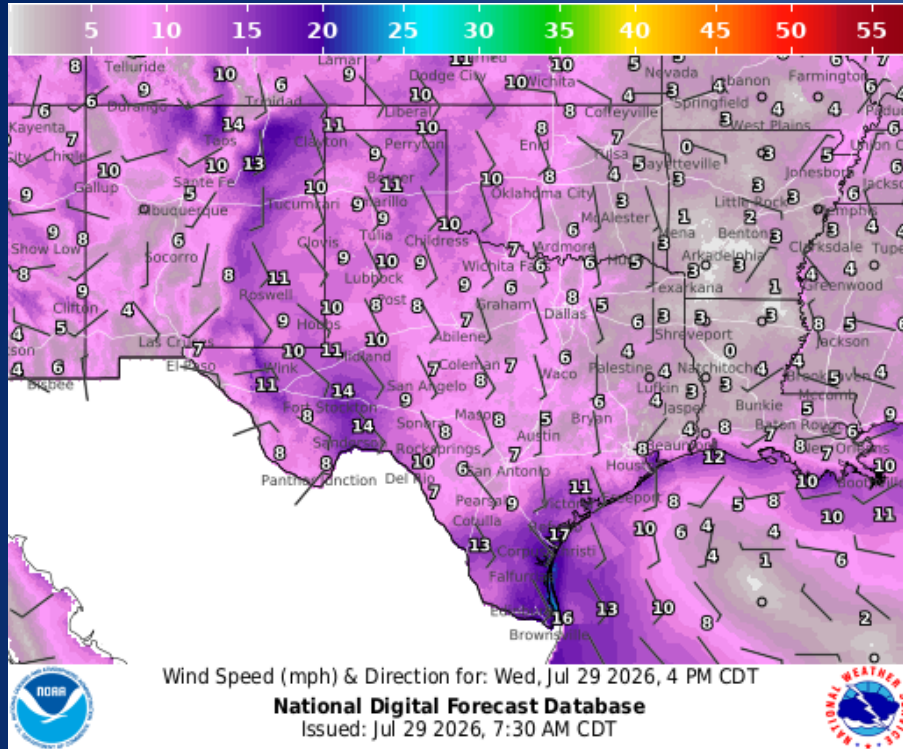

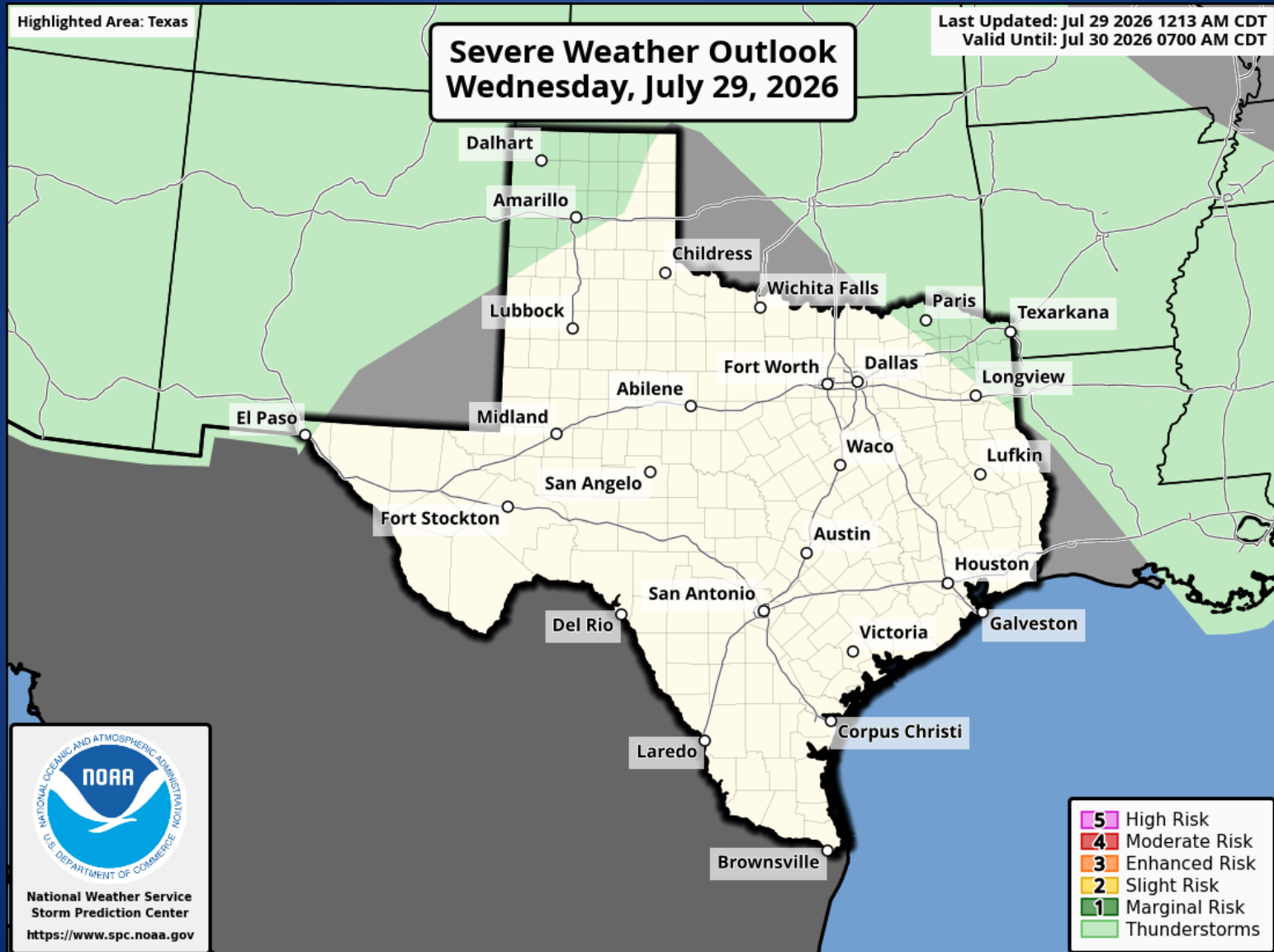

Practice Heat Safety to Prevent Heat-Related Illnesses



Key Messages

- Triple-digit Heat Indices expected each afternoon
- Warm and muggy conditions at night provide little to no relief
- Major (level 3 of 4) to **Extreme** (level 4 of 4) Heat Risk expected through the weekend

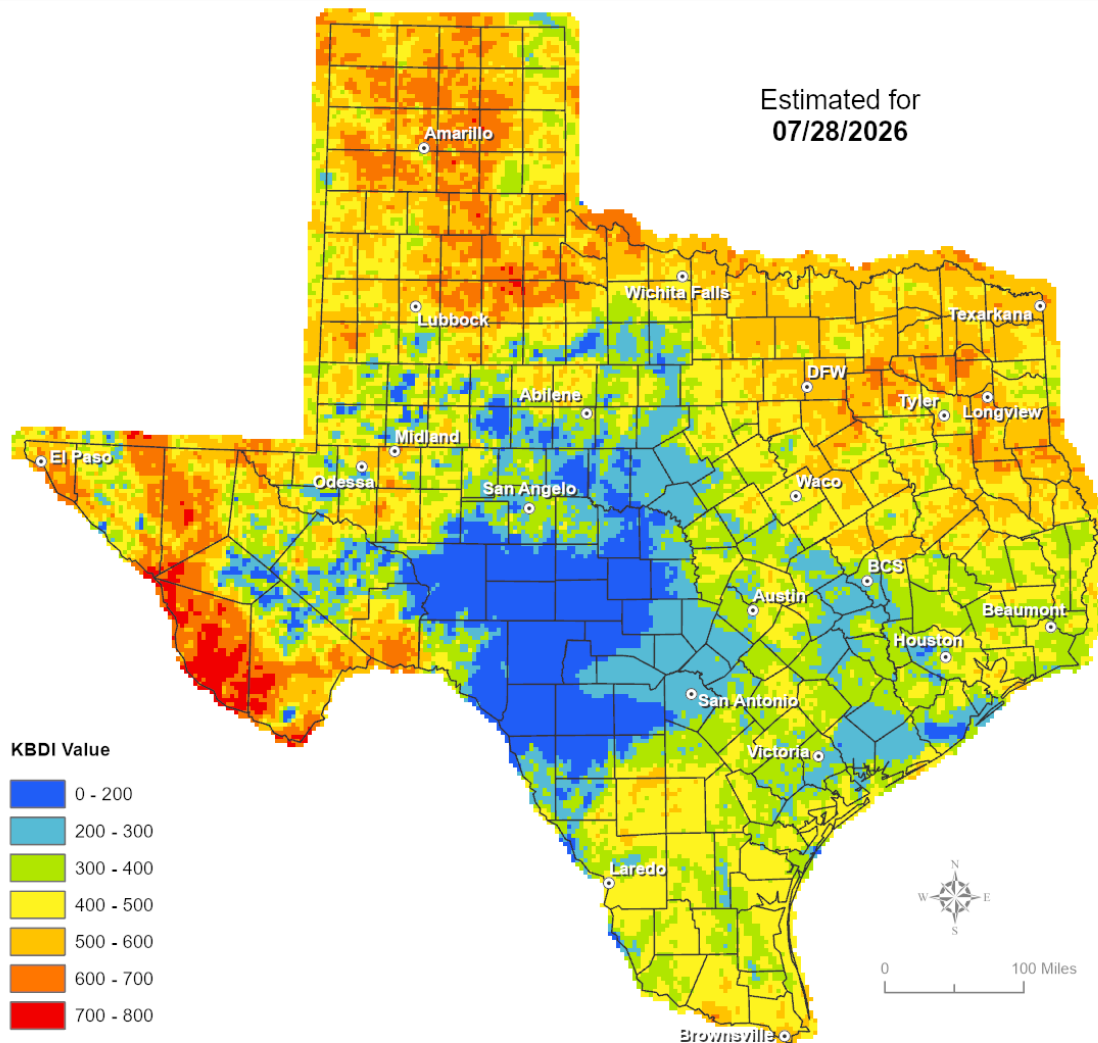


Keetch-Byram Drought Index

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

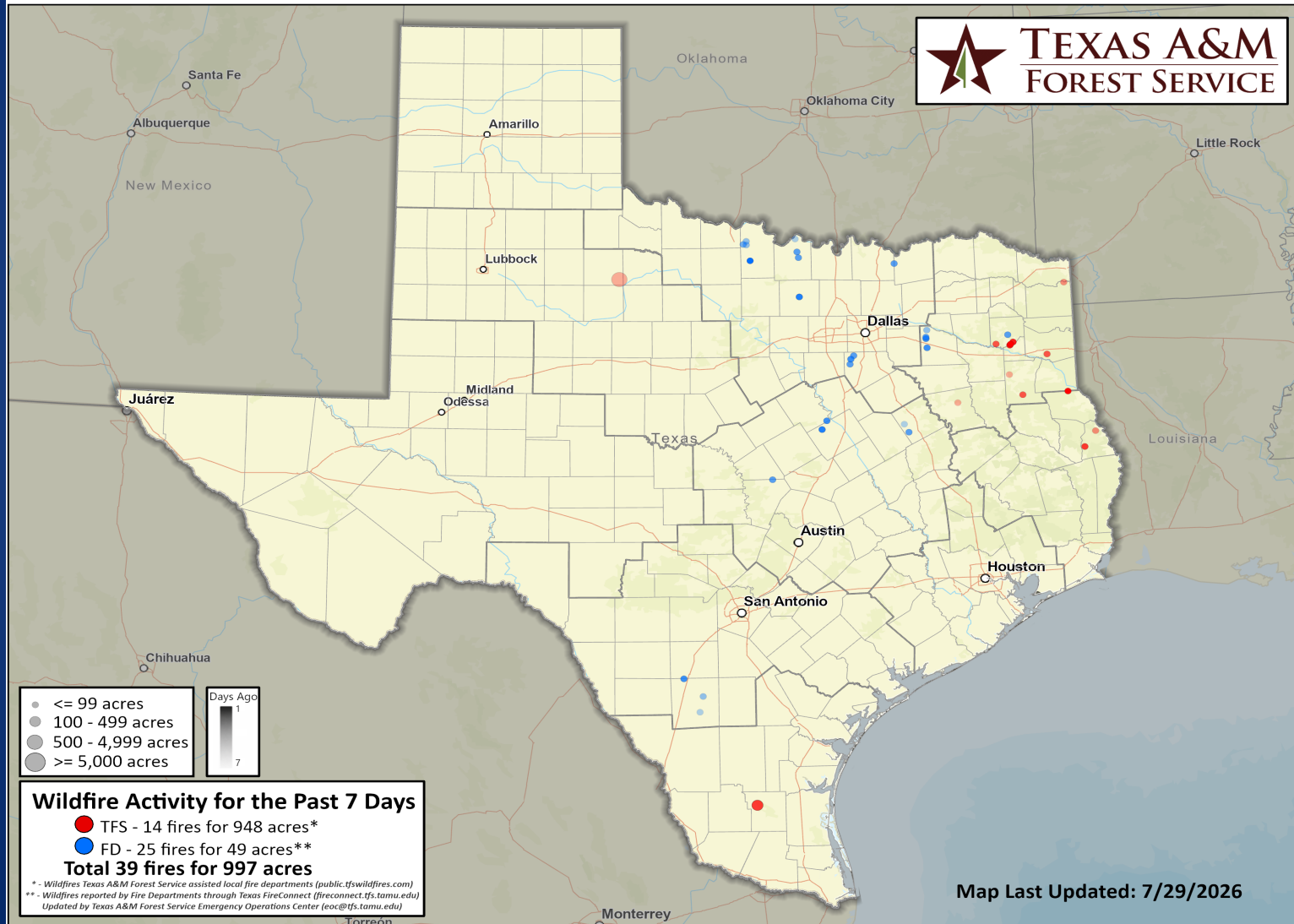
