STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On July 17, Governor Greg Abbott requested a Presidential Disaster Declaration to support Texas' ongoing response and recovery efforts following severe weather and flooding impacting communities across the state. Governor Abbott also visited Uvalde County to receive updates on flood conditions, survey damage, and meet with state and local officials coordinating the local response. This was followed by the Governor holding a press conference in the City of Uvalde.

On July 16, Governor Greg Abbott held a severe weather briefing and press conference at the State Operations Center in Austin to provide an update on the state's ongoing response to flooding across Texas. Response efforts continue while coordinating with local partners to provide assistance where it is needed most.

On July 14, Governor Greg Abbott issued a disaster declaration for 59 Texas counties as severe storms continue to threaten the state. Additional counties may be added as conditions warrant. The Governor also directed the Texas State Emergency Operations Center (SOC) to continue 24-hour operations at Level II (Escalated Response) to support the state's ongoing response to severe storms and flash flooding.

On July 12, Gov. Abbott directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to activate state emergency response resources ahead of severe weather and flash flooding threats expected to impact multiple regions of Texas over the next several days.

- Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 1 (Includes Disaster District (DD) 1, 2, and 7)

DD 2 – Lubbock (Includes Bailey, Cochran, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Garza, Hale, Hockley, King, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Motley, Terry, and Yoakum Counties): DDEOC 2 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) under 26-0013 18MAY Severe Weather and remains activated under 26-0019 12JUL Severe Weather.

DD 7 – Abilene (Includes Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Fisher, Haskell, Jones, Kent, Knox, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, Stephens, Stonewall, Throckmorton, and Taylor Counties): DDEOC 7 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) under 26-0013 18MAY Severe Weather and remains activated under 26-0019 12JUL Severe Weather.

Haskell County: On July 18, 2026, Haskell Memorial Hospital has reopened with no unmet needs.

Region 6 (Includes DDs 17, 18, and 24)

DD 18 – San Antonio (Includes Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, McMullen, Medina, and Wilson Counties): DDEOC 18 activated to Level II (Escalated Response Conditions) on July 14.

DD 24 – Del Rio (Includes Dimmit, Edwards, La Salle, Kinney, Maverick, Real, Uvalde, Val Verde, and Zavala Counties): DDEOC 24 activated to Level II (Escalated Response Conditions) on July 14.

Zavala County: Residents in Batesville were evacuated to the local Nutrition Center.

Region 7 (Includes DDs 8, 9, and 10)

DD 8 – El Paso (Includes Brewster, Culberson, El Paso, Hudspeth, Jeff Davis, and Presidio Counties): DDEOC 8 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on July 14.

DD 9 – Midland/Ft. Stockton (Includes Andrews, Borden, Crane, Dawson, Ector, Gaines, Glasscock, Howard, Loving, Martin, Midland, Pecos, Reeves, Terrell, Upton, Ward, and Winkler Counties): DDEOC 9 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on July 14.

DD 10 – San Angelo (Includes Coke, Concho, Crockett, Irion, Kimble, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Reagan, Schleicher, Sterling, Sutton, and Tom Green Counties): DDEOC 10 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on July 14.

Region 8 (Includes DDs 11, 12, 13, and 23)

DD 12 – Austin (Includes Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis, and Williamson Counties): DDEOC 12 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on July 14.

DD 13 – Bryan (Includes Brazos, Burleson, Grimes, Leon, Madison, Robertson, and Washington Counties): DDEOC 13 returned to Level IV (Normal Conditions) on July 15.

DD 23 – Killeen (Includes Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Milam, Mills, and San Saba Counties): DDEOC 23 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on July 14.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):

The State Operations Center (SOC) has activated to Level II (Escalated Response) in support of this severe weather incident. The SOC is directing interagency coordination

to maintain unified communication, deploy necessary resources, and support response operations in affected regions across Texas.

Communications Coordination Group (CCG):

TDEM ESF 2 / Communications Coordination Group (CCG) partners are monitoring the situation and continue to prepare resources to respond as necessary. Our partners across the public, private and volunteer sectors are assessing and adjusting their resources in accordance with the situation. Some of the actions being taken are:

AT&T FirstNet has deployed two (2) Cell on Wheels (COW), to the city of Kerrville, Kerr County and one to the city of Centerpoint, and one (1) to the city of Camp Wood, Real County.

T-Mobile has reported service has been restored in and around Kerrville and Uvalde, and restoration efforts are ongoing in surrounding communities. The most significant impacts remain north of Kerrville and to the south, including Brackettville, Dilley, Carrizo Springs, and areas outside Uvalde. They are deploying satellite-based backhaul solutions, including Starlink kits, to reestablish connectivity where traditional infrastructure has been disrupted. Work will continue as weather conditions improve and crews can safely access impacted sites.

The Texas Department of Public Safety, Office of the SWIC (Statewide Interoperable Communications) assisted in reviewing and deconflicting requests for communications platforms and communications personnel.

Amateur Radio services have activated local nets and continue to monitor and provide backup Emergency Communication (EMCOMM) support, as well as localized spot reports. Amateur Radio groups including Texas RACES, ARRL ARES, and the 7290 Net, are supporting local EOC operations as requested by state and local jurisdictions and are providing statewide monitoring of Amateur Radio Nets.

FEMA Region 6 ESF 2 staff have begun coordination calls between federal, state and private sector ESF 2 partners. Our federal partners are monitoring the situation and to assist if requested.

The Texas Telecommunicator Emergency Response Taskforce (TXTERT) is monitoring the situation to support dispatch centers in the impacted areas if required.

ESF-5 Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):

The TDEM ISTF has 20 members deployed to areas of the state affected by severe weather and flooding.

TDEM Mass Care ISTF continues monitoring for potential mass care activities. There have been no requests for mass care coordination; however, partner agencies remain on standby and are prepared to provide support to Texas Communities.

Feeding

- World Central Kitchen will be feeding citizens throughout Kerrville, Comfort, Uvalde, Batesville, and Crystal City. (470 meals spread across all counties)
- The Salvation Army San Antonio Full Size unit will continue to provide food in Uvalde in support of Shelter operations with feeding in partnership with ARC.
- In coordination with SBTC, a Mass Feeding unit has been placed on standby in support of potential feeding operation in and around Uvalde County.
- On Friday, July 17th, we distributed 923 meals and 145 drinks across both sites.
- Mercy Chef's has been providing meals in Kerr and Kendall Co. (2,236 Cumulative Hot Meals)

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1):

July 17, 2026. Today, extra personnel from TX-TF1 joined up with the Type 4 to form a Type 3 WC US&R. Also, EMAC SWR boat squads from Oklahoma, Louisiana, Arkansas and Alabama arrived. Two additional HSART swimmers have also joined a fifth TMD helicopter. Many ESF 9 resources were active with rescues, evacuations and investigations today. 3 people were rescued, 39 people and 1 animal were evacuated and 13 people were contacted and chose to shelter in place. The resources are currently on the move as the flood threat continues its trend southward to the Rio Grande/Gulf of America.

July 18, 2026. 06:00 WS Austin evacuated 2 people and 2 dogs from a house in rising water in the Sonora @ around 10:30. At around 11:42 WS Gainesville launched 2 boats near Menard to rescue 1-person whose car washed into the water. Resources are placed strategically around the state and ready to move if needed to follow the threat of rising water.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 2 (TEEX/TX-TF2): On July 15, TX-TF2 assessed minor tornado damage in Bexar County. On July 13, TXTF2 activated a Type 3 WC US&R.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service – Public Works Team (TX-PWRT):

July 18

[TX-PWRT has one team staged at Freeman Coliseum. Sandbag operations in McMullen County were completed yesterday.](#)

On July 17, the TX-PWRT Team staged at Freeman Coliseum has been tasked with assisting and facilitating sandbag operations in McMullen County. PWRT continues to staff the SOC and communicate with the Texas Commission of Environment Quality on the status of water systems.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

As of July 16, TAMFS has six Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) All Hazard (AH) Strike Teams assigned to AH Group Alpha in San Antonio and assigned to AH Group Bravo in College Station.

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife):

AgriLife has the Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) unit monitoring the weather situation from the flooding in South and Southwest Texas. Weather information has been pushed out, and contact has been made with officials in affected counties. A County Extension Agent is staffing at Disaster District Emergency Operations Center (DDEOC) 24 - Del Rio. County Extension Agents, Disaster Assessment, and Recovery Specialists are actively monitoring the weather situation and communicating with clientele to move livestock out of low-lying areas and to provide guidance on how to report AgSTAT damages.

July 18

The 4 AgriLife Extension DAR Specialists who were rostered to provide logistical support to the TAMU Veterinary Emergency Team for SAR canine operations have been stood down. The TAMU VET had no requests for work and are demobilizing as of today from Kerrville.

July 17

The AgriLife Extension DAR unit has rostered 4 DAR Specialists to provide logistical support to the TAMU Veterinary Emergency Team for SAR canine operations.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):

TCEQ has placed emergency management staff and emergency response hazmat contractors on heightened readiness for possible deployment to assist with any air/water/waste related issues including drinking water/wastewater issues and/or emergency response activities.

As of July 18, TCEQ is tracking [four](#) drinking water systems that are on a Boil Water Notice (BWN) serving a population of [51,023](#).

Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):

DPS continues to support statewide response operations related to the severe weather impacting portions of Texas. Resources have been identified and strategically positioned across the affected areas for rapid deployment, including Tactical Marine Unit (TMU) swift water rescue boat teams, Aviation Operations helicopters hoist capabilities, and Special Operations Group (SOG) Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) teams.

As of July 17, there is one Communications Command Platform (CCP) staged in Kerrville, and one CCP being relocated to Cystal City. There are also Victim Services Advocates and clinicians making outreach efforts to the impacted areas to offer resources and assistance as needed.

Total contacts for this incident include 132 rescues and 59 evacuations.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) (Texas Emergency Medical Task Force):

July 18

DSHS Consumer Protection Division (CPD) Food and Drug programs have sanitarians on standby and are actively monitoring and working with the impacted regions to support retail and manufactured food recovery operations. Guidance on flood and disaster recovery efforts has been provided to the regions to share with local food establishments.

The Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF) remains activated to support ongoing response operations.

- 1 patient transferred from Val Verde Regional Medical Center to Baptist Medical Center in San Antonio on 7/17 in coordination with the Texas Military Department
- Ambus staged at Uvalde Memorial Hospital to provide patient surge capacity
- Ambulance Strike Teams have been working in the impacted areas with Emergency Support Function 9 on water rescues and evacuations, interfacility transfers and 911 system decompression support.
- Camp Eagle near Garner State Park team assisted evacuating children (7/18/2026).

South Texas Regional Advisory Council (STRAC) Regional Medical Operations Center (RMOC)

- All hospitals are operating normally with no unmet needs, although some facilities are experiencing an influx of dialysis patients who have been unable to receive treatment for several days.

DSHS Public Health Region 9/10 Regional Health and Medical Operations Center (RHMOOC) at Limited Activation Currently monitoring weather events in Concho Valley and the Permian Basin region.

- Ozona (Crockett Co.)
 - Search and Rescue teams conducted rescues.
 - A shelter established for displaced residents has been closed.
- Sonora (Sutton Co.)
 - Voluntary evacuations took place and a shelter established for displaced residents has been closed.

DSHS Public Health Region 11 Regional Health and Medical Operations Center (RHMOCC) at Level III Increased Readiness is closely monitoring weather affecting the region to maintain situational awareness.

Coastal Bend Regional Advisory Council (CBRAC)

- CBRAC activation level III Increased Readiness, is monitoring the Rio Grande in the City of Laredo due to the severe weather impacting the Texas Hill Country and areas along the Rio Grande around Del Rio and Eagle Pass

To date, DSHS has assisted in the health services for 436 responders, treated 42 patients, and transported 41 patients.

As of July 17, the DSHS State Medical Operations Center (SMOC) is at Partial Activation and is actively monitoring and supporting severe weather operations. DSHS has deployed multiple All Hazards (AH) Teams and Severe Weather Package Teams to impacted areas.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC):

HHSC began staffing the SOC in support of emergency weather response operations on July 14. HHSC has activated its ice, water, and freight contracts to provide incident support.

As of July 16, one assisted living facility and two intermediate care facilities in the Uvalde area have evacuated due to weather impacts. Surveyors check in with all impacted facilities daily to assess status and identify unmet needs. There are no unmet needs.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

As of July 17, TxDOT is reporting 74 state-maintained road segment closures located across flood-impacted counties. Major highway segment closures include United States Highway (US) 83 (Uvalde, Real), US-90 (Uvalde, Kinney), US-83 (Uvalde), US-377 (Kimble, Edwards), segments of US-57 (Frio, Kinney, Zavala), and Texas State Highway (SH) 16 (Gillespie) between Kerrville and Fredericksburg.

Additionally, TxDOT is reporting 28 state-maintained roadways with patches of floodwater. Major state highways impacted by patches of floodwater extend from Abilene, the Hill Country, and down to South Texas including Interstate Highway (IH) 10, IH-35, US-290, and US-380 (mainly frontage roads).

TxDOT has mobilized 21 portable message boards with cameras for increased monitoring and public alerts in the flood-impacted areas.

TxDOT is in the process of moving portable message boards used for World Cup events and strategically placing them in the flood-impacted counties to increase public safety messaging.

TxDOT EOC and local EOCs in impacted areas are activated and are closely monitoring the severe weather threats, statewide. TxDOT reps are also staffing activated DDEOCs. TxDOT ESF-1 is staffing the State Operations Center during the 24hour activation.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

As of July 18, Texas Game Wardens and Game Warden Search and Rescue Boat teams have responded to numerous calls for service in affected communities. Contacts have included residents needing rescue and evacuation from flooded homes, vehicles submerged in floodwater and swept off roadways. Texas Game Wardens SAR Boat Teams are working closely with Task Force personnel to coordinate response efforts and meet ongoing operational needs. Boat Teams helped gather supplies at Walmart for delivery to a local shelter utilizing vessels for delivery in Uvalde.

Game Warden Aviation helicopter crews rescued a man from swift water flooding by hoisting him to safety outside his home. During the same response, the aviation team also hoisted fellow first responders from a flooded area to ensure their safety. In addition, Game Warden Search and Rescue boat teams conducted three separate rescue operations, evacuating two adults and one child from flooded areas.

To date, TPWD has assisted in 153 rescue operations, 92 evacuations including five pets, and 27 shelter-in-place orders for this response.

Texas Military Department (TMD):

TMD has activated three Ground Transportation Platoons (GTP), one Battalion Mission Command (BNMC), six Ground Support Unit Hybrids (GSU-H), two Ground Support Unit Headquarters (GSU-HQ), two ETN teams, and one Liaison Officer (LNO). Also, TMD has activated four Rotary Wing Medium, one Rotary Wing Heavy Mission Ready Packages (MRP), TF Aviation BNMC, and Tactical Air Control Party (TACP) supporting State Agency partners. TMD has activated four Emergency Tracking Network (ETN) Teams. TMD has activated 347 personnel, 96 vehicles, and 10 rotary wing aircraft.

To date, TMD has assisted in 16 rescues operations and 40 evacuation operations totaling 69 persons assisted and 14 pets.

Texas Cyber Command (TXCC):

The TXCC is monitoring the weather situation and is ready to support the state's response efforts. TXCC is using cybersecurity tooling and threat intelligence feeds. There are no cyber threats related to this event.

Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD)

American Red Cross (ARC):

The ARC has established a Level 2 Disaster Relief Operation (DR 546-27) for this response.

July 18

ARC is focusing on mass care sheltering and feeding operations in Uvalde and Batesville. They have partnered with the Salvation Army to support the feeding mission in Uvalde. A current concern includes the rising hotel costs due to the floods, keeping families from extended hotel stays, causing fluctuations in sheltering populations.

ARC has three open shelters: Uvalde County serving 111 clients, Zavala County serving 0 clients, and Kerr County serving 7 clients; and two closed shelters in Comal and Gillespie Counties.

ARC has three feeding stations in Uvalde County, serving 905 meals and 100 snacks.

The Salvation Army:

In response to the major storm impacting Central and South Texas, The Salvation Army is supporting shelter feeding as requested across the area and evaluating conditions to begin service in affected areas as requested.

As of July 18, the Salvation Army distributed 923 meals and 145 drinks across two sites, Kerrville and Uvalde.
