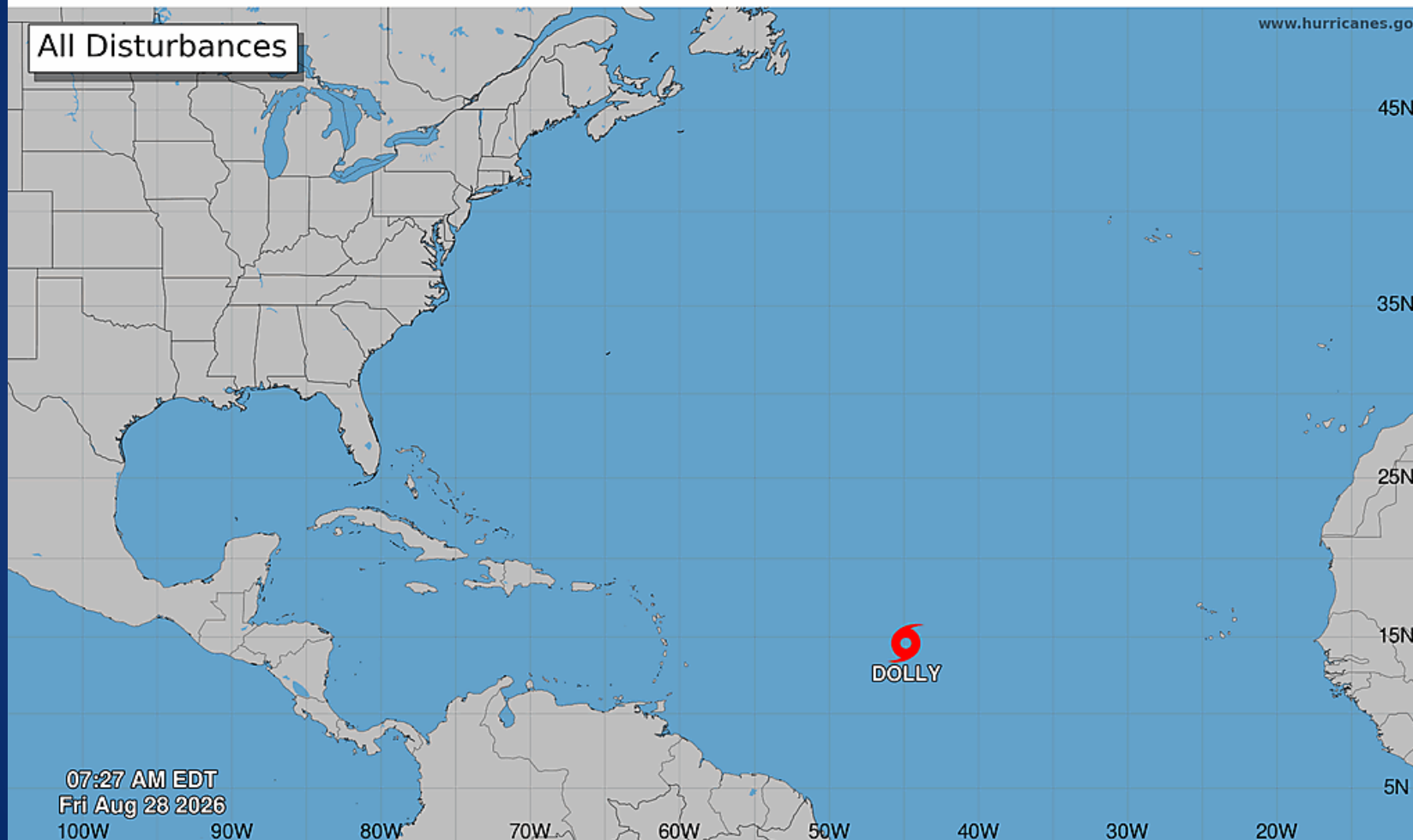
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

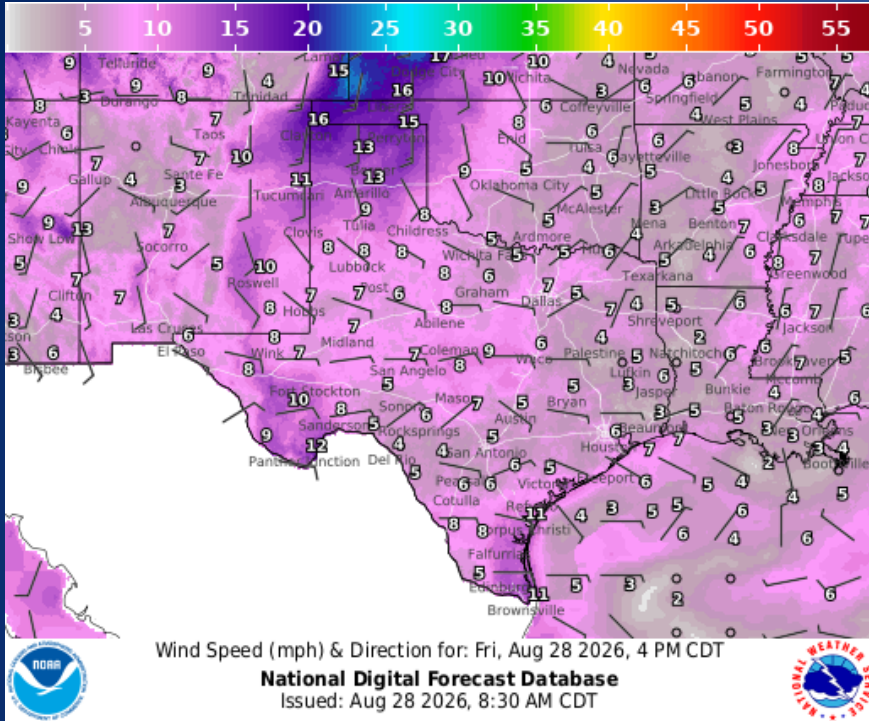

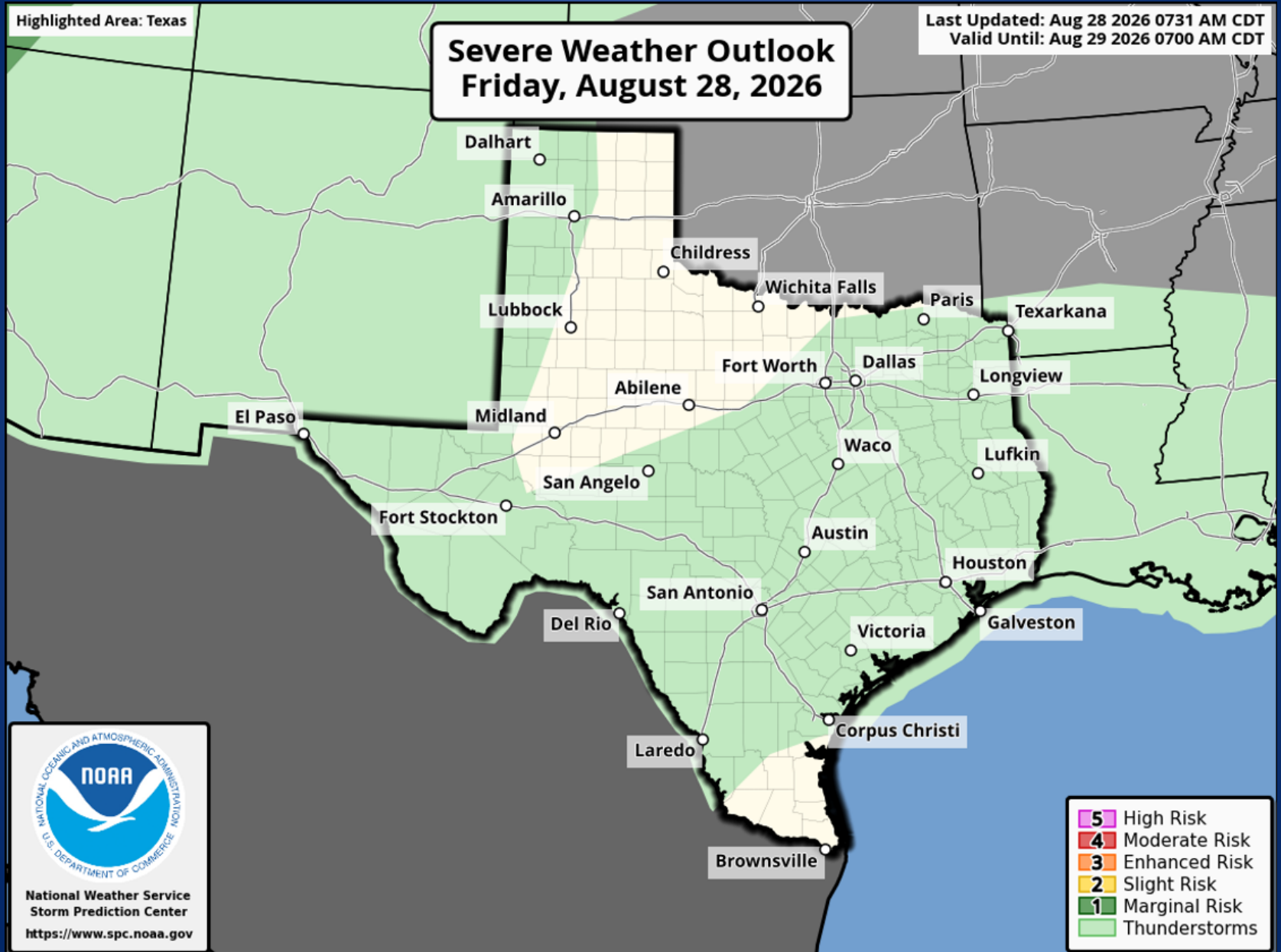

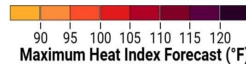

High temperatures will reach 96 to 100° inland and 89 to 94° along the beaches. Additionally, heat index values are projected to range from 102 to 108°.

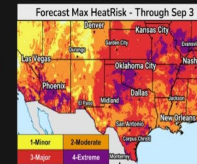

HOT! Heat and Worsening Drought Conditions Possible During the First Week of September

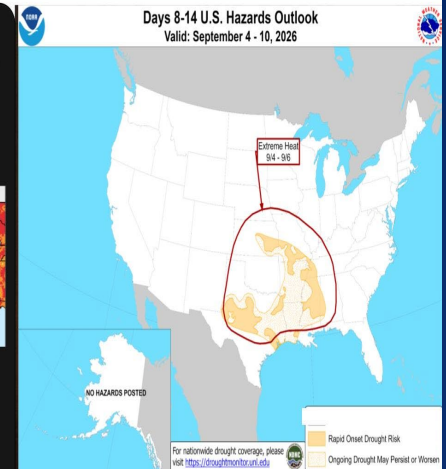
What to expect:

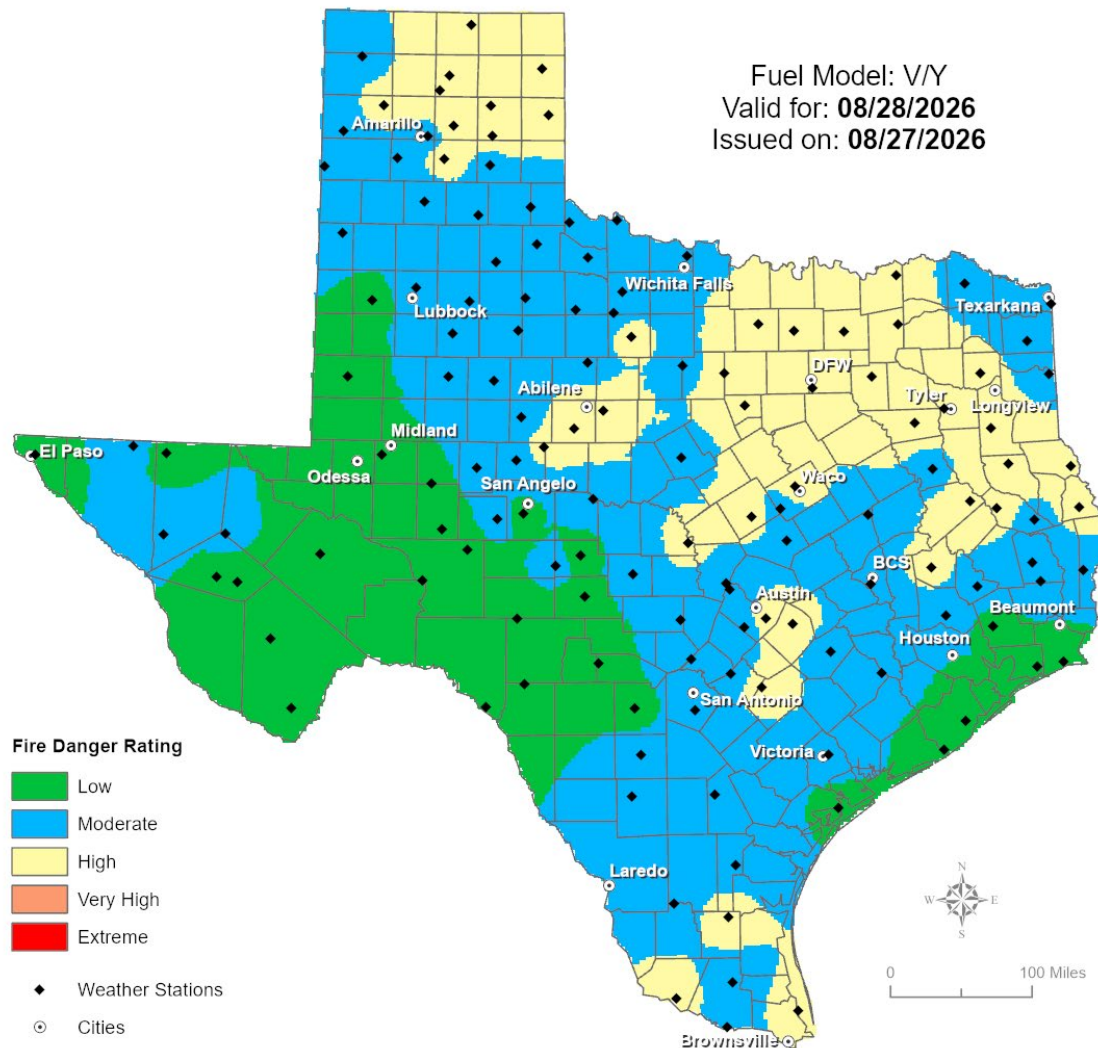

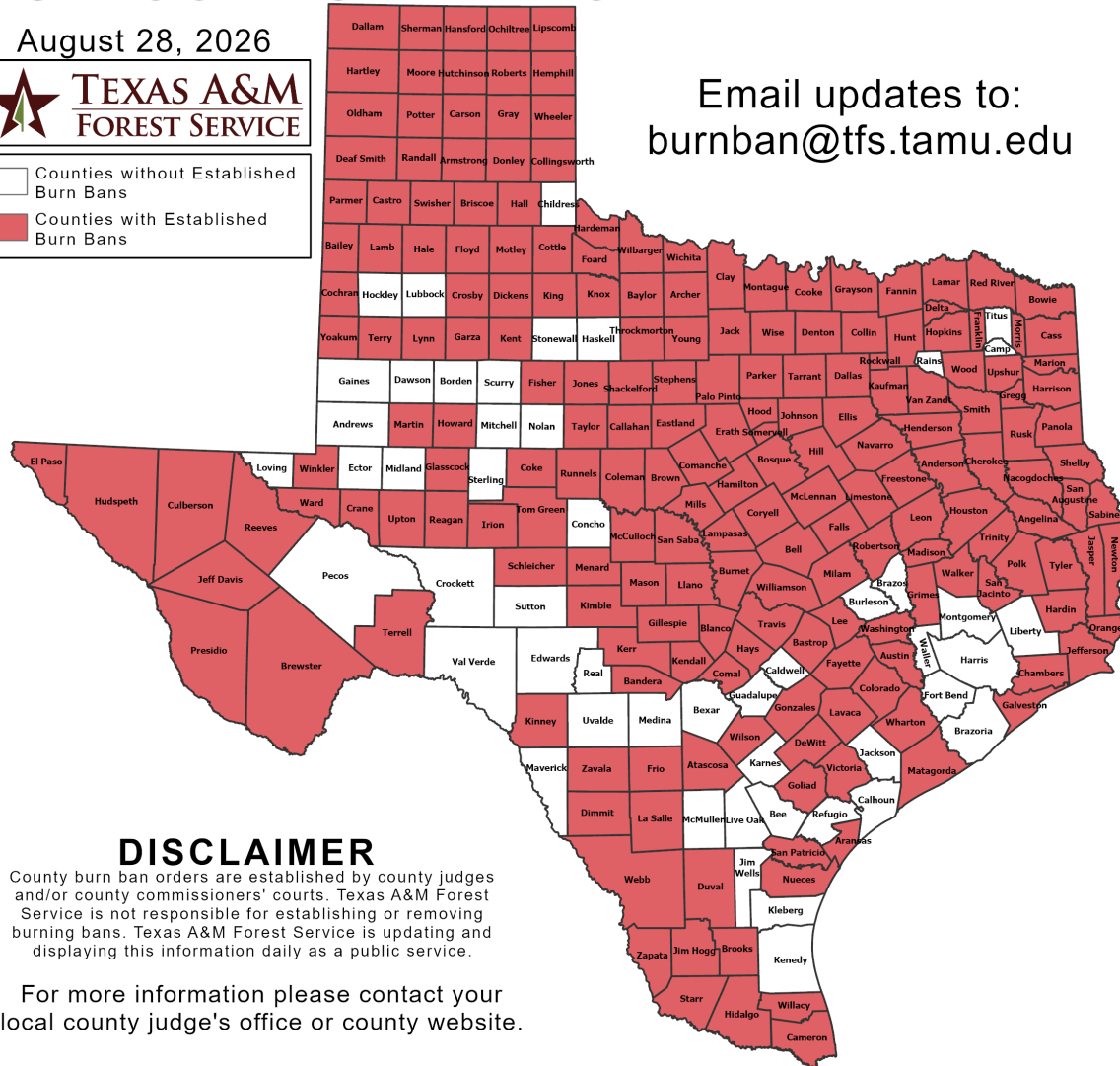

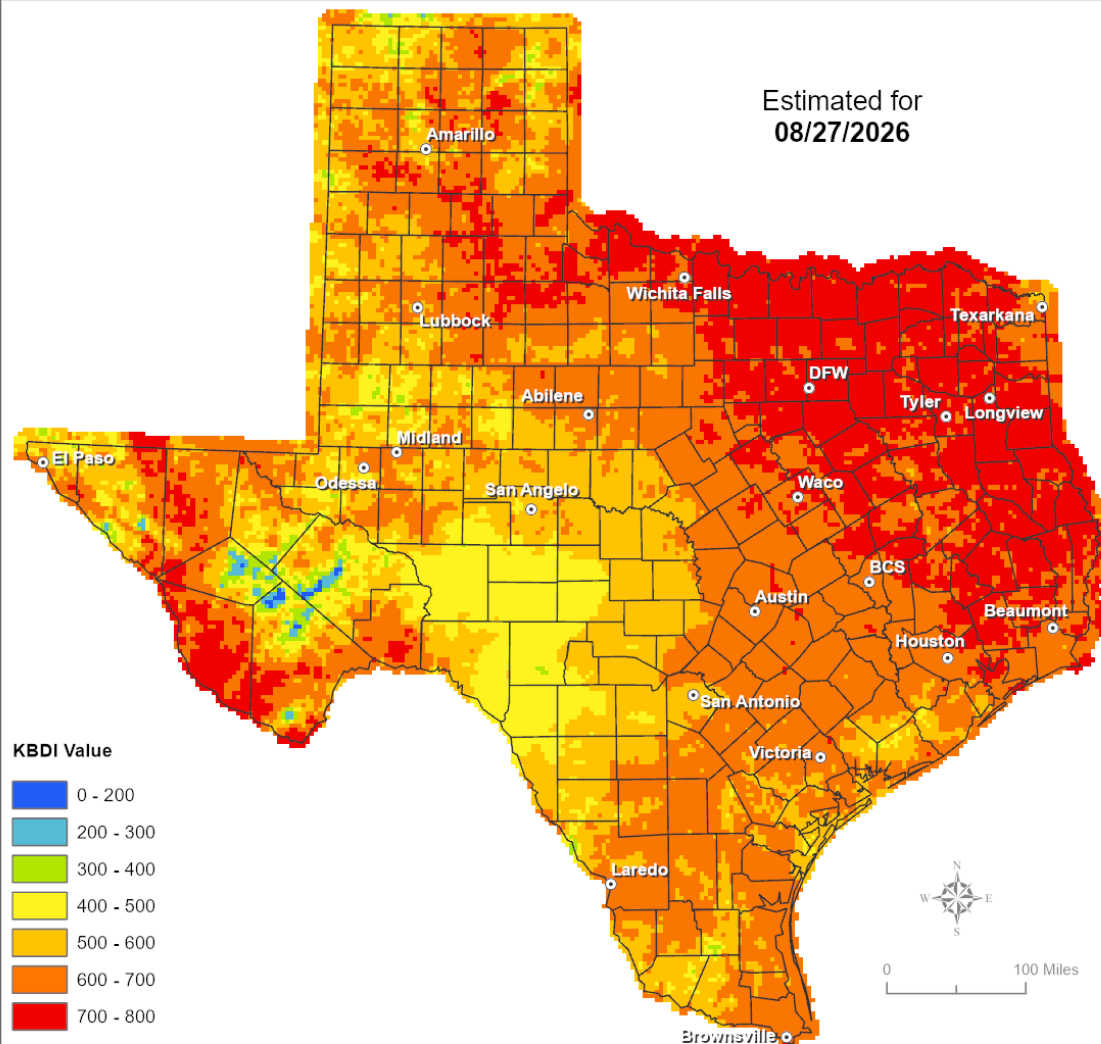

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

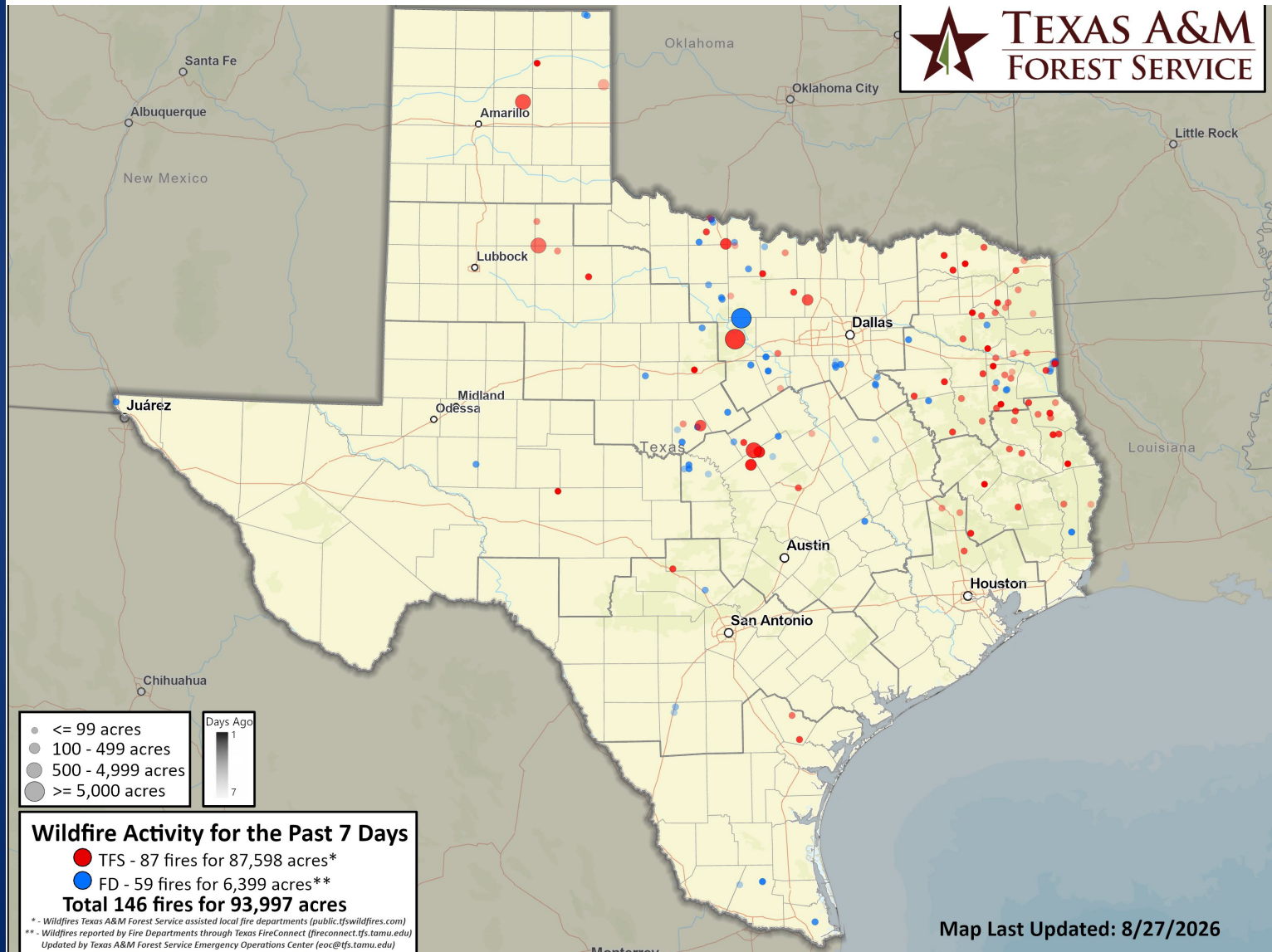
