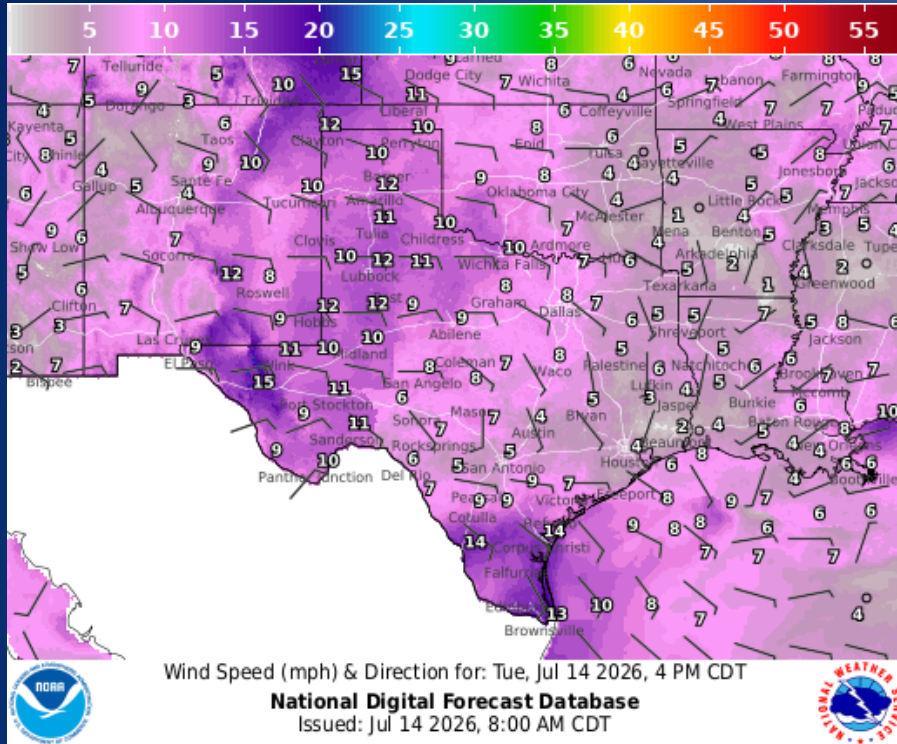

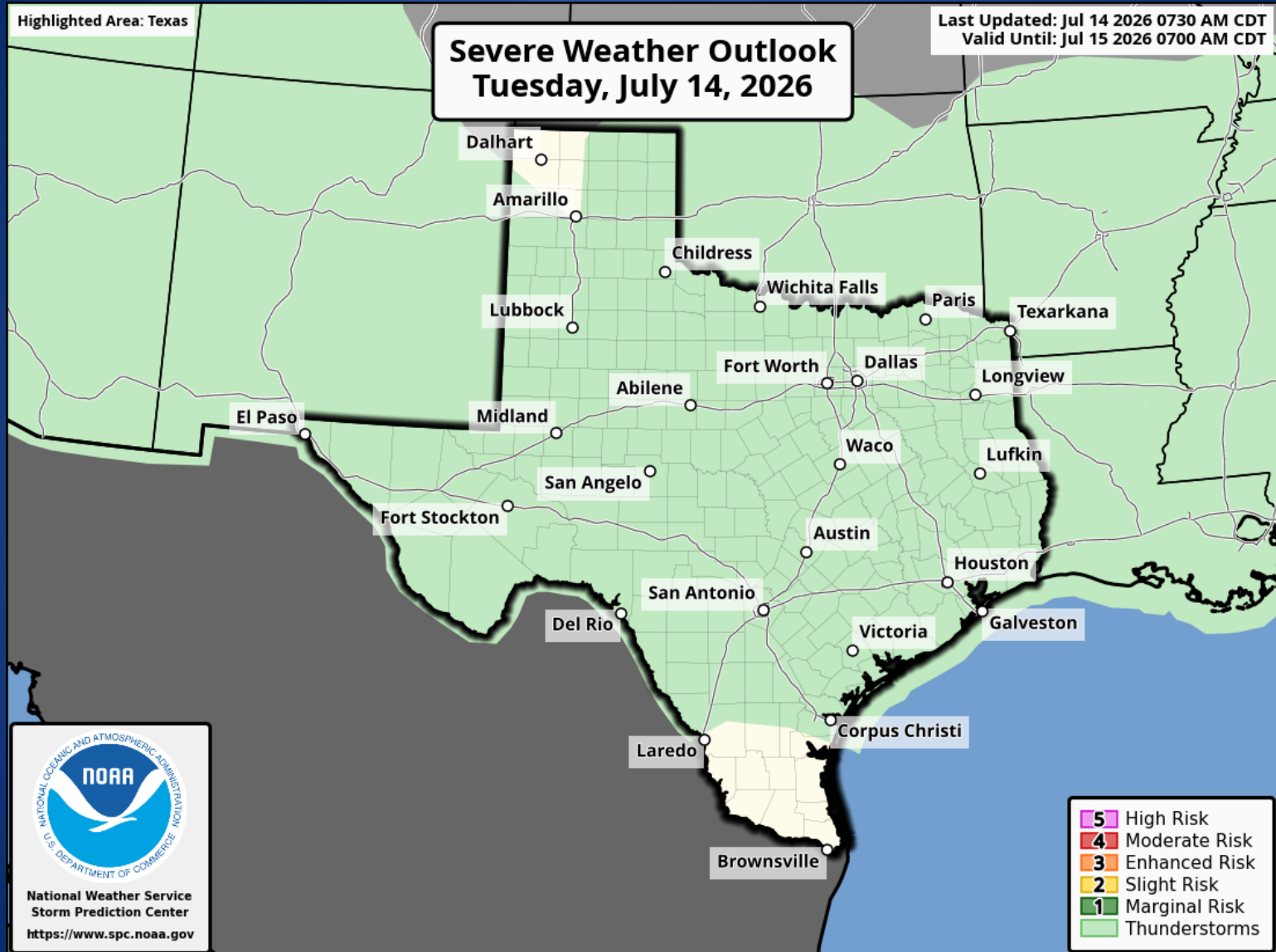

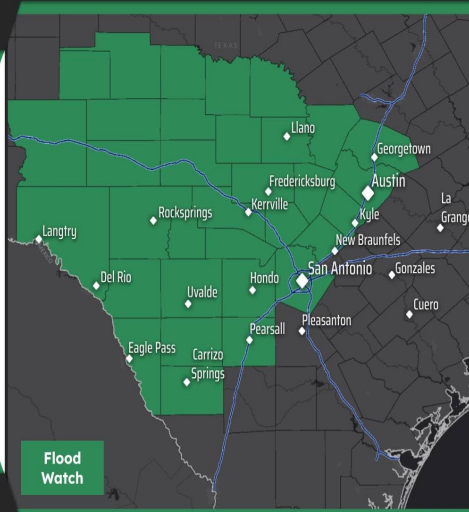
- Life-threatening flooding possible somewhere within the Flood Watch area
- Widespread rain amounts of 2 to 6 inches over most of the watch area
- Isolated pockets of 10 to 15 inches of rain possible over Rio Grande Plains, southern Edwards Plateau, and western Hill Country
- Rivers, creeks, streams, and other low-lying, flood-prone locations could flood quickly

A Flood Watch remains in effect for parts of the Hill Country, I-35 corridor, southern Edwards Plateau, and Rio Grande Plains from now through Thursday evening. There is the potential for life threatening flooding somewhere in the watch area. Storm totals of 2 to 6 inches are possible over the Flood Watch area. Isolated totals of 10 to 15 inches of rain are possible over parts of the Rio Grande Plains, southern Edwards Plateau, and western Hill Country. Stay weather aware and remember to have multiple ways to receive warnings.

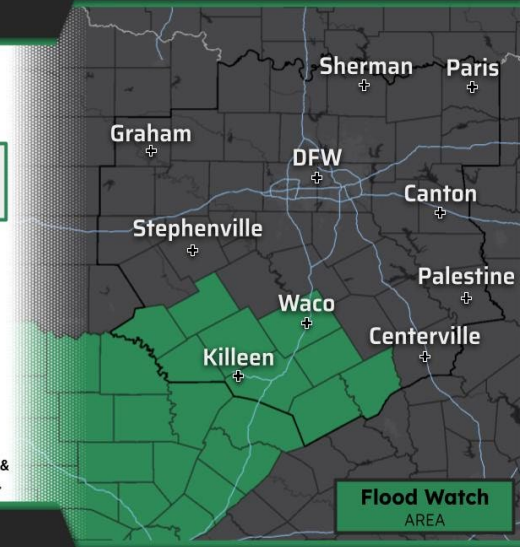

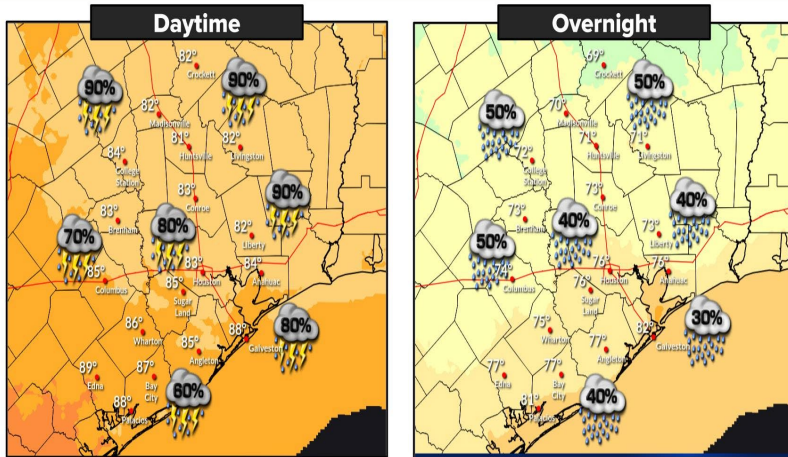

Widespread showers and thunderstorms will persist through much of the morning and afternoon on Tuesday before gradually dissipating through the evening hours Tuesday night. Locally heavy rainfall is possible which could lead to localized street flooding. Daytime highs will stay in the 80s with overnight lows in the 70s.

Drive carefully as wet roads could lead to hydroplaning

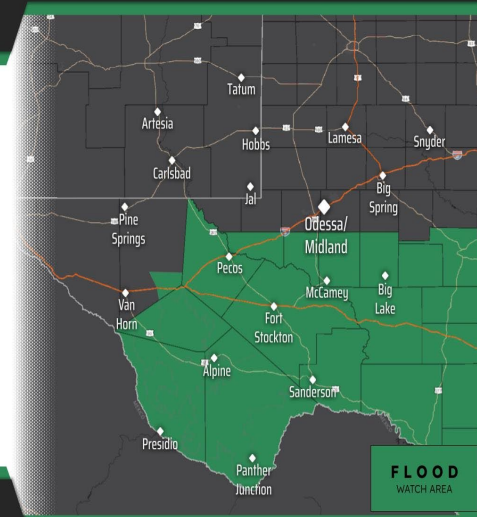

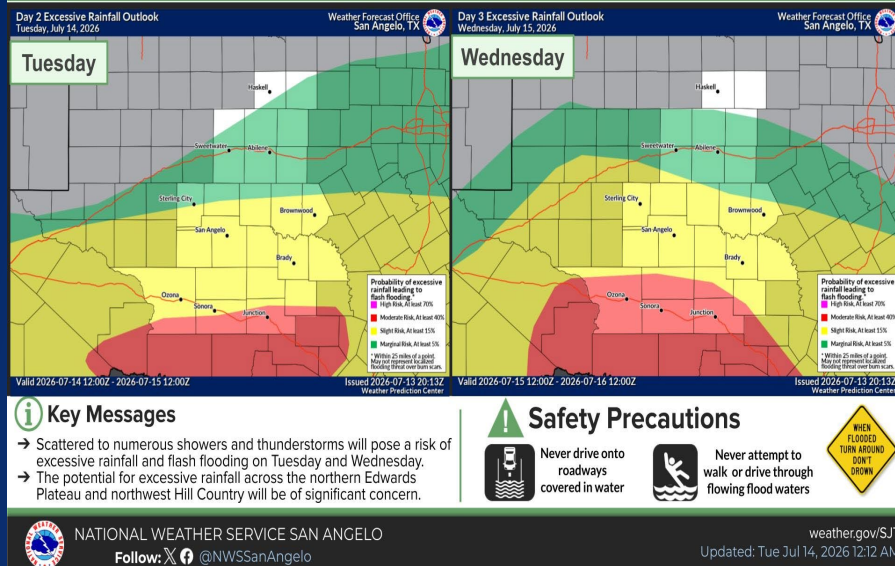

Hazardous Weather

Excessive Rainfall Outlook- Tuesday & Wednesday



Scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms are forecast on Tuesday and Wednesday. These storms will have the potential to produce locally heavy rainfall and flash flooding especially across the northern Edwards Plateau and northwest Hill Country.

- There is a Marginal to Slight Risk for excessive rainfall and flash flooding today through tonight, with Deep East Texas in the Slight Risk area.



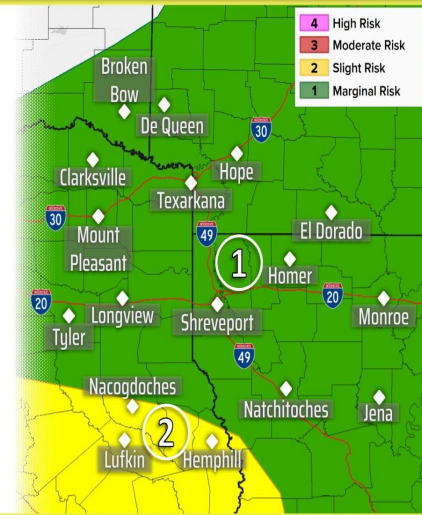
Amounts

There is a Marginal to Slight Risk for excessive rainfall and flash flooding today, with Deep East Texas outlined in the Slight Risk area. Localized flash flooding will be possible with slow-moving or training storms that produce heavy rainfall rates of an inch or more per hour.

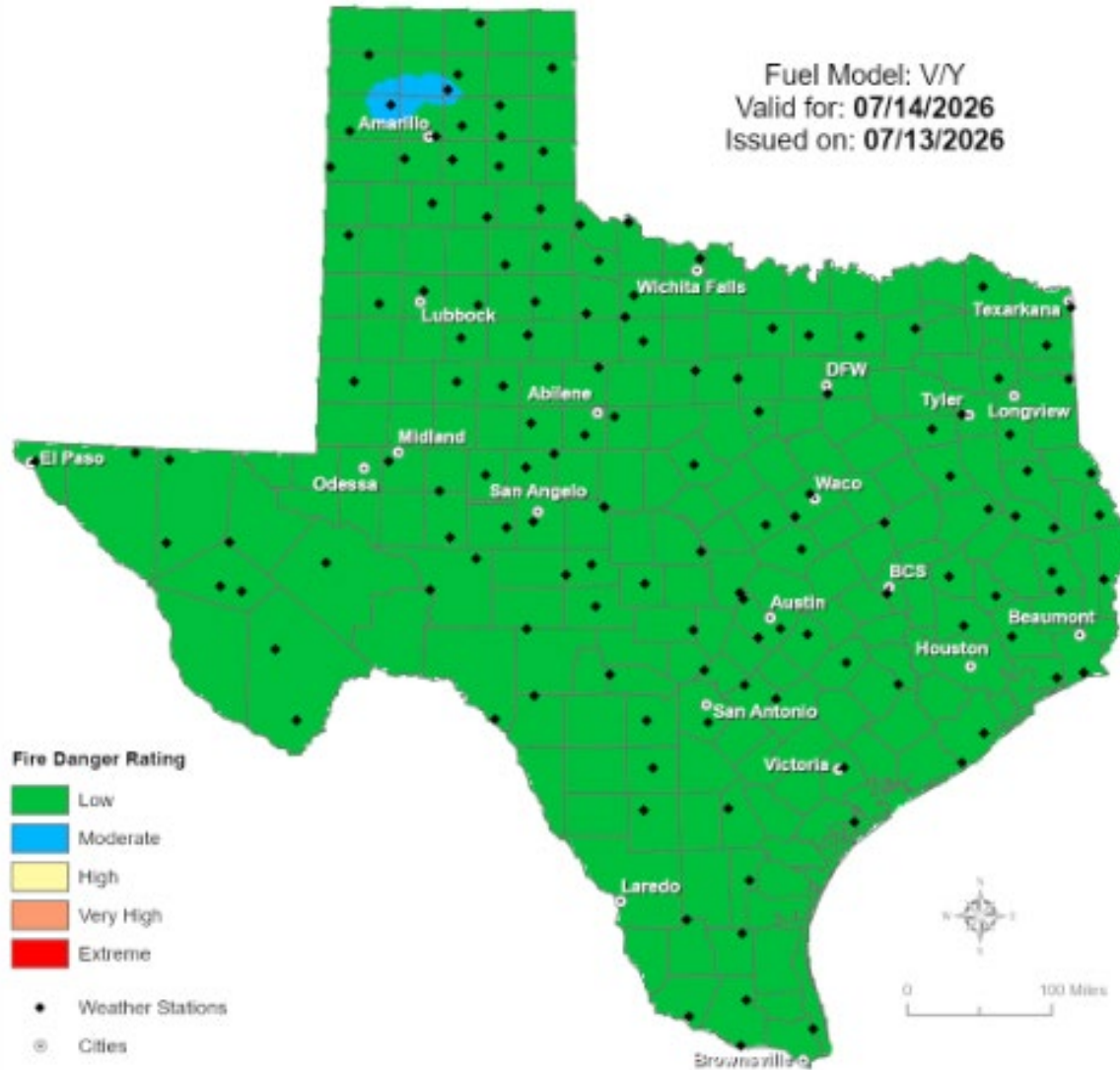

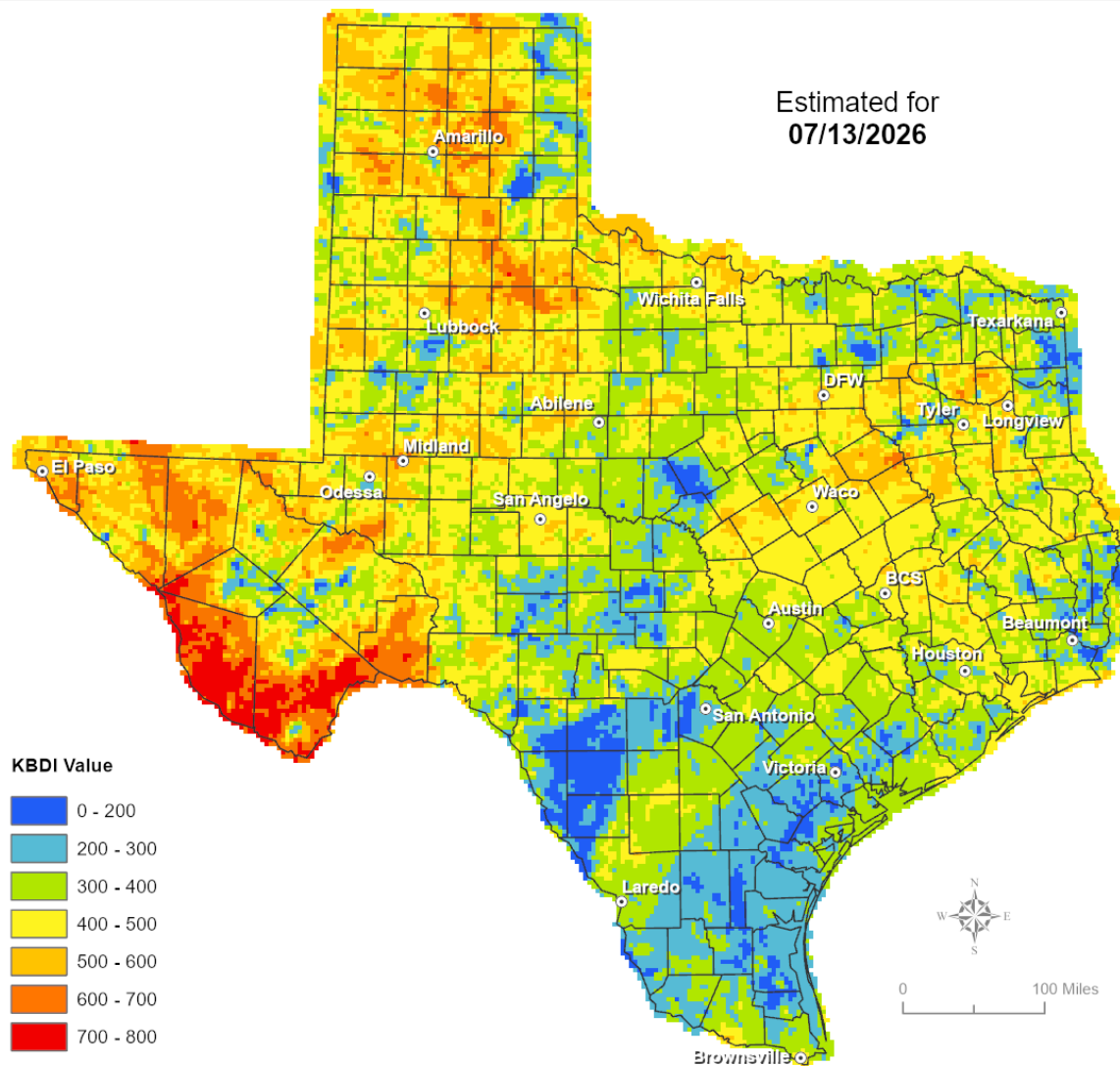

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

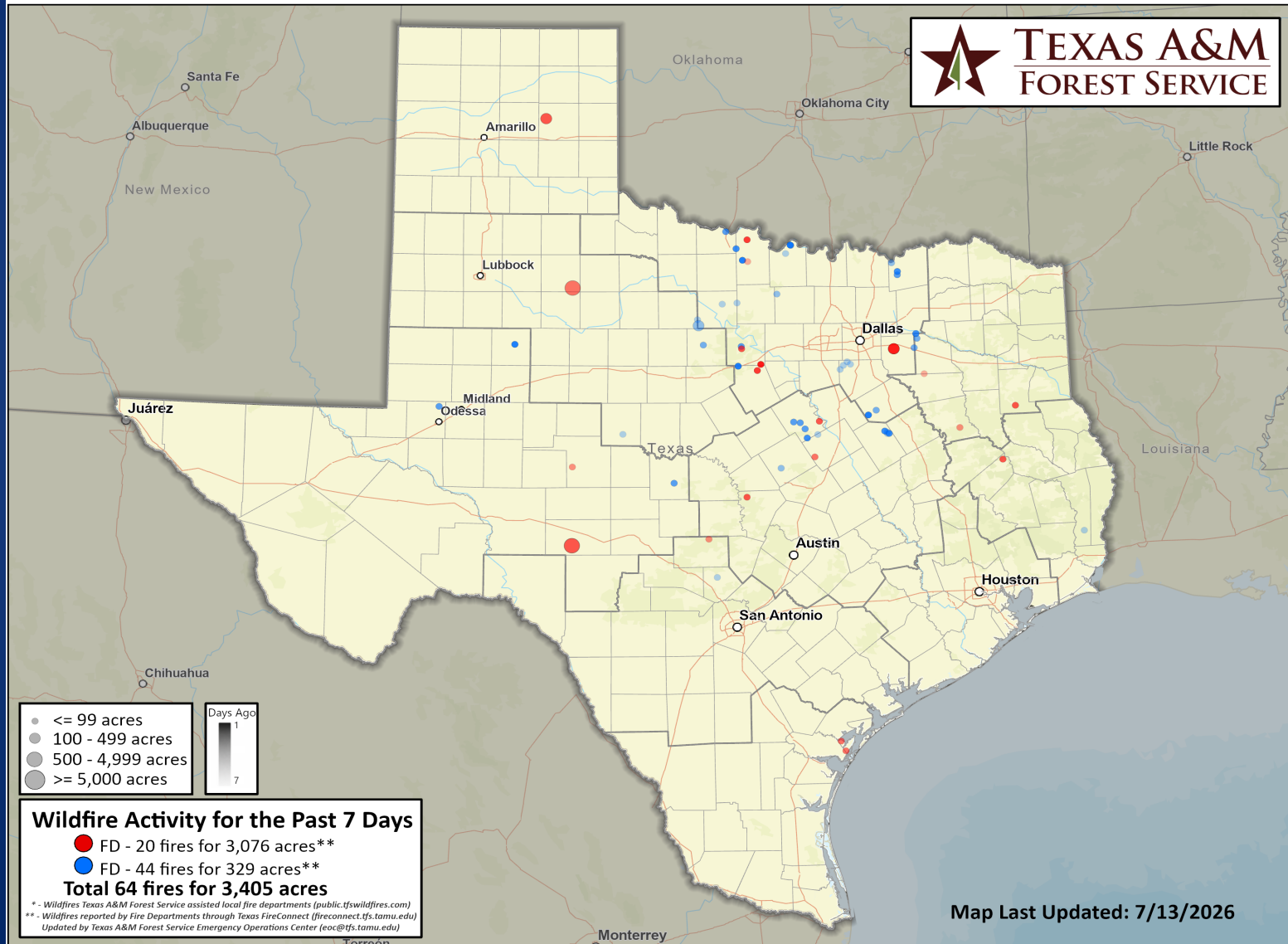
Keetch-Byram Drought Index
