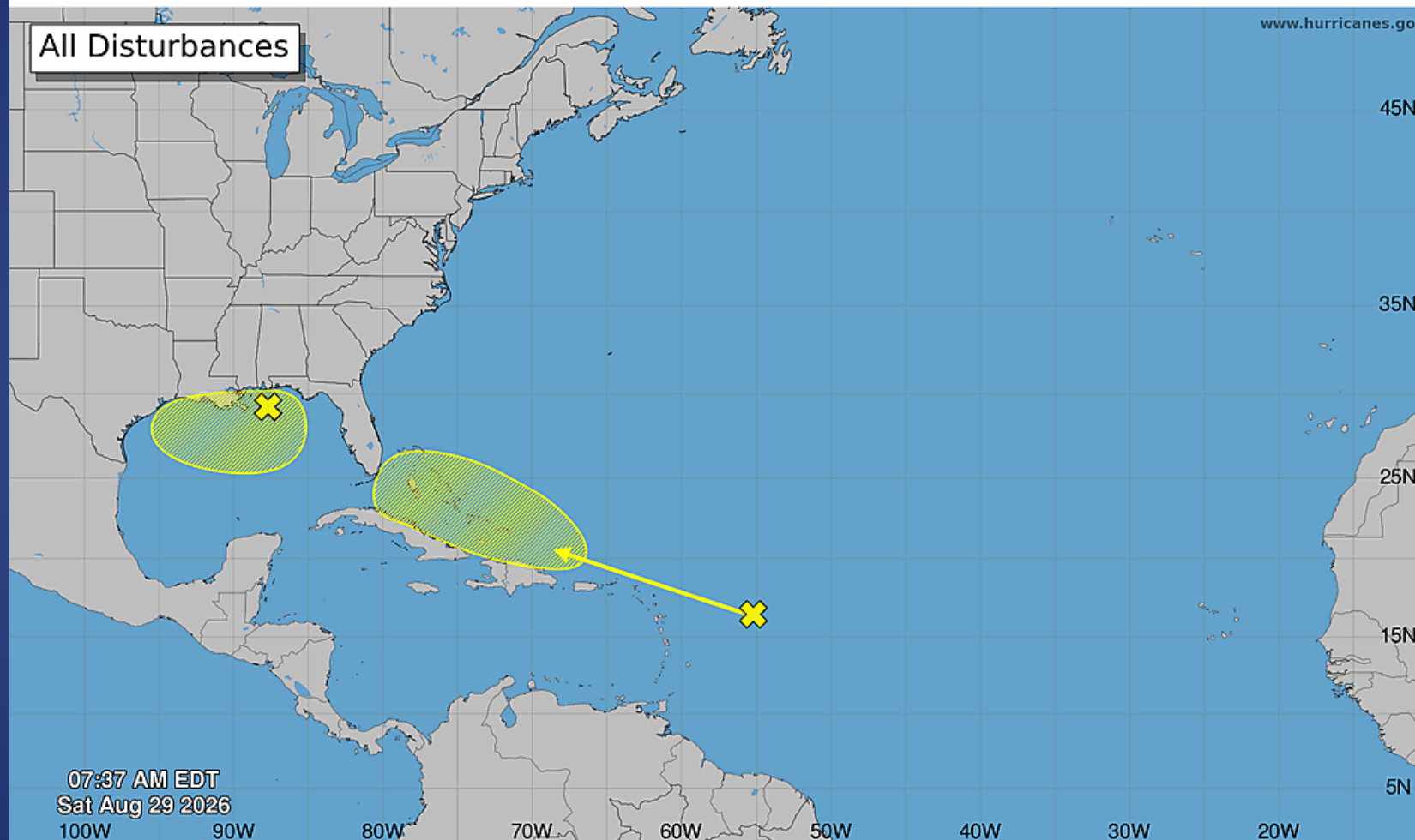
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

Record or Near Record Heat On Saturday

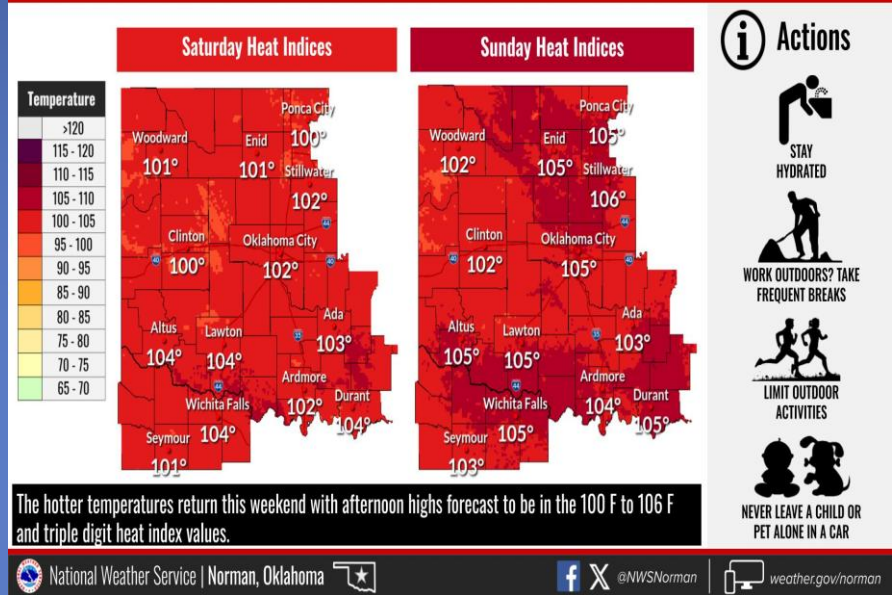

The high pressure heat dome is returning to the desert southwest and southern plains, meaning record or near record breaking heat is likely over our area this weekend. On Saturday Amarillo and Borger look to tie or break the record high for this date while Dalhart will be a couple degrees off the record.

Expect a hot and dry weekend ahead. **The elevated fire weather concern will continue, particularly west of I-35.**

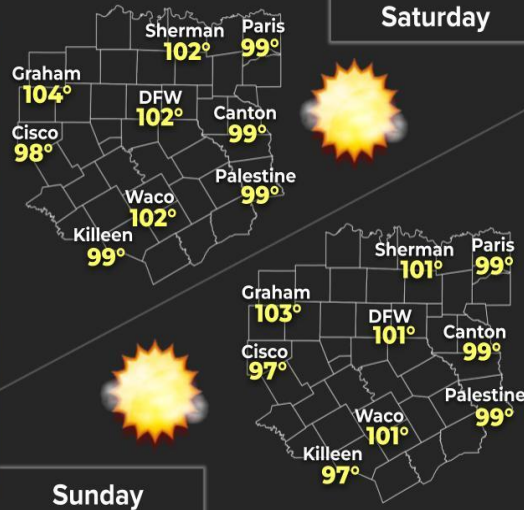
- Peak heat index values in the mid 90s to around 105°.
- Lows in the 70s to around 80°.
- **Elevated fire weather threat continues** due to dry and hot conditions.



Do NOT leave a fire unattended or burn unnecessarily.



AVOID any activities that could spark a wildfire, as fires could spread rapidly.

Hot and dry conditions are expected this weekend. Afternoon highs will peak in the mid 90s to around 103 each afternoon, with heat indices up to around 105. The elevated fire threat will continue each day, particularly west of I-35 where humidity is lowest.

Today: Moderate to Major Heat Risk

Practice Heat Safety to Prevent Heat-Related Illnesses



Key Messages

- High temperatures ranging from 98-105°F this afternoon
- Peak heat indices ranging from 104-111°F
- **Moderate** (level 2 of 4) to **Major** (level 3 of 4) risk of heat-related illness

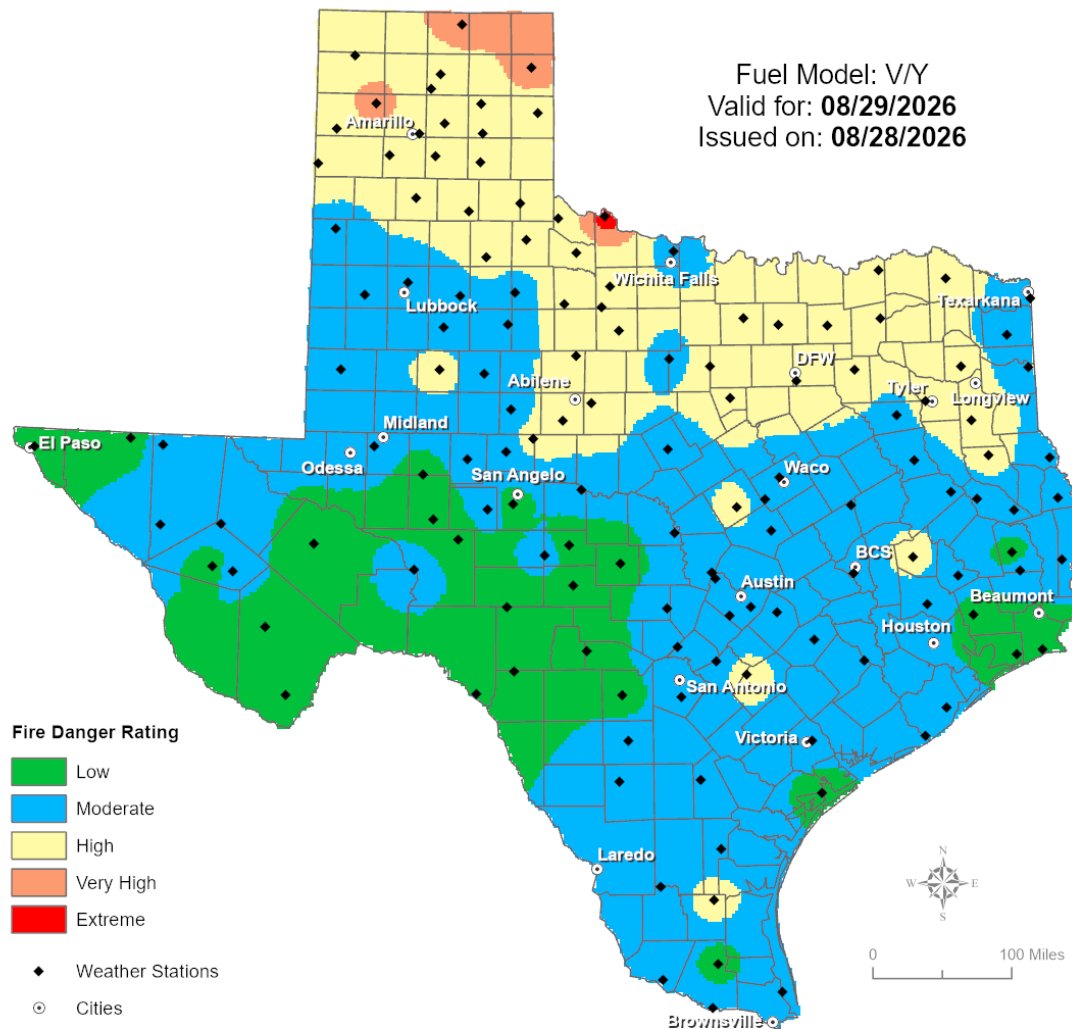

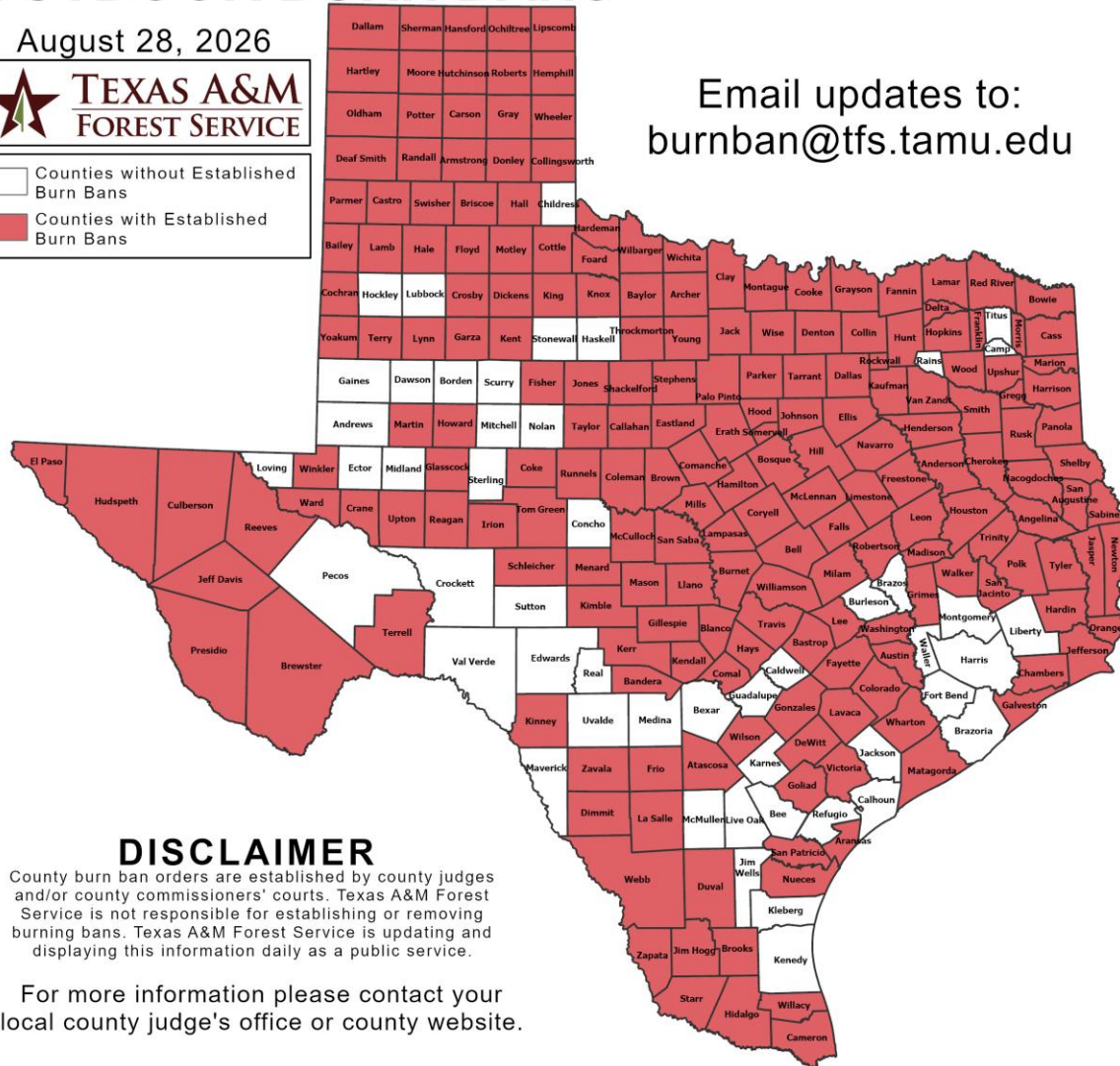

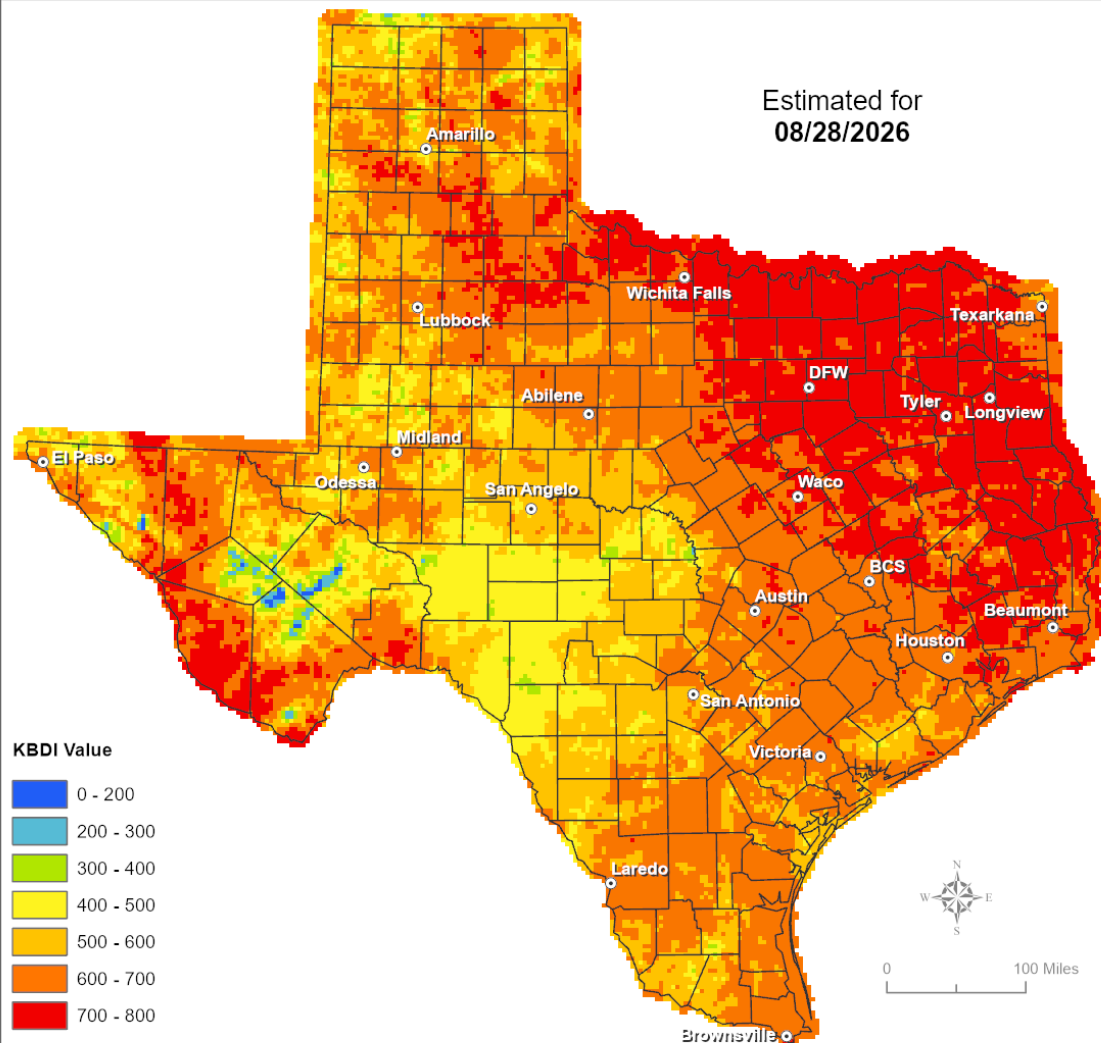

Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Report of 1,041 (+11) fires and 183,681 (+1,562) acres have been burned this year. There are 204 (No Change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 254 counties with an average over 400.
