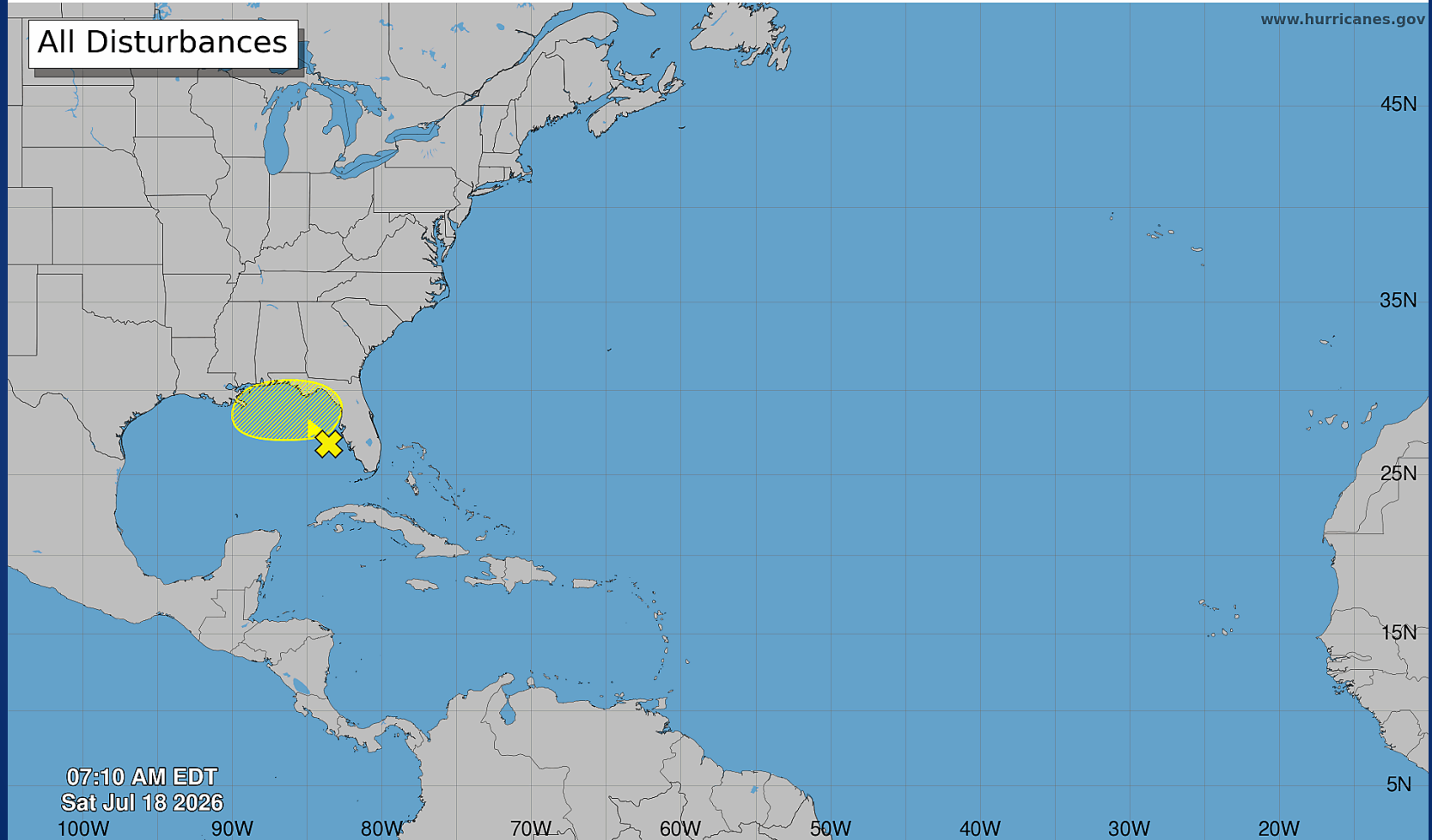
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

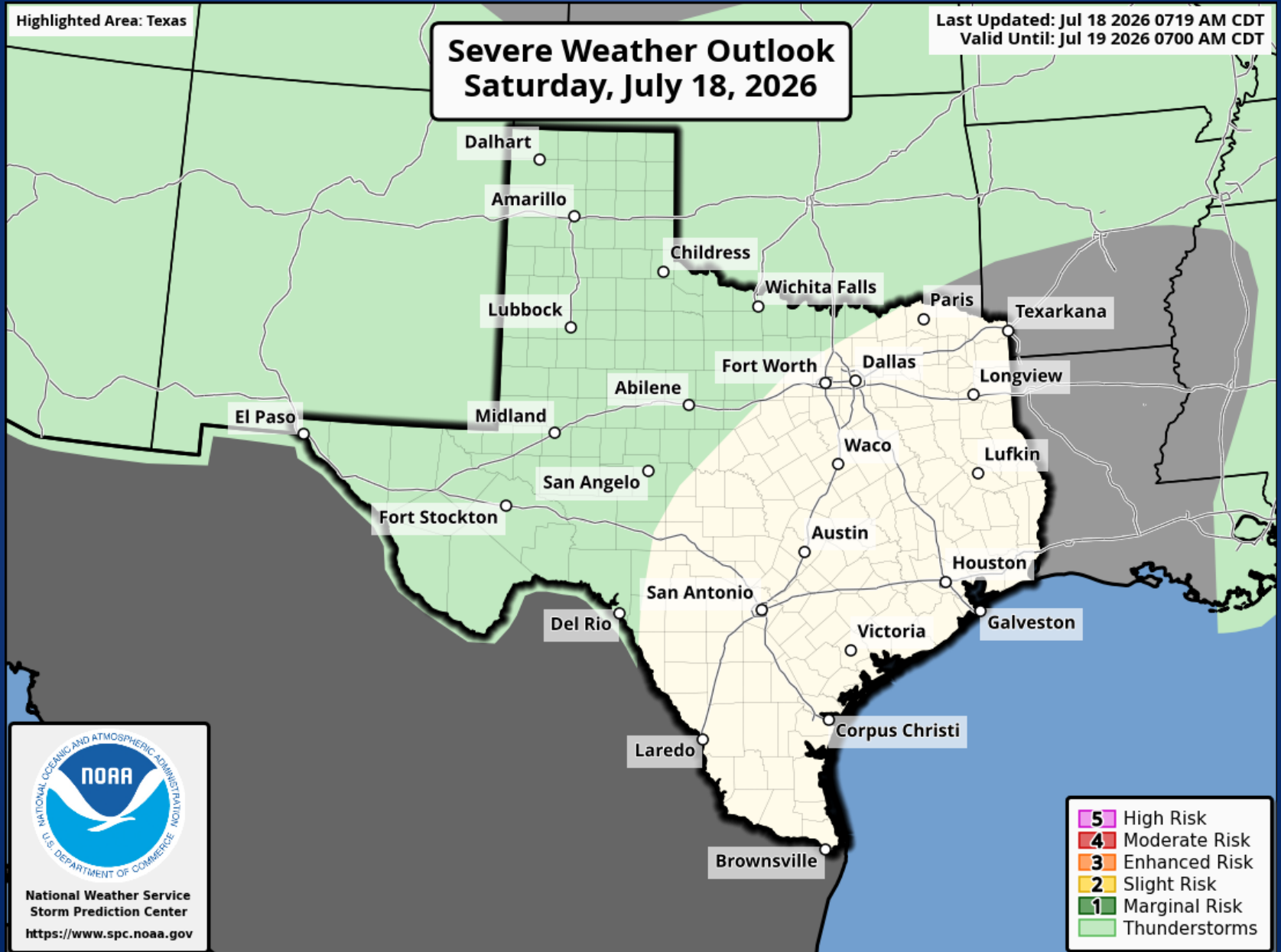

San Saba River Flooding near San Saba- MINOR

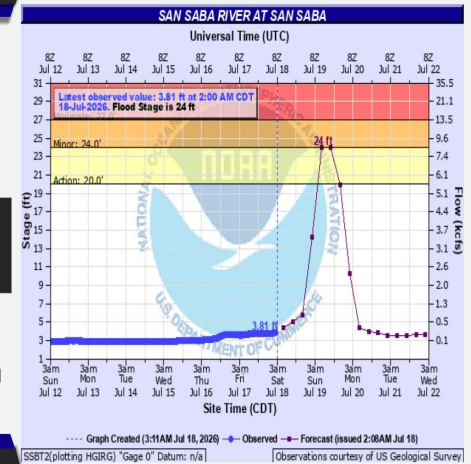
Conditions:

Current Level: 3.8 ft (As of 1:00 AM Saturday).
River Trend: a rapid rise is expected to start Saturday evening, with a crest near 24 feet Sunday morning.

Minor Flood: 24 ft

The river will rise above minor flood stage Saturday evening and crest early Sunday morning. This flood crest is similar to the flood of 10/14/1959. Please stay tuned for the latest updates on the San Saba River near San Saba.

Llano River Flooding near Mason-MINOR

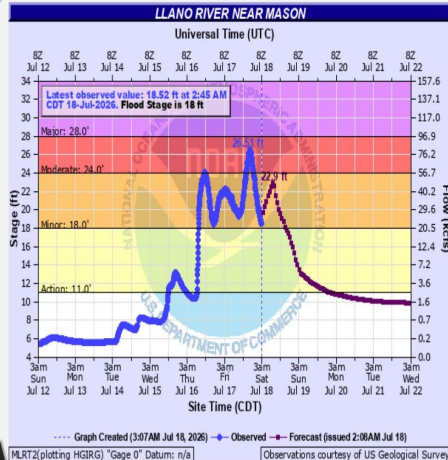
Conditions:

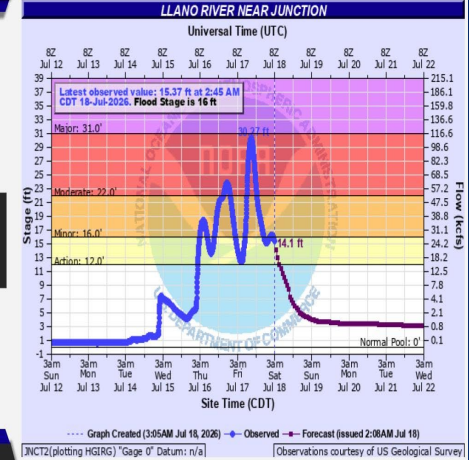

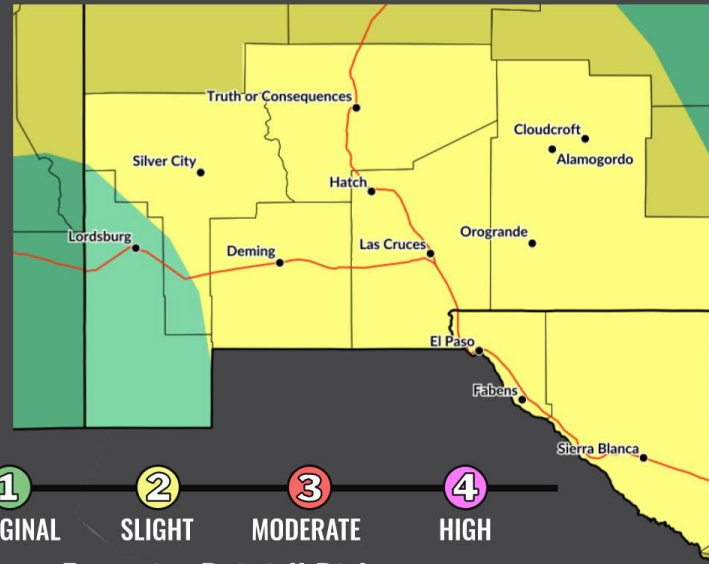

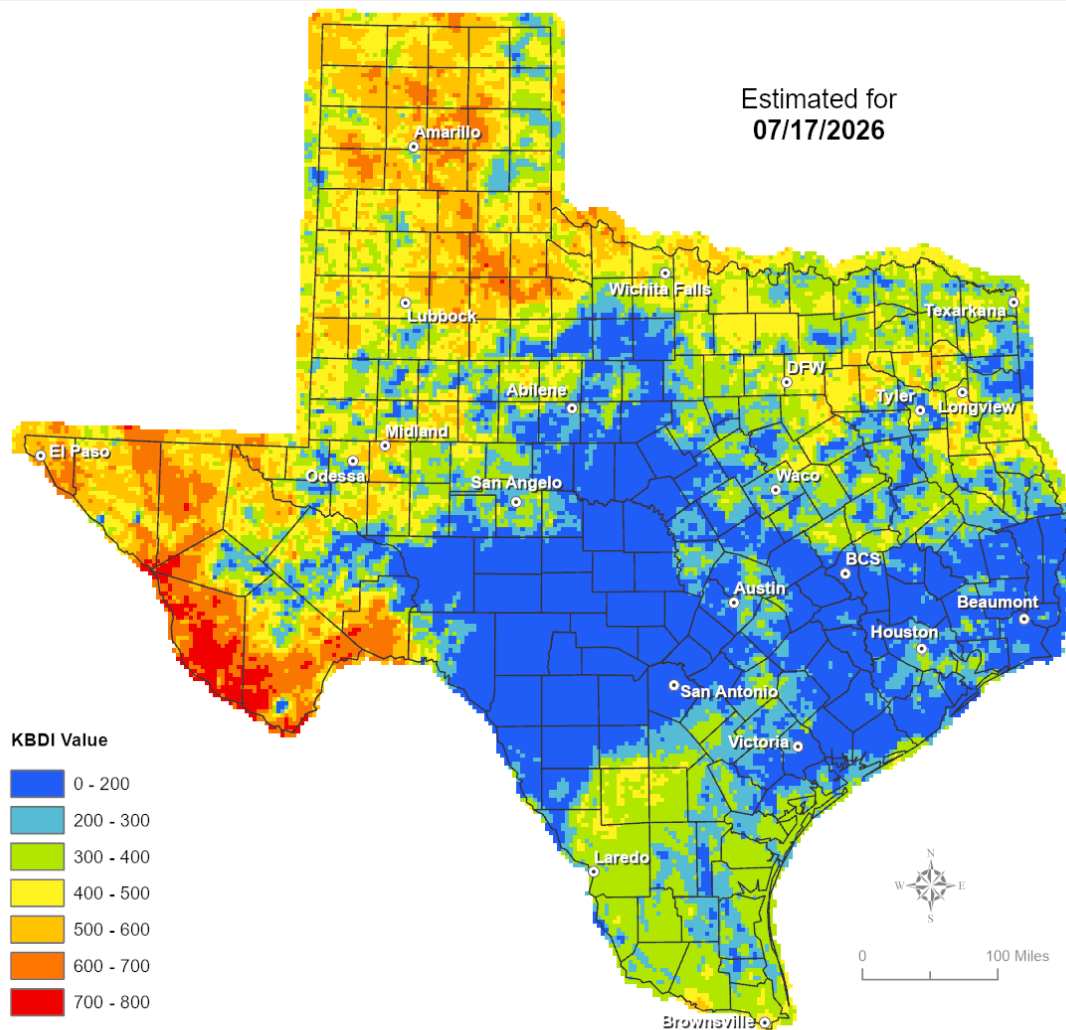

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

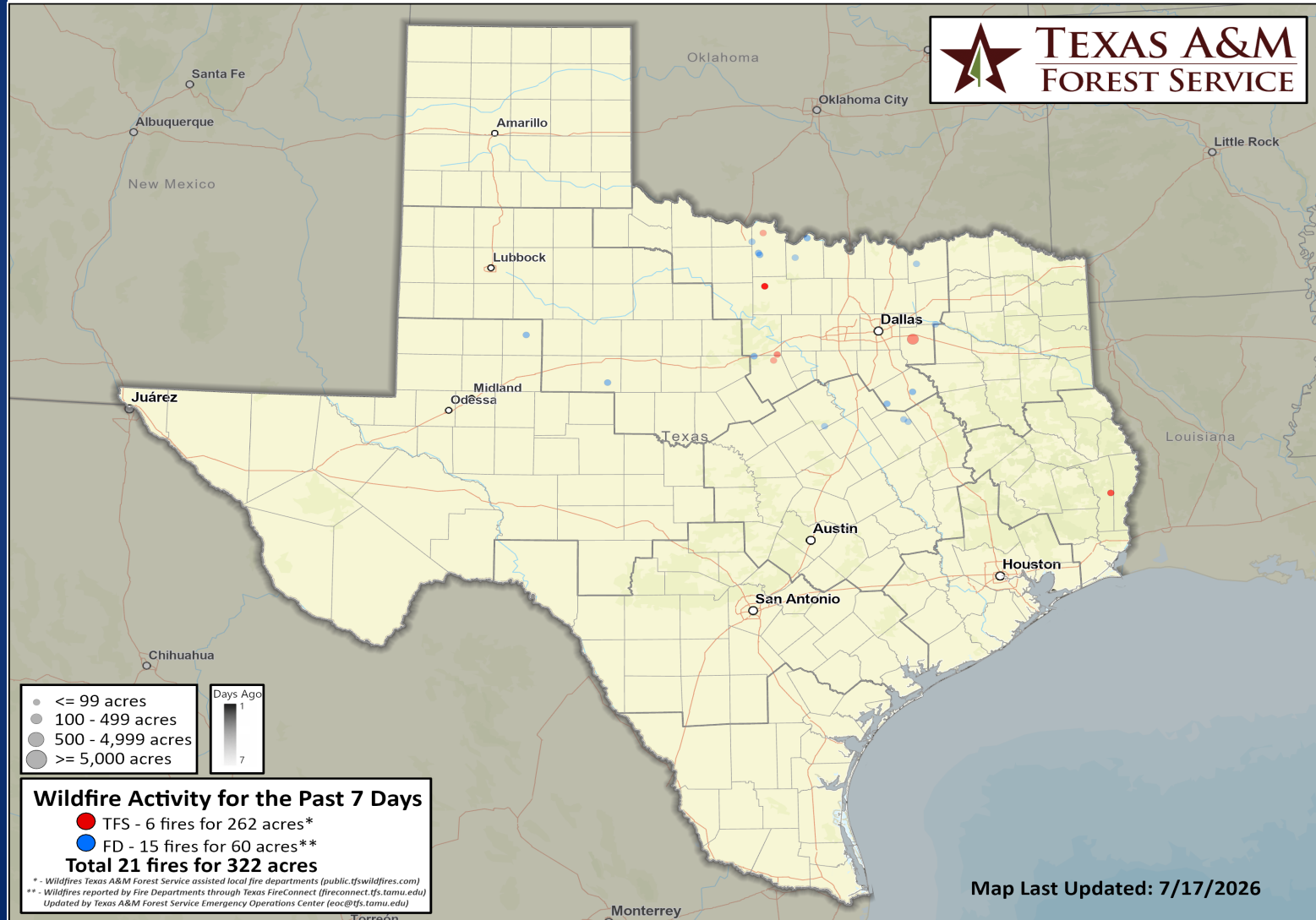
