The heat wave continues across the panhandles today. This will see the highs once again go into the triple digits with the hotter spots breaching 110s. The heat risk remains major to extreme across the panhandles. Prolonged heat can compound so be sure to stay hydrated and cool. DO NOT leave people or pets in unattended vehicles as the heat inside can quickly become deadly.

A Heat Advisory is in effect for the Coastal Plains and portions of the Rio Grande Plains Tuesday from Noon to 7PM. Temperatures will climb to between 99-103 on Tuesday and in combination with humidity, it will feel hotter, between 108-111 at times.

Key Messages

- Triple-digit Heat Indices expected each afternoon
- Warm and muggy conditions at night provide little to no relief
- Moderate to Major (levels 2/3 of 4) Heat Risk expected, with Extreme (level 4 of 4) Heat Risk possible mid to late week

A Heat Advisory is in effect for almost all of Southeast Texas (excluding the barrier islands) Tuesday afternoon and evening. ⚠️ High temperatures in the upper 90s to around 100, along with heat index values up to 110 can be expected. 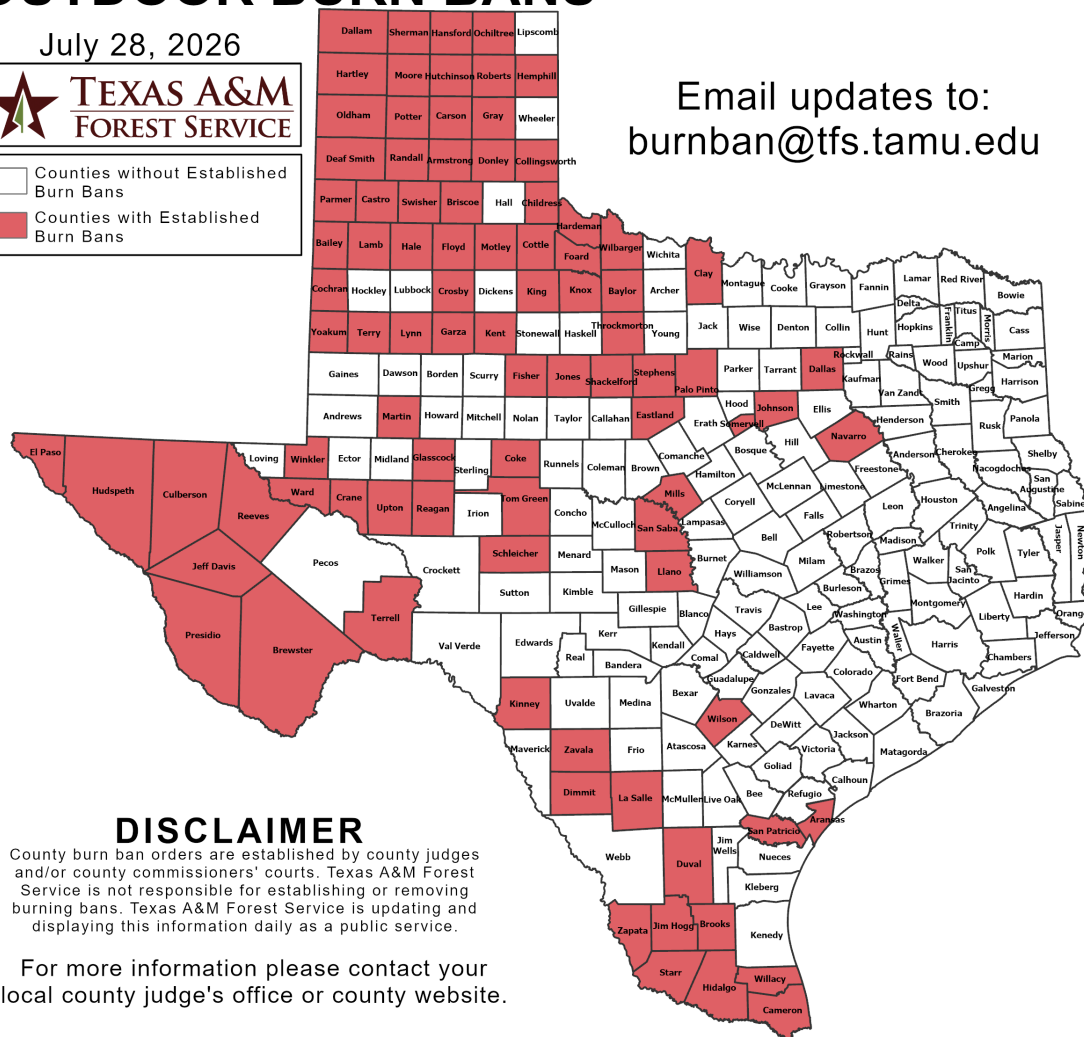

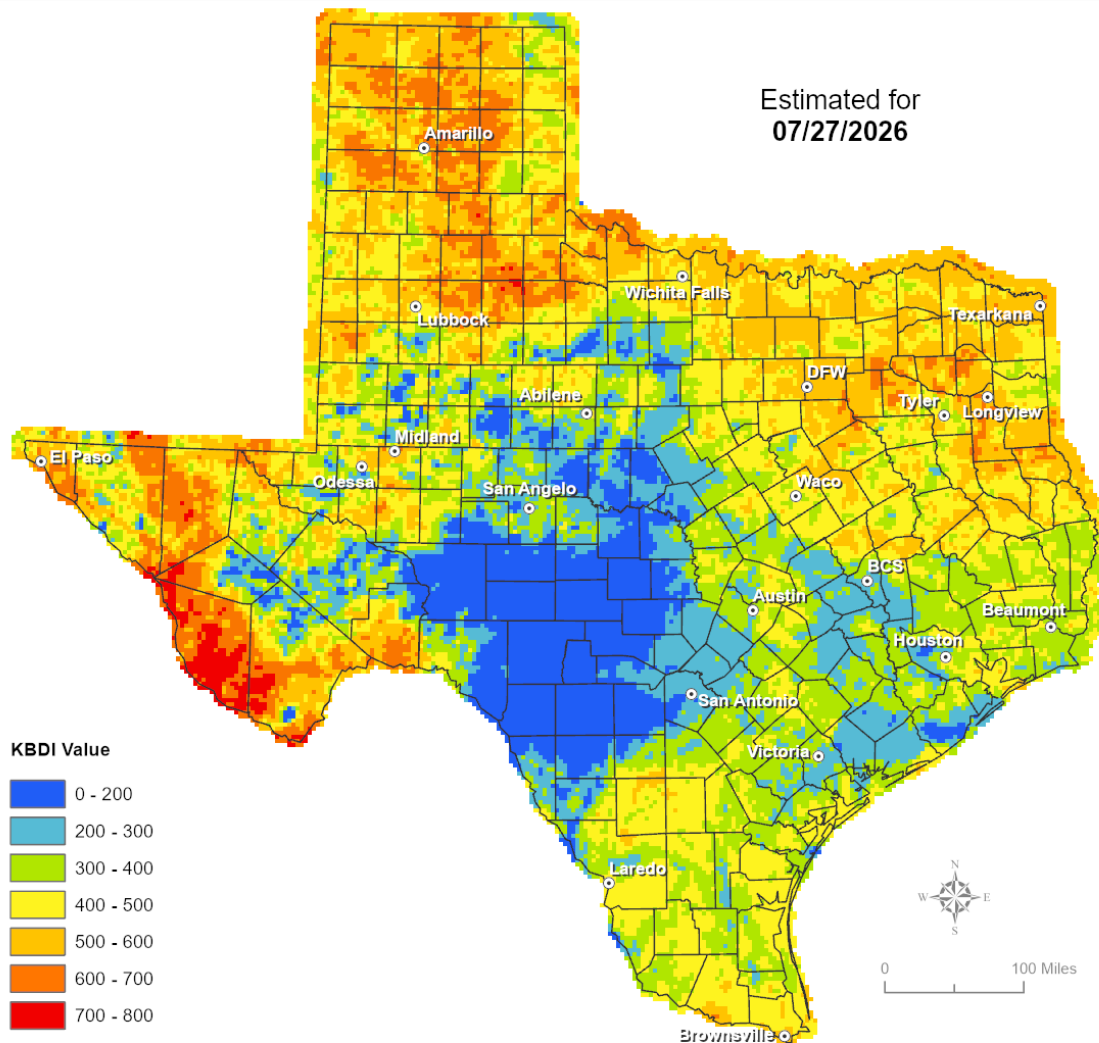

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

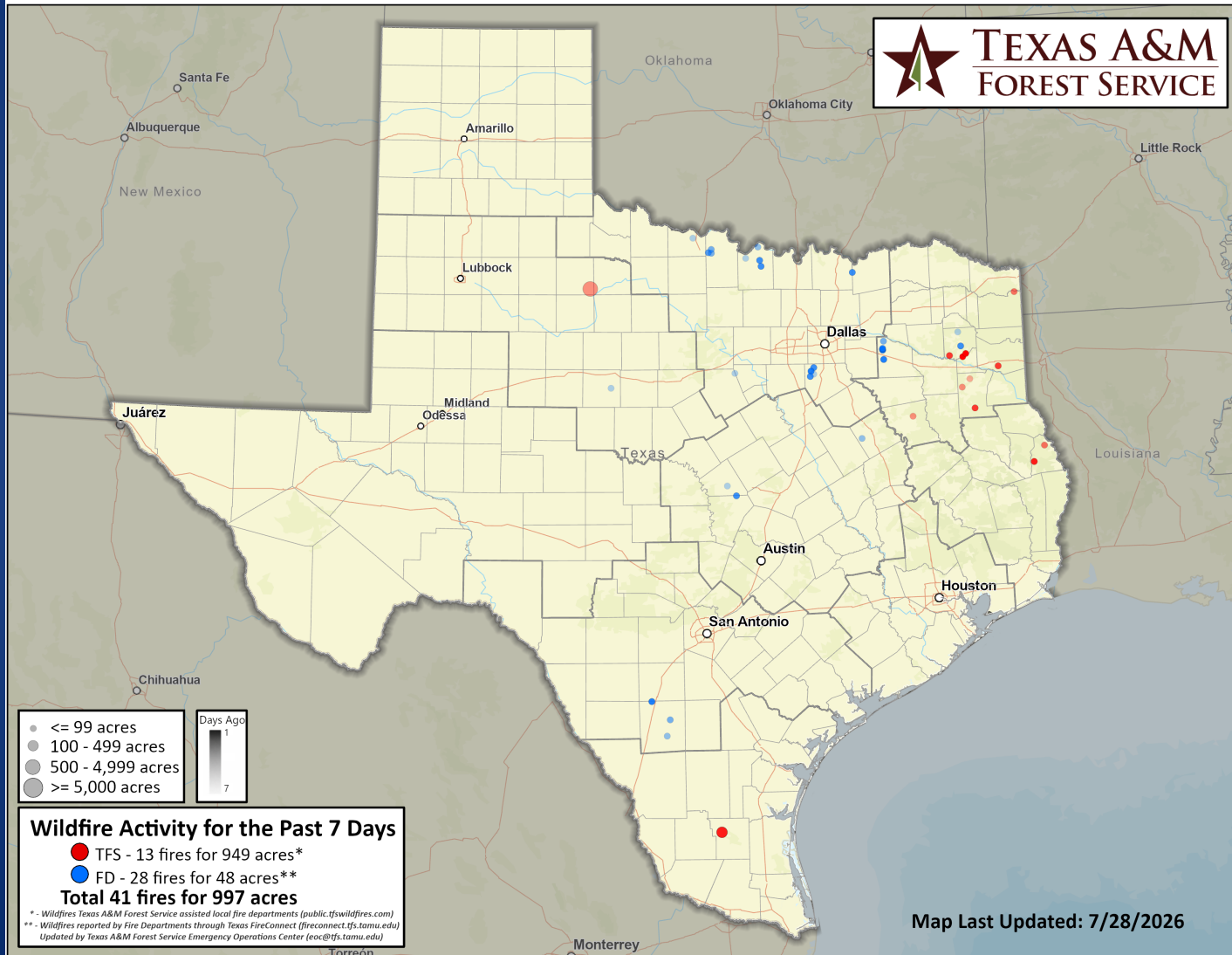
