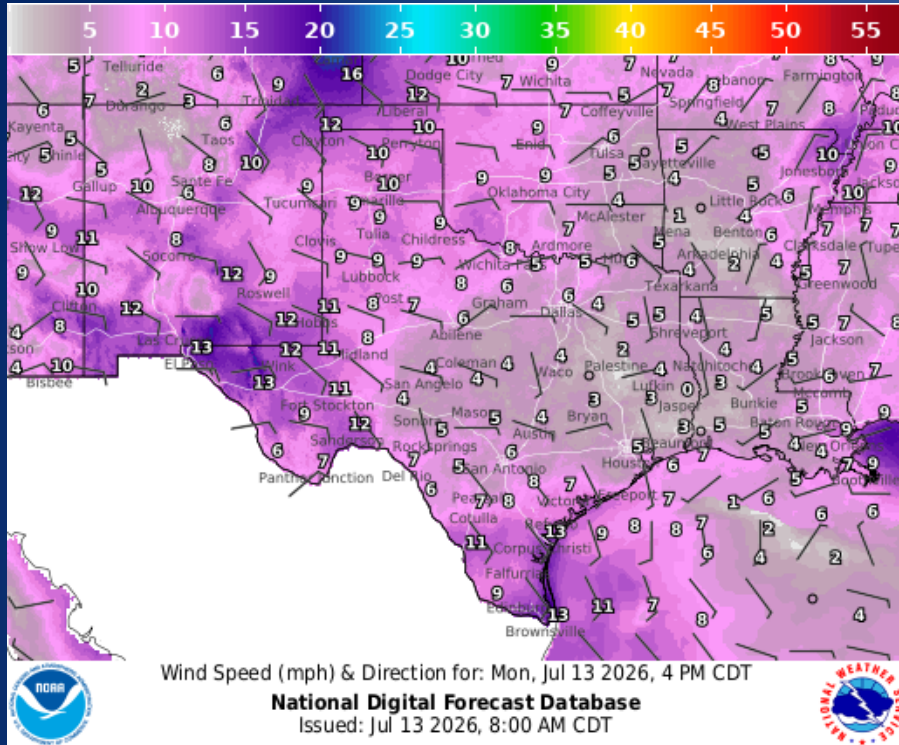

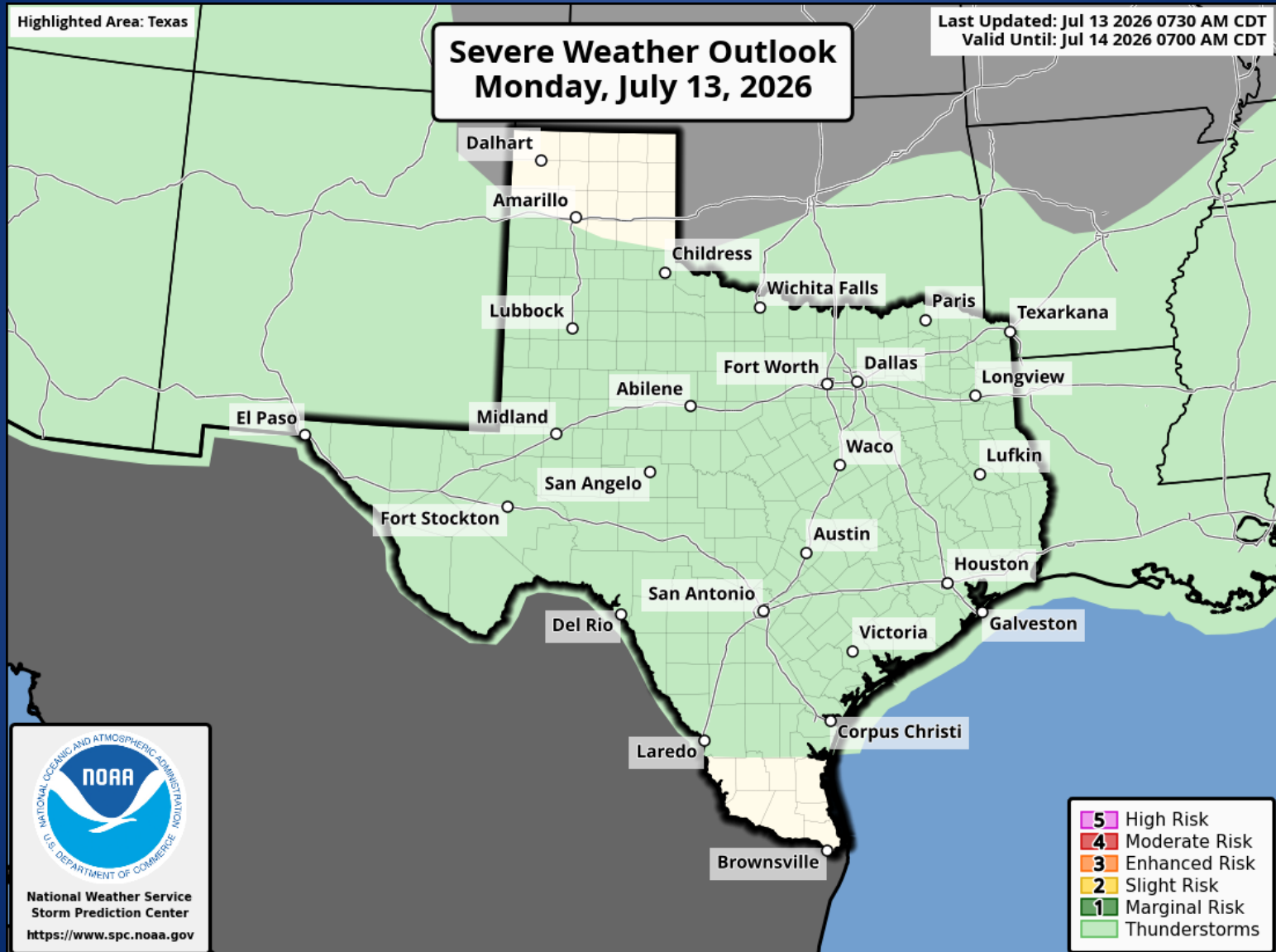

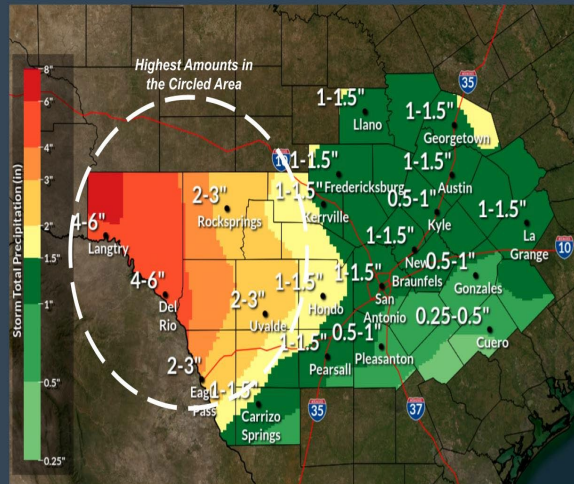

Scattered storms will continue with a threat primarily for **isolated flooding**. A few storms may also contain strong wind gusts.

Not everyone will see storms, but pay close attention, especially if you have outdoor plans!

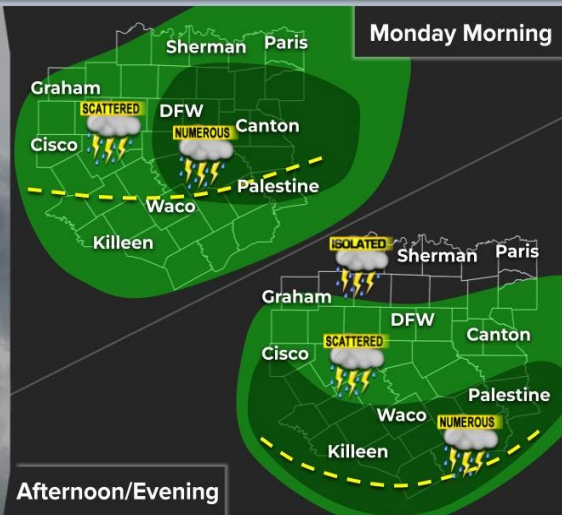
Storm Hazards:



Never drive into water of unknown depth. Turn around, don't drown!



Plan for interruptions to outdoor activities. Remember, when thunder roars, go indoors!

Scattered showers and storms will continue with a threat primarily for isolated flooding. The highest coverage is expected to shift into Central Texas by Monday afternoon. Locally heavy rain with the slow moving storms will lead to isolated instances of flooding, with a secondary threat for strong storms containing small hail and gusty winds. Remember to **NEVER** drive into water of unknown depth. Turn Around, Don't Drown!

Rainfall amounts will range from 0.25" to 0.50" with a few isolated amounts over 1.00".

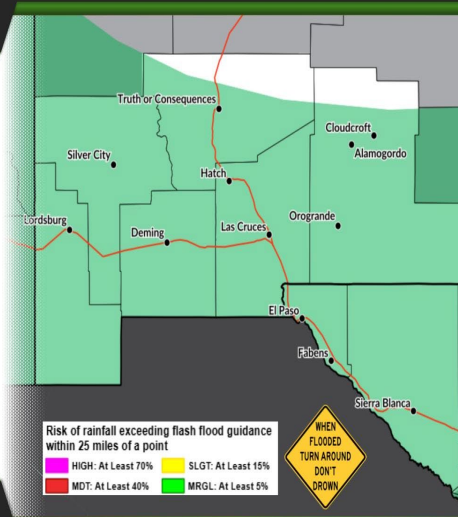

Scattered mountain and isolated thunderstorms capable of producing periods of moderate to heavy rainfall will occur in the afternoon and evening. Rain amounts will range from 0.25 to 0.5 inches with isolated amounts over an inch that could produce localized flooding.

Locally Heavy Rainfall Likely



Key Messages

- Scattered to widespread showers and thunderstorms are expected through Tuesday. These storms could produce localized heavy rainfall.
- **Slight Risk (level 2 of 4)** of Excessive Rainfall on Monday and Tuesday for most of southeast Texas



Potential Impacts

- Heavy rainfall and gusty winds.
- Street flooding, especially in low-lying areas and areas with poor drainage.

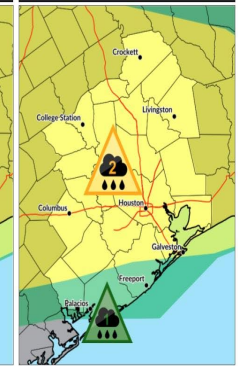

These storms could produce localized heavy rainfall. Slight Risk (level 2 of 4) of Excessive Rainfall on Monday. Marginal (level 1 of 4) to Slight Risk of Excessive Rainfall on Tuesday. Potential Impacts: Heavy rainfall and gusty winds. Street flooding, especially in low-lying areas and areas with poor drainage. Actions: Remain weather-aware and check the forecast for updates! Have multiple ways to receive alerts!

Key Points

Overview

Disturbances rounding the edge of an upper ridge up north will provide lift for several rounds of isolated to scattered rainfall through the week

What We Know:

- Medium to high (40-90%) chances of isolated to scattered showers/storms for much of the area each day this week
- Best odds will generally be south of the I-20 corridor
- Multiple rounds of heavy rainfall may cause localized flash flooding

? What We Still Don't Know:

- Exact rainfall totals?
- Exact coverage and timing?

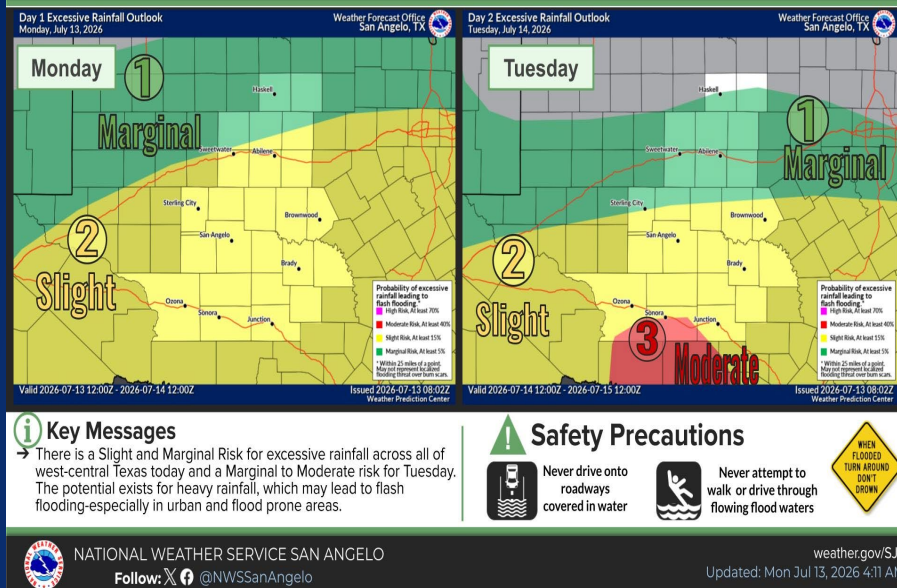

Aside from below normal temperatures, increased rain chances are on tap this week. The potential for occasionally heavy rainfall may pose a risk of localized flooding, especially on Monday and Tuesday.

Excessive Rainfall Outlook Today and Tuesday



Scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop each afternoon and evening through Tuesday. Due to a moisture-rich environment, and slow movement of these storms, some may produce locally heavy rainfall and flooding.

Key Messages

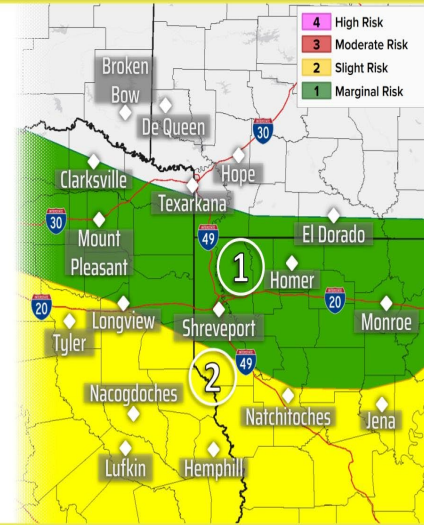
- A Slight Risk for excessive heavy rainfall and flash flooding exists today through tonight for much of East Texas and North Louisiana.

Amounts

- New rain amounts from 1-2 inches with isolated higher totals are possible in the Slight Risk area.

- Stay up to date with the latest forecast. Know what to do if a Flash Flood Warning is issued.

A flash flood risk covers roughly the southern two-thirds of the region today through the evening hours before showers and storms diminish. Localized flash flooding will be possible with slow-moving or training storms that produce heavy rainfall rates of an inch or more per hour.

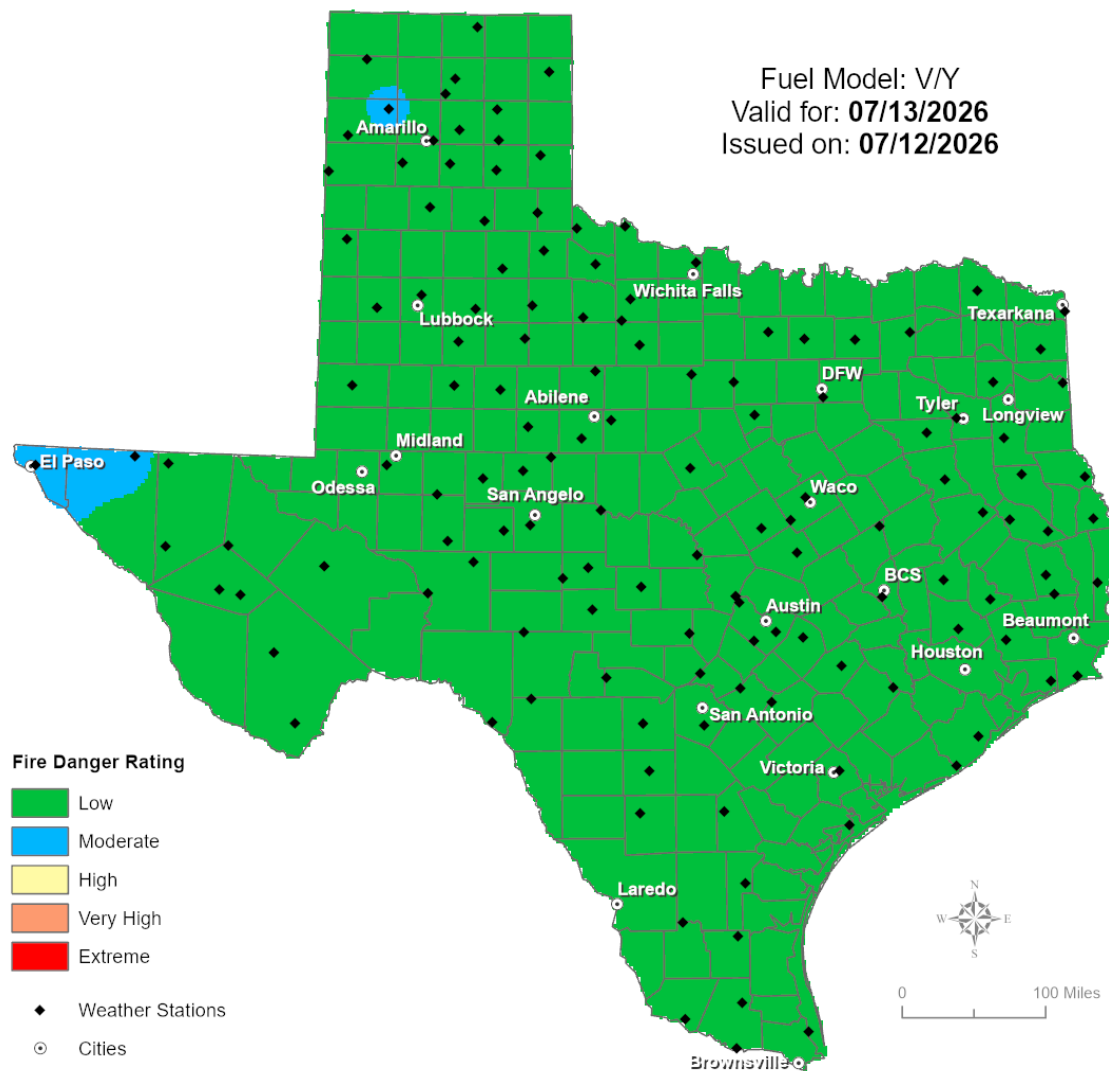

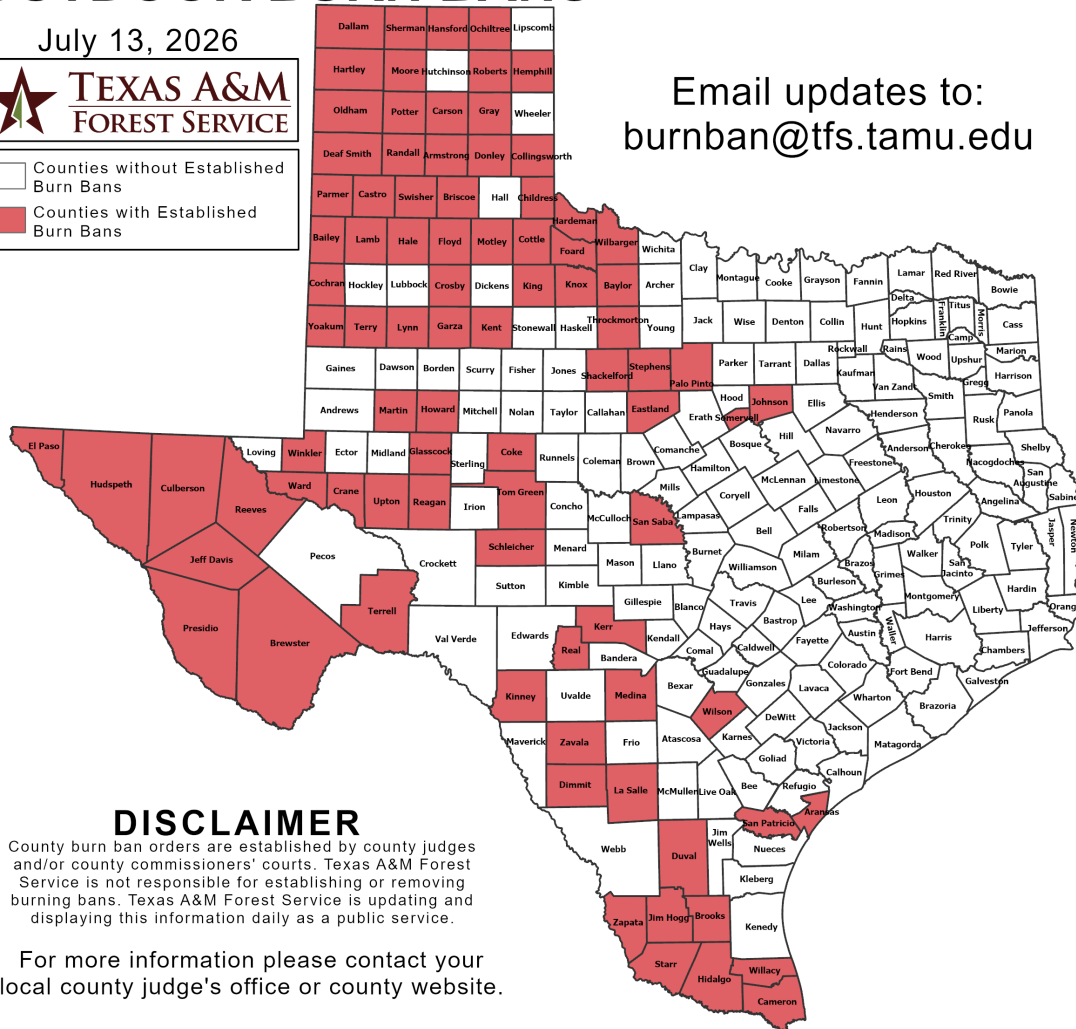

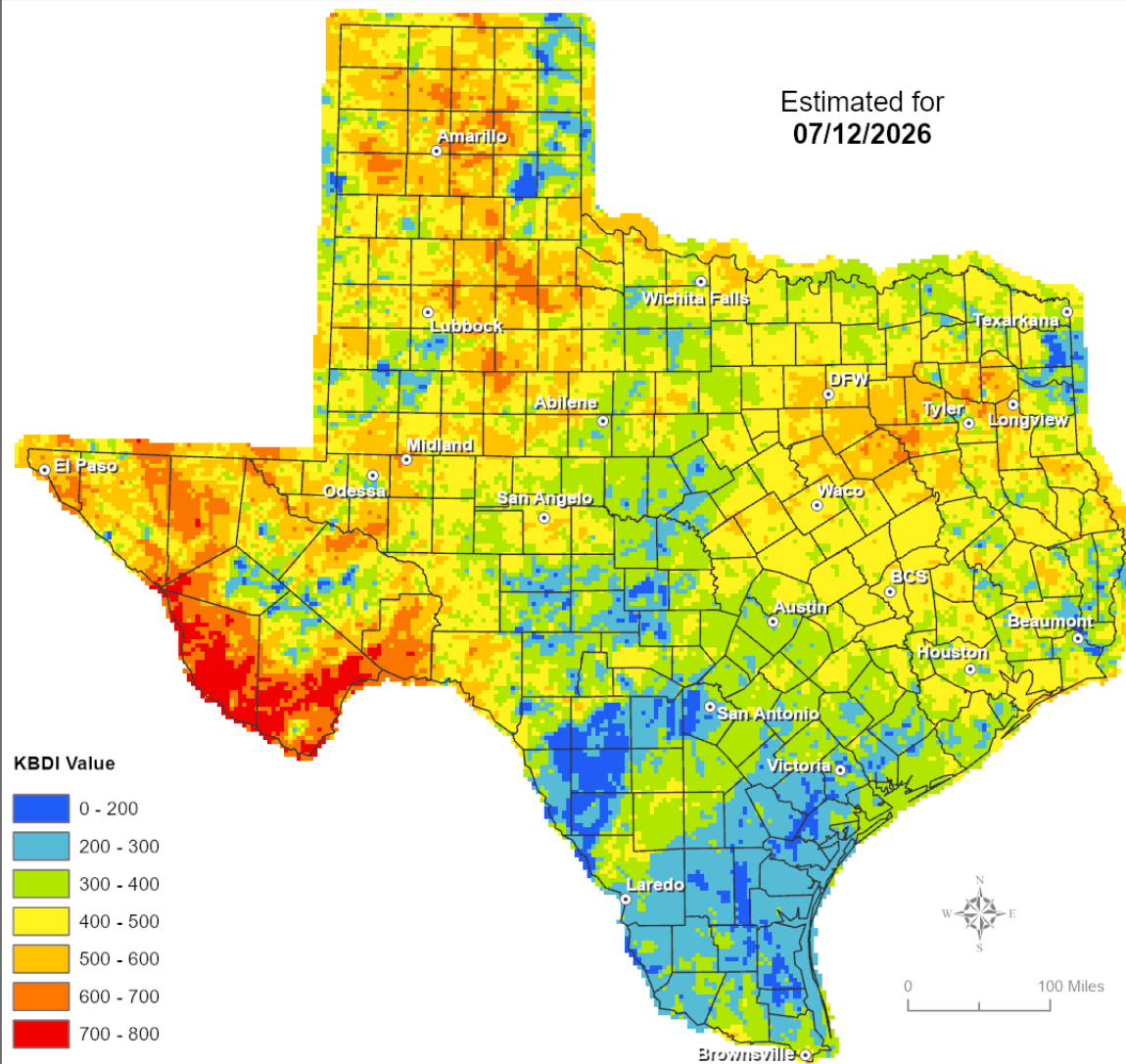

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

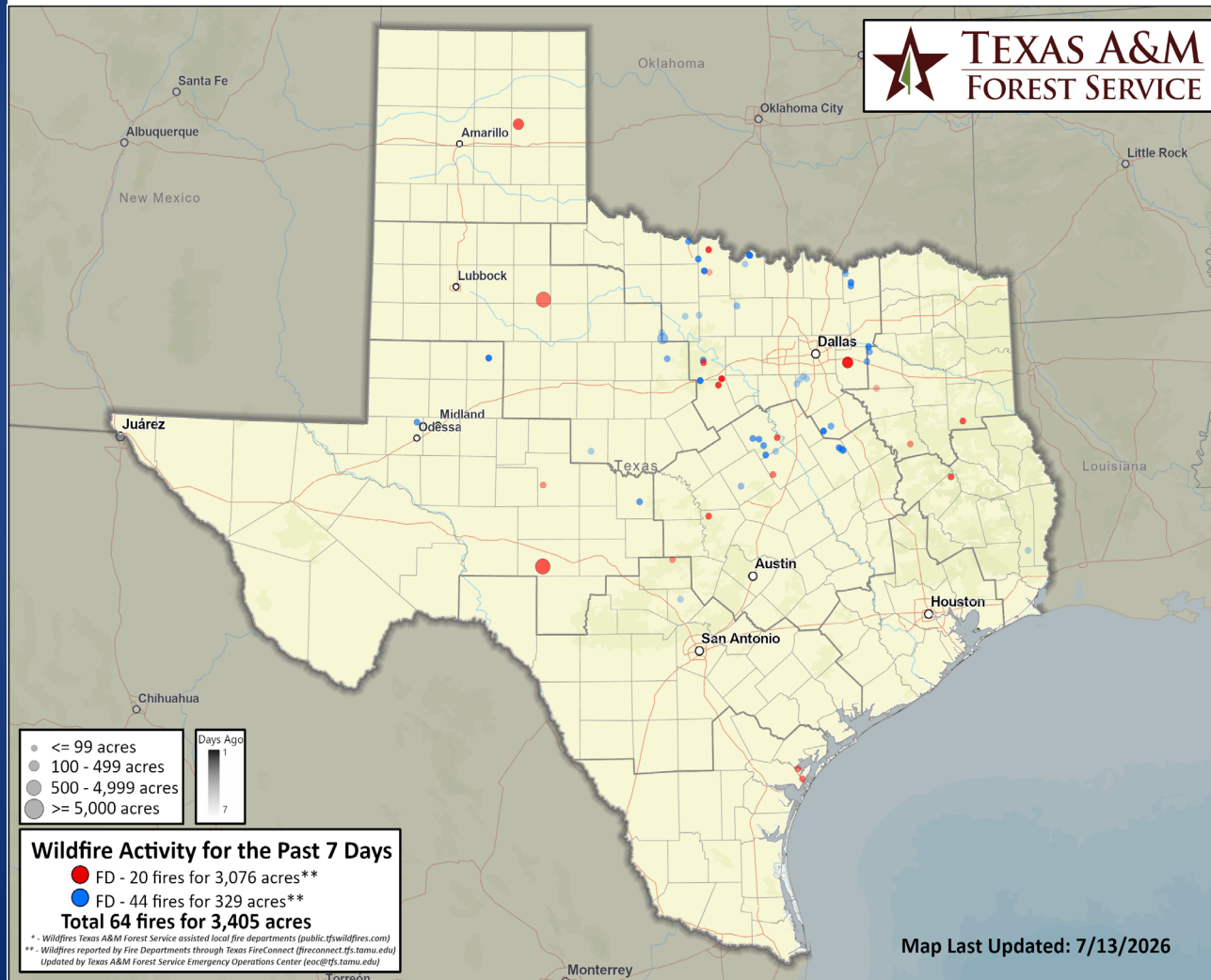
Keetch-Byram Drought Index
