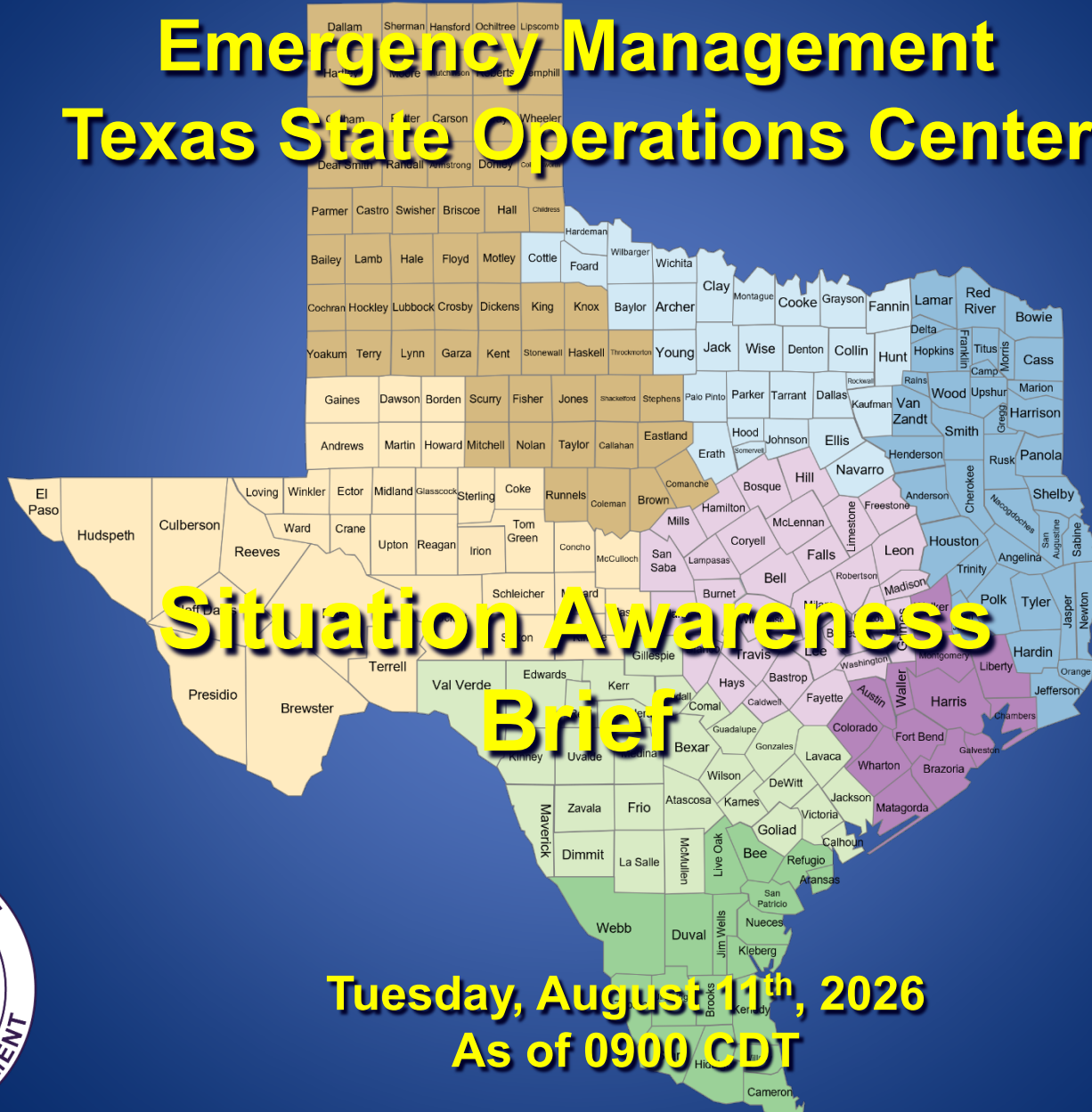

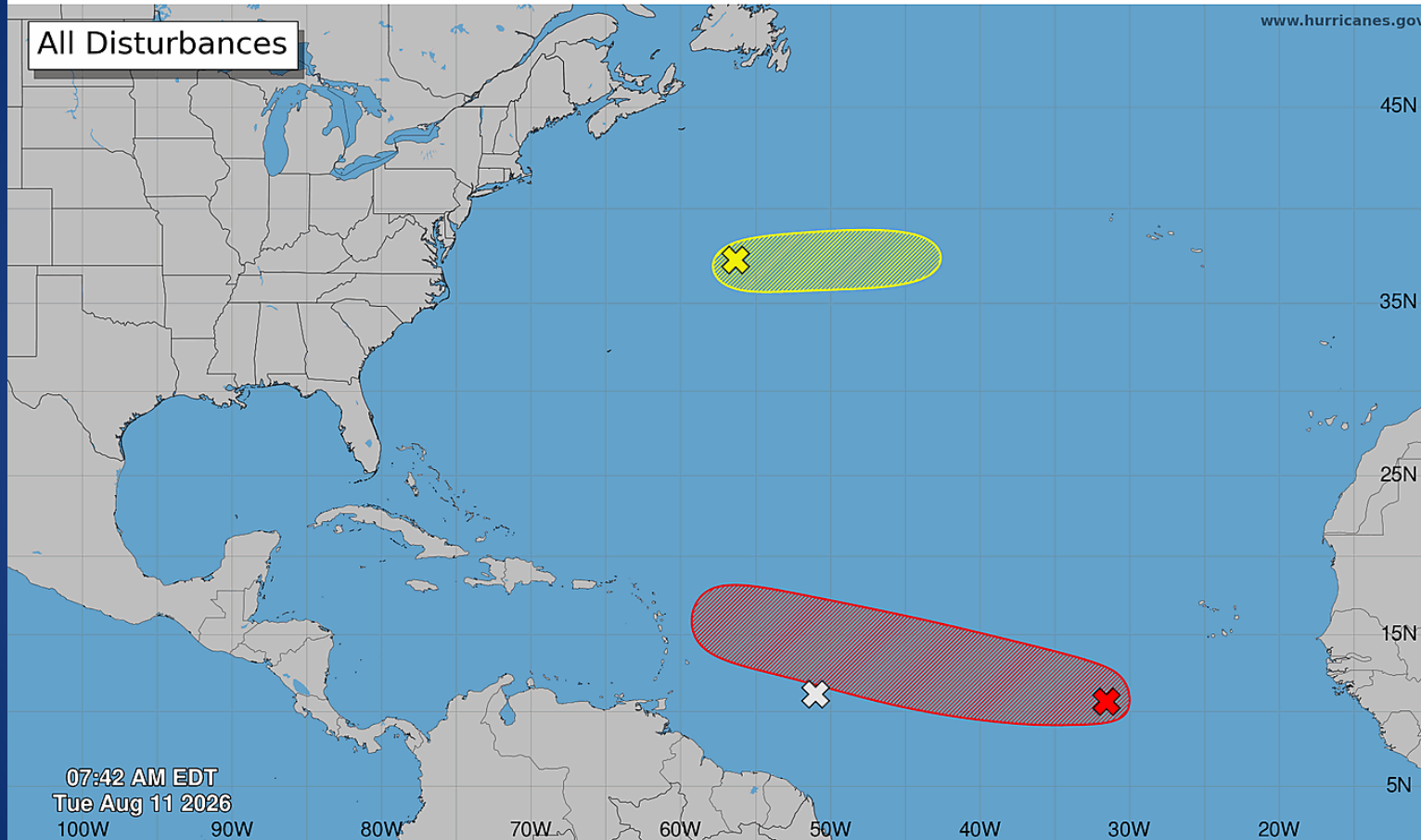


Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook National Hurricane Center Miami, Florida

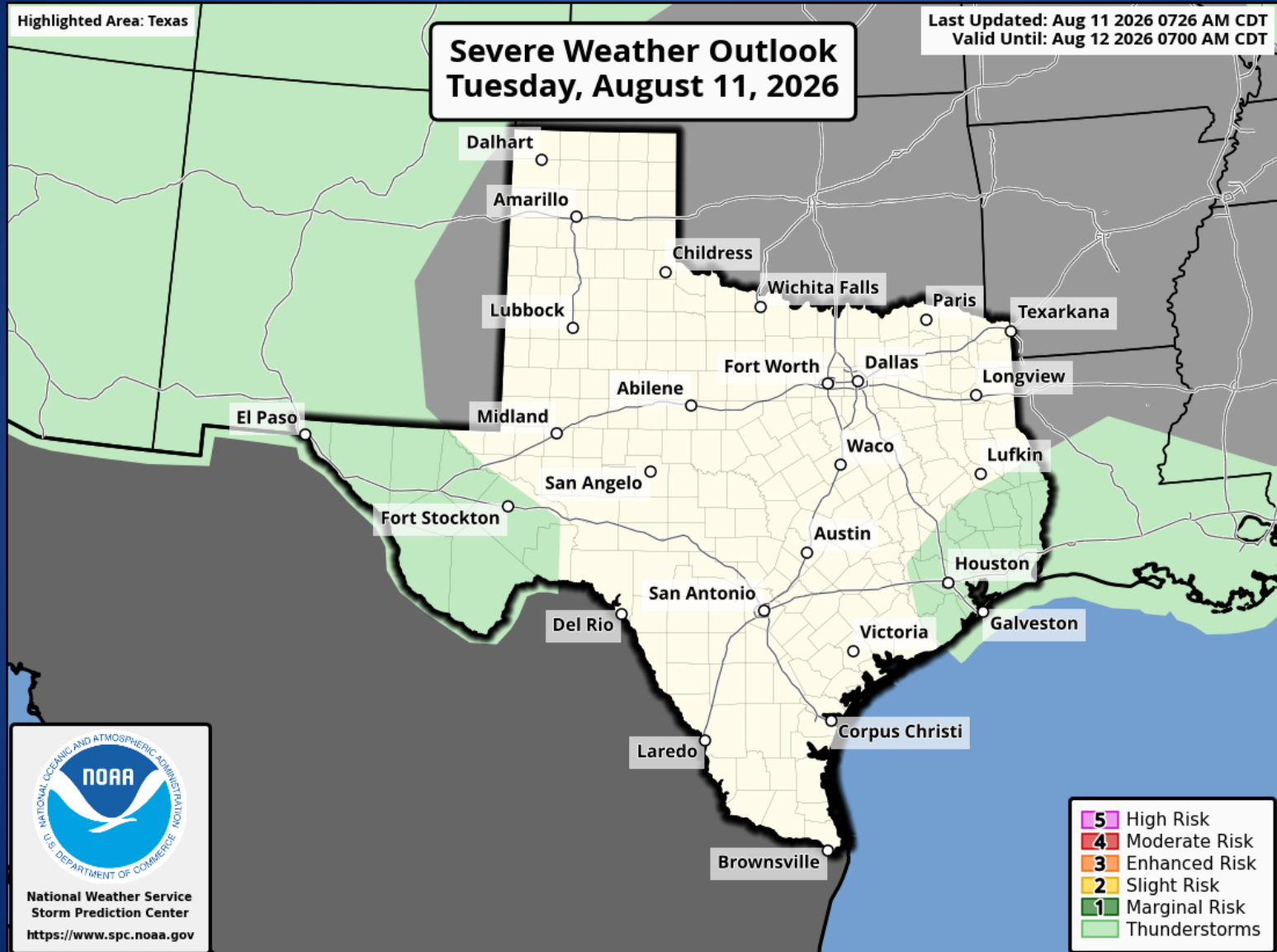

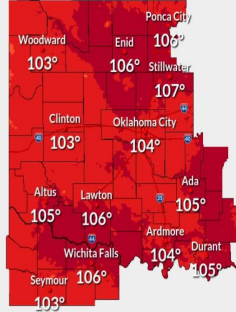

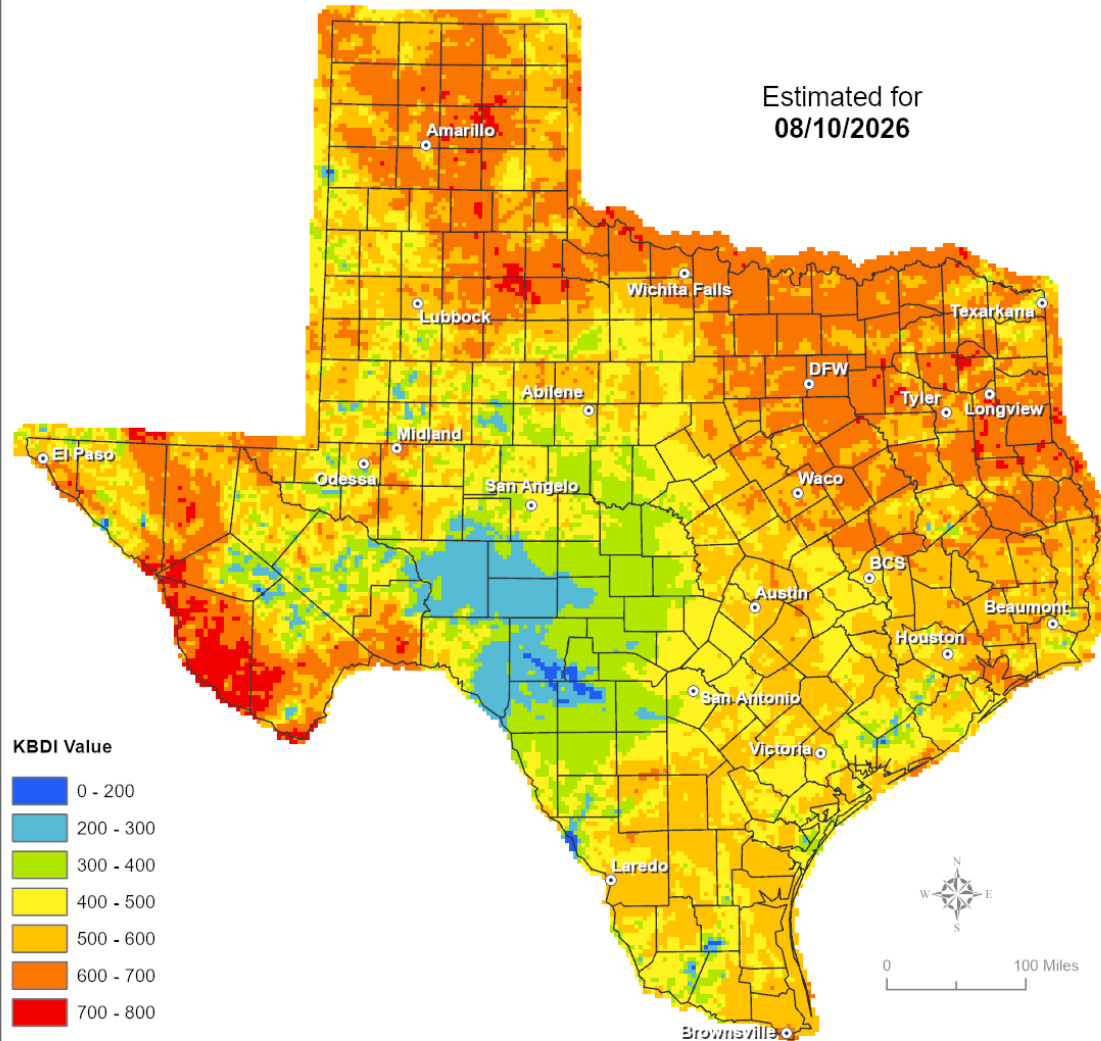

Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Report of 830 fires and 112,372 (+2,171) acres have been burned this year. There are 121 (+8) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 231 (+3) counties with an average over 400.
