Drive carefully as wet roads could lead to hydroplaning

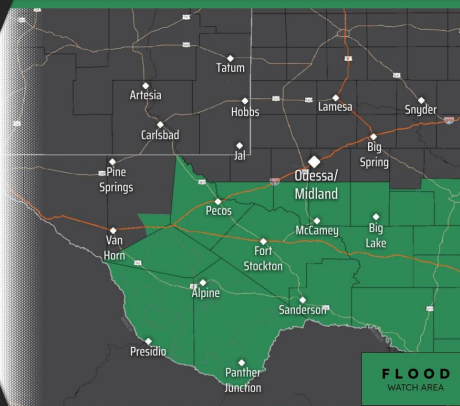

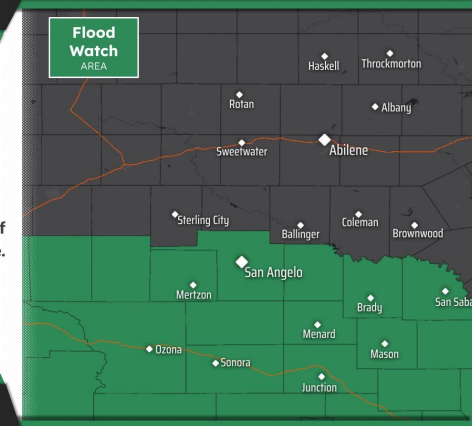
Northern Edwards Plateau, Northwest Hill Country, and southern portions of the Concho Valley and Heartland.

Multiple rounds of slow moving showers and thunderstorms will be capable of producing 4-8" of rainfall. Isolated amounts of 10"+ are also possible.

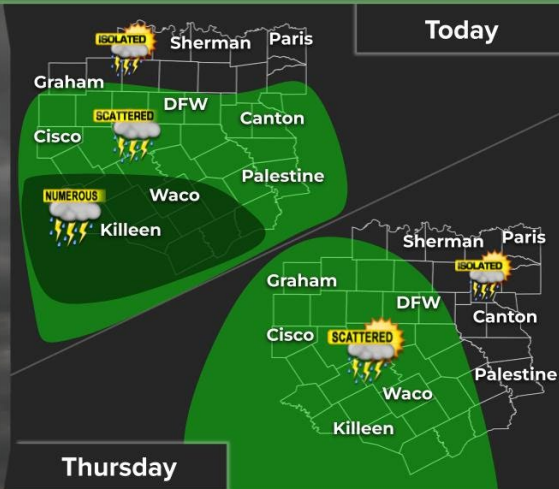
Peak rain coverage will occur through the daytime, gradually decreasing in the evening & overnight.

Most storms will occur during the daytime, with coverage diminishing in the evening and overnight hours. Heavy rain and flooding will be the primary concern, and severe thunderstorms are not expected.

Key Messages

- Heavy rainfall from thunderstorms today and this evening could lead to ponding of water in low-lying and poor drainage areas.



Amounts

- Localized heavy rainfall amounts could exceed an inch or more in a short period of time.

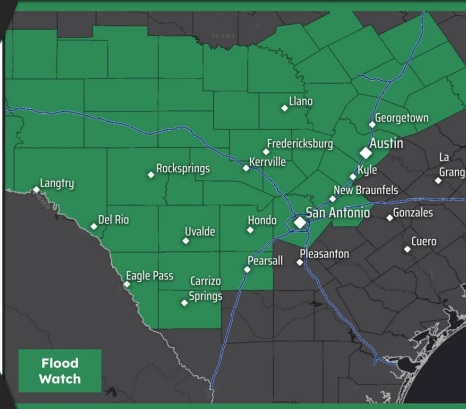


Edwards Plateau

- Life-threatening flooding possible somewhere within the Flood Watch area
- Considerable to locally catastrophic flash flooding of creeks, streams, and other low-lying, flood-prone likely locations across the Rio Grande Plains, southern Edwards Plateau, and U.S. 90 corridor
- ◆ Pockets of 10 to 20 inches of rainfall in this area
- Additional rain amounts of 2 to 6 inches possible elsewhere

A Flood Watch remains in effect for parts of the Hill Country, I-35 corridor, southern Edwards Plateau, and Rio Grande Plains through Thursday evening. There is the potential for life threatening flooding somewhere in the watch area. There is a Level 4 of 4 Risk (High) for flooding rain (today) for portions of the U.S. 90 corridor, west of San Antonio - including the southern Edwards Plateau and Rio Grande. Considerable to locally catastrophic flash flooding impacts likely in this region. Pockets of an additional 10-20 inches of rain in this region are possible. Storm totals across the rest of the area under the Flood Watch of 2 to 6 inches are possible. Stay weather aware and remember to have multiple ways to receive warnings.

Locally Heavy Rainfall Likely



Key Messages

- Another round of scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms is expected to develop Wednesday morning into the early/mid afternoon hours.
- Locally heavy downpours are expected with the strongest storms.
- **Slight Risk (level 2 of 4)** of Excessive Rainfall for most of southeast Texas, including the Houston Metro area.
- **Marginal Risk (level 1 of 4)** of Excessive Rainfall for far eastern areas.
- Additional rainfall totals of 1-3".



Impacts

- Locally heavier thunderstorms capable of heavy rain & gusty winds.
- Street flooding, especially in low-lying areas and areas with poor drainage.



Actions

- Have multiple ways to receive alerts!
- Remain weather-aware and stay tuned for forecast updates!

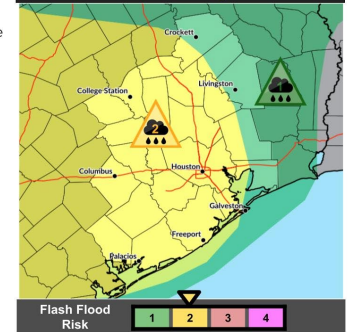

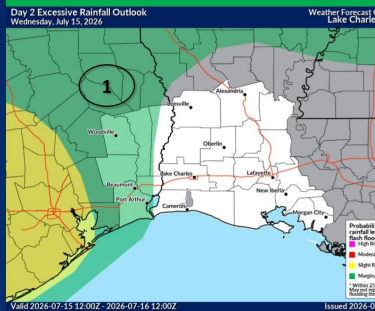

Marginal Risk (level 1 of 4) of Excessive Rainfall for far eastern areas. Additional rainfall totals of 1-3". Potential Impacts: Heavy rainfall and gusty winds. Street flooding, especially in low-lying areas and areas with poor drainage. Actions: Remain weather-aware and check the forecast for updates! Have multiple ways to receive alerts!

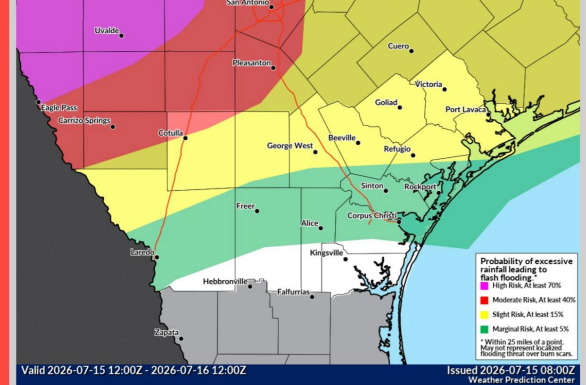

Lingering tropical-like moisture from the Gulf will continue to interact with a stalled frontal boundary and a weakness aloft to produce showers and thunderstorms, especially across southeast Texas. These storms will have the potential to produce high rainfall rates. Clogged drainage ditches and urban areas may result in flash flooding due to a high volume of rainfall in a short period of time.

Heavy rainfall could result in flash flooding tonight through Wednesday. The Weather Prediction Center has placed portions of South Texas in a Slight risk (>15%) for heavy rainfall across northern counties from Victoria Crossroads to La Salle county, with a small portion of La Salle county in a moderate risk (>40%), and a portion of southern counties in a Marginal Risk (5%) for flash flooding. Please make sure you have multiple ways to receive weather warnings and be prepared to take an alternate route. Turn Around Don't Drown.

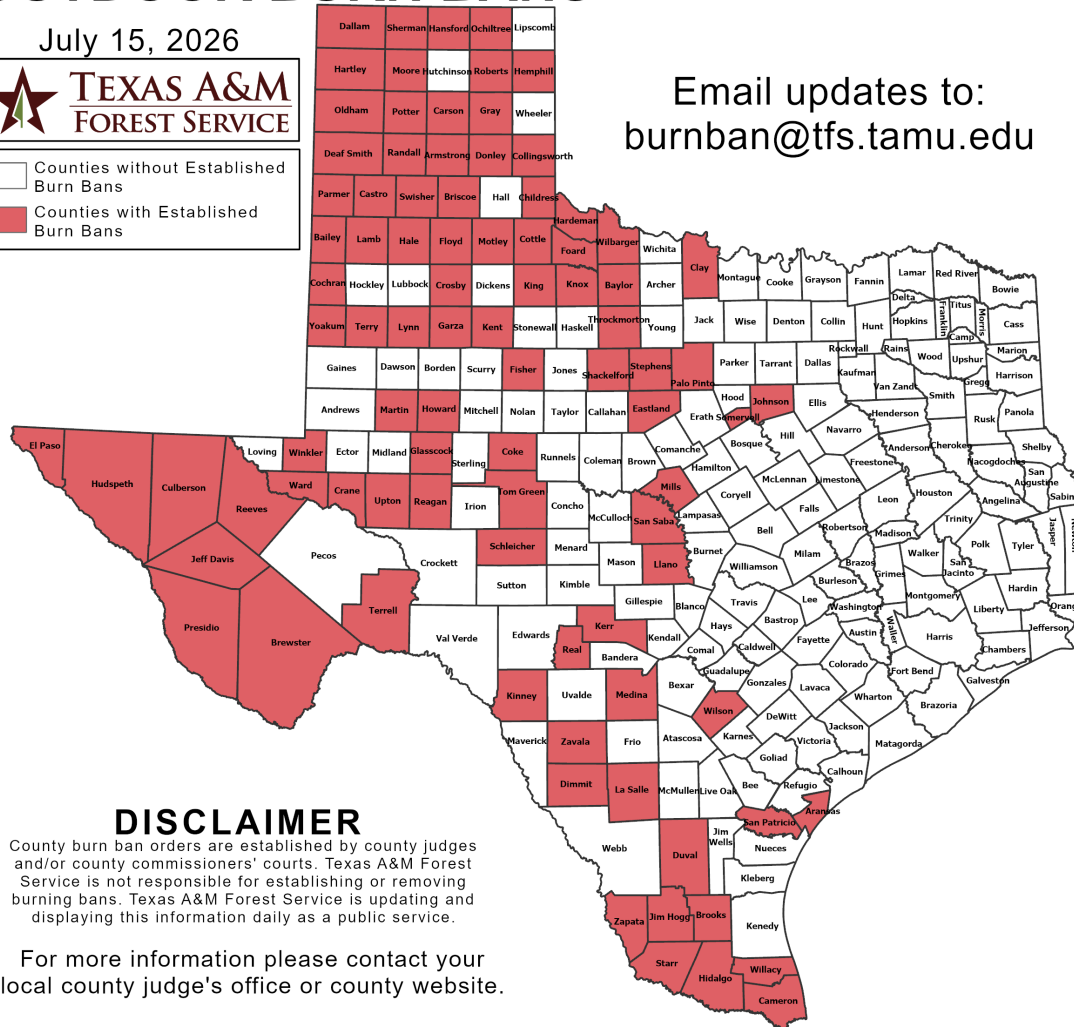

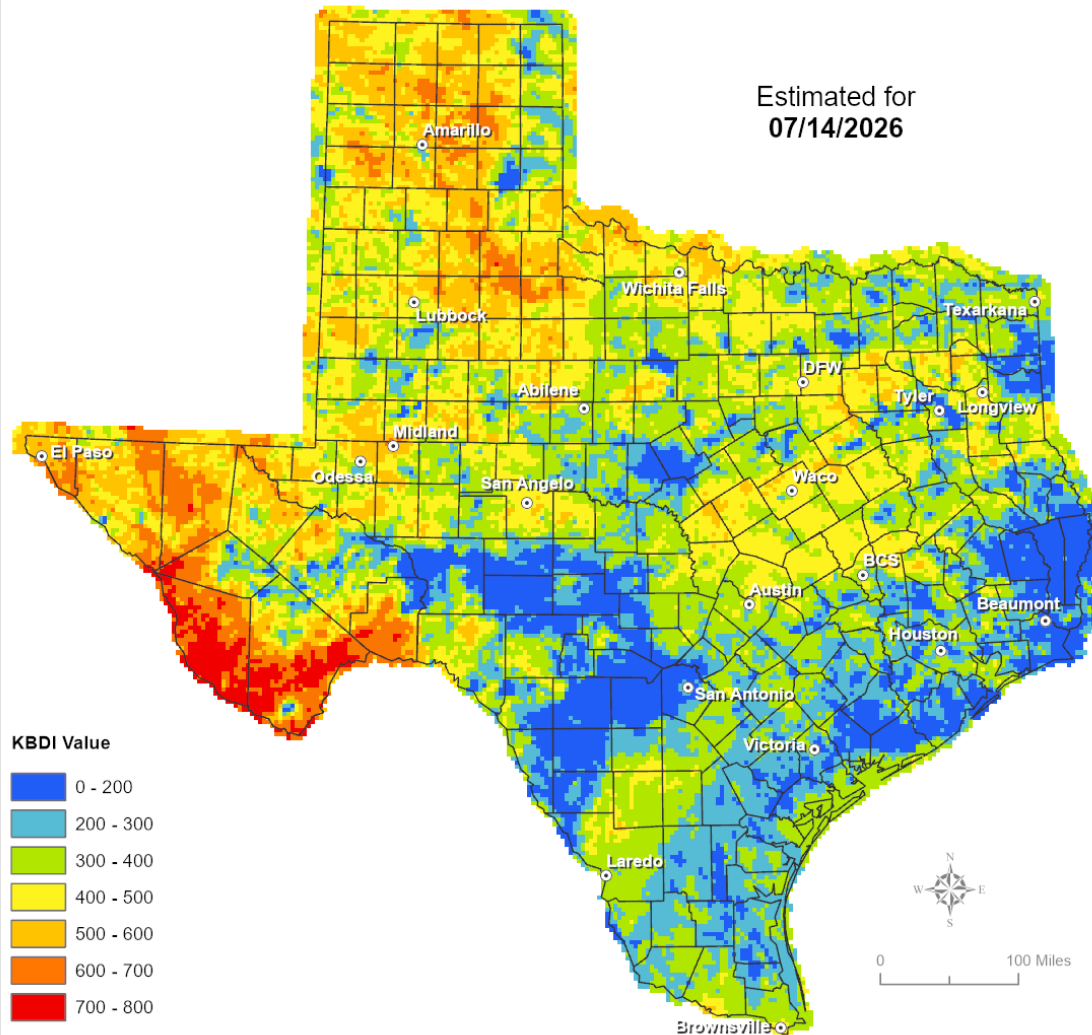

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

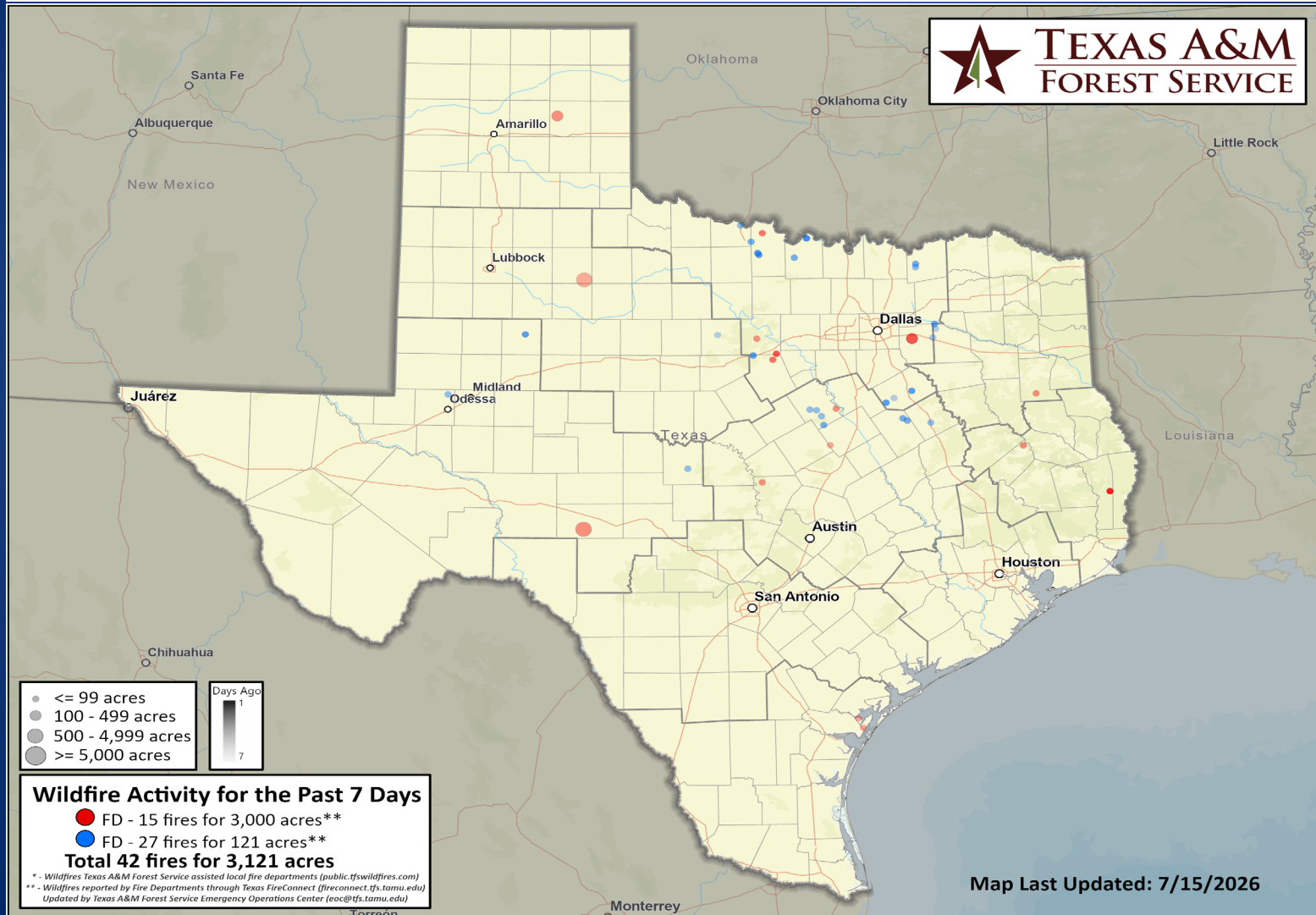
