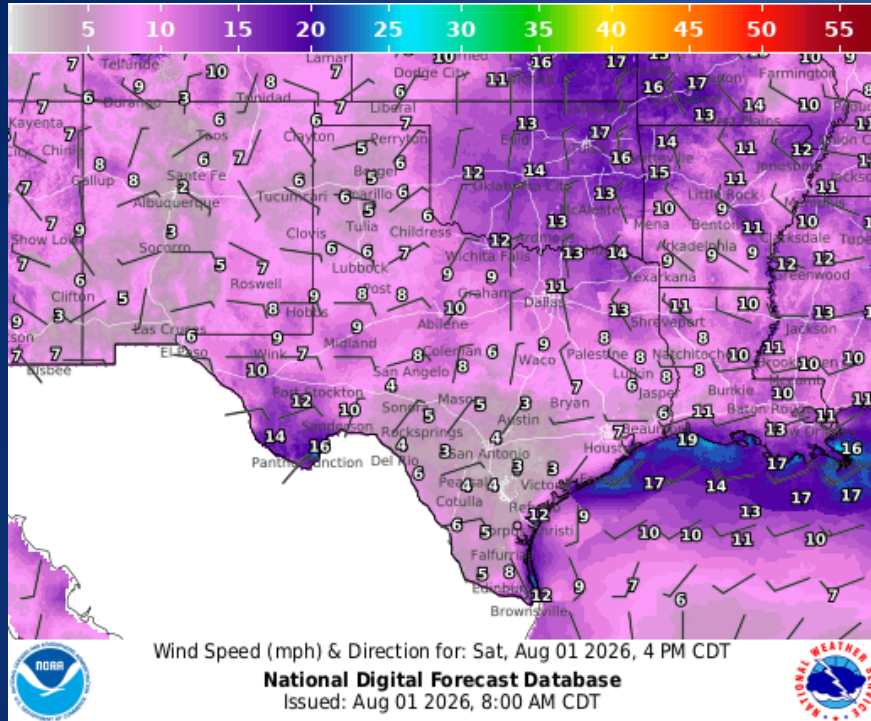

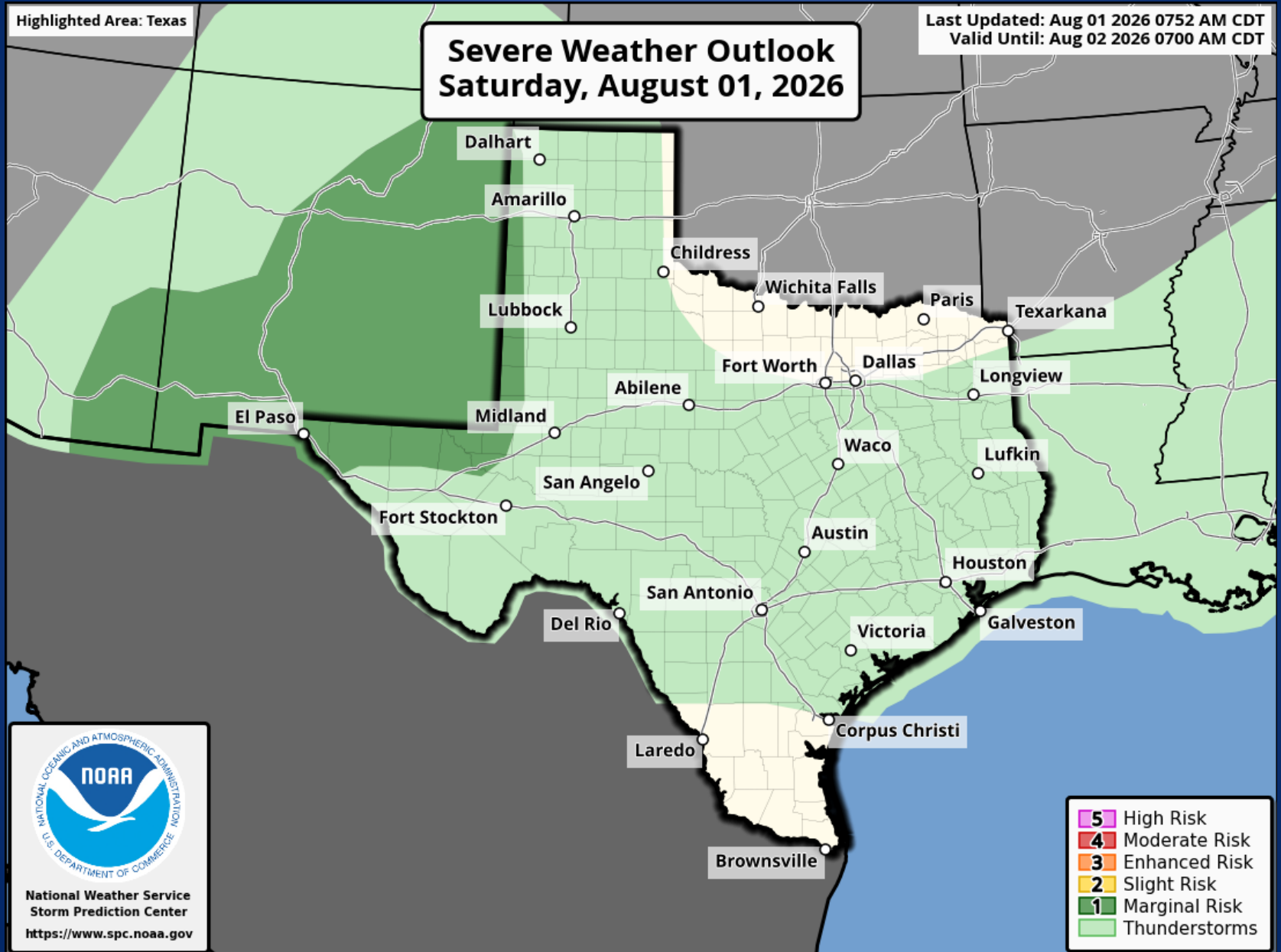

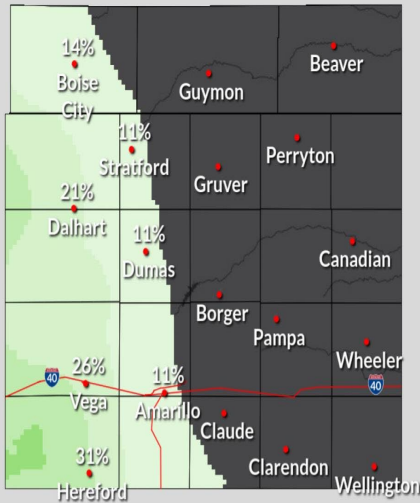

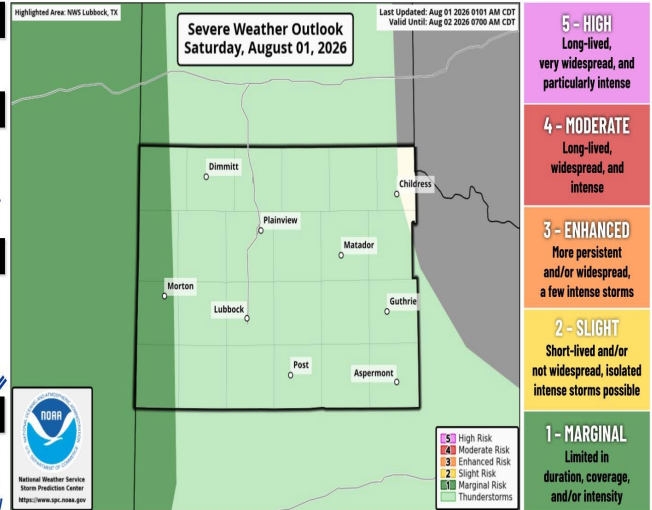

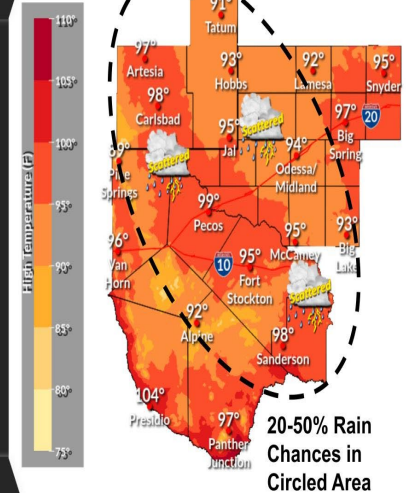

Cooler Today, With Some Storm Chances

Key Points

- Temperatures cool today behind a front. Most locations see highs near or even just below seasonal norms.
- Additional showers and thunderstorms develop later this afternoon and evening. The best chances (40-50%) will be for portions of the Trans-Pecos and in southeast New Mexico. Lower chances (10-30%) exist elsewhere within the circled area.
- Heavy rain may lead to instances of flash flooding. Some storms may also produce strong winds and frequent lightning.

Shower and storm chances increase again this afternoon and evening for much of the area, especially in southeast New Mexico and for portions of the Trans-Pecos. Highs top out near or even a degree or two below normal behind a cold front.

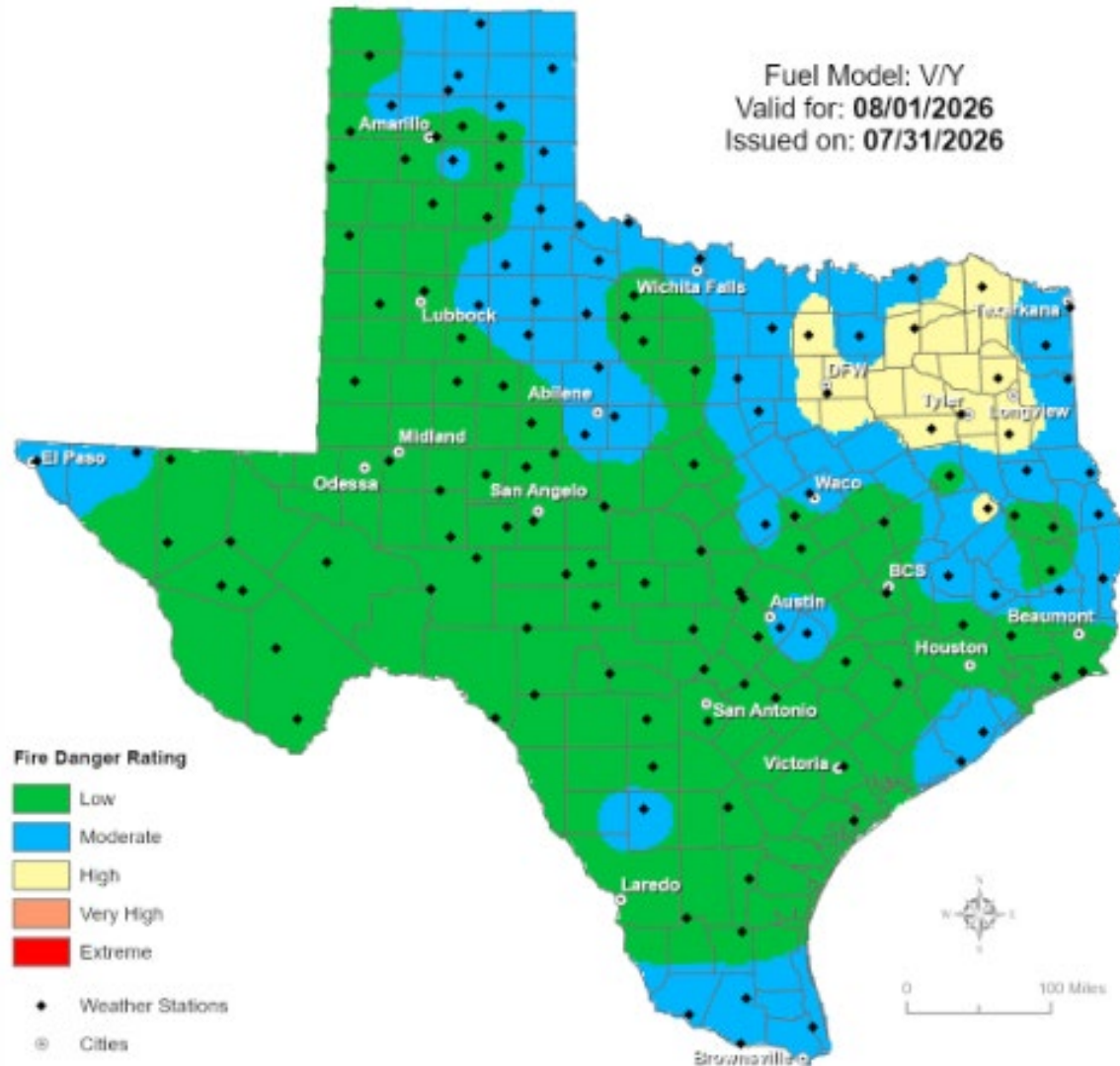

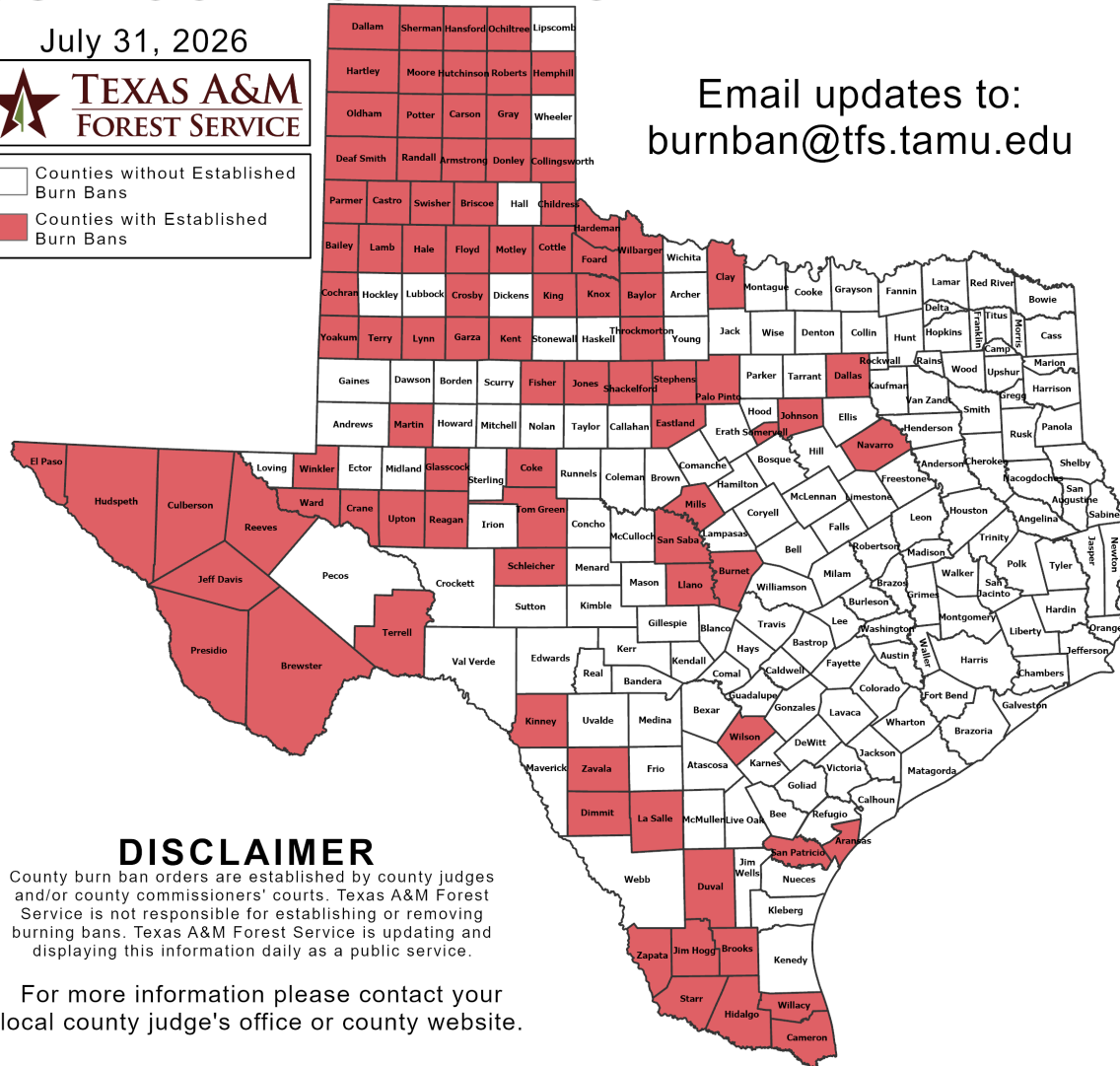

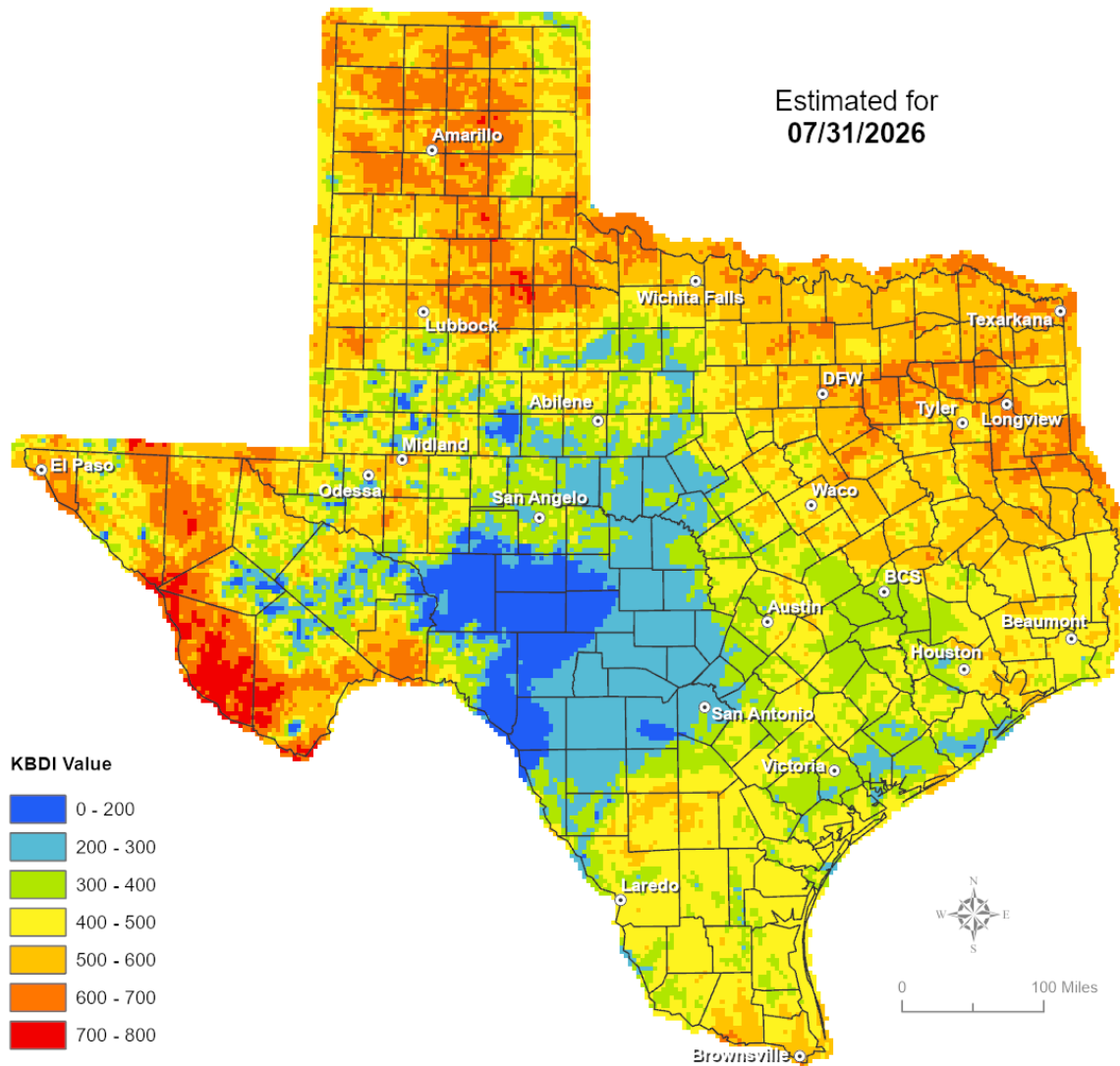

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

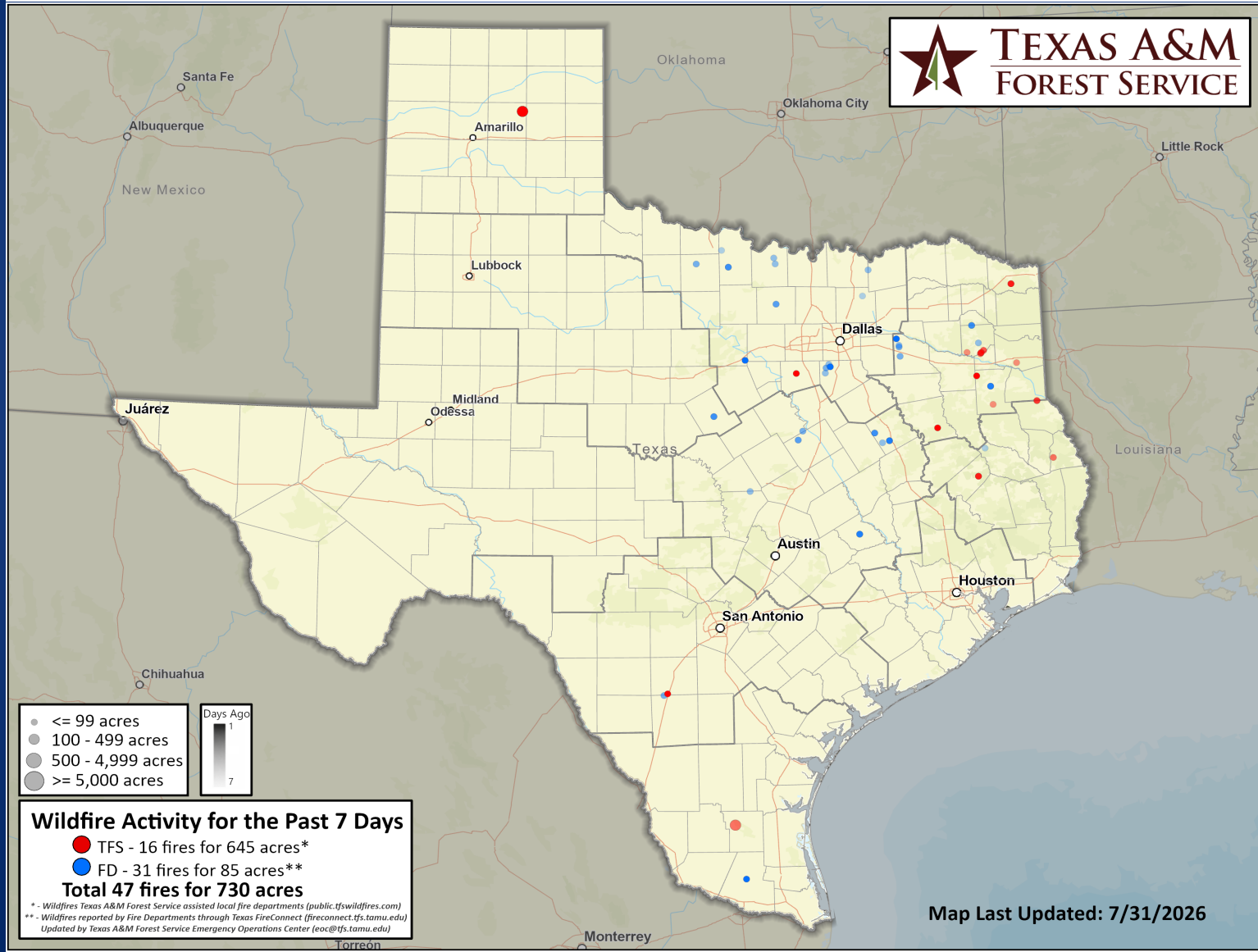
Keetch-Byram Drought Index
