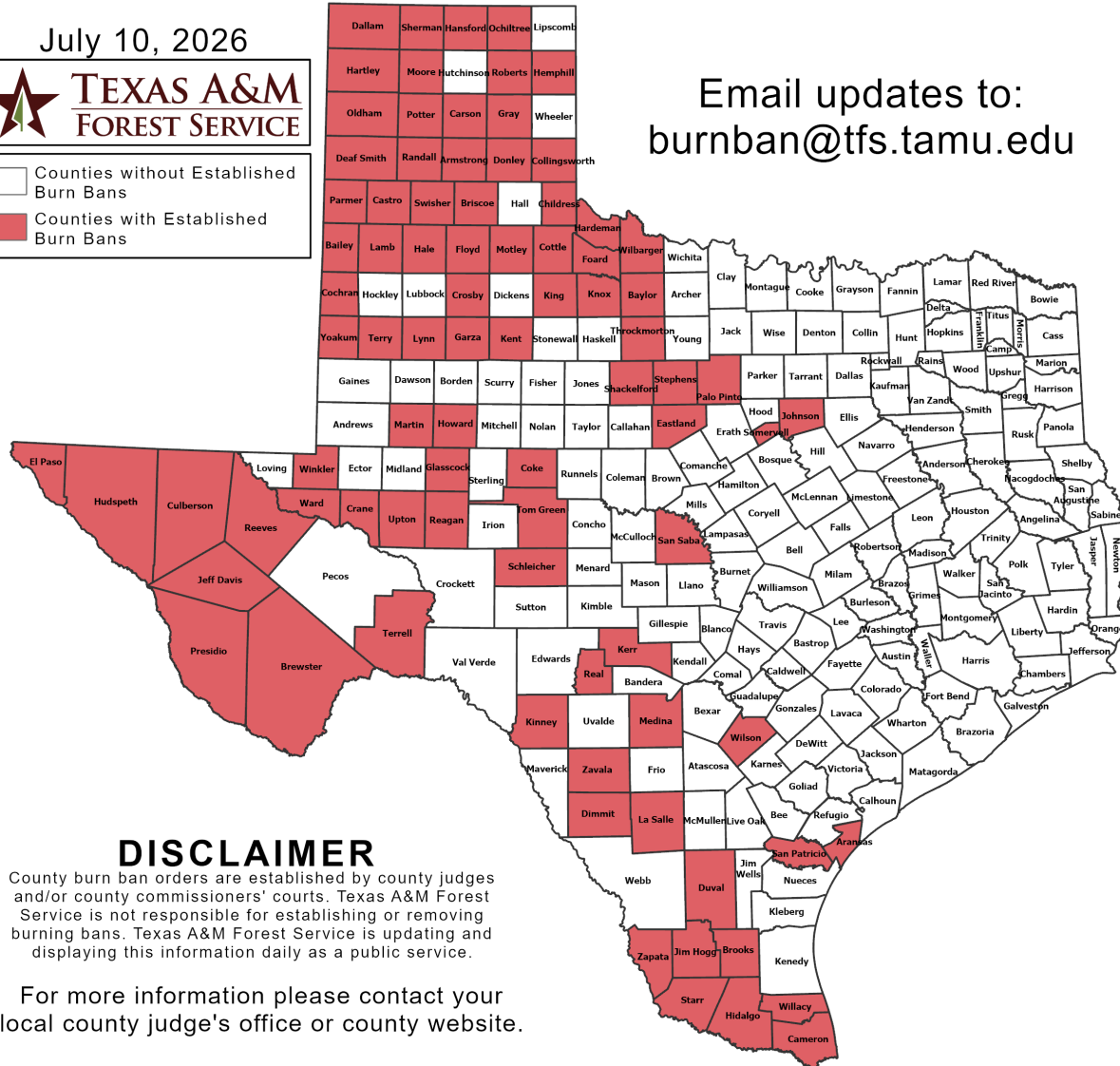

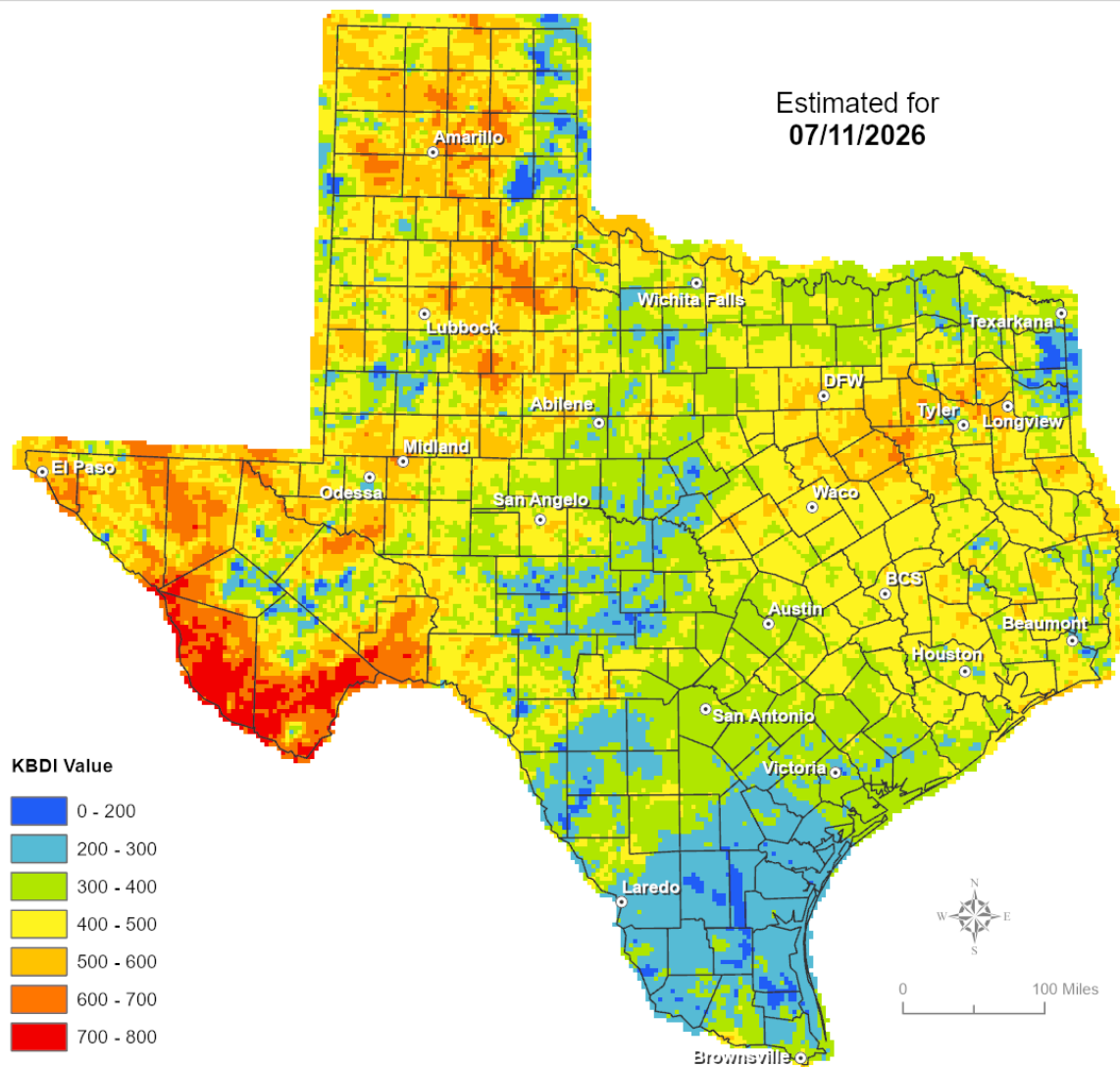

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

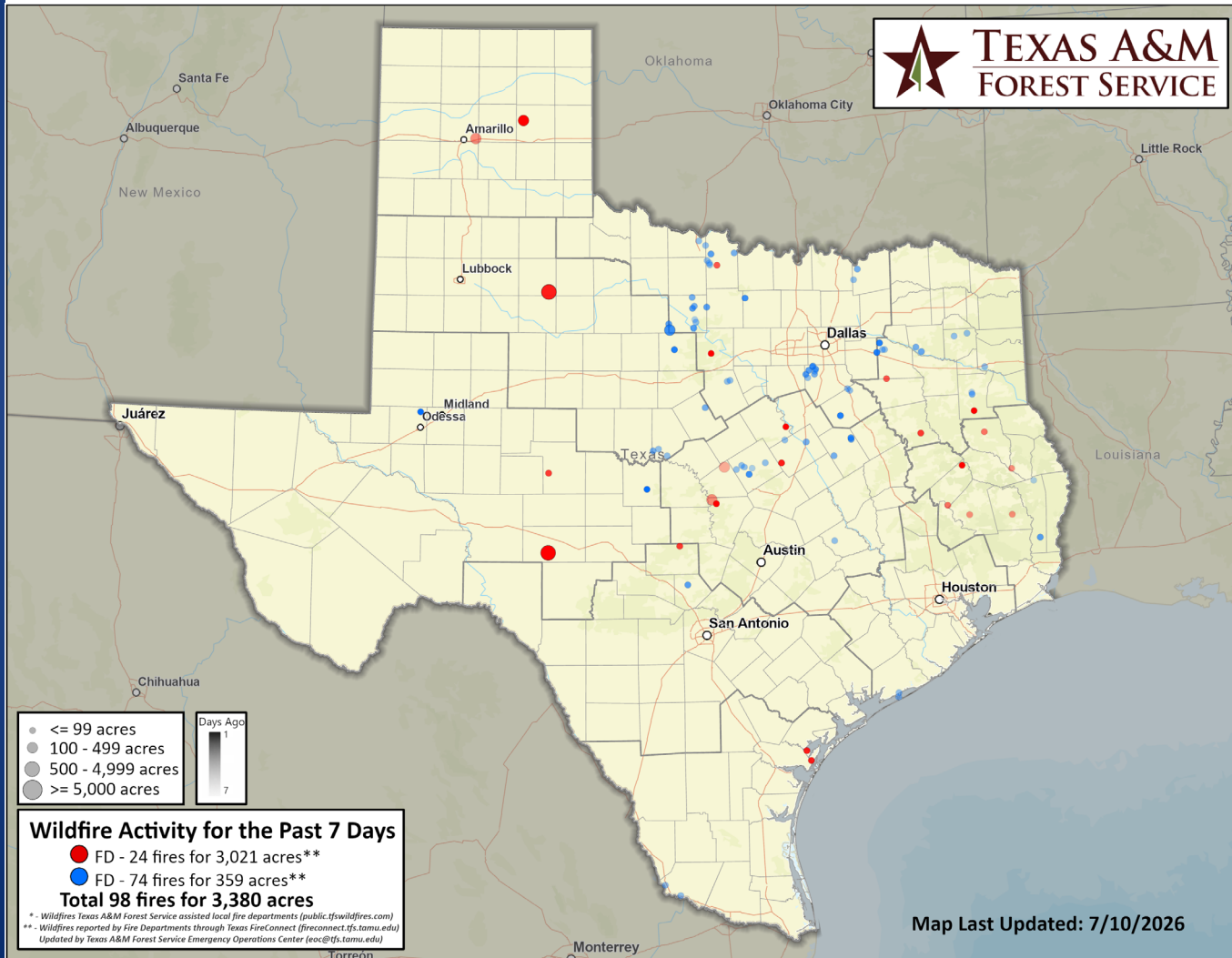
Keetch-Byram Drought Index
