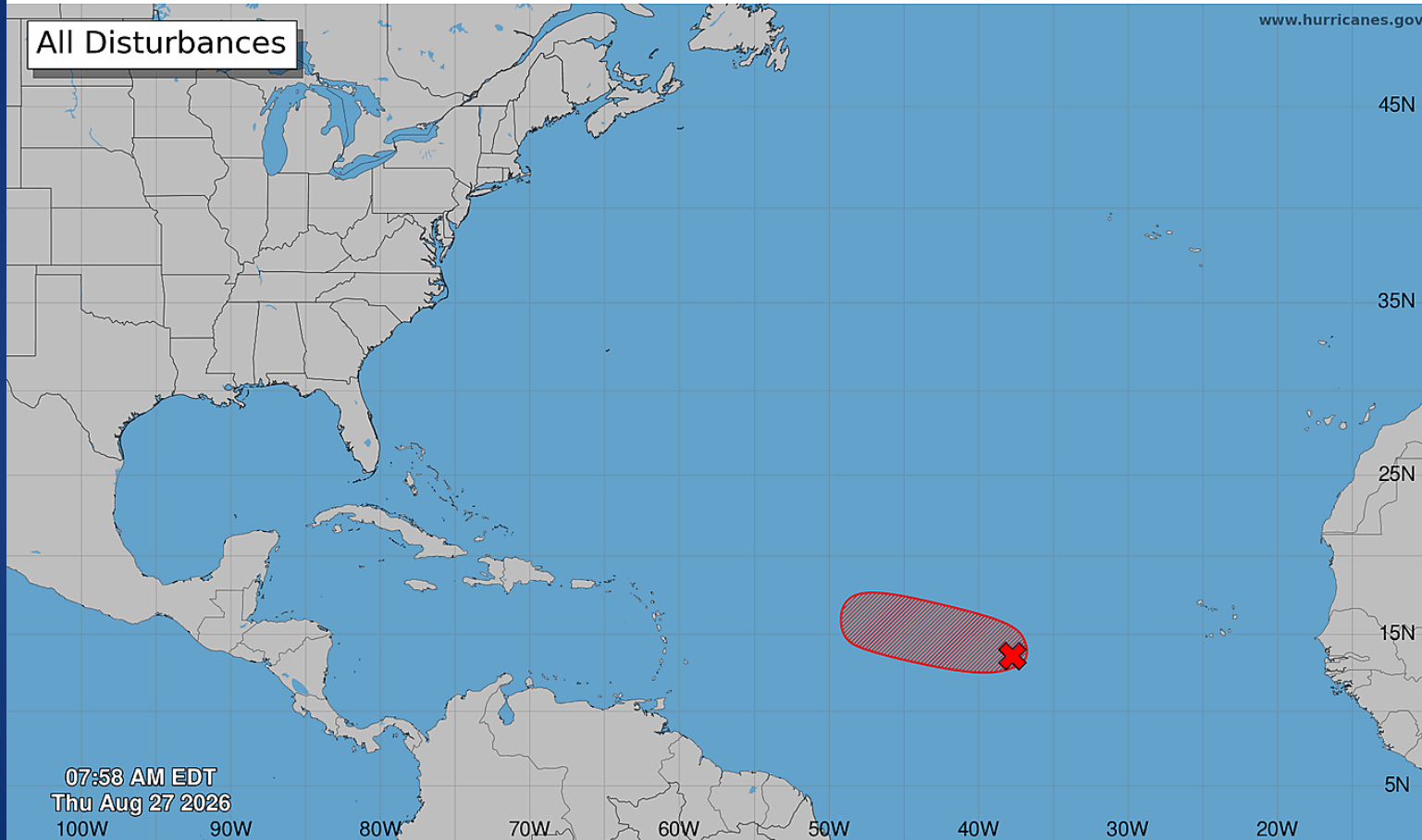
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

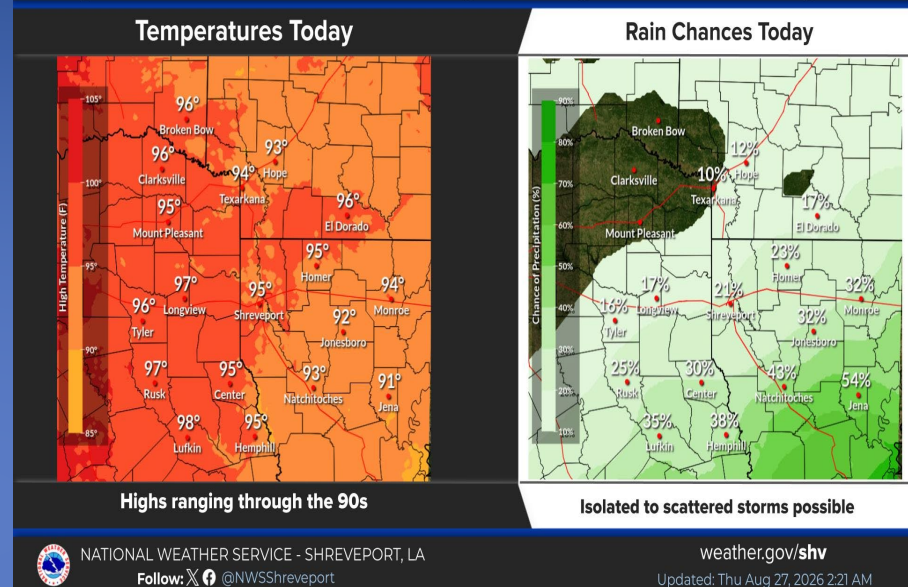
Hazardous Weather

Potential for a Wet Thursday



There is the potential for storms with high rain rates this morning into this afternoon. Rainfall rates will be around 1 to 2 inches per hour. If these storms linger over the same location or move over the same location, heavy rainfall amounts may produce flooding of low-lying and urban poor drainage areas.

Temperatures closer to average Today across the region.



Temperatures today will be closer to normal for late August with highs ranging mostly through the 90s. There will continue to be chance of showers and thunderstorms today with those chances mainly near and south of the I-20 Corridor.

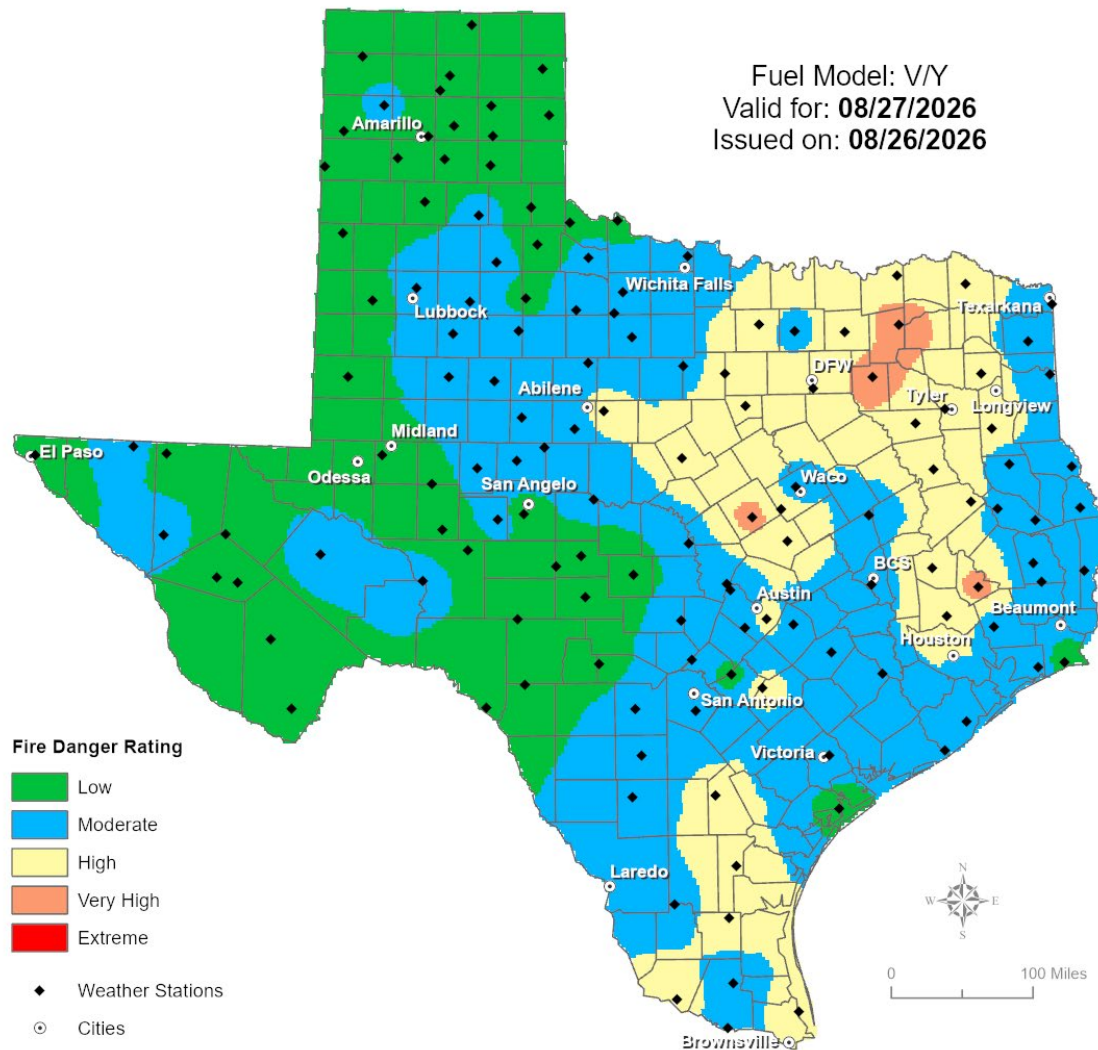

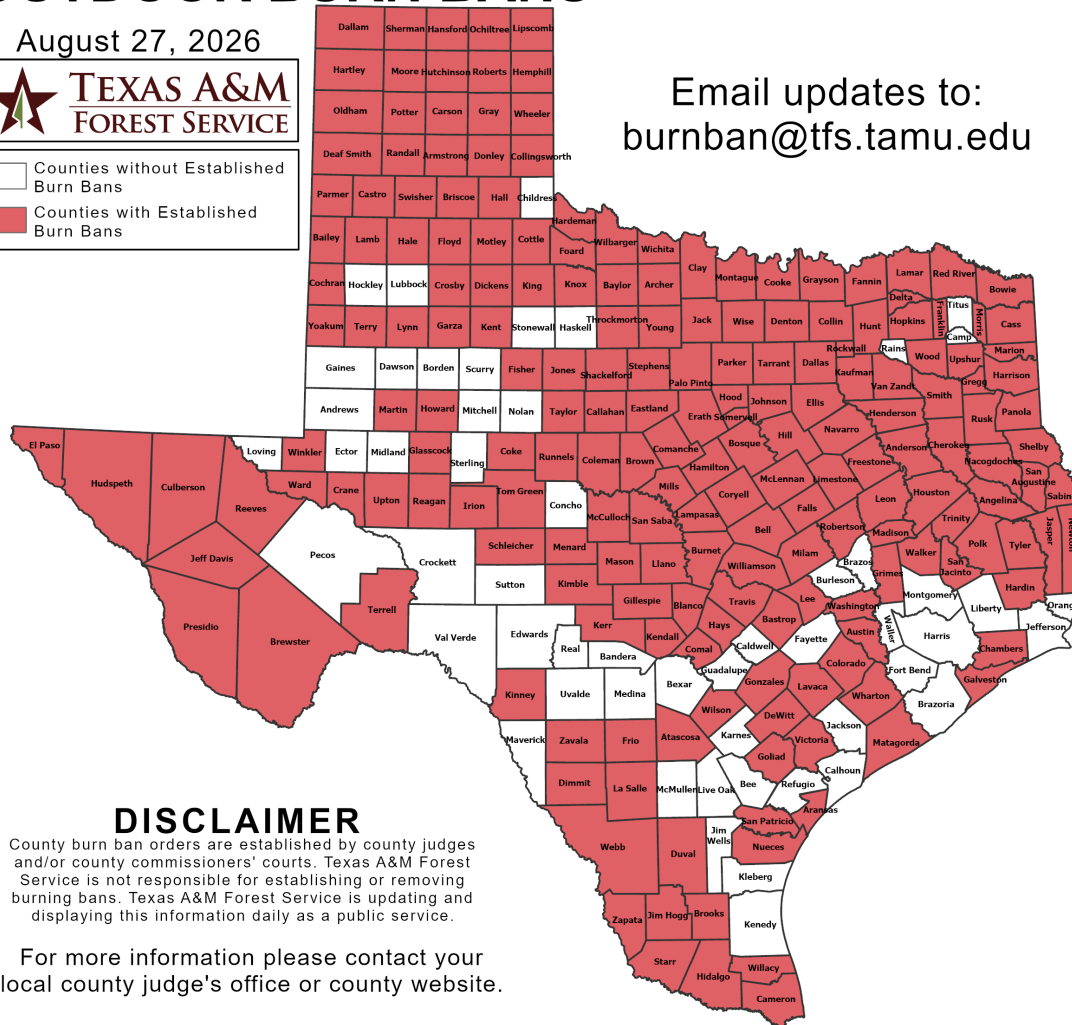

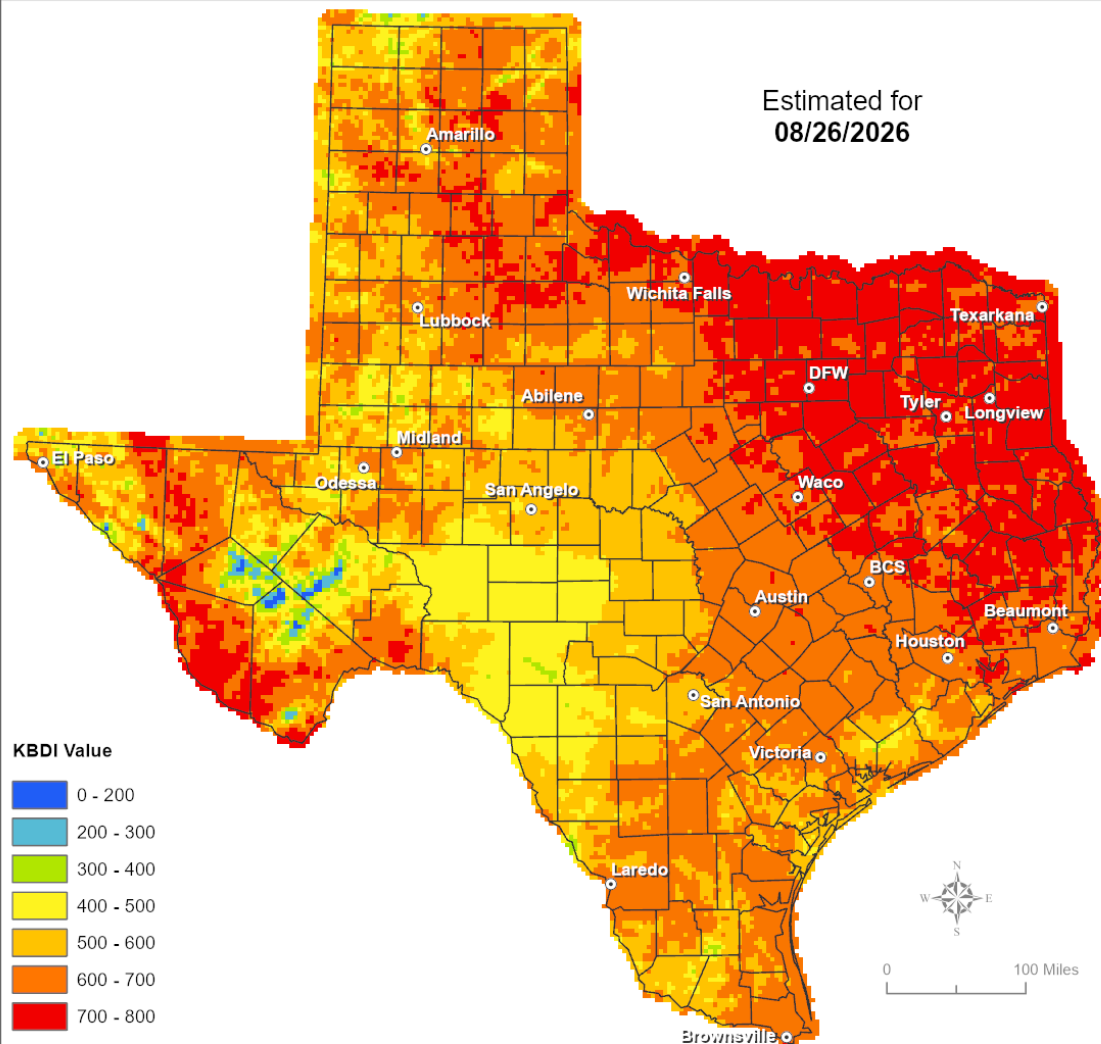

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

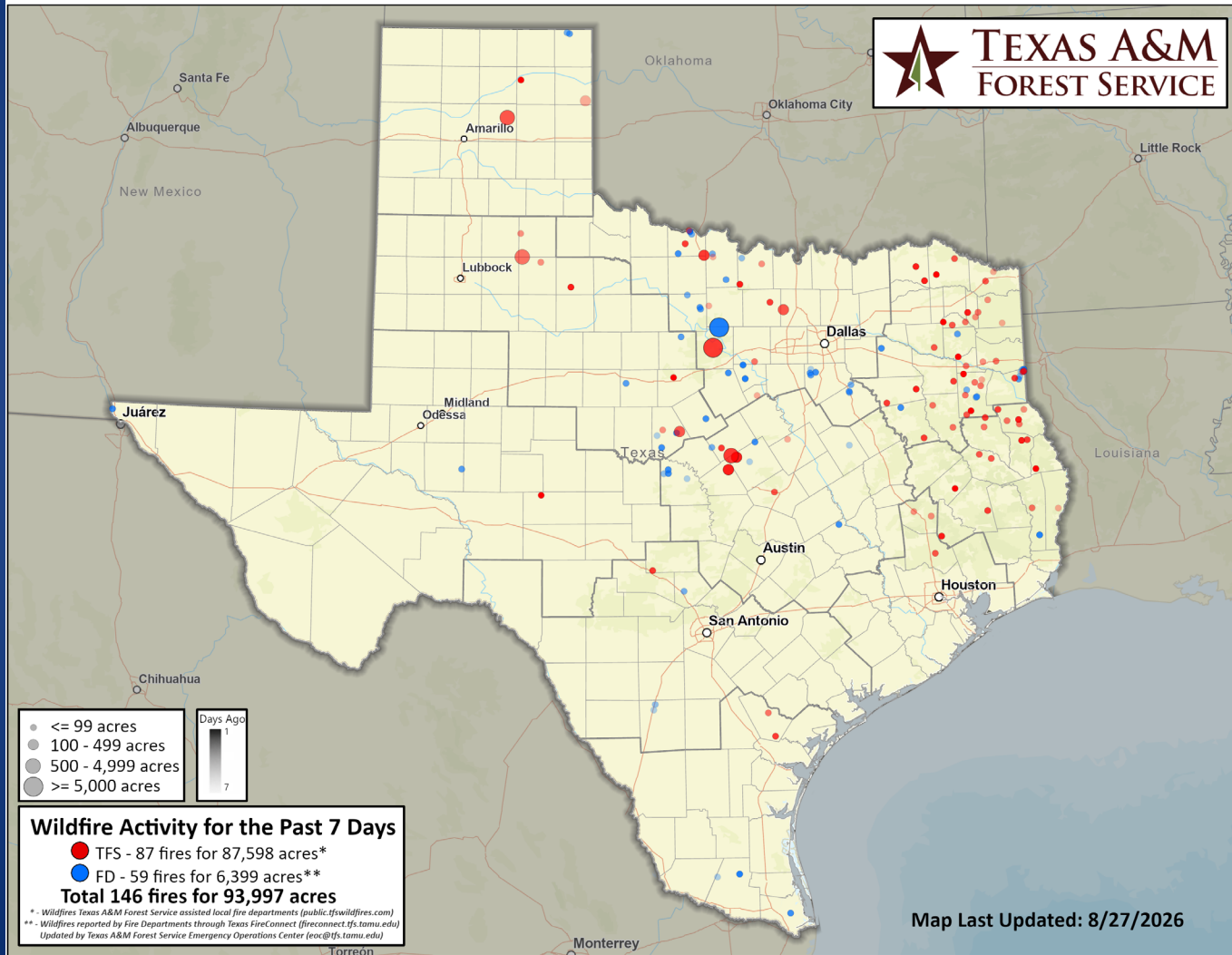
