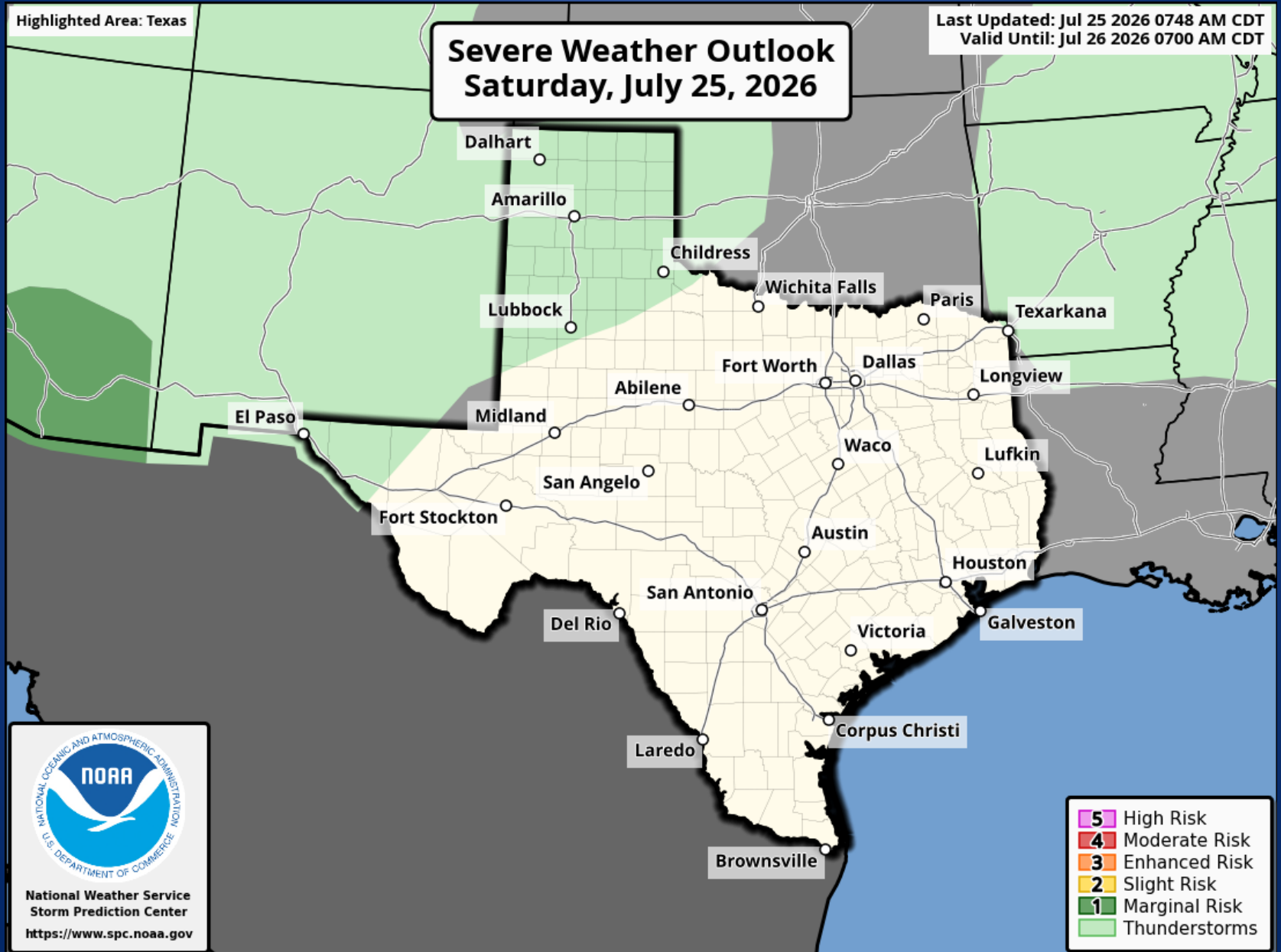

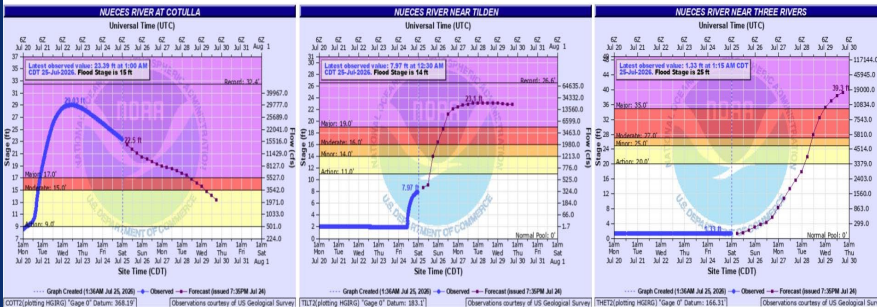

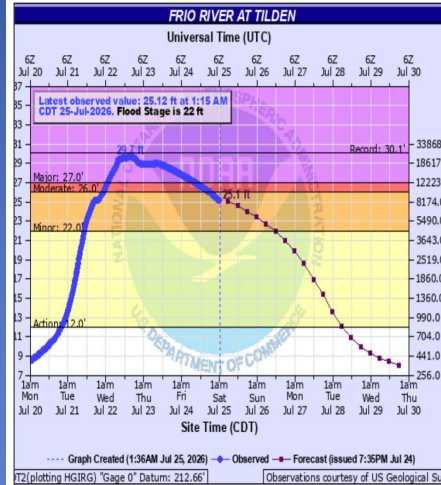

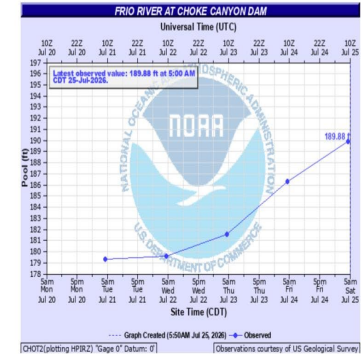
- The Frio River at has fallen into minor flood stage and will continue to fall, dropping below flood stage late Sunday or early Monday.

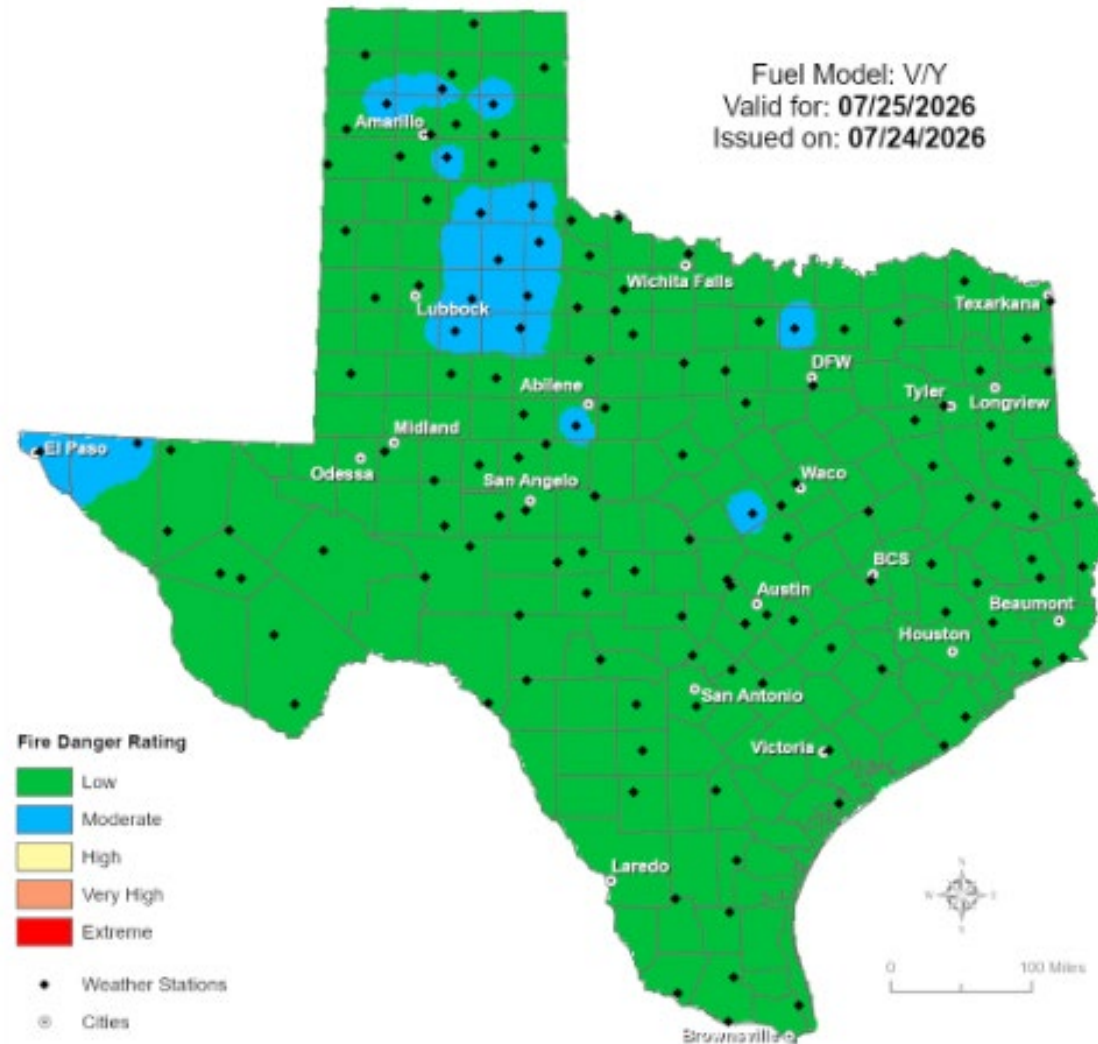

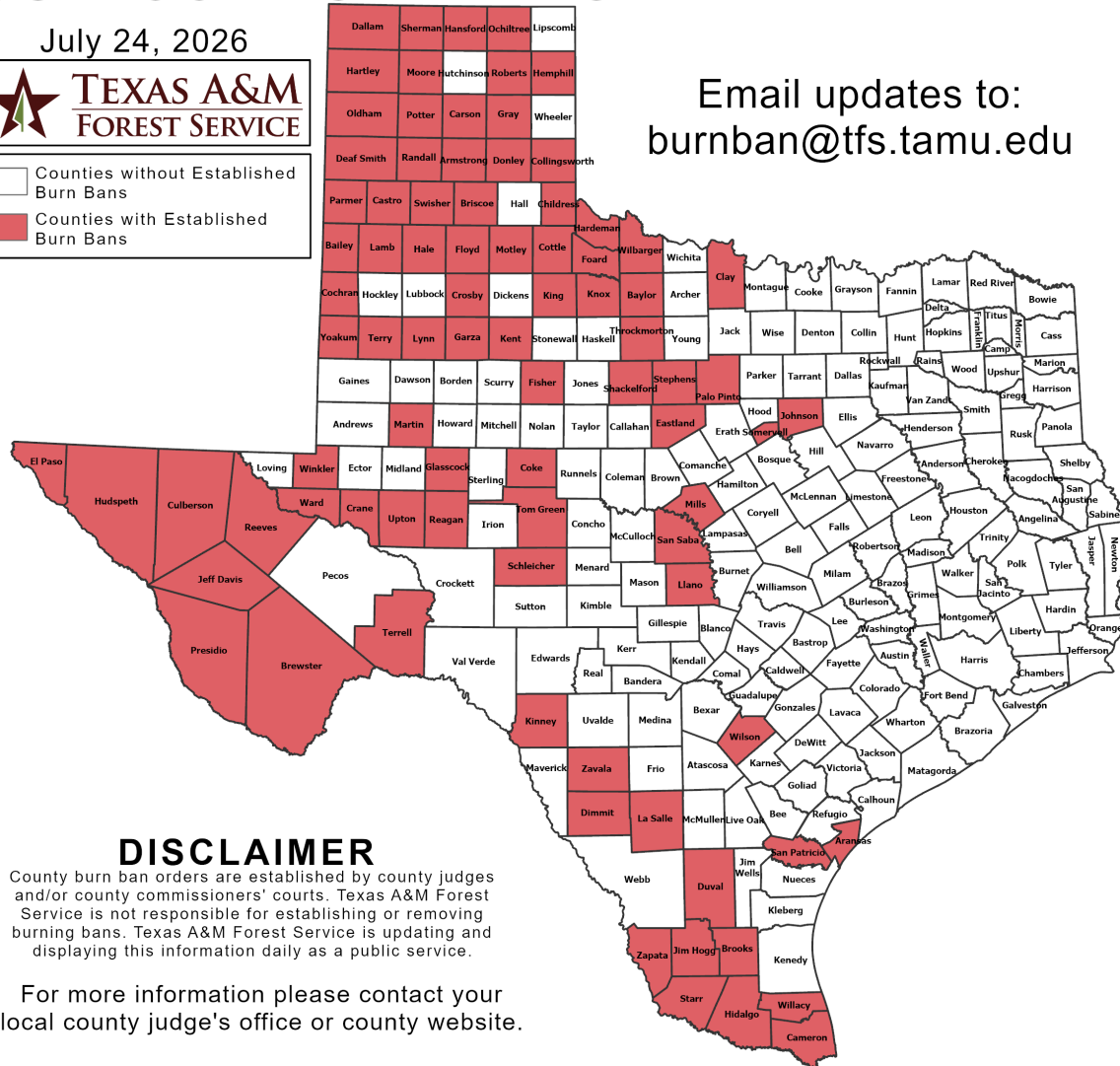

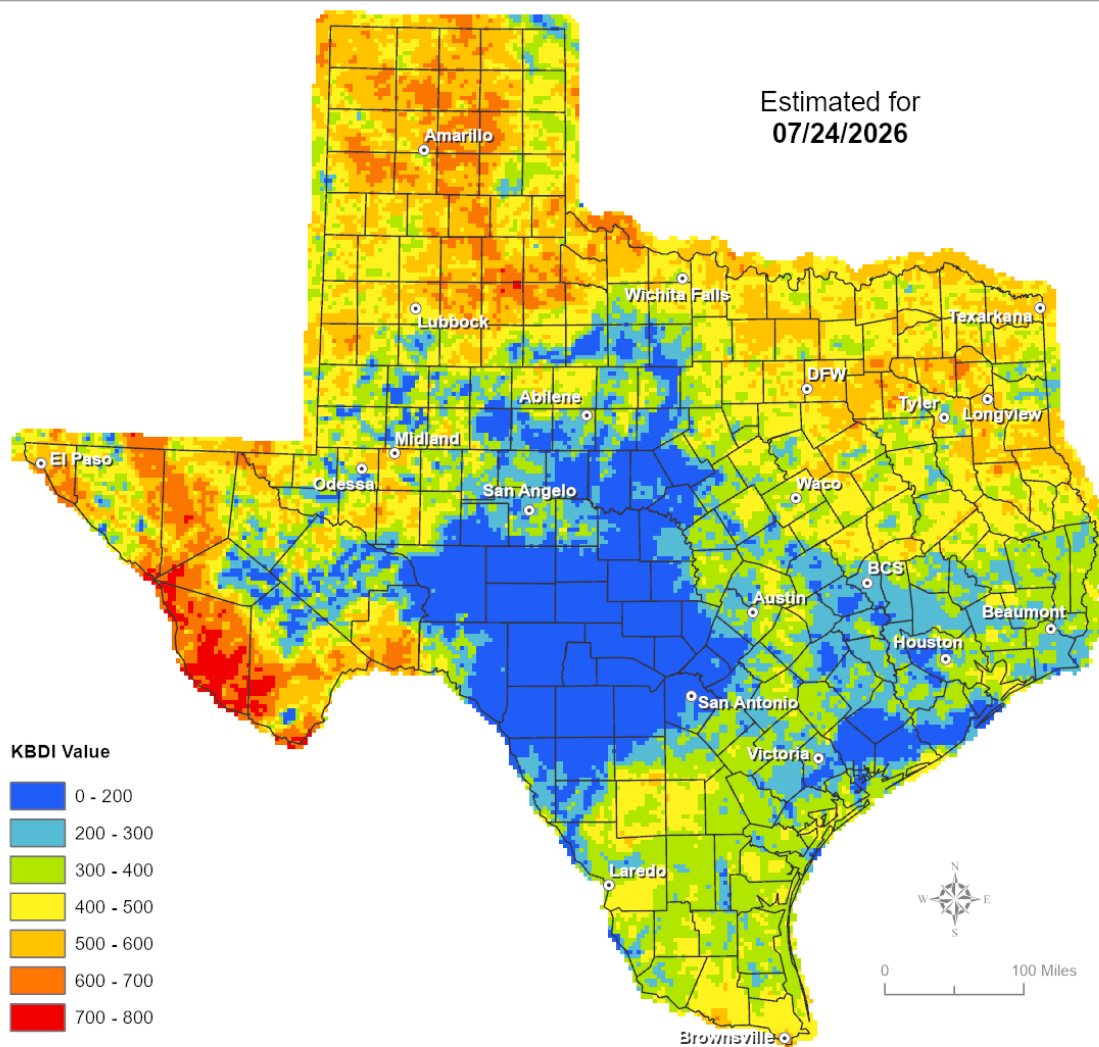

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

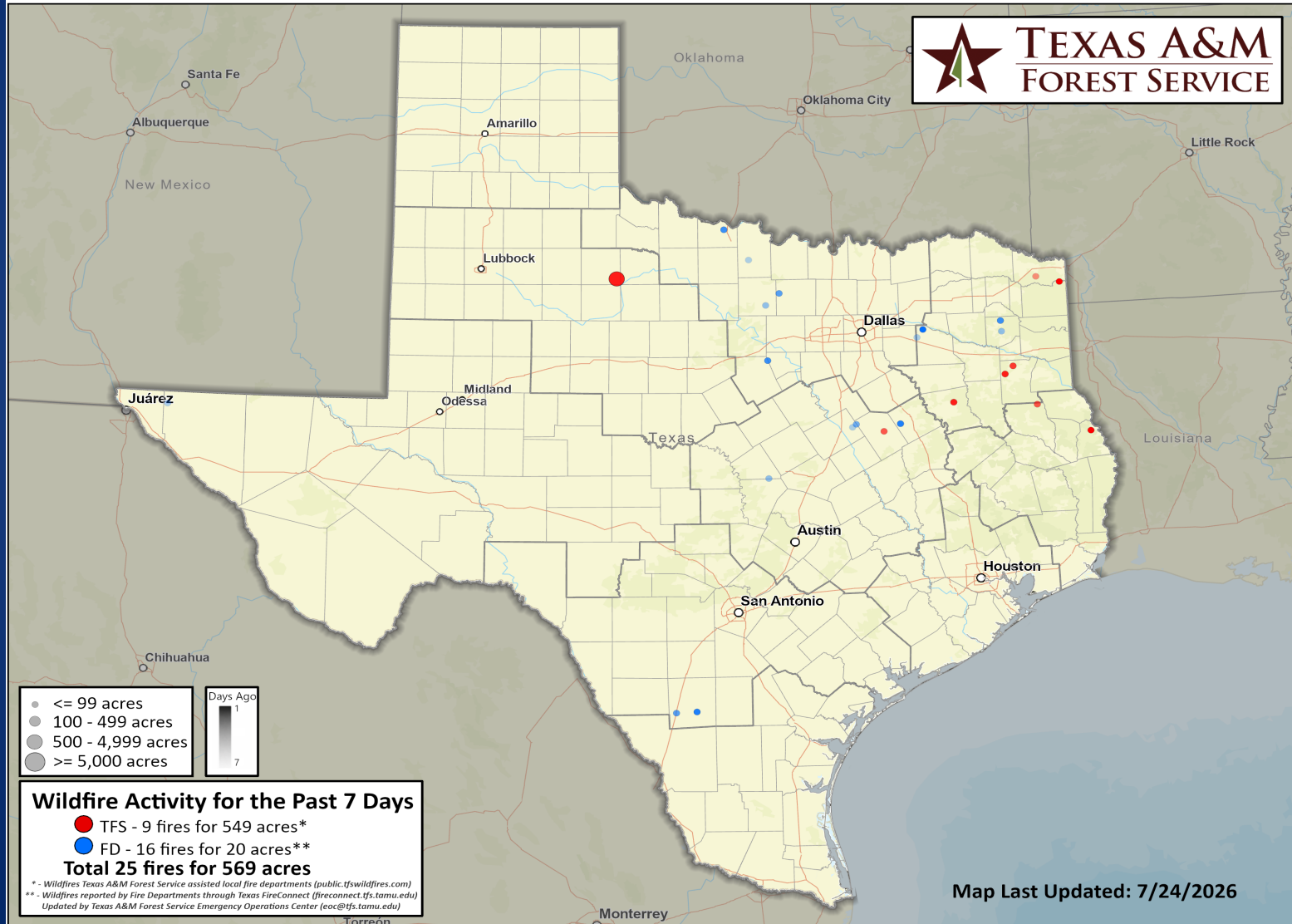
