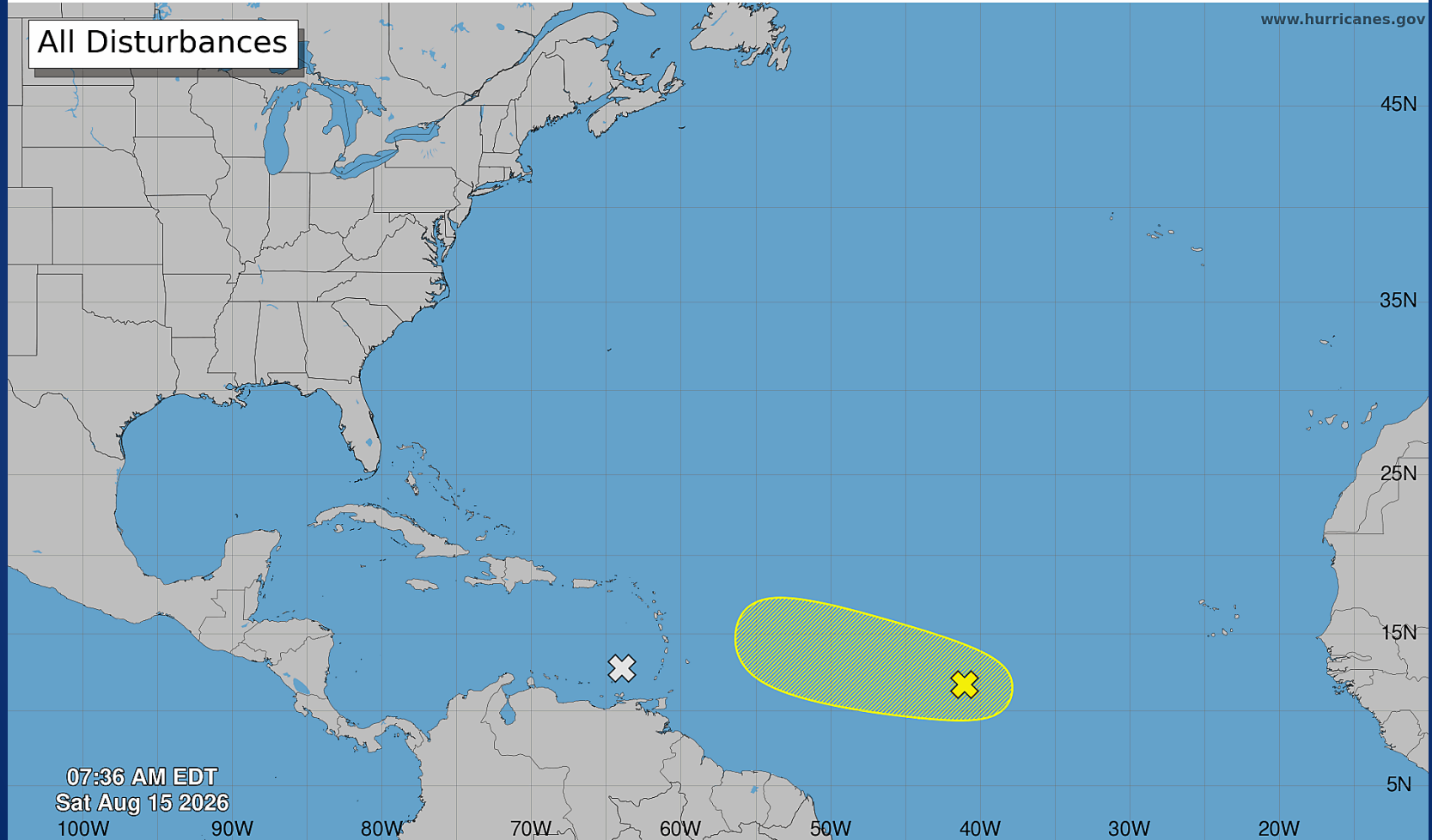
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

→ Keep vehicles off dry grass

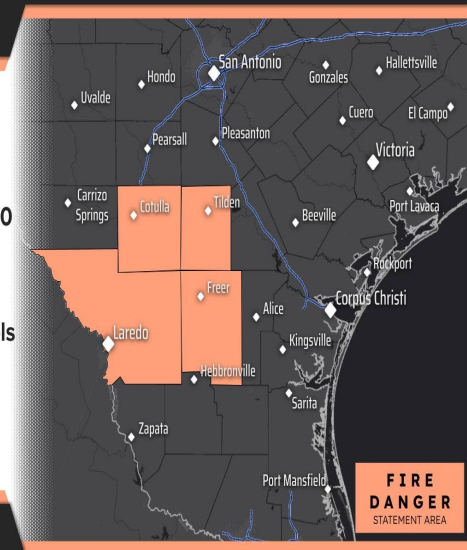

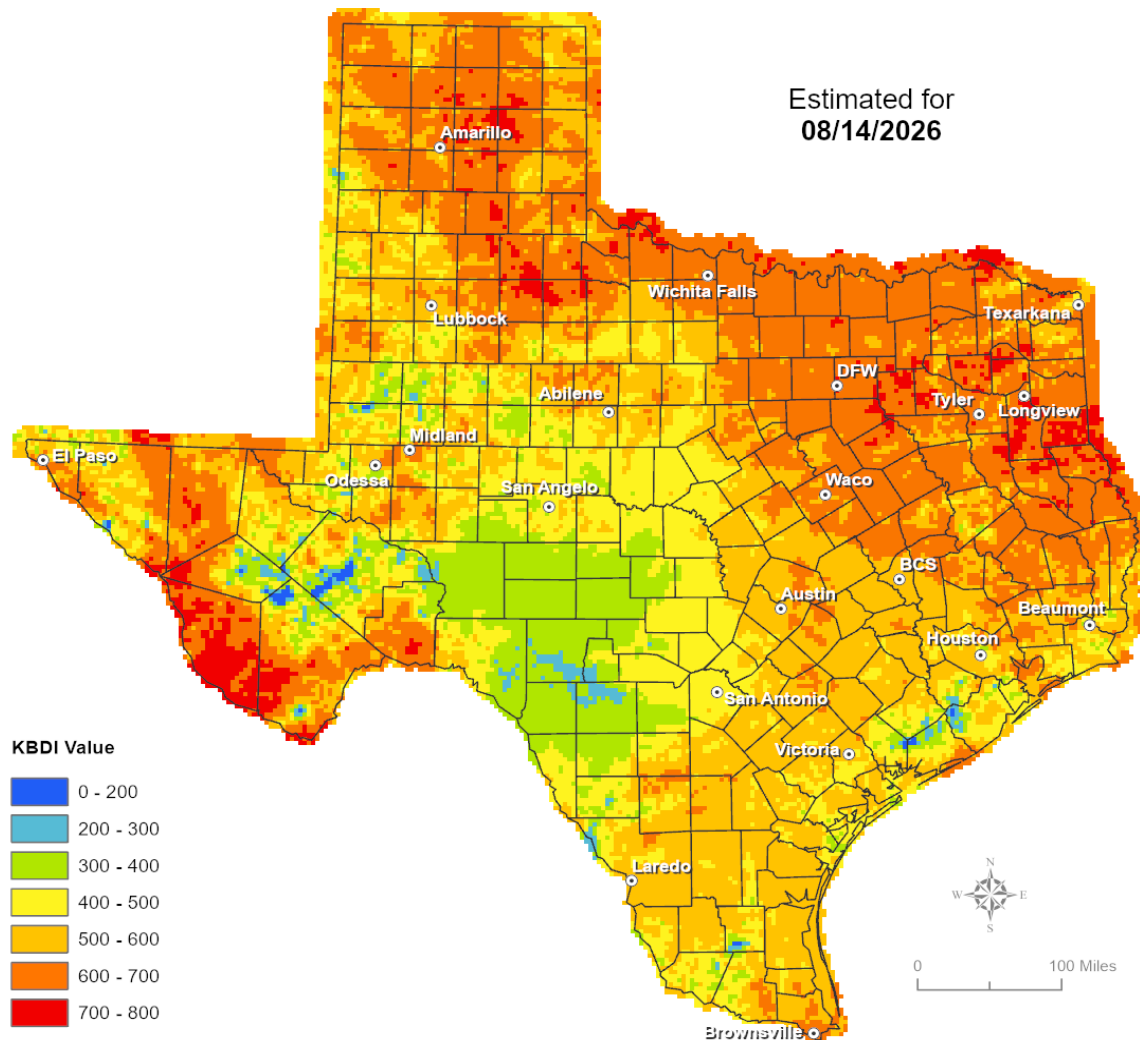
