**STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:** On July 17, Governor Greg Abbott requested a Presidential Disaster Declaration to support Texas' ongoing response and recovery efforts following severe weather and flooding impacting communities across the state. Governor Abbott also visited Uvalde County to receive updates on flood conditions, survey damage, and meet with state and local officials coordinating the local response. This was followed by the Governor holding a press conference in the City of Uvalde.

On July 16, Governor Greg Abbott held a severe weather briefing and press conference at the State Operations Center in Austin to provide an update on the state's ongoing response to flooding across Texas. Response efforts continue while coordinating with local partners to provide assistance where it is needed most.

On July 14, Governor Greg Abbott issued a disaster declaration for 59 Texas counties as severe storms continue to threaten the state. Additional counties may be added as conditions warrant. The Governor also directed the Texas State Emergency Operations Center (SOC) to continue 24-hour operations at Level II (Escalated Response) to support the state's ongoing response to severe storms and flash flooding.

On July 12, Gov. Abbott directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to activate state emergency response resources ahead of severe weather and flash flooding threats expected to impact multiple regions of Texas over the next several days.

- Protect life and property.
- Support rapid & effective response.
- Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

DD 24 – Del Rio (Includes Dimmit, Edwards, La Salle, Kinney, Maverick, Real, Uvalde, Val Verde, and Zavala Counties): DDEOC 24 activated to Level II (Escalated Response

Conditions) on July 14.

**Zavala County:** Residents in Batesville were evacuated to the local Nutrition Center.

DD 9 – Midland/Ft. Stockton (Includes Andrews, Borden, Crane, Dawson, Ector, Gaines, Glasscock, Howard, Loving, Martin, Midland, Pecos, Reeves, Terrell, Upton, Ward, and Winkler Counties): DDEOC 9 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on July 14.

DD 10 – San Angelo (Includes Coke, Concho, Crockett, Irion, Kimble, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Reagan, Schleicher, Sterling, Sutton, and Tom Green Counties): DDEOC 10 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on July 14.

## **RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS**

### **Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):**

The State Operations Center (SOC) has activated to Level II (Escalated Response) in support of this severe weather incident. The SOC is directing interagency coordination to maintain unified communication, deploy necessary resources, and support response operations in affected regions across Texas.

### **Communications Coordination Group (CCG):**

TDEM ESF 2 / Communications Coordination Group (CCG) partners are monitoring the

situation and continue to prepare resources to respond as necessary. Our partners across the public, private and volunteer sectors are assessing and adjusting their resources in accordance with the situation. Some of the actions being taken are:

AT&T FirstNet has deployed two Cell on Wheels (COW), to the city of Kerrville, Kerr County and one to the city of Centerpoint, and one to the city of Camp Wood, Real County.

T-Mobile has reported service has been restored in and around Kerrville and Uvalde, and restoration efforts are ongoing in surrounding communities. The most significant impacts remain north of Kerrville and to the south, including Brackettville, Dilley, Carrizo Springs, and areas outside Uvalde. They are deploying satellite-based backhaul solutions, including Starlink kits, to reestablish connectivity where traditional infrastructure has been disrupted. Work will continue as weather conditions improve and crews can safely access impacted sites.

The Texas Department of Public Safety, Office of the Statewide Interoperable Communications (SWIC) assisted in reviewing and deconflicting requests for communications platforms and communications personnel.

Amateur Radio services have activated local nets and continue to monitor and provide backup Emergency Communication (EMCOMM) support, as well as localized spot reports. Amateur Radio groups including Texas RACES, ARRL ARES, and the 7290 Net, are supporting local EOC operations as requested by state and local jurisdictions and are providing statewide monitoring of Amateur Radio Nets.

FEMA Region 6 ESF 2 staff have begun coordination calls between federal, state and private sector ESF 2 partners. Our federal partners are monitoring the situation and to assist if requested.

The Texas Telecommunicator Emergency Response Taskforce (TXTERT) is monitoring the situation to support dispatch centers in the impacted areas if required.

#### **ESF-5 Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):**

The TDEM ISTF has 20 members deployed to areas of the state affected by severe weather and flooding. [There are 17 ISTF members currently enroute to Freeman Coliseum in San Antonio.](#)

**ESF-6 Mass Care ISTF:**

TDEM Mass Care ISTF continues monitoring for potential mass care activities. There have been no requests for mass care coordination; however, partner agencies remain on standby and are prepared to provide support to Texas Communities.

**Feeding**

- World Central Kitchen will be feeding citizens throughout Kerrville, Comfort, Uvalde, Batesville, and Crystal City. (470 meals spread across all counties)
- The Salvation Army San Antonio Full Size unit will continue to provide food in Uvalde in support of Shelter operations with feeding in partnership with ARC.
- In coordination with SBTC, a Mass Feeding unit has been placed on standby in support of potential feeding operation in and around Uvalde County.
- On Friday, July 17th, we distributed 923 meals and 145 drinks across both sites.
- Mercy Chef's has been providing meals in Kerr and Kendall Co. (2,236 Cumulative Hot Meals)

**Bulk Distribution /Distribution of Emergency Supplies (DES)**

- Local community partners have dropped off supplies to ARC for DES distribution over the weekend, supplementing our 300 cleanup kits.

### **Texas A&M University Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences (TAMU-CVM):**

On July 18, the Texas A&M Veterinary Emergency Team (TAMU VET) Type 3 Veterinary Medical Support team repositioned from Kerrville to Raymondville High School. TAMU VET has 12 vet members and support equipment supporting search and rescue canines in the field. Canine teams are on standby for flooding issues as waters continue down the river basin, while most work is water rescue and not canine search.

### **Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1):**

On July 19, eight Type 3 Swift Water Rescue (SWR) boat squads were added from Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, and Oklahoma from the EMAC to division. Also added were five Type 3 Water Capable (WC) Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) teams from FEMA; Arizona TF1, Colorado TF1, Missouri TF1, Nebraska TF1, and Tennessee TF1. These resources have been embedded into existing groups of resources throughout the impacted areas of flooding in Texas.

Over the last 24 hours, seven people have been rescued. Total Contacts 36 rescues, 104 human/pet evacuations, and 17 shelter-in-place.

**Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 2 (TEEX/TX-TF2):** On July 15, TX-TF2 assessed minor tornado damage in Bexar County. On July 13, TX-TF2 activated a Type 3 WC US&R.

### **Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service – Public Works Team (TX-PWRT):**

On July 19, TX-PWRT staged at Freeman Coliseum was requested to respond to Carrizo Springs. The team arrived on site and will perform an assessment of the issues in the water system to report back to TDEM and PWRT Operations.

### **Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):**

As of July 19, TAMFS has 10 Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) All Hazard (AH) Strike Teams assigned to AH Group Alpha in San Antonio and assigned to AH Group Bravo in College Station.

### **Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife):**

AgriLife has the Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) unit monitoring the weather situation from the flooding in South and Southwest Texas. Weather information has been pushed out, and contact has been made with officials in affected counties. A

County Extension Agent is staffing at Disaster District Emergency Operations Center (DDEOC) 24 - Del Rio. County Extension Agents (CEA), Disaster Assessment, and Recovery Specialists are actively monitoring the weather situation and communicating with clientele to move livestock out of low-lying areas and to provide guidance on how to report AgSTAT damages.

On July 18, AgriLife demobilized at end of shift from DDEOC 24 for ESF 11 representation. CEAs and DAR Specialists continue to monitor the weather and flood situation. They are working with USDA and clientele to assess agricultural damage as soon as it is safe to do so. Specialists and CEAs continue to promote iSTAT damage reporting across affected counties.

There were 35 entries from the State of Texas Assessment Tool portal from landowners with agricultural damage to fencing, crops, livestock and equipment, and 18 of those are requesting assistance from the AgriLife Extension Service. CEAs in those affected counties will be notified to contact the requesting landowners to provide relief assistance.

**Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):**

TCEQ has placed emergency management staff and emergency response hazmat contractors on heightened readiness for possible deployment to assist with any air/water/waste related issues including drinking water/wastewater issues and/or emergency response activities.

As of July 19, TCEQ is tracking four drinking water systems that are on a Boil Water Notice (BWN) serving a population of 51,023.

**Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):**

DPS continues to support statewide response operations related to the severe weather impacting portions of Texas. Resources have been identified and strategically positioned across the affected areas for rapid deployment, including Tactical Marine Unit (TMU) swift water rescue boat teams, Aviation Operations helicopters hoist capabilities, and Special Operations Group (SOG) Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) teams.

As of July 17, there is one Communications Command Platform (CCP) staged in Kerrville, and one CCP being relocated to Cystal City. There are also Victim Services Advocates and clinicians making outreach efforts to the impacted areas to offer resources and assistance as needed.

Total contacts for this incident include 132 rescues and 59 evacuations.

**Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) (Texas Emergency Medical Task Force):**

As of July 19, DSHS State Medical Operations Center (SMOC) is at Partial Activation and is actively monitoring and supporting severe weather operations. DSHS will continue active SOC LNO coverage for 24-hour shifts beginning July 14. Consumer Protection Division Food and Drug Branch is deploying additional sanitarians to help with retail food inspection operations for parts of the state with no local health jurisdiction. DSHS priorities currently are:

- Coordinating and providing any public health or medical needs from jurisdictions
- Monitoring healthcare facilities operational statuses
- Supporting shelter surveillance operations
- Patient care and patient movement

**Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC):**

HHSC began staffing the SOC in support of emergency weather response operations on July 14. HHSC has activated its ice, water, and freight contracts to provide incident support.

As of July 19, no additional long-term care facilities have been evacuated.

As of July 16, one assisted living facility and two intermediate care facilities in the Uvalde area have evacuated due to weather impacts. Surveyors check in with all impacted facilities daily to assess status and identify unmet needs. There are no unmet needs.

**Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):**

As of July 19, the TxDOT EOC has transitioned from in-person to virtual/on call status; EM staff continue to closely monitor. TxDOT continues to staff the SOC during this activation.

TxDOT is reporting 43 state-maintained road locations still impacted by the flood event. Of those, 35 are road segment closures that are mainly FM/RM roads. TxDOT crews continue to monitor roadways, perform debris removal, and conduct damage assessments.

TxDOT Corpus Christi District deployed a damage assessment team and assisted San



Antonio District in multiple inspections. TxDOT is deploying a Bridge Assessment team to assist San Angelo District with ongoing damage assessments/inspections.

TxDOT crews moved Portable Changeable Message Signs (PCMS) with cameras to San Saba on July 18; local crews closely monitored roadways along the San Saba River as it crested overnight. Crews in Uvalde, Kerr, and Frio counties performed multiple emergency repairs on July 18.

TxDOT PIOs and Media Relations continue to push travel safety messaging across social media platforms.

TxDOT has mobilized 21 portable message boards with cameras for increased monitoring and public alerts in the flood-impacted areas.

TxDOT is in the process of moving portable message boards used for World Cup events and strategically placing them in the flood-impacted counties to increase public safety messaging.

**Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):**

On July 19, TPWD fulfilled multiple requests for UAS support in La Salle County for aerial imagery of river flooding and affected zones. Game Wardens responded to landowner requests and assisted in relocating cattle from flooded areas to higher ground. Game Wardens deployed vessels to herd and move the livestock.

As of July 18, Texas Game Wardens and Game Warden Search and Rescue Boat teams have responded to numerous calls for service in affected communities. Contacts have included residents needing rescue and evacuation from flooded homes, vehicles submerged in floodwater and swept off roadways. Texas Game Wardens SAR Boat Teams are working closely with Task Force personnel to coordinate response efforts and meet ongoing operational needs. Boat Teams helped gather supplies at Walmart for delivery to a local shelter utilizing vessels for delivery in Uvalde.

Game Warden Aviation helicopter crews rescued a man from swift water flooding by hoisting him to safety outside his home. During the same response, the aviation team also hoisted fellow first responders from a flooded area to ensure their safety. In addition, Game Warden Search and Rescue boat teams conducted three separate rescue operations, evacuating two adults and one child from flooded areas.

To date, TPWD has assisted in 153 rescue operations, 92 evacuations including five

pets, and 27 shelter-in-place orders for this response.

**Texas Military Department (TMD):**

TMD has activated one Battalion Mission Command (BNMC), two General Support Unit Headquarters(+) (GSUHQ+), six General Support Unit Hybrids (GSU-H), and three Ground Transportation Platoons (GTP) in support of our State Agency partners at Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM). TMD has activated four Rotary Wing Medium (RWM), one Rotary Wing Heavy (RWH), a TF Aviation Battalion Mission Command (BNMC), and a Tactical Air Control Party-TRE Response (TACP-TRE) MRPs in support of our State Agency Partner TX-TF1. TMD has activated four TETN Teams and one MDC/LNO. TMD has activated 360 personnel, 99 vehicles, and 10 rotary wing aircraft.

To date, TMD has assisted in 19 rescue operations and 52 evacuation operations totaling 69 persons assisted and 14 pets.

**Texas Cyber Command (TXCC):**

The TXCC is monitoring the weather situation and is ready to support the state's response efforts. TXCC is using cybersecurity tooling and threat intelligence feeds. There are no cyber threats related to this event.

**Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD)**

**American Red Cross (ARC):**

The ARC has established a Level 2 Disaster Relief Operation (DR 546-27) for this response.

On July 19, ARC initiated coordination with The Salvation Army to support feeding operations at the Uvalde County Fairplex. Engaged local partners in preparedness planning for the potential transition to long-term sheltering operations. Through RC Respond, received 74 client assistance requests to date. The majority of requests involve cleanup kits, muck-out support, and financial assistance needs.

ARC has two open shelters: Uvalde County serving 111 clients, Zavala County serving 0 clients, and Kerr County serving 7 clients; and two closed shelters in Comal and Gillespie Counties.

ARC has three feeding stations in Uvalde County, serving 905 meals and 100 snacks.

**The Salvation Army:**

In response to the major storm impacting Central and South Texas, The Salvation Army is supporting shelter feeding as requested across the area and evaluating conditions to begin service in affected areas as requested.

As of July 19, the Salvation Army distributed 2,754 meals and 2,450 drinks across two sites, Kerrville and Uvalde.
