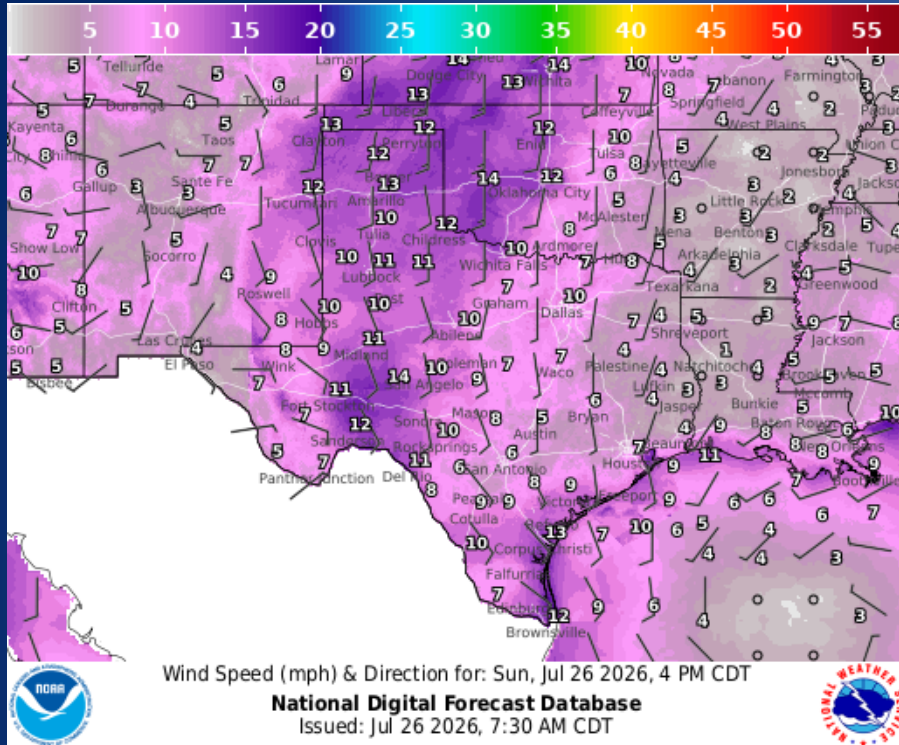

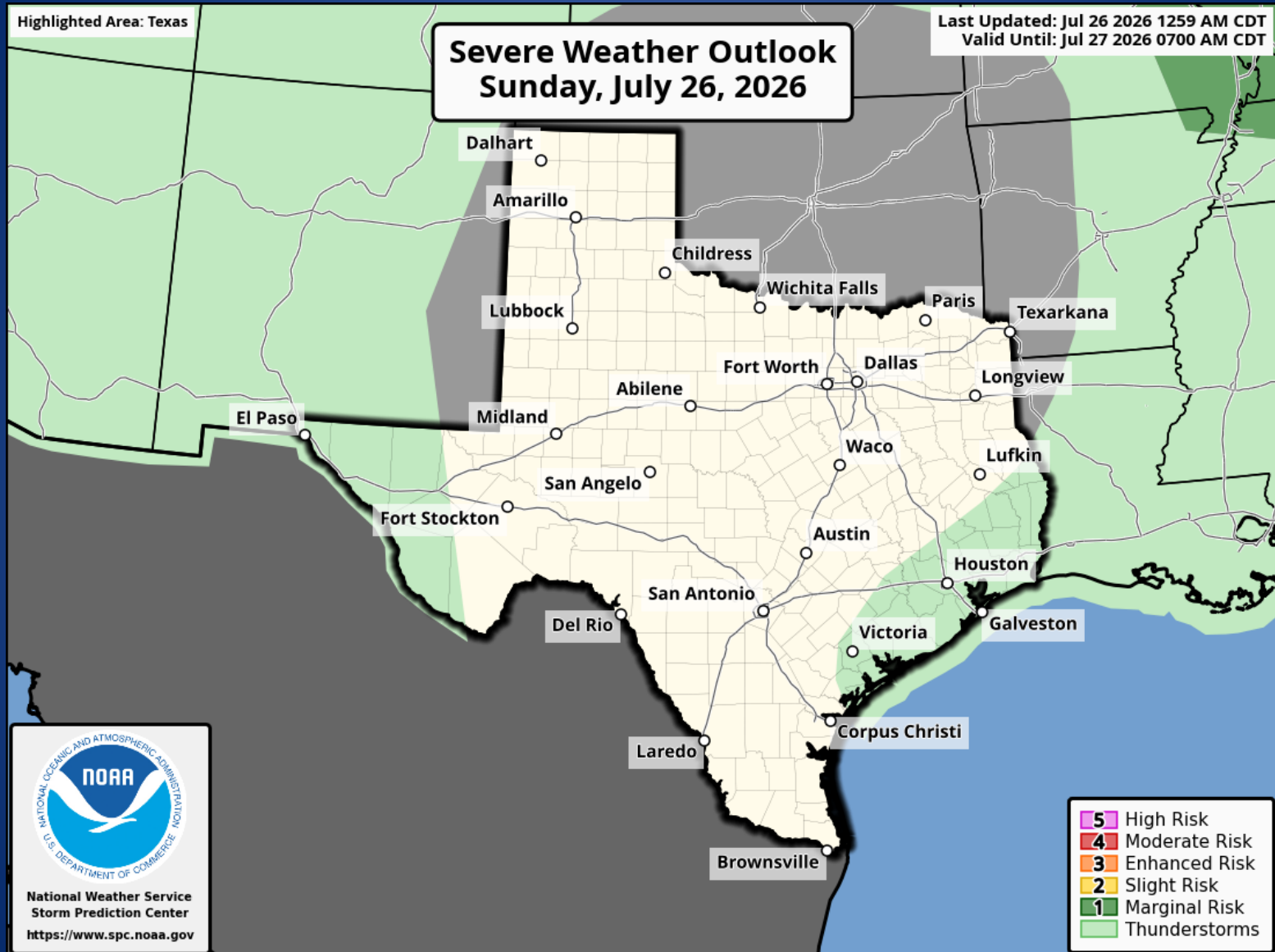

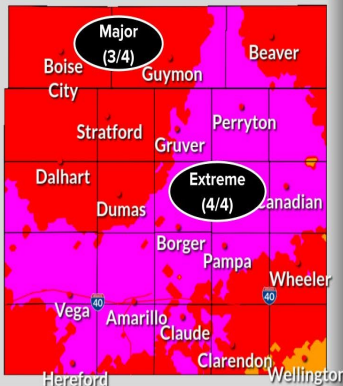

The heat wave continues across the panhandles today. This will see the highs once again go into the triple digits. The heat risk remains major to extreme across the panhandles. Prolonged heat can compound so be sure to stay hydrated and cool. **DO NOT** leave people or pets in unattended vehicles as the heat inside can quickly become deadly.

A Heat Advisory is in effect through Sunday evening for North Texas and Eastern Central Texas. High temperatures will range from 97 to 103, with heat index values up to 109. Remember to stay hydrated and take frequent breaks in air conditioned buildings.

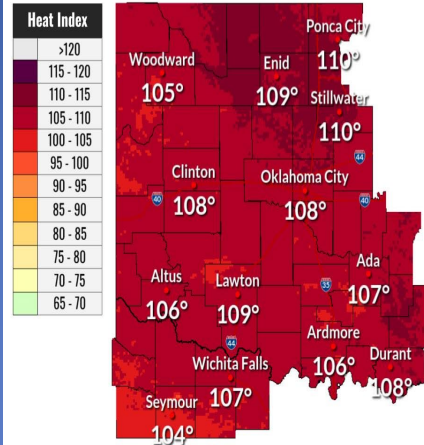

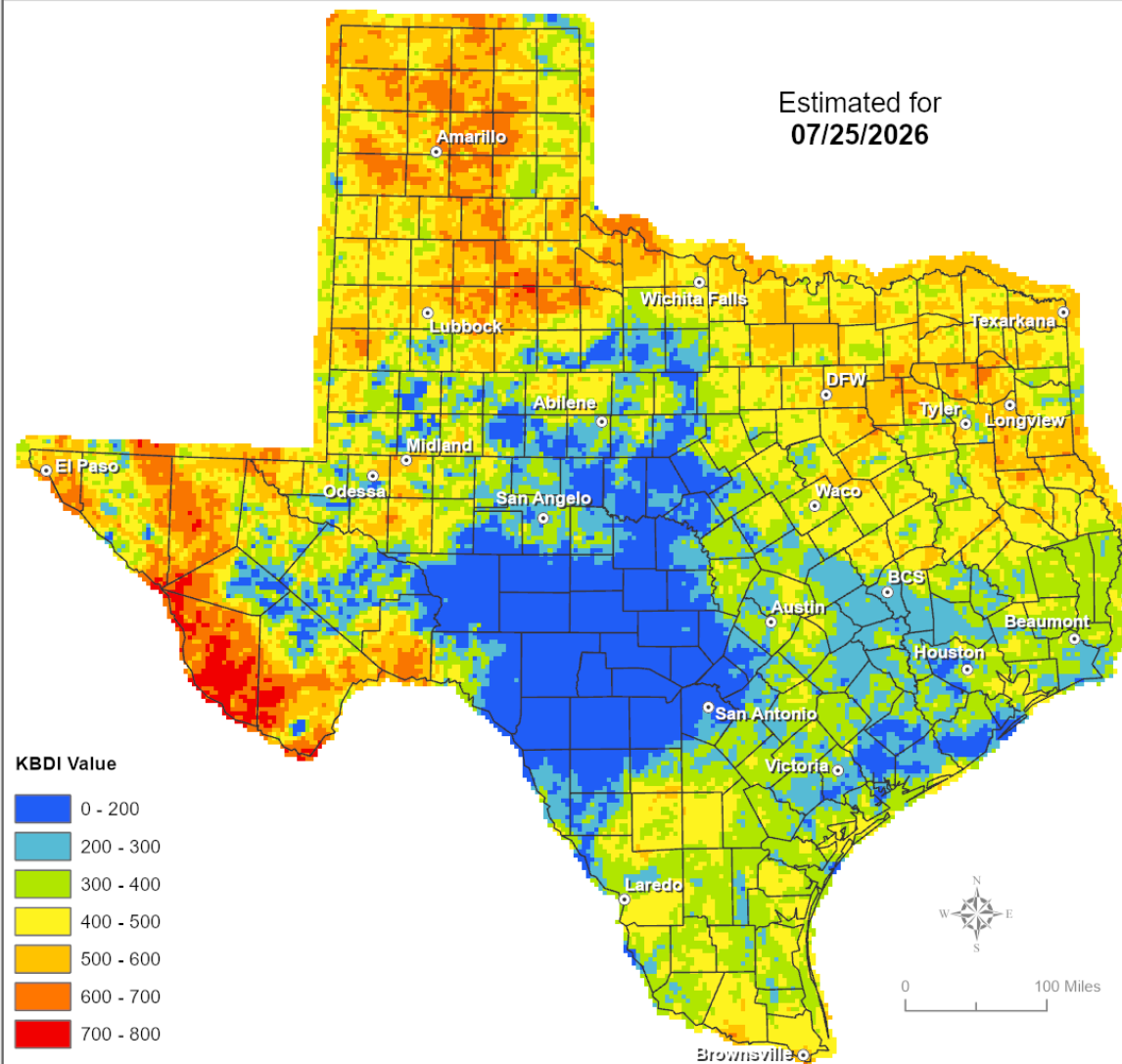

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

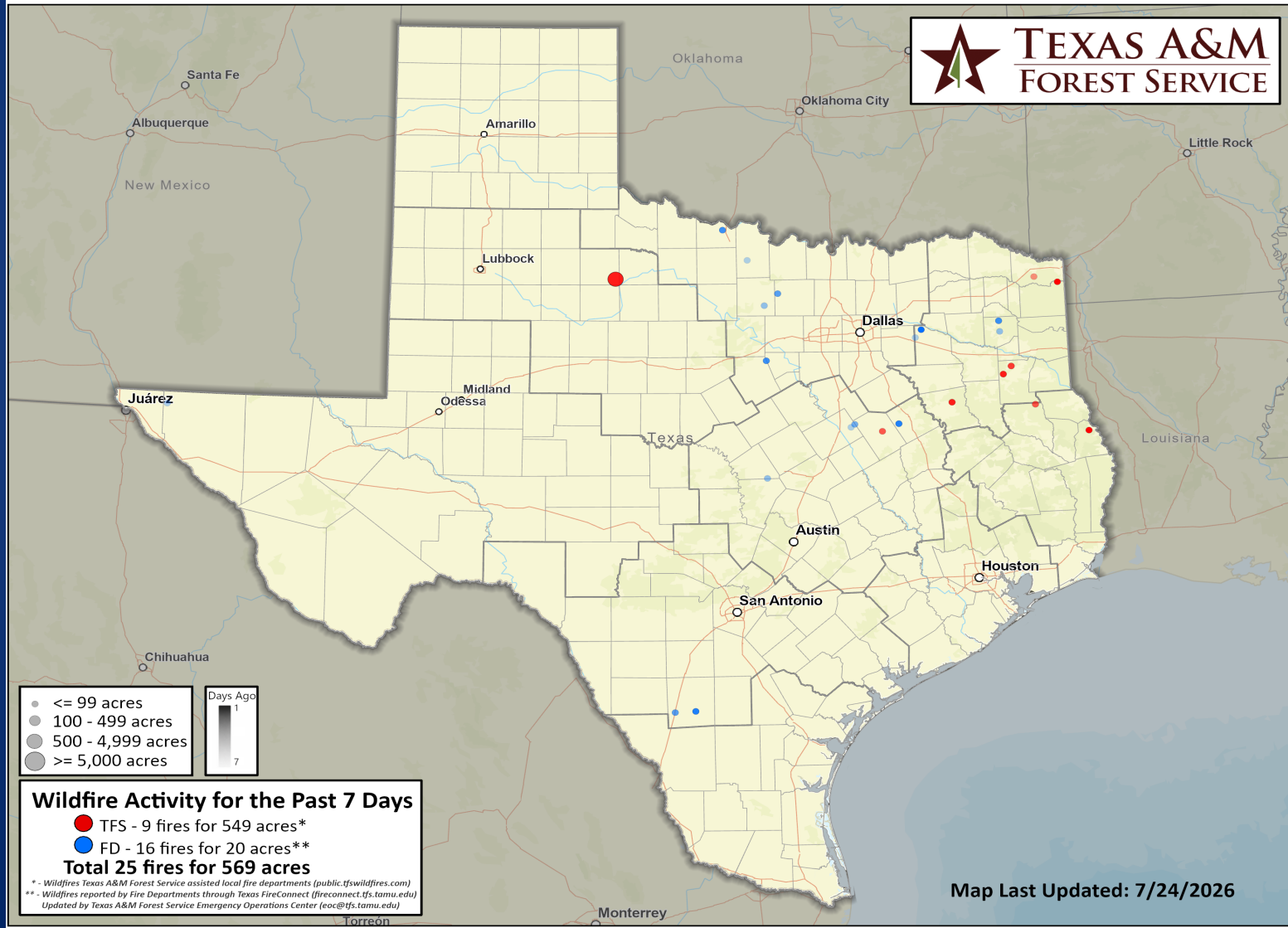
Keetch-Byram Drought Index

Report of 752 fires (No Change) and 107,662 (No Change) acres have been burned this year. There are 86 (No Change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 124 (+8) counties with an average over 400.
