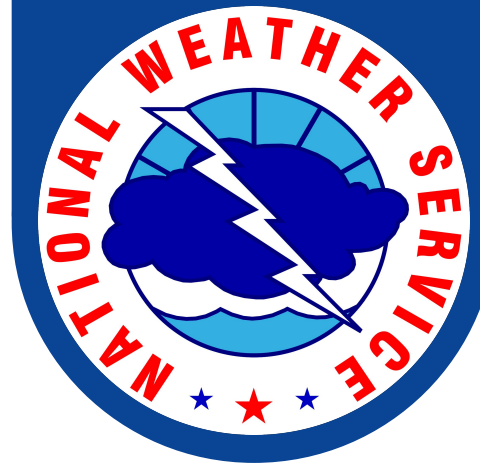

# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

## Saturday, August 29, 2026

# Summary

- **Flash Flooding:**
  - **Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) for portions of NM and SE LA into Monday and continuing in NM and into Far W TX for midweek.**
- **Fire Weather:**
  - **Elevated (level 1 of 3) for TX/OK Panhandles, W OK today through Monday.**
  - **Continue monitoring into next week.**
- **Tropical:**
  - **2 areas of possible development in the next 7 days:**
    - **1 - Remnants of Dolly - Low chances of redevelopment near the Caribbean Islands. Confidence is low for development. Too early to determine if any impacts could happen to FEMA 6.**
    - **2 - Disorganized showers over the northern Gulf - Low chances of development, and if any, would be slow to develop. Too early to determine if any impacts could happen to FEMA 6.**

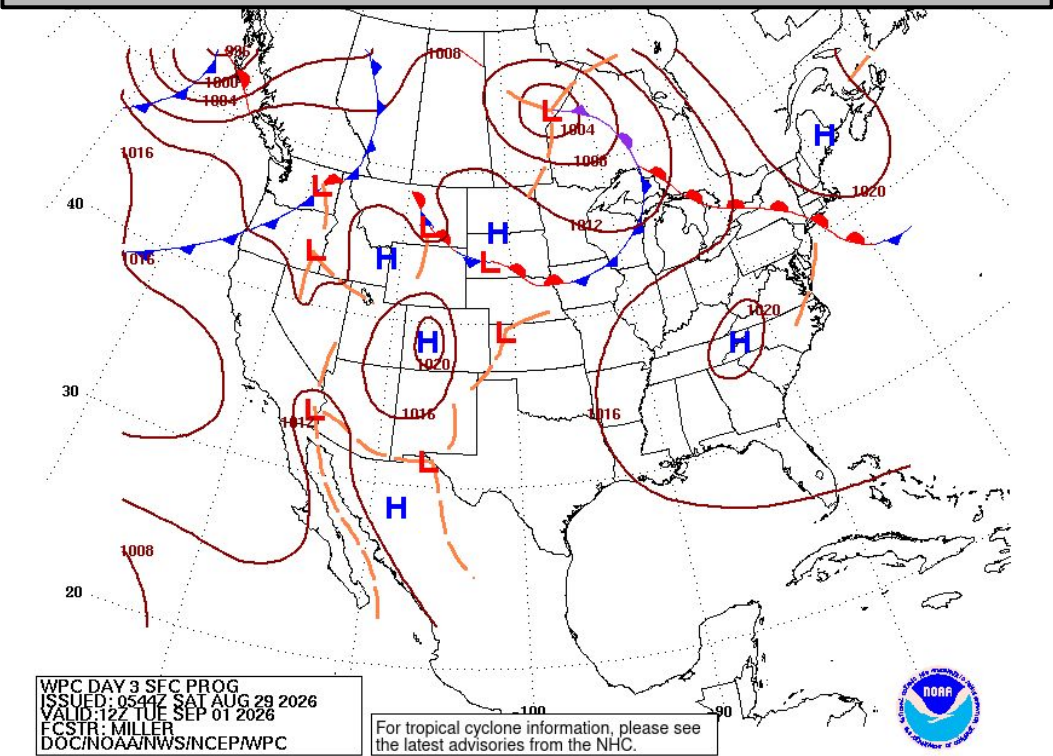
# Monday's Severe Weather Probabilities/CIIG Level



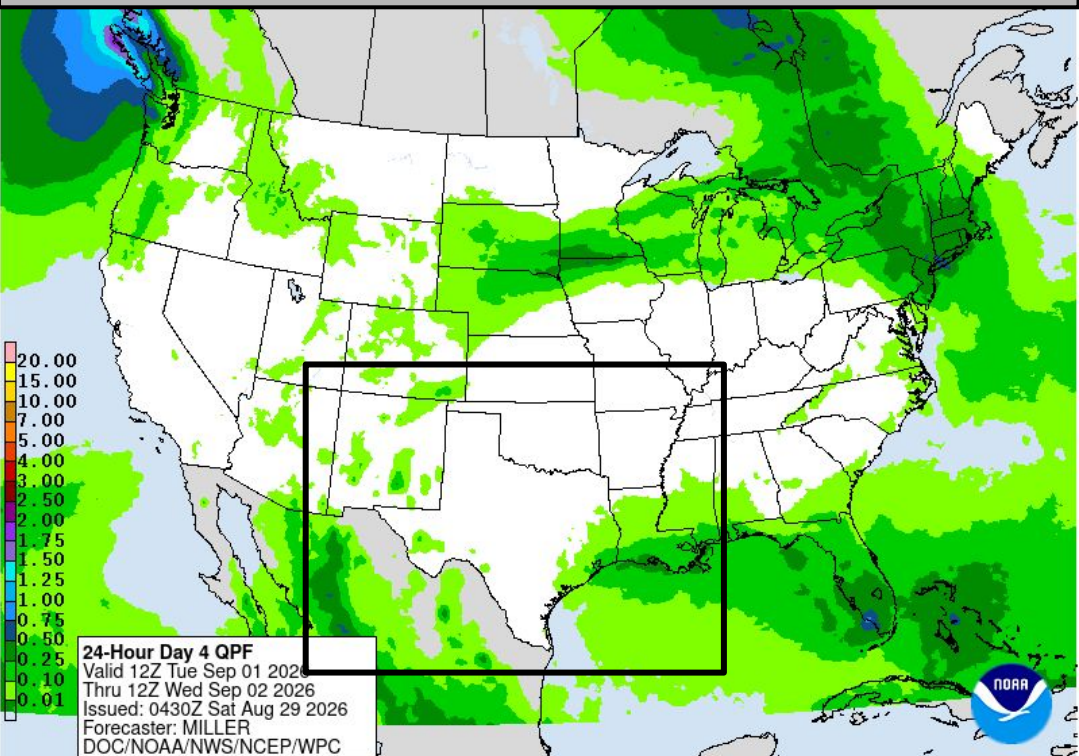

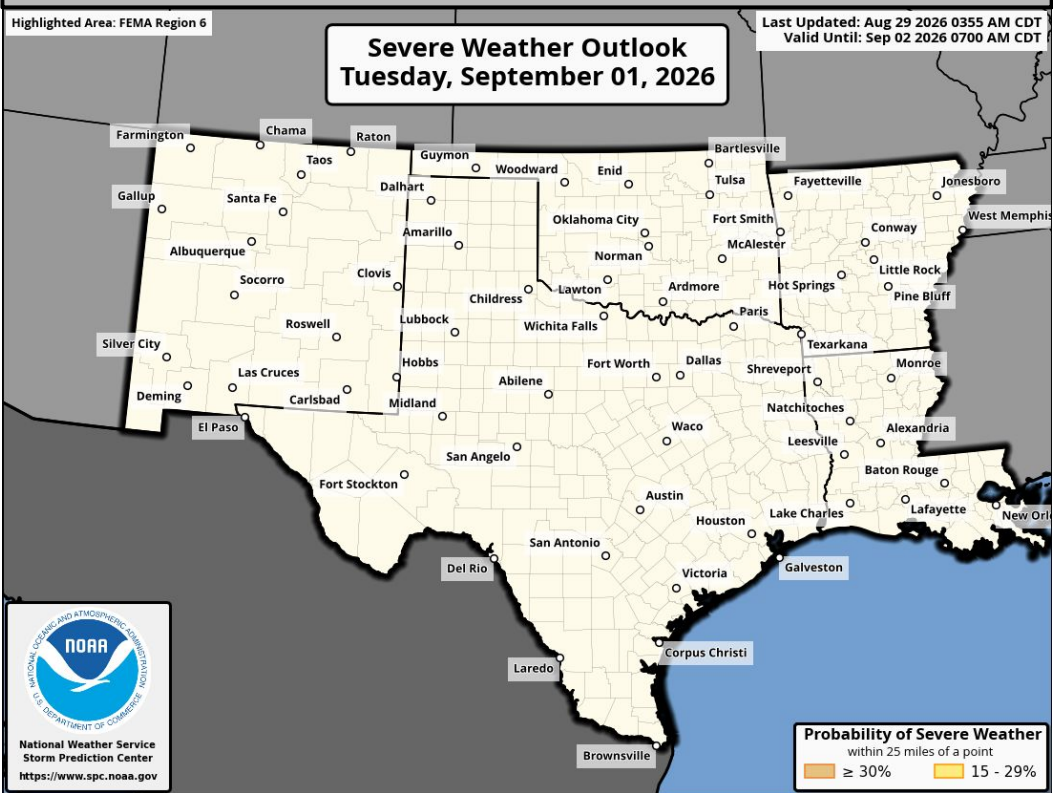

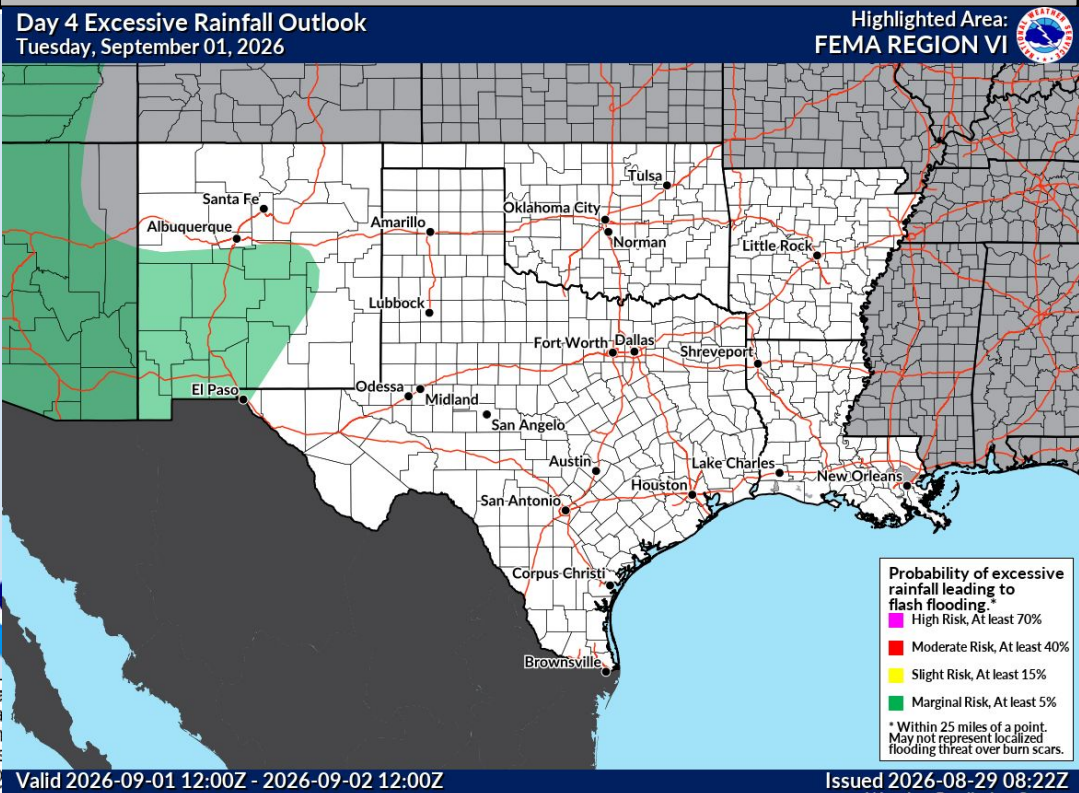

Excessive Rainfall Outlook



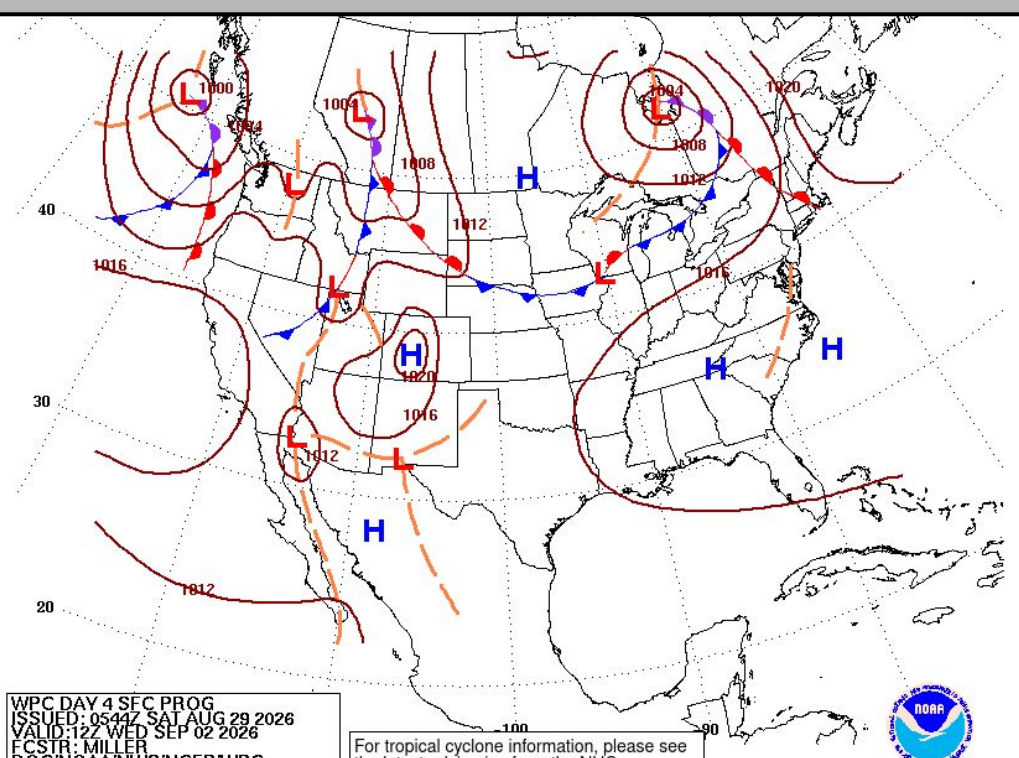
