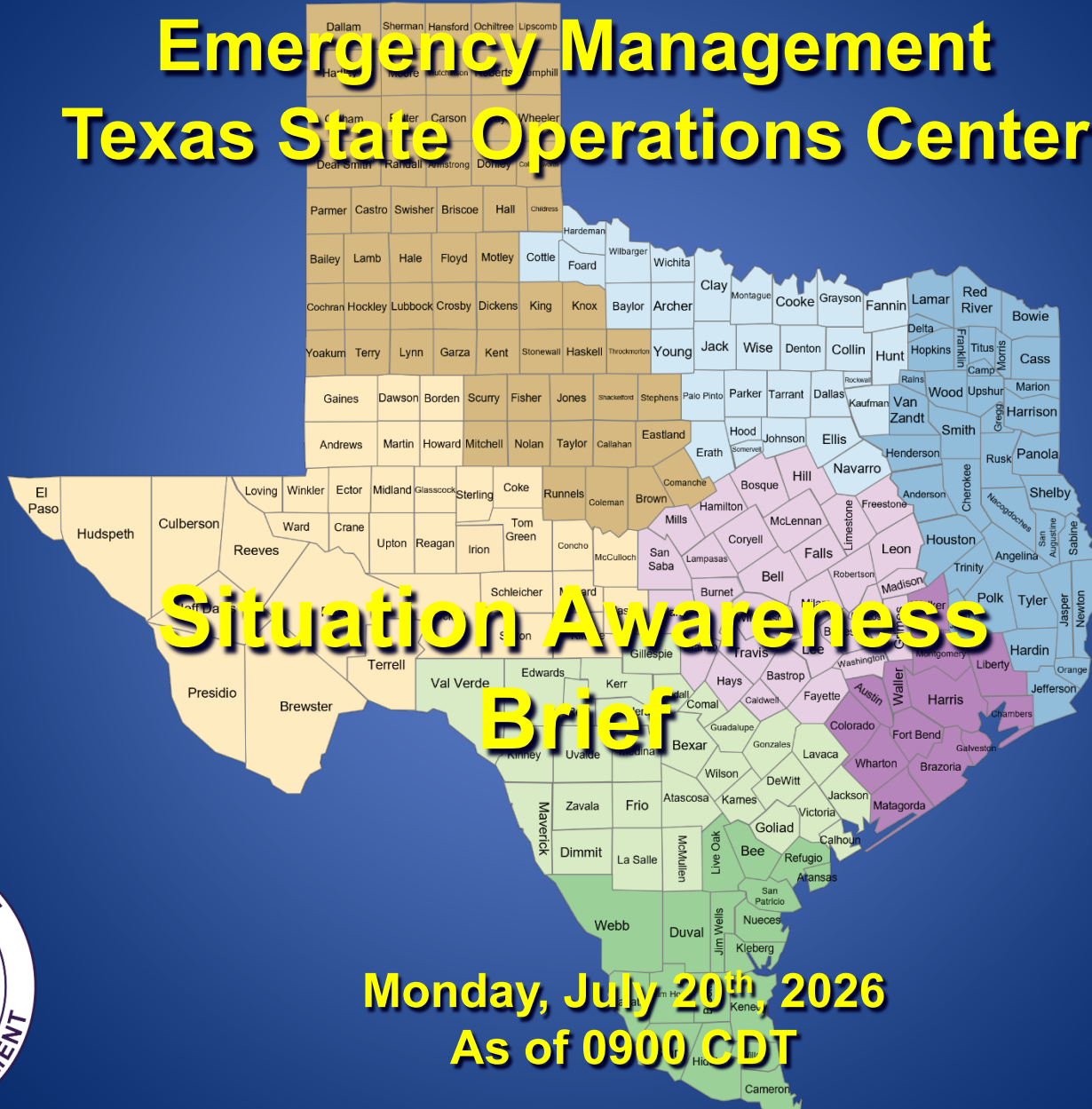

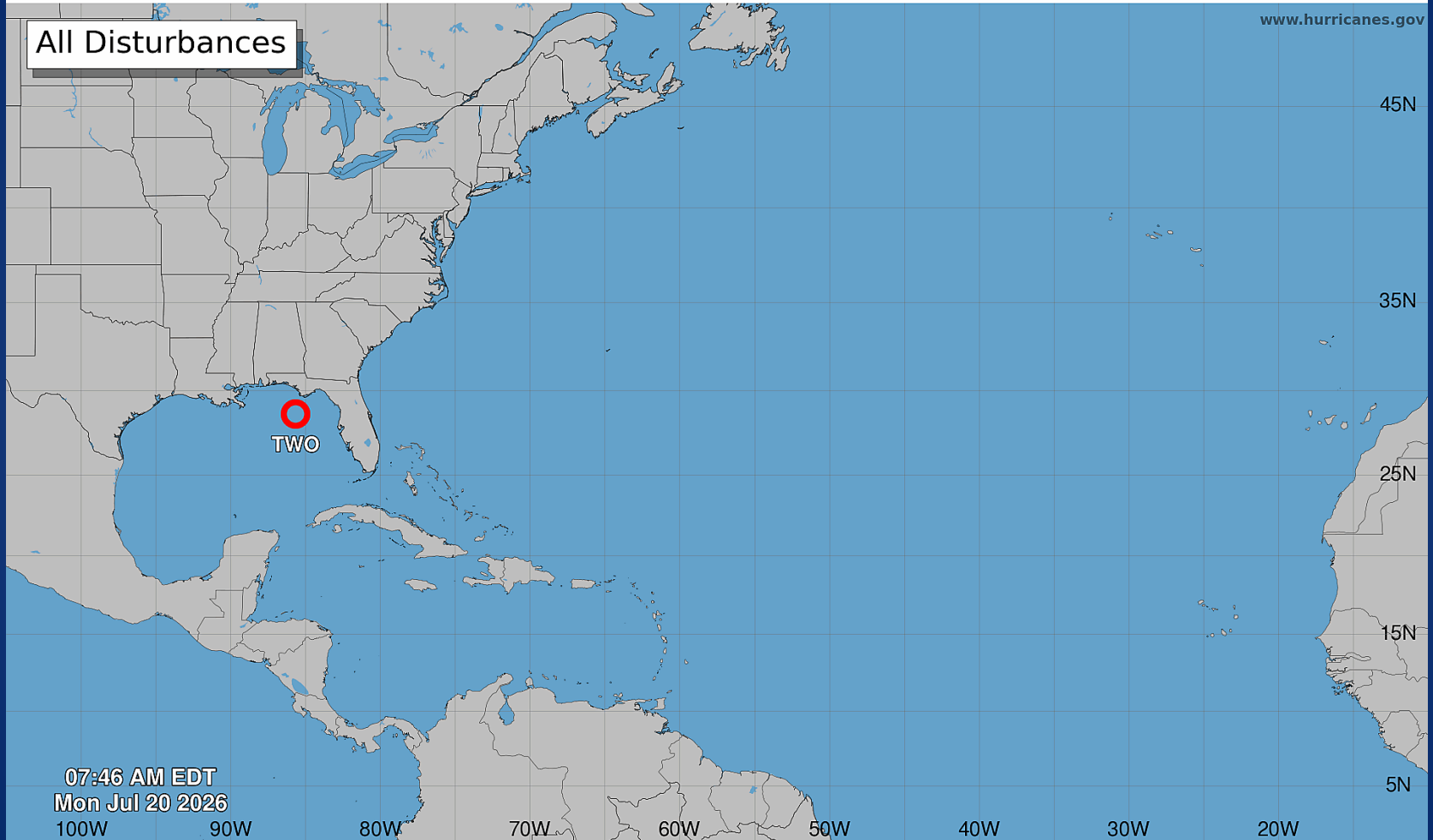


Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

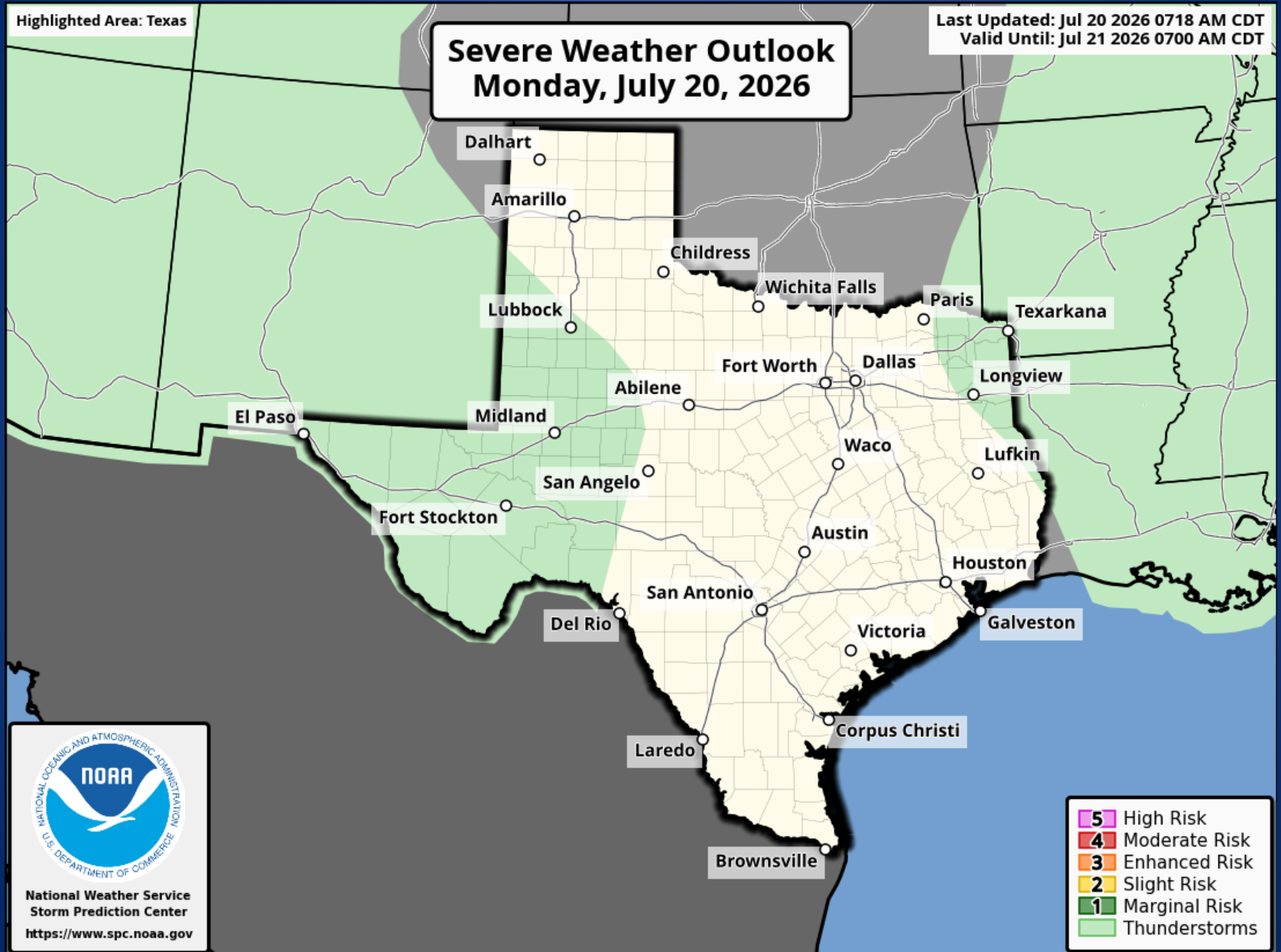

Weather Headlines

- Extreme heat risk is expected across the Panhandles by the end of the week.
- Overnight low temperatures are only expected to reach the upper-70's by the end of the week, offering little relief from the heat during the overnight.
- The combination of increasing high temperatures through the week and the poor overnight relief is the reason for the drastic increase in HeatRisk by the weekend.

Extreme HeatRisk is expected across the Panhandles by the end of the week. While temperatures are expected to increase through the week, prolonged hot temperatures and little relief with overnight lows are also factors in the increasing HeatRisk.

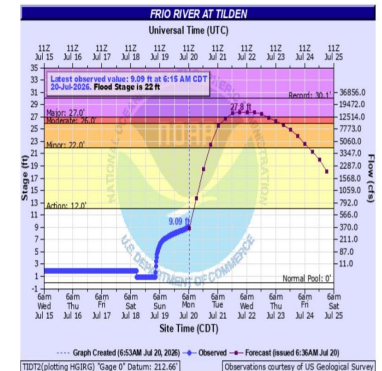
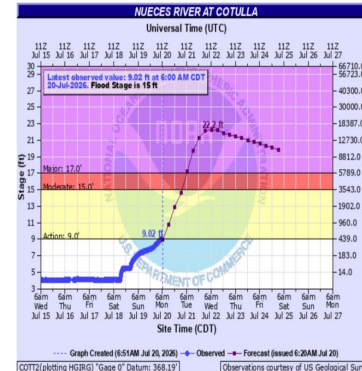


Nueces and Frio River Flooding

Tilden & Cotulla

The latest river forecast calls for the Nueces River at Cotulla to enter flood stage (15 ft) Monday afternoon and crest in Major Flood Stage on Wednesday (near 22 ft). For the Frio River at Tilden, the river is expected to rise into Minor Flood Stage (22 ft) on Monday, with a crest in Major Flood Stage (near 28 ft) Tuesday.



Note: This forecast is based on the crests/max discharge values observed upstream

The Nueces River at Cotulla is forecast to reach flood stage Monday afternoon, peaking in Major Flood Stage on Wednesday. The Frio River at Tilden is expected to enter into minor flood stage on Monday and cresting in Major Flood Stage on Tuesday.

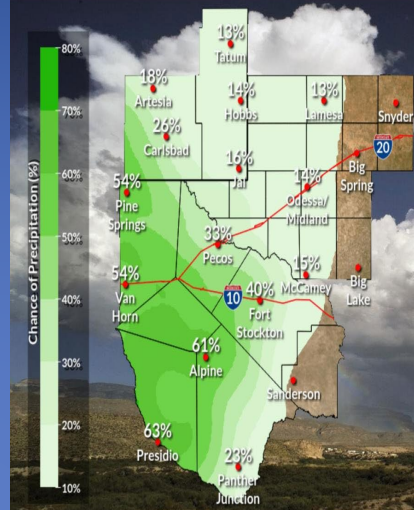

A Fire Danger Statement is in effect this afternoon and early evening for all of Deep South Texas, excepting the coastal counties and islands. Southeasterly winds between 15 and 25 mph are expected, with gusts up to 35. Humidity could get as low as 15%, especially in the Western Ranchlands. Avoid outdoor burning and properly discard cigarettes.

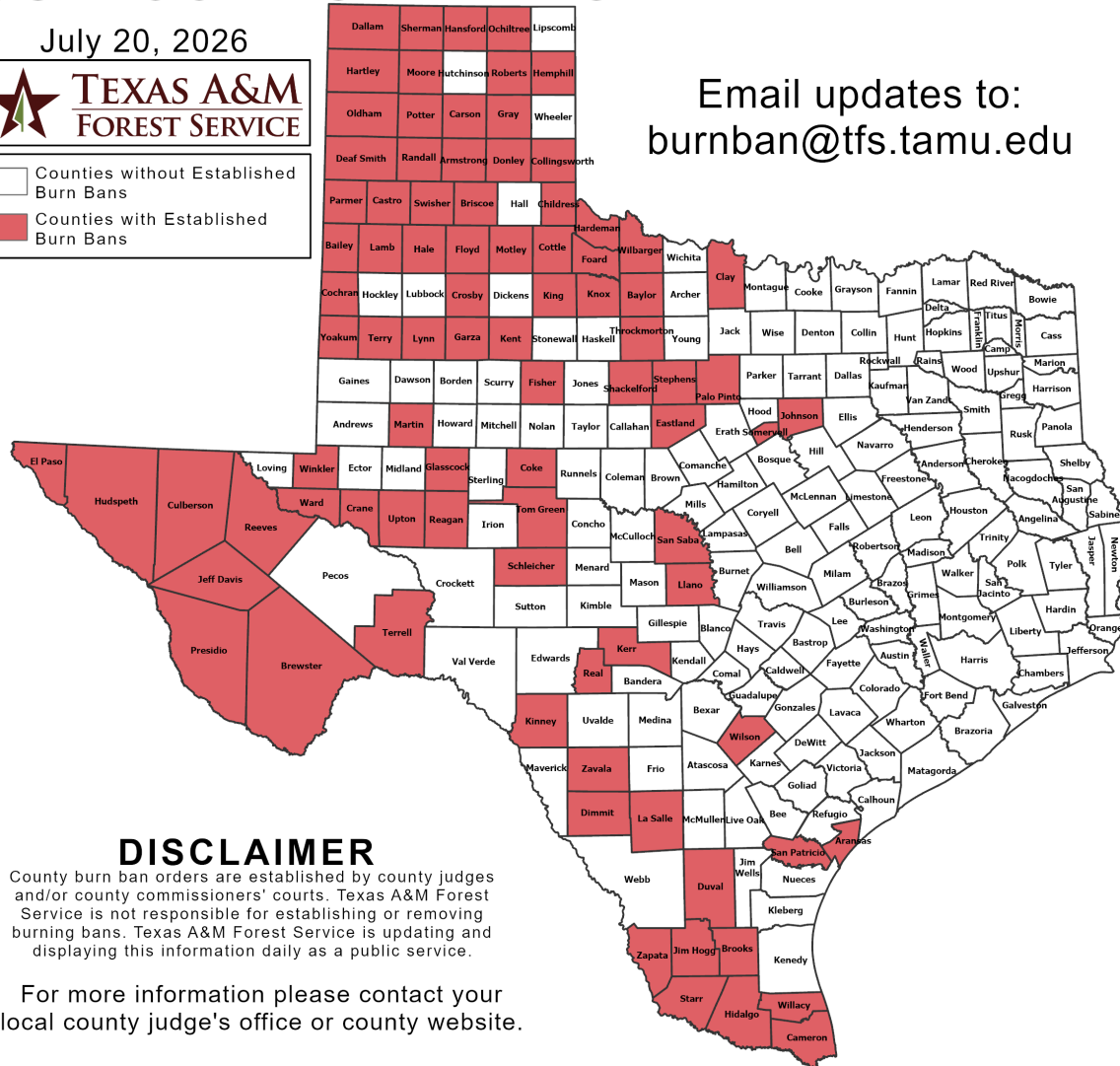

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

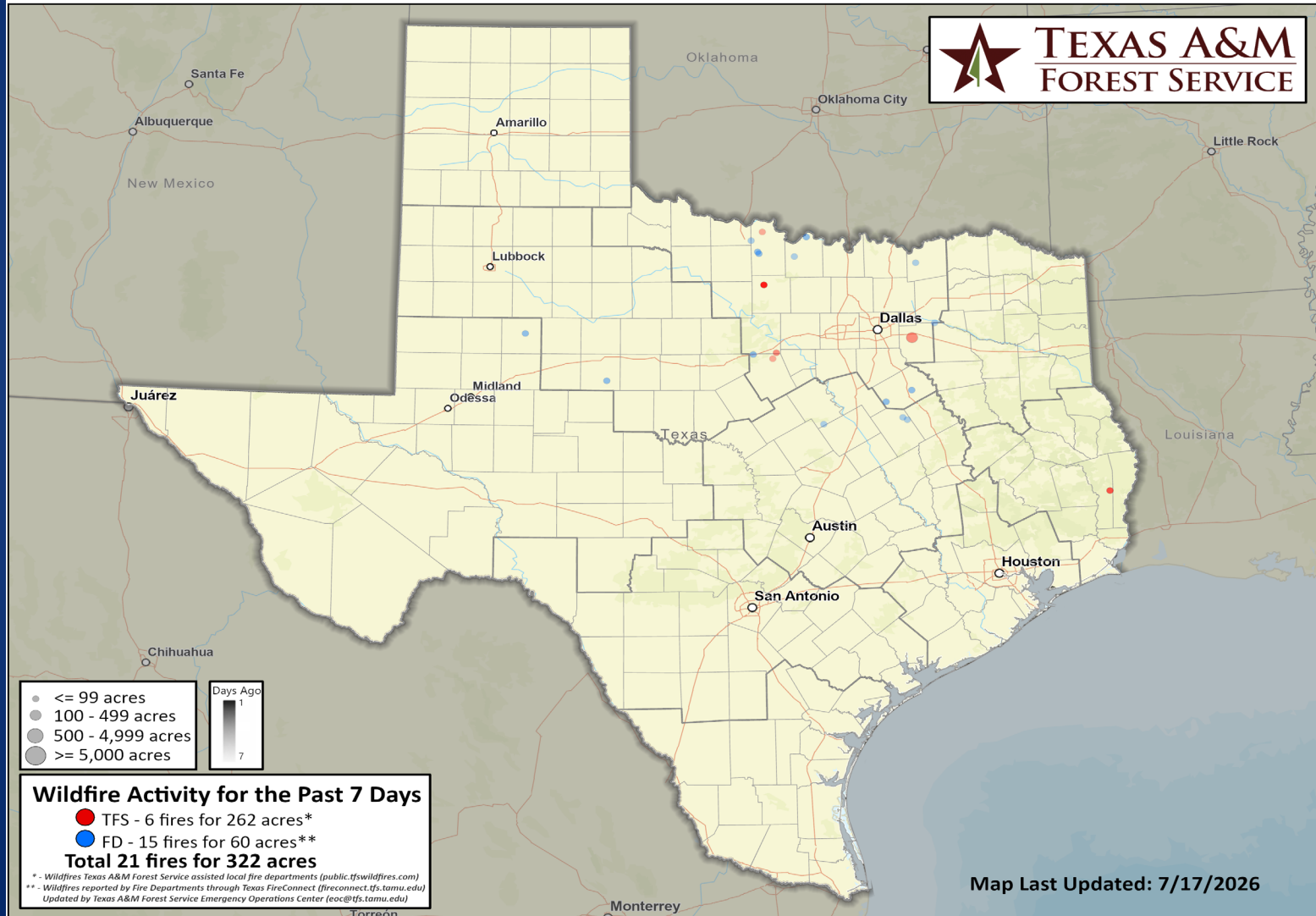
