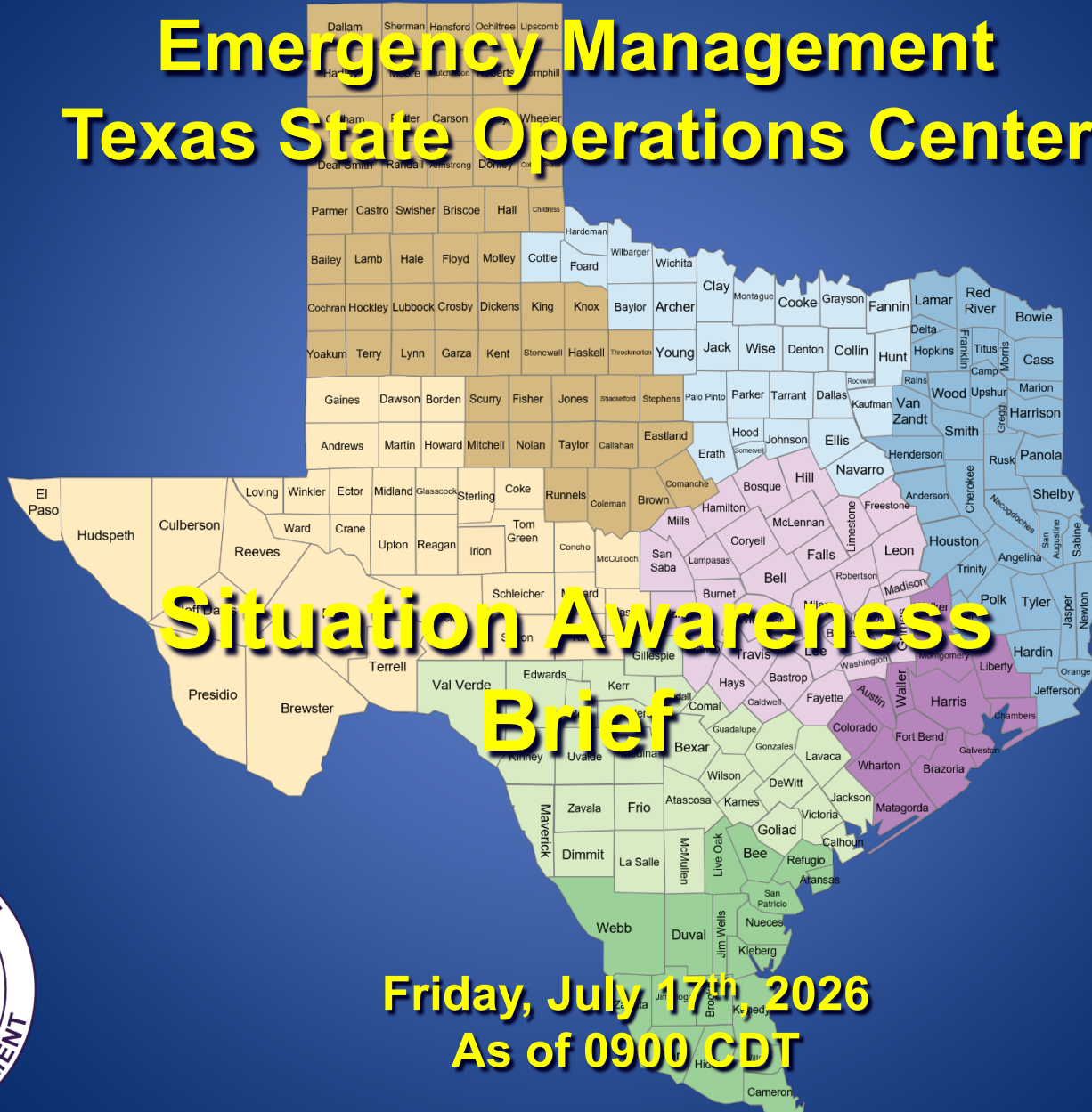

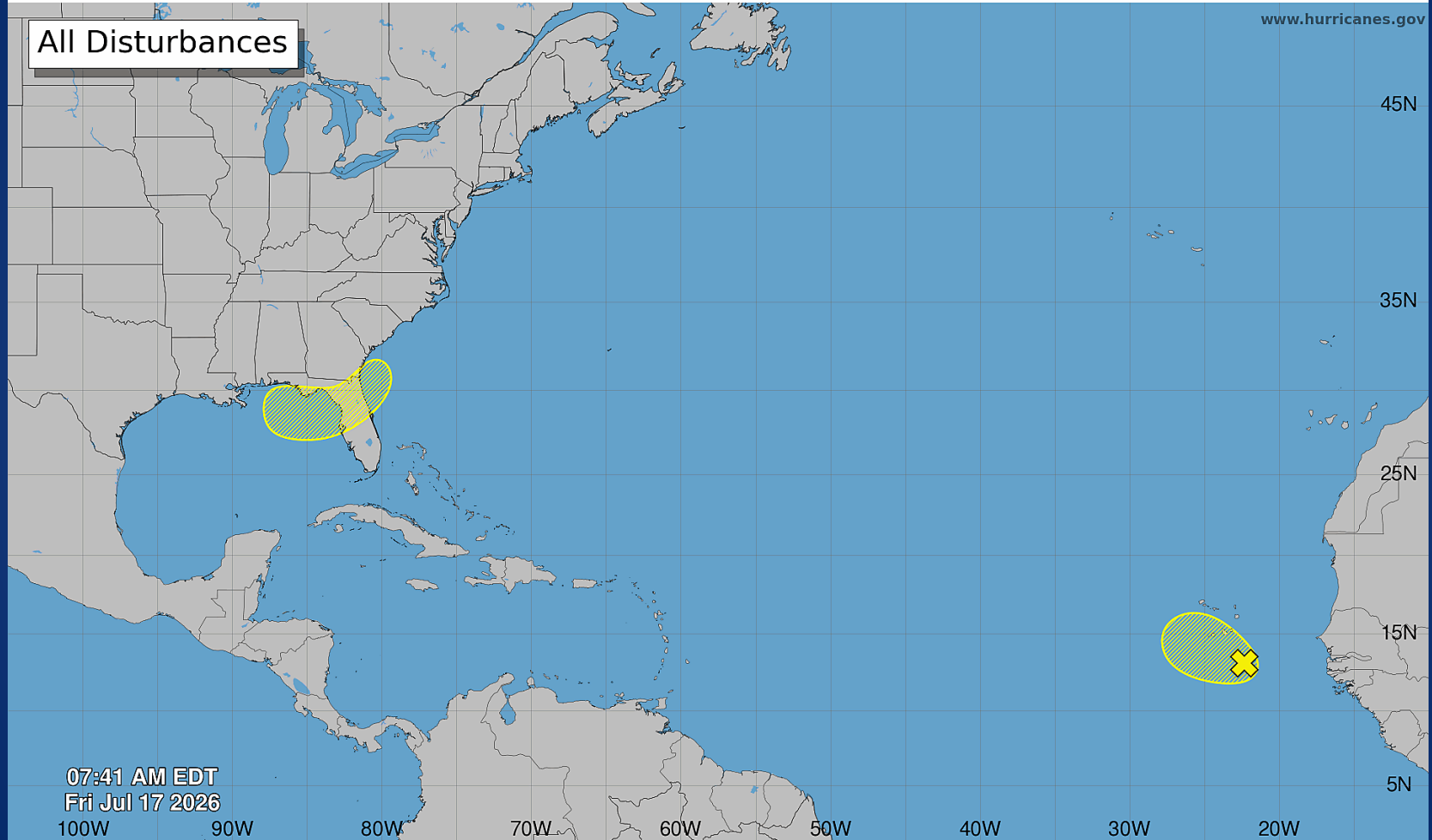
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

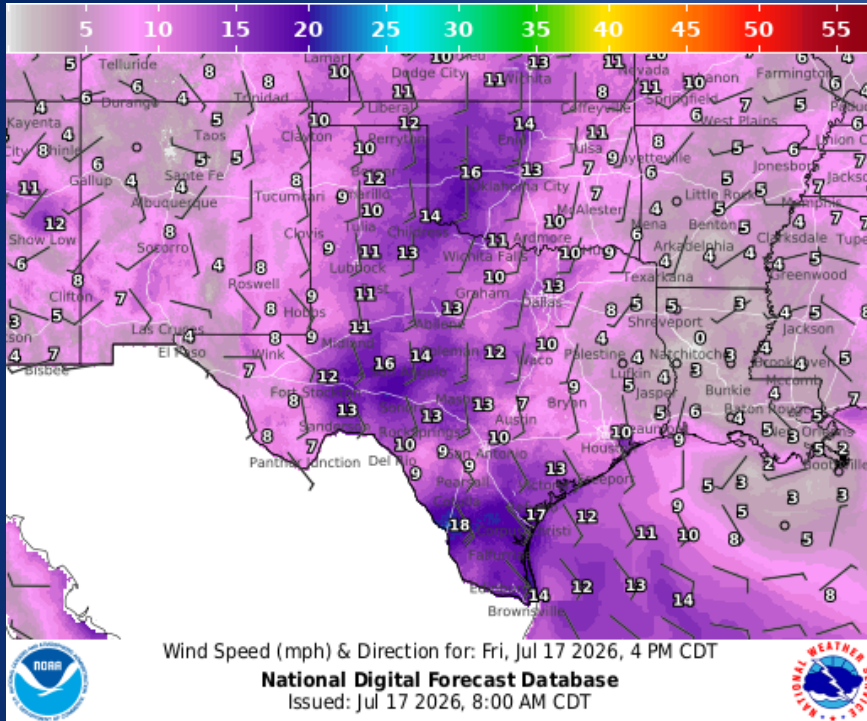

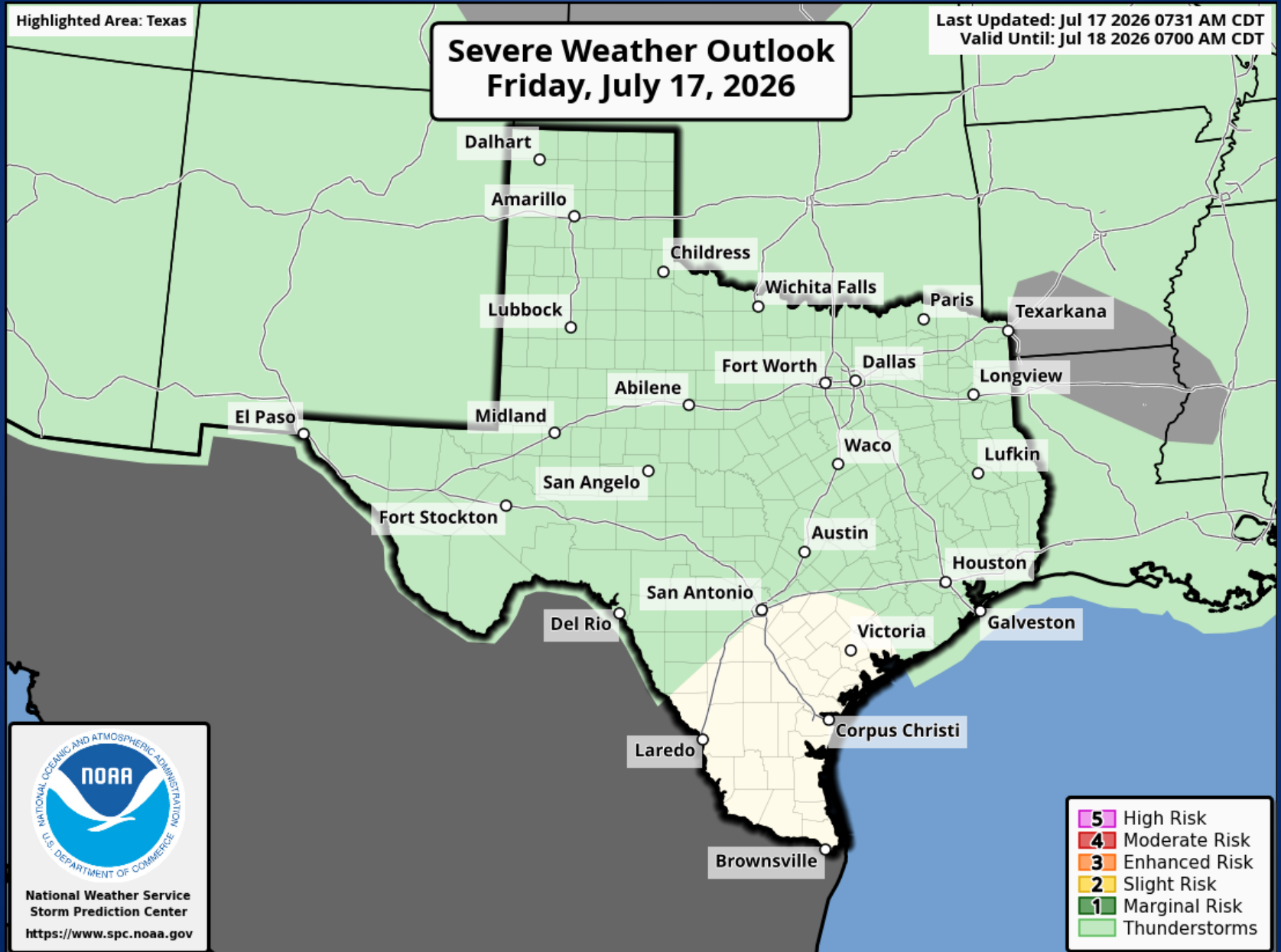

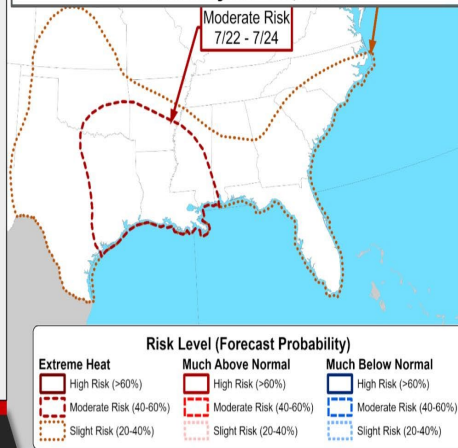

Forecast Key Messages

- Building high pressure will bring warming temperatures through early next week.
- There is a Moderate Risk (40-60%) of Extreme Heat across the region by the middle of next week.

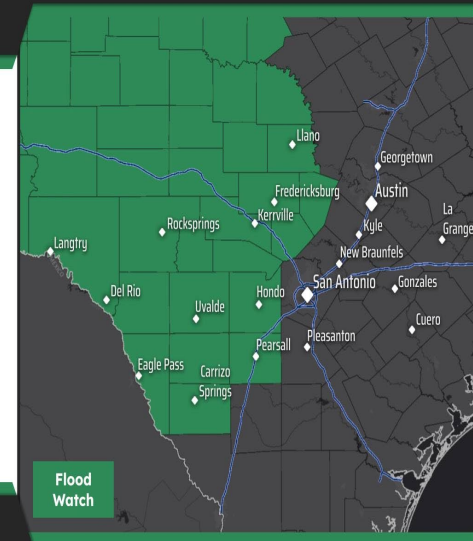


- Life-threatening flooding possible somewhere within the Flood Watch area

A Flood Watch remains in effect for parts of the Hill Country, southern Edwards Plateau, and Rio Grande Plains through noon Friday. New rainfall of 2 to 4 inches are totals of up to an isolated amount of 8 inches is possible in this region. Stay weather aware and remember to have multiple ways to receive warnings.

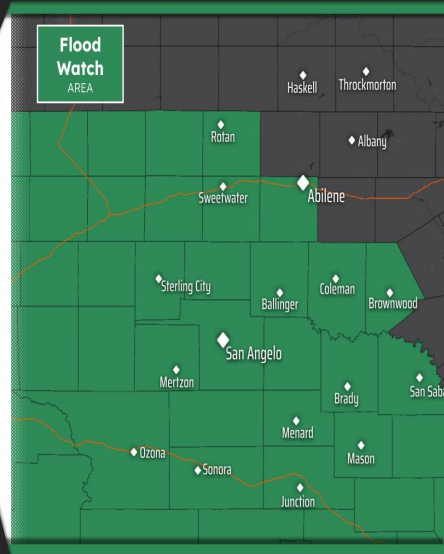

Heavy rainfall rates combined with slow moving showers and thunderstorms will result in favorable conditions for flash flooding to develop. Rainfall totals of 4-8" with locally higher amounts of 10"+ being possible.

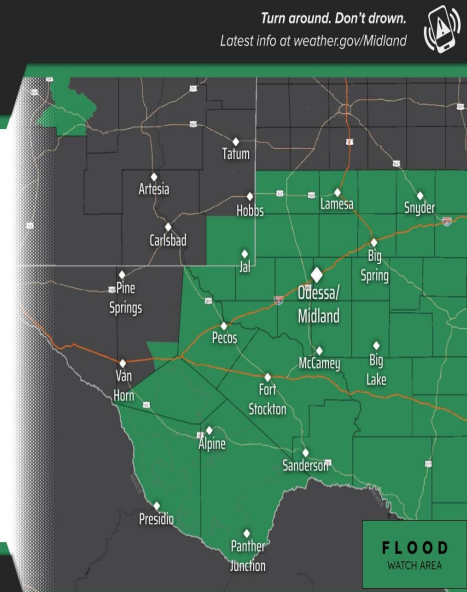

A Flood Watch remains in effect for much of west Texas, as well as portions of southeastern New Mexico through early this evening. Additional rounds of showers/storms will move into the area as an upper level system slowly moves westward. Heavy rainfall could lead to areas of flash flooding.

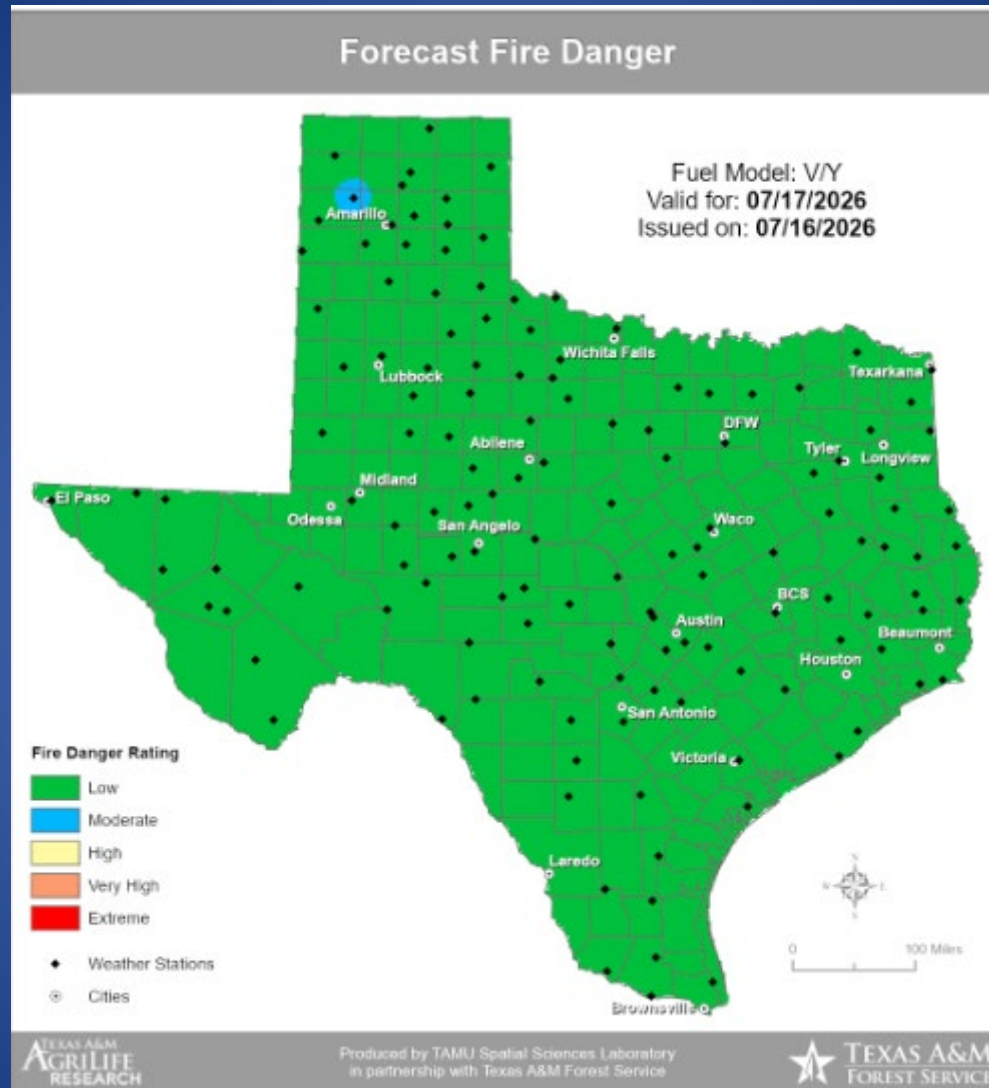

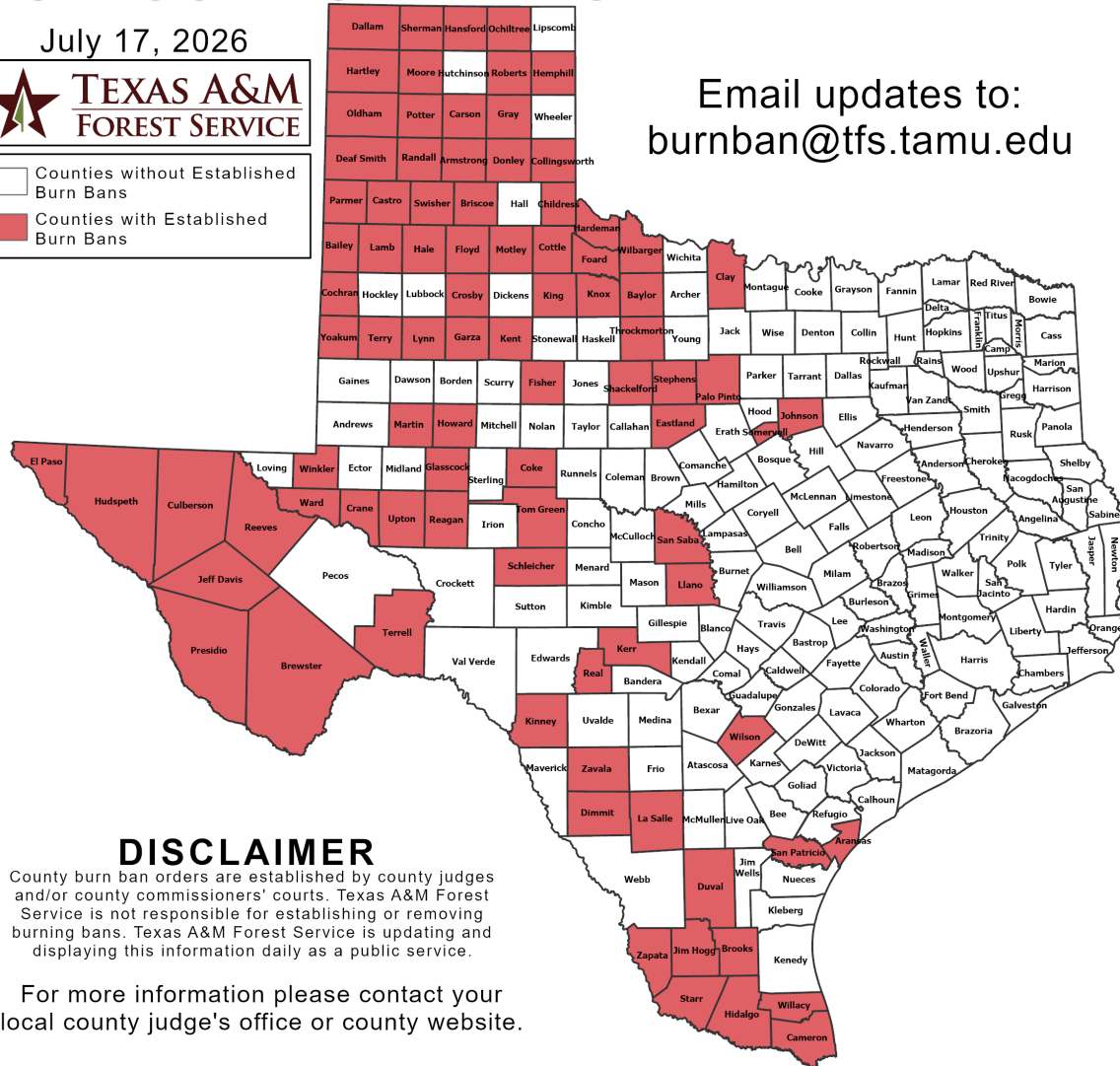

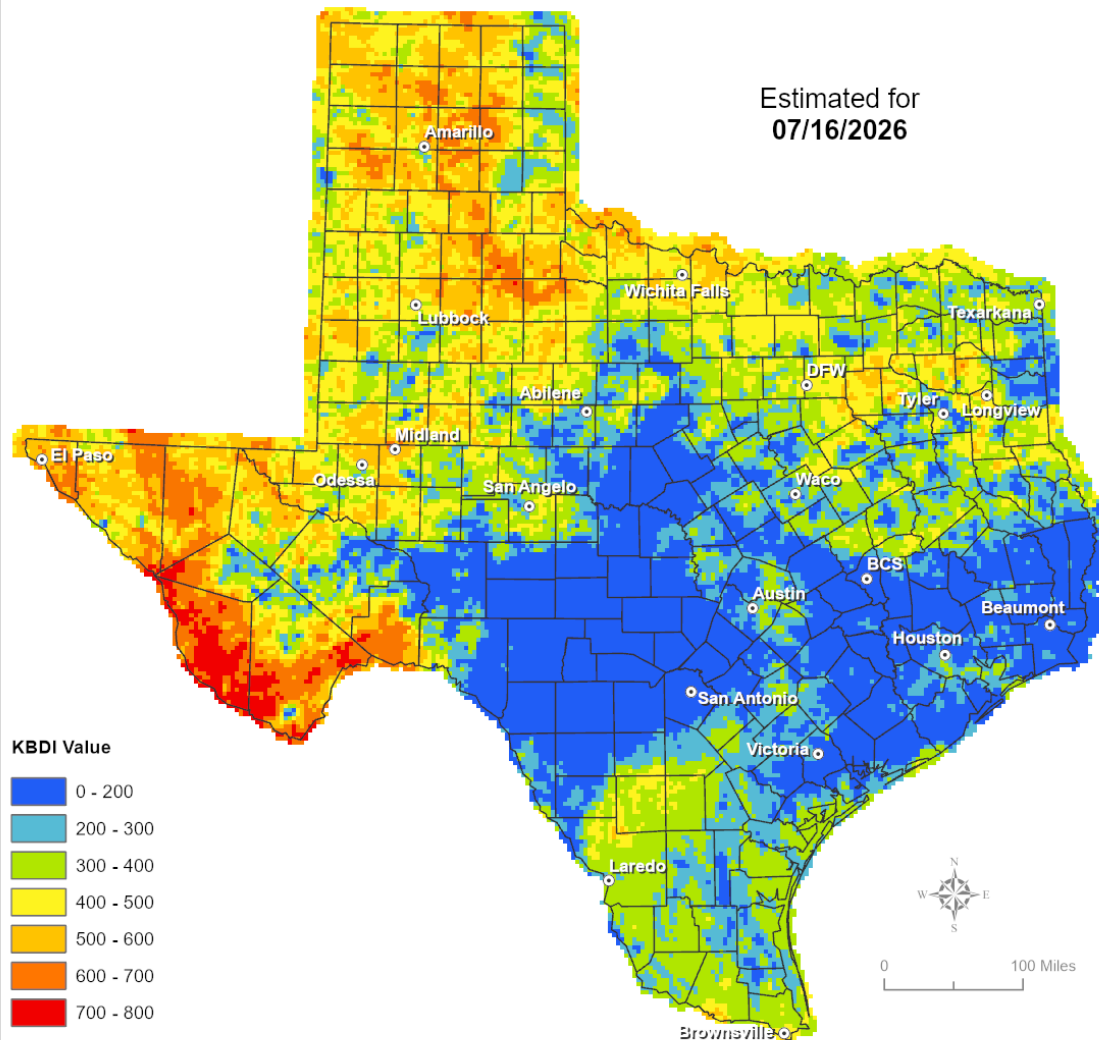

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

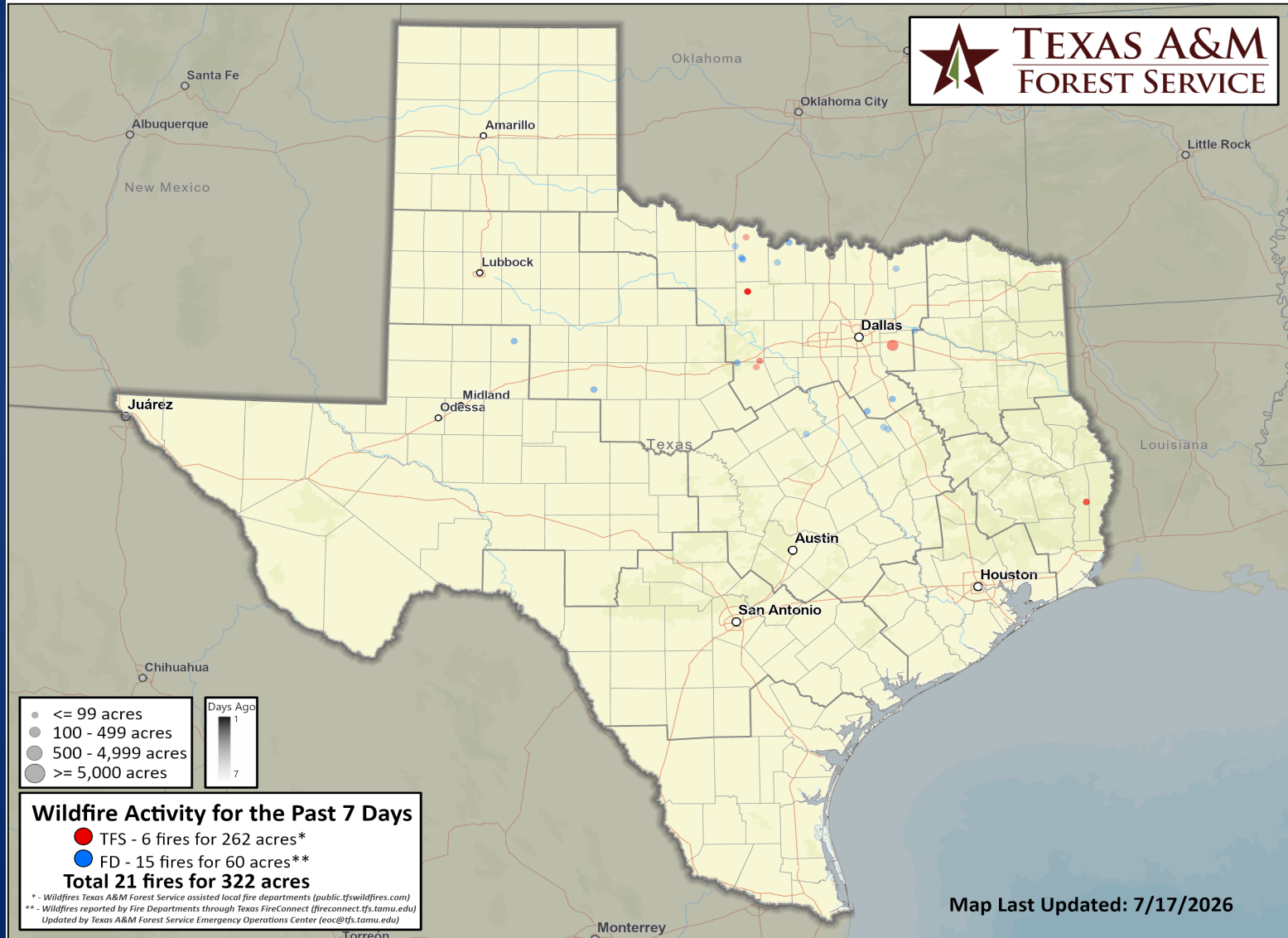
