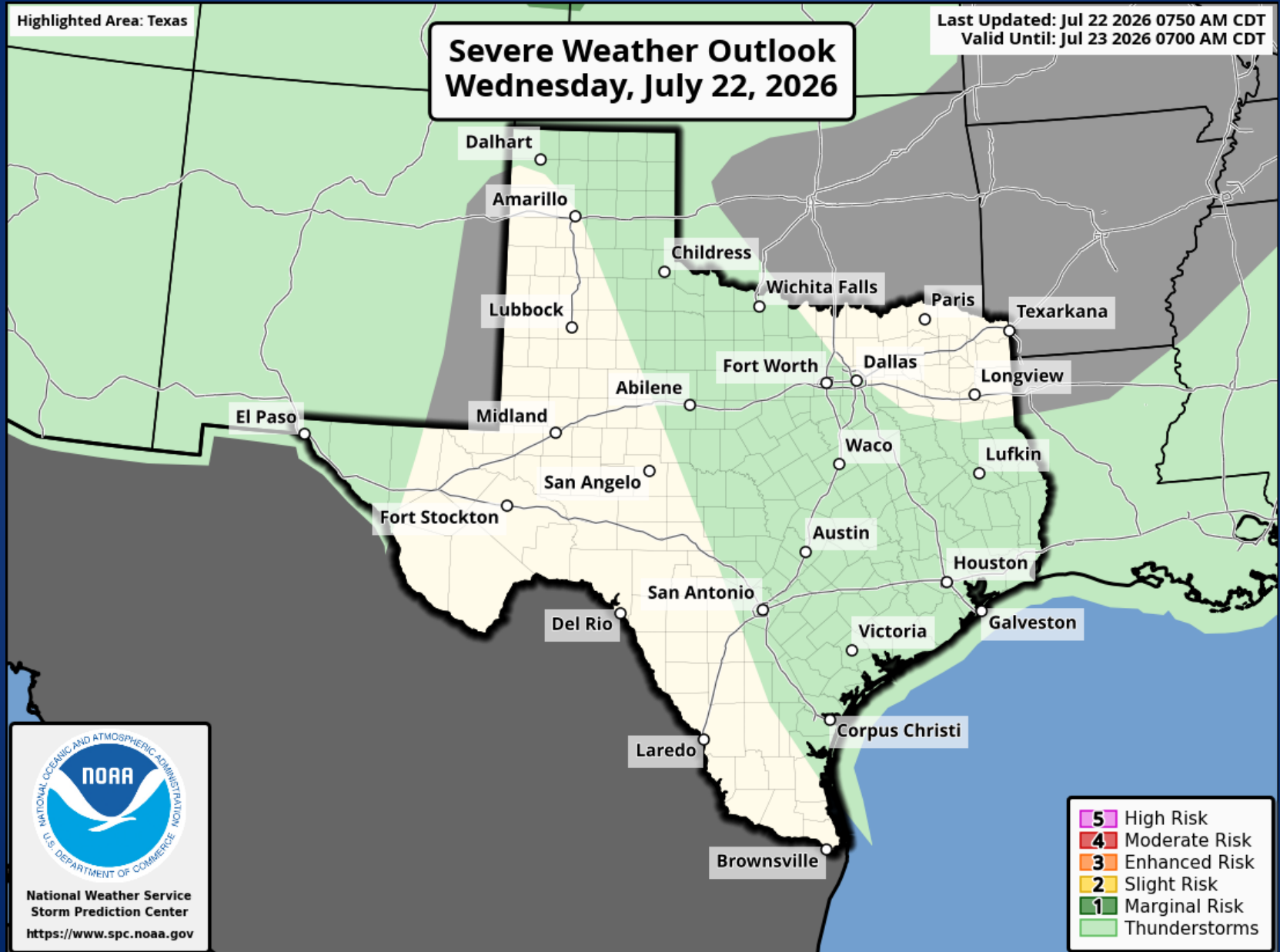

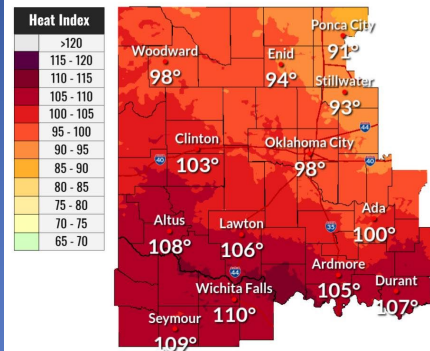

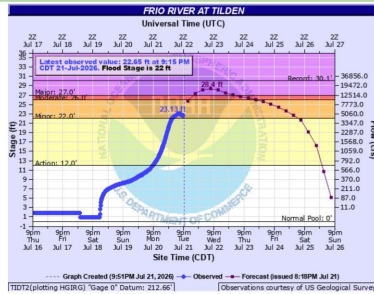
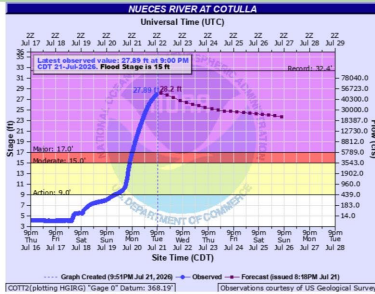


Nueces and Frio River Flooding

The Nueces River at Cotulla is currently (~28 ft) in Major flood stage and is forecast to crest overnight just over 28 ft. For the Frio River at Tilden, the river continues to rise and is currently (~23 ft) and in Minor Flood Stage. A crest in Major flood stage (28 ft) late Wednesday is forecast before falling back to Minor Thursday.



Note: This forecast is based on the crests/max discharge values observed upstream

The Nueces River at Cotulla is currently in Major flood stage with a crest just over 28 ft likely before midnight tonight. The Frio River at Tilden is in minor flood stage and expected to crest in Major Flood Stage late Wednesday.

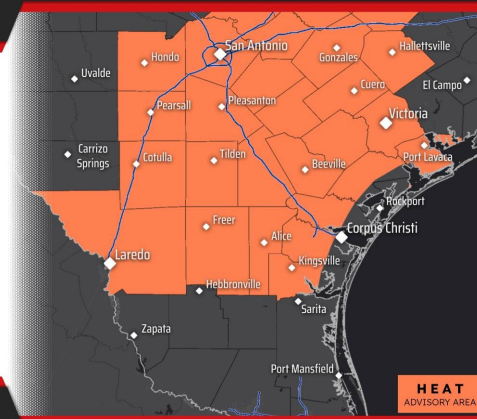

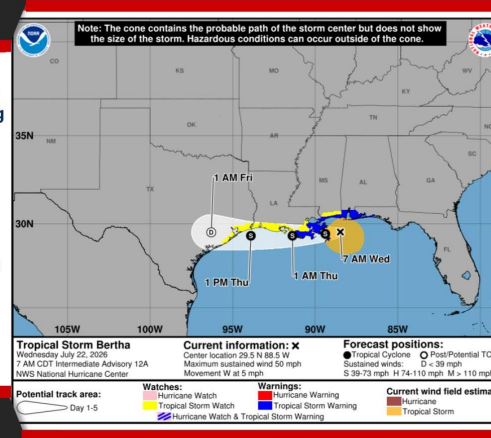
A hot day is in store for most of South Texas today. Heat index values will climb as high as 110-112°F this afternoon, increasing the Heat Risk to Major (level 3 of 4). As such, a Heat Advisory has been issued for inland locations. Make sure to hydrate and take plenty of AC/shade breaks if you plan to be outdoors.

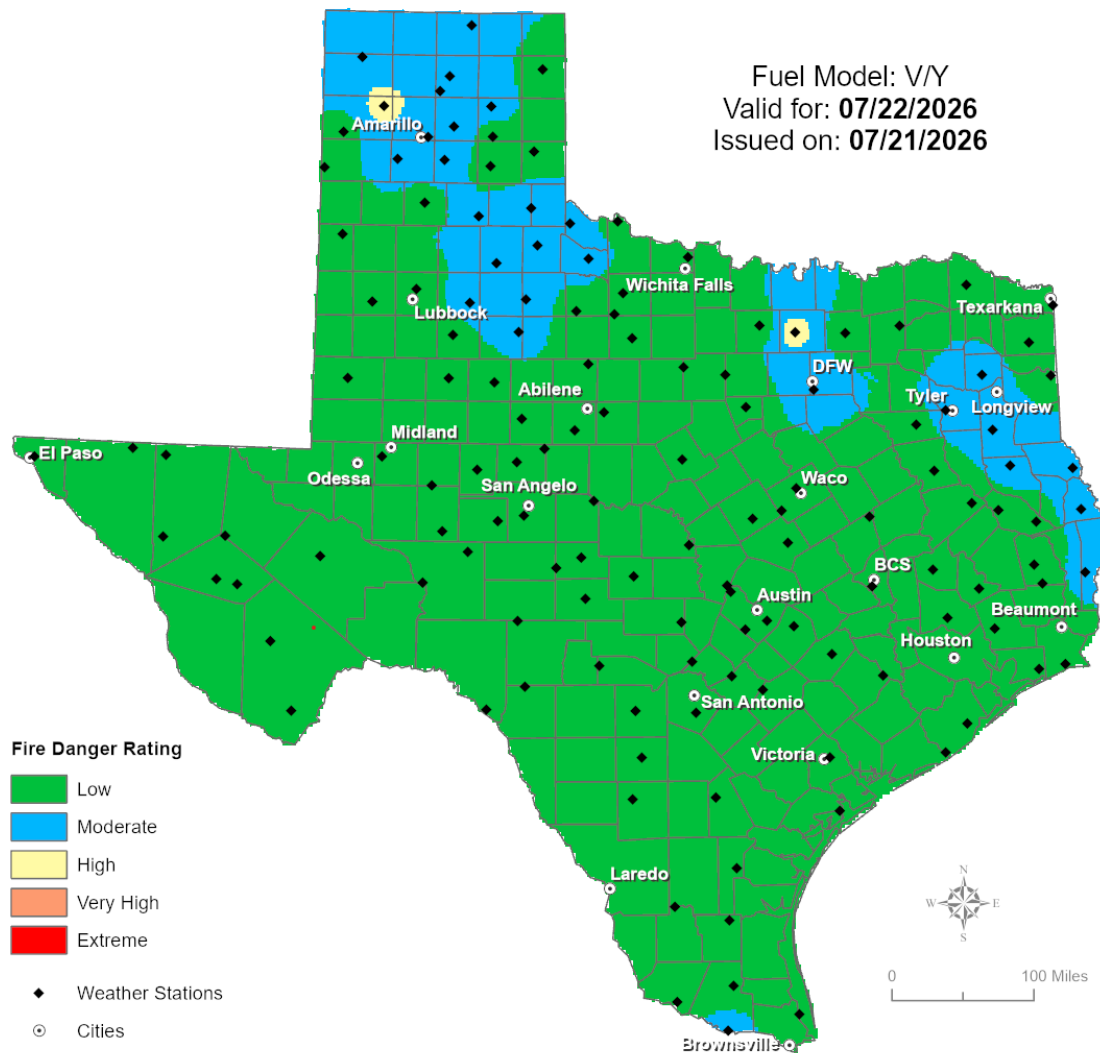

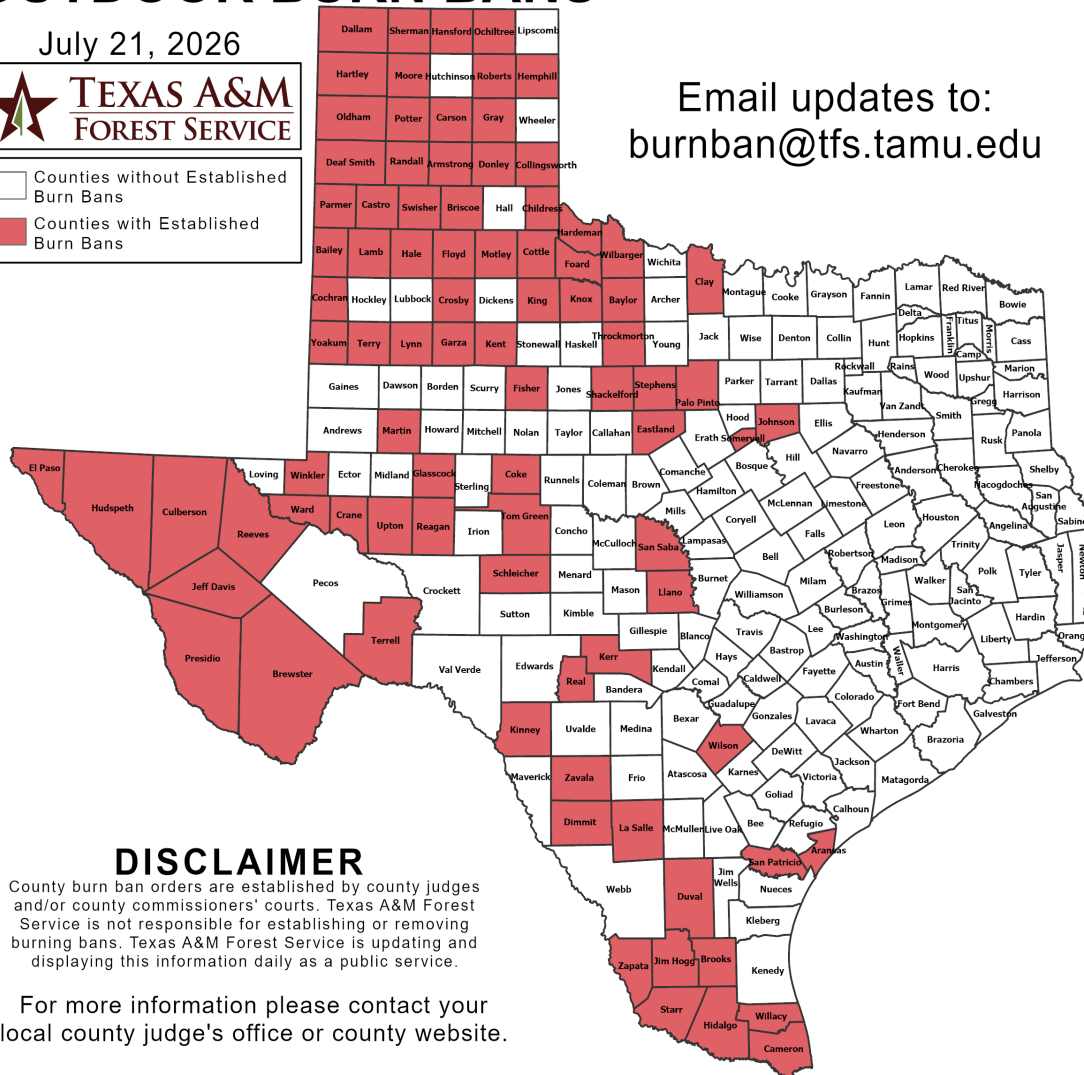

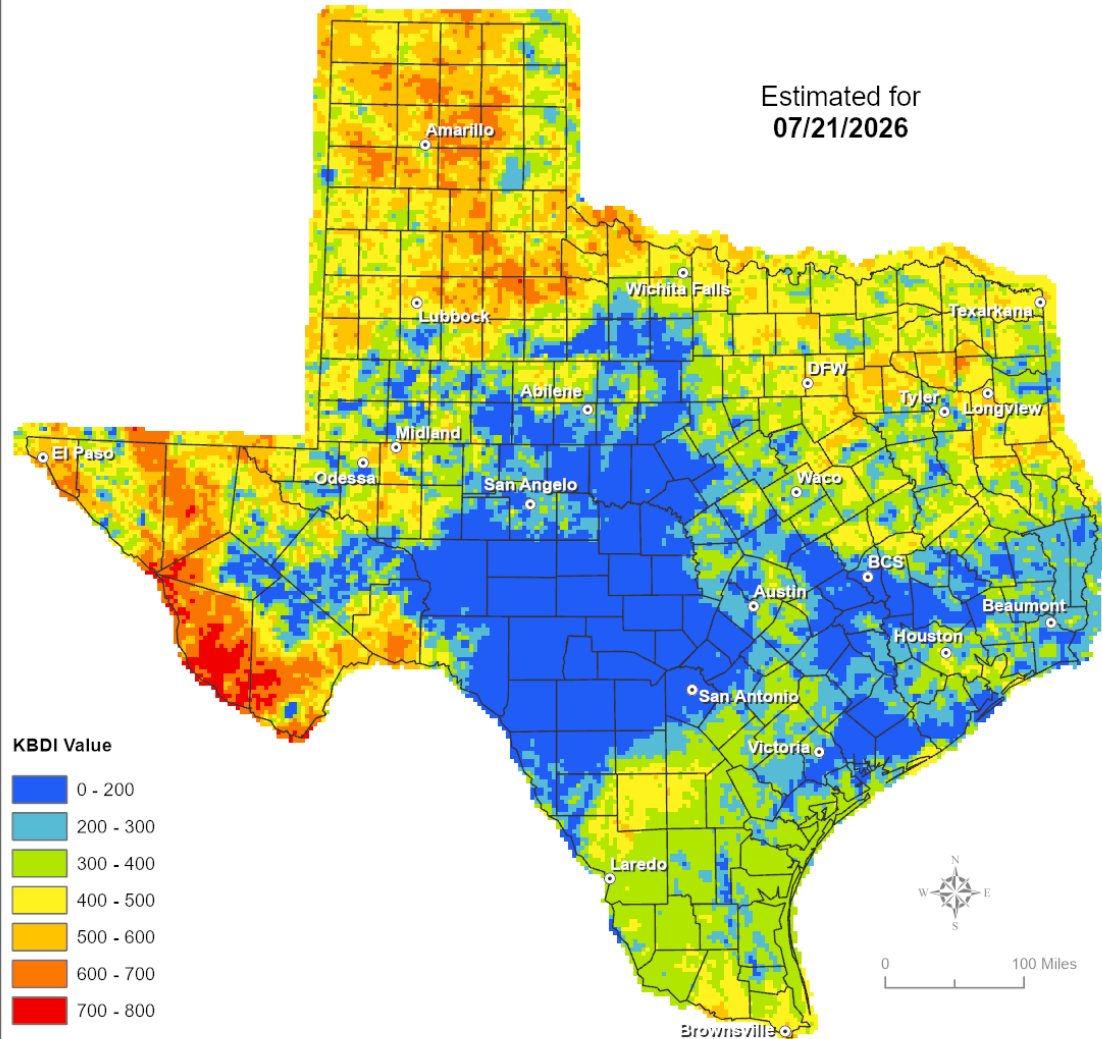

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

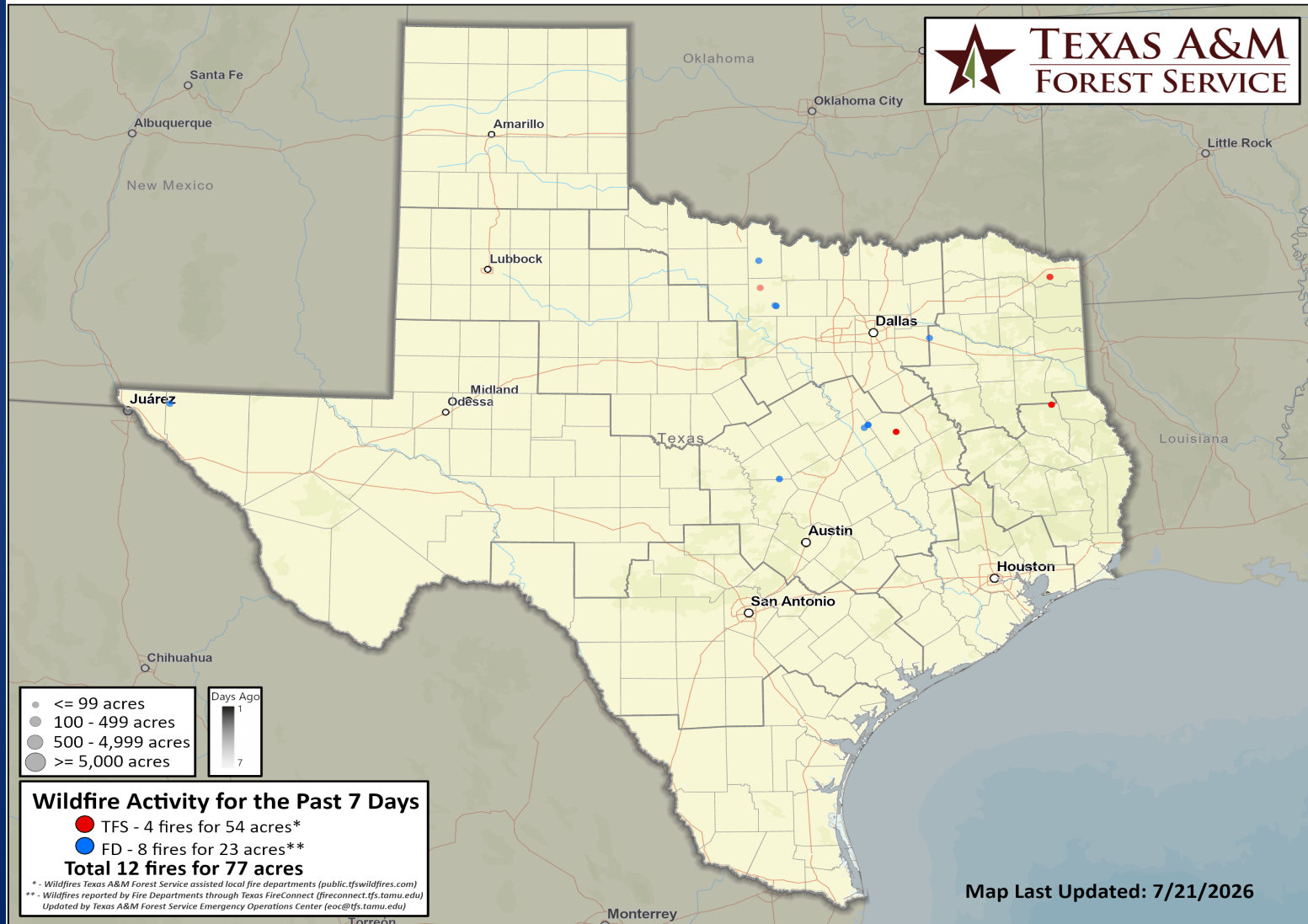
