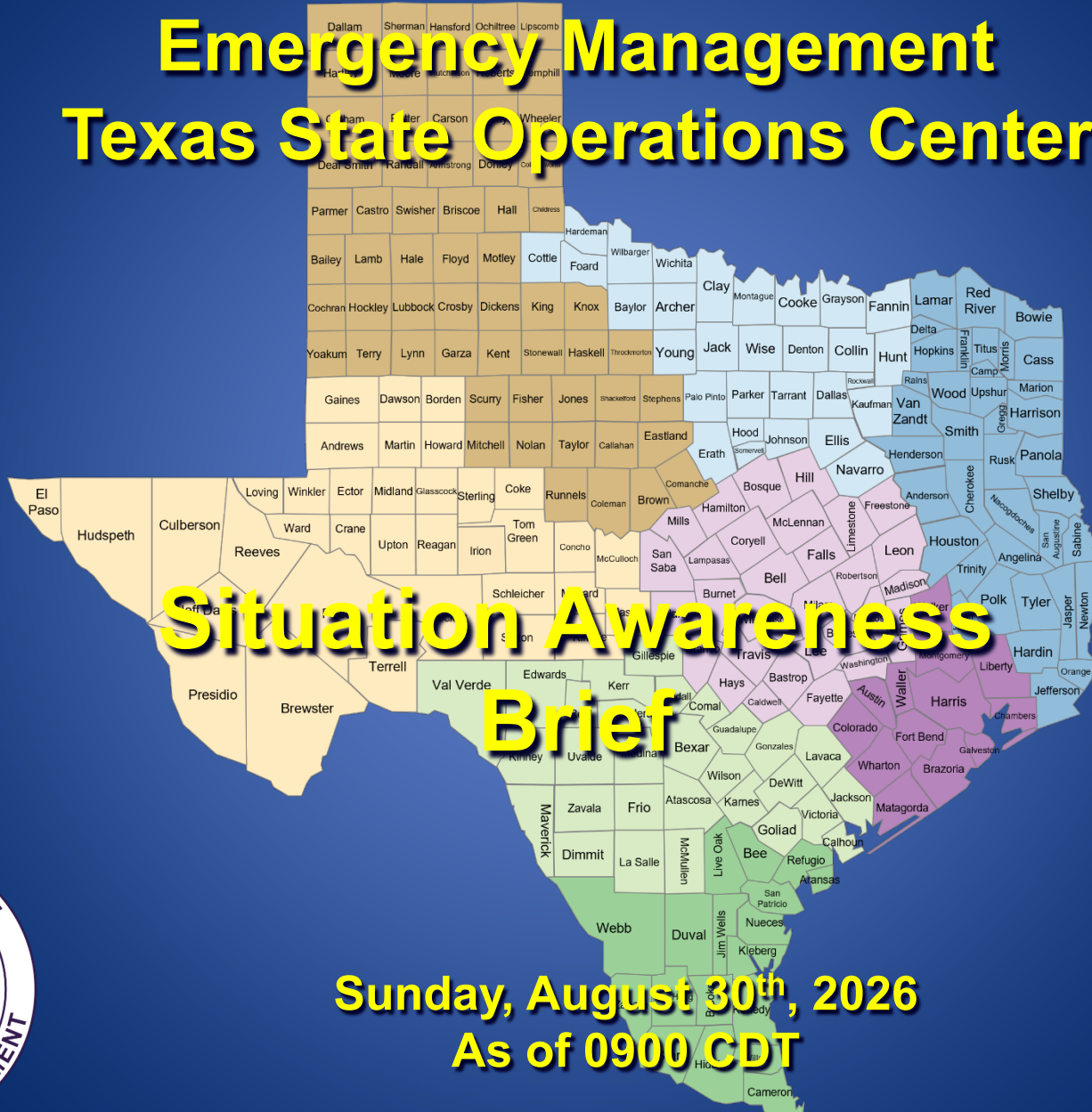

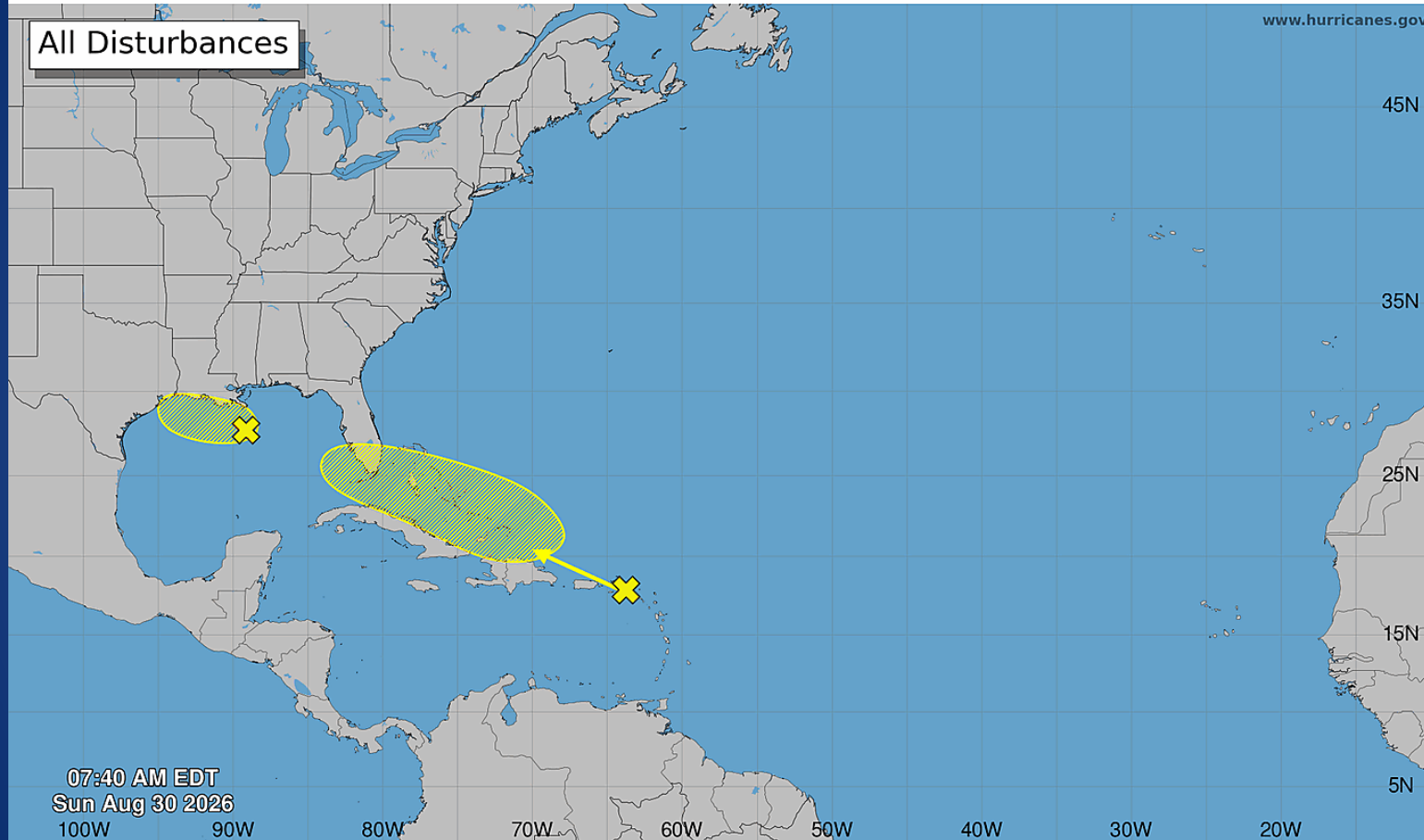


Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook National Hurricane Center Miami, Florida

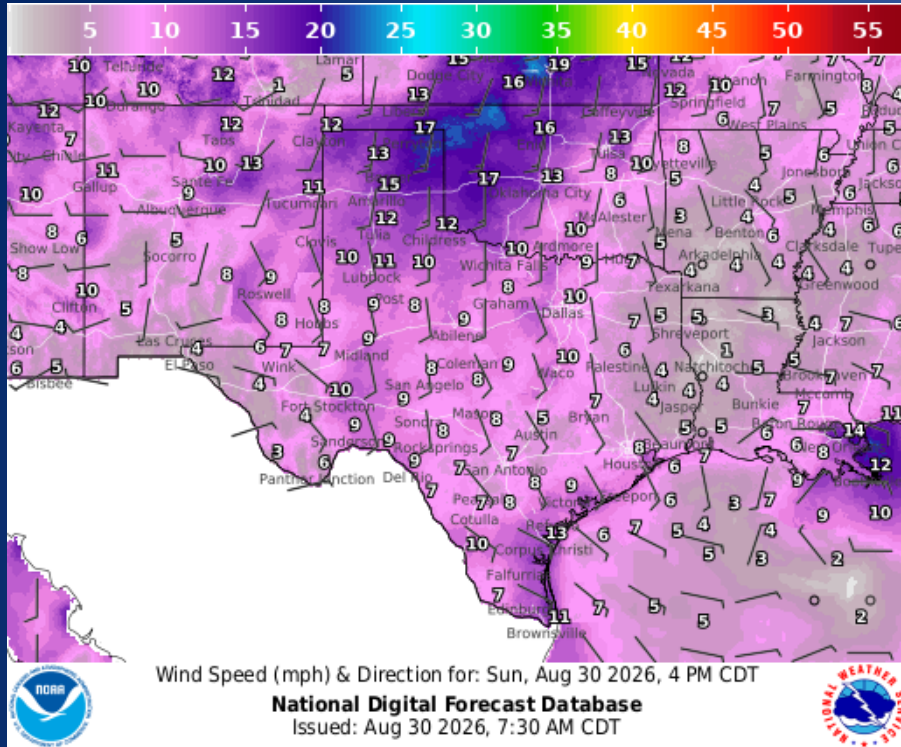

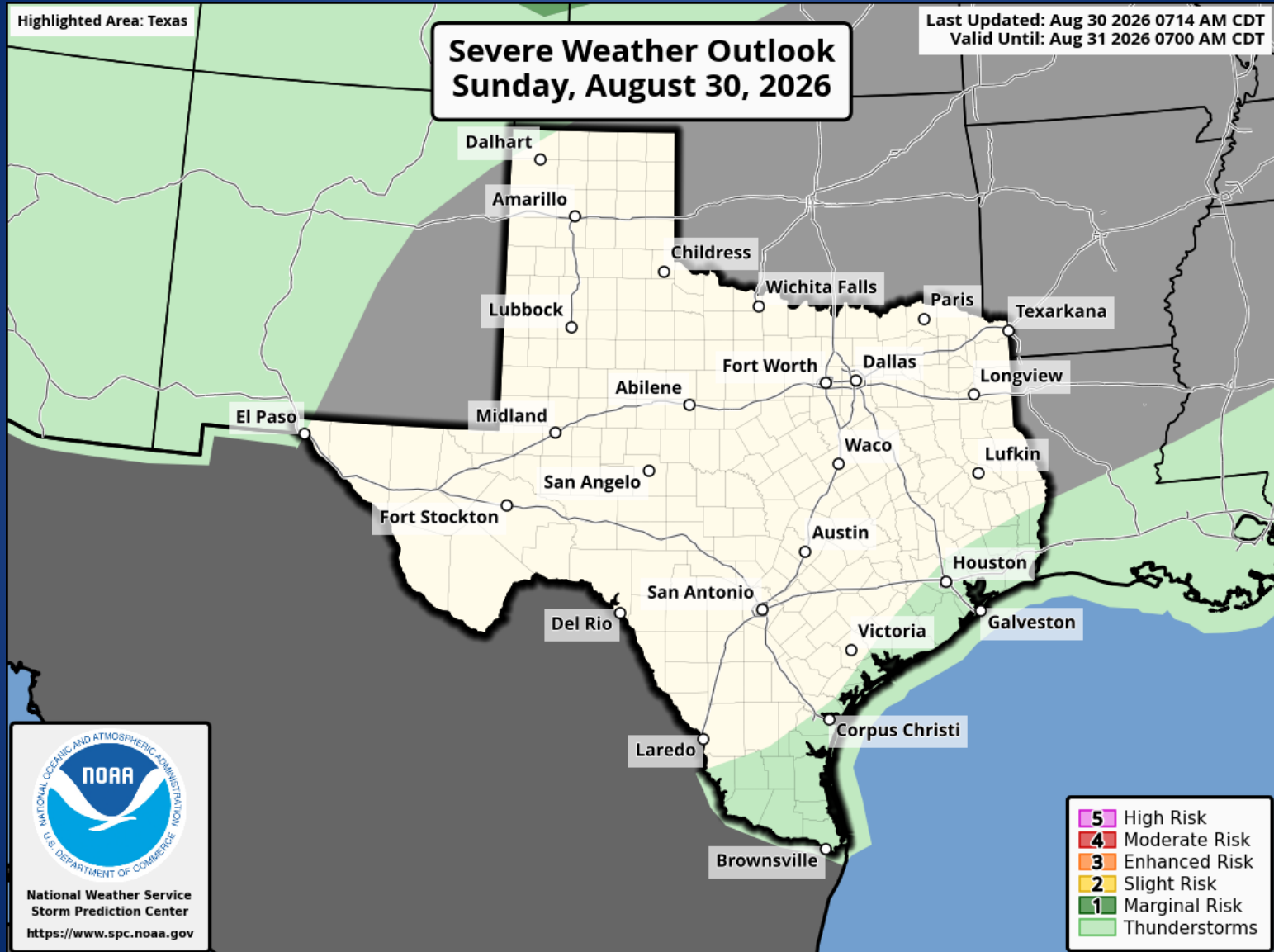


Wind Speeds

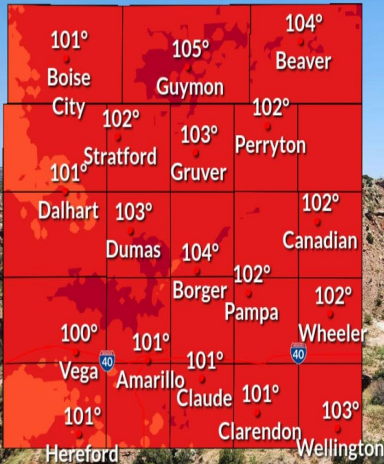

The high pressure and associated heat dome will remain entrenched across portions of the desert southwest and southern plains. This will allow for record to near record high temperatures. Very little chance of rain during this period. The far northwest portion of the area (near Kenton OK) could have a 15% or less chance of rain late Sunday night.

Today: Moderate to Major Heat Risk

Practice Heat Safety to Prevent Heat-Related Illnesses



Key Messages

- High temperatures ranging from 98-105°F this afternoon
- Peak heat indices ranging from 104-111°F
- **Moderate** (level 2 of 4) to **Major** (level 3 of 4) risk of heat-related illness

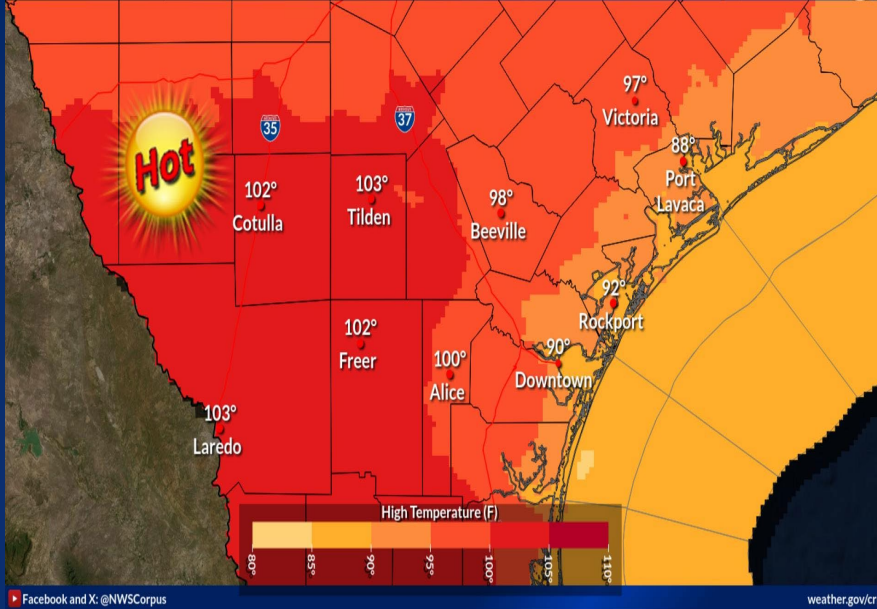

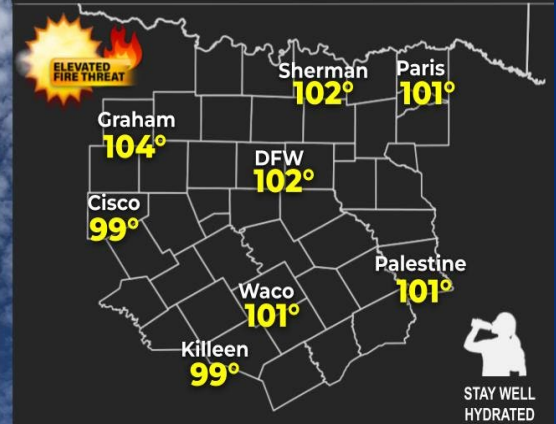
Expect a hot and dry Sunday. The fire threat will remain elevated with low humidity and occasional wind gusts up to 25 mph.

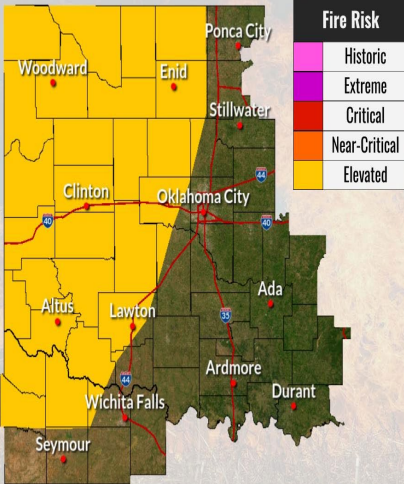

KEY MESSAGES

- Relative humidity as low as 15-25%.
- High temperatures from 100°F to 107°F

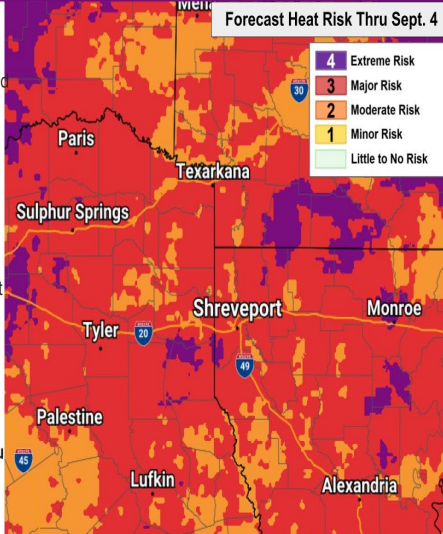
Impactful Heat Risk Continues into the First Week of September

 **What does this mean?**

- **High chances** of daytime high temperatures in the mid 90s to near 100°F for much of the next seven days.
- **Hot and Humid** with peak heat index values climbing to between 105°F and 109°F by the middle of this week. Heat Advisories may be needed by the middle to end of this week.
- HeatRisk of **Major** and **Extreme** by the middle of next week.



- **Stay hydrated, stay cool, take frequent breaks if you plan to be outdoors.** Know the signs of heat illness!

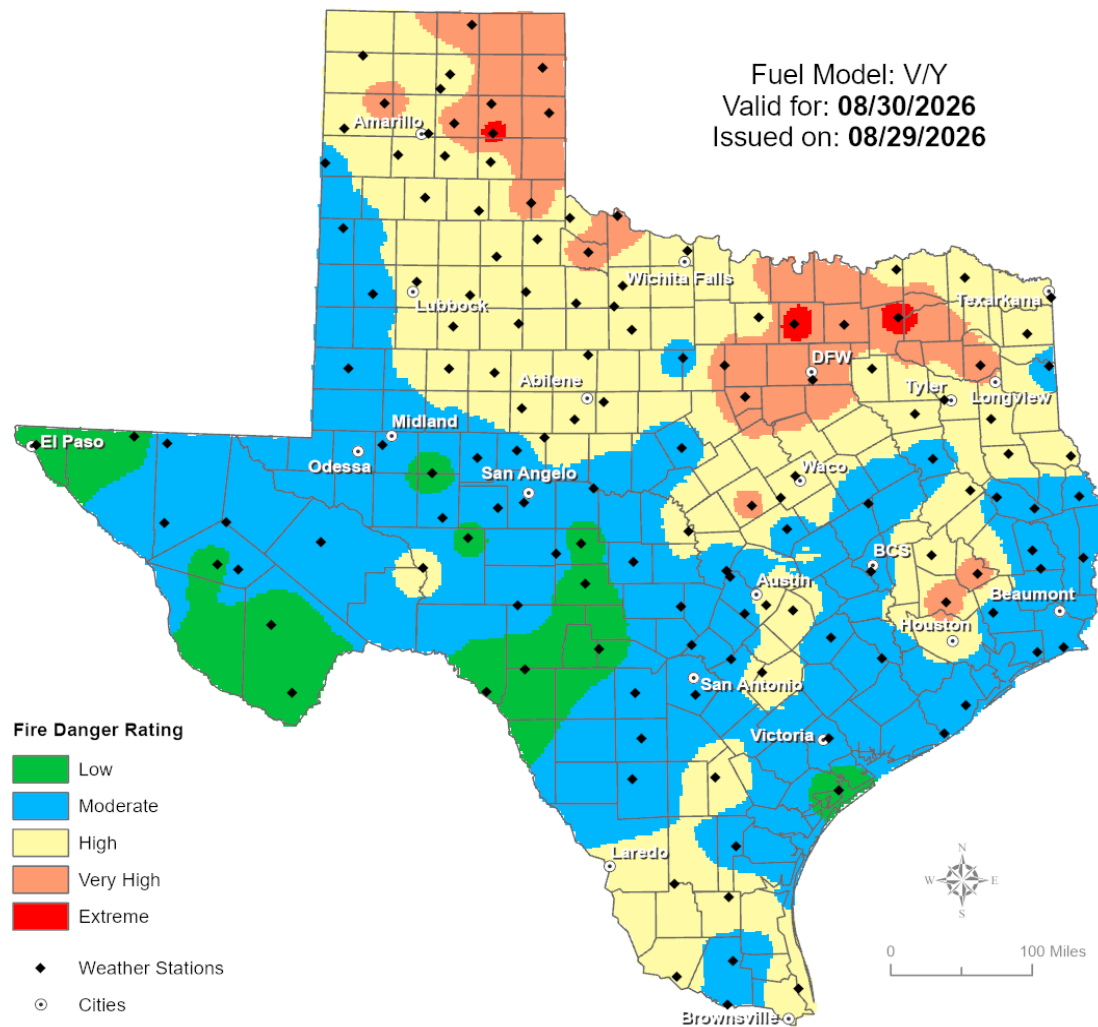
Extreme heat is expected across the Four State Region as we move into early September. Major to Extreme Heat Risk is expected areawide by the middle to latter half of this week.

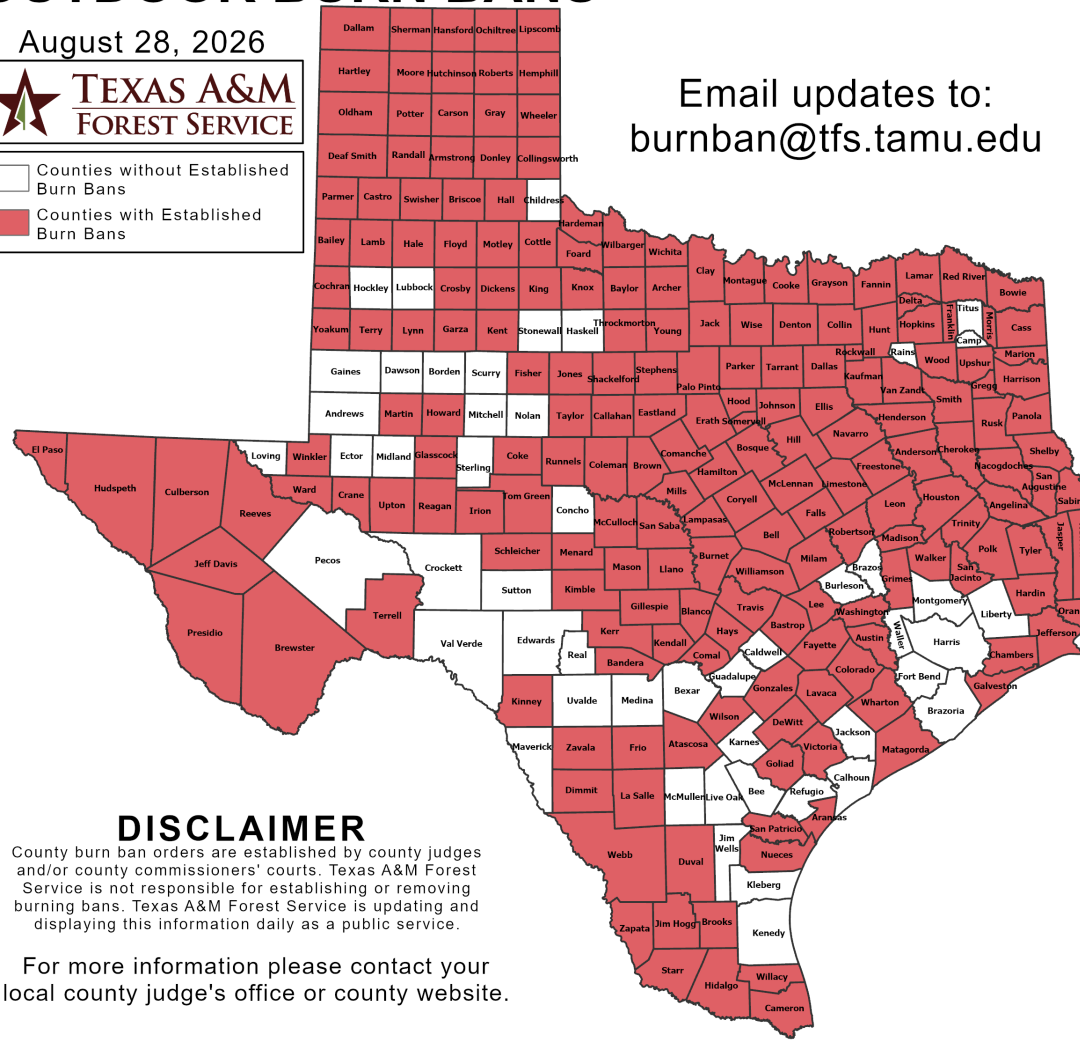

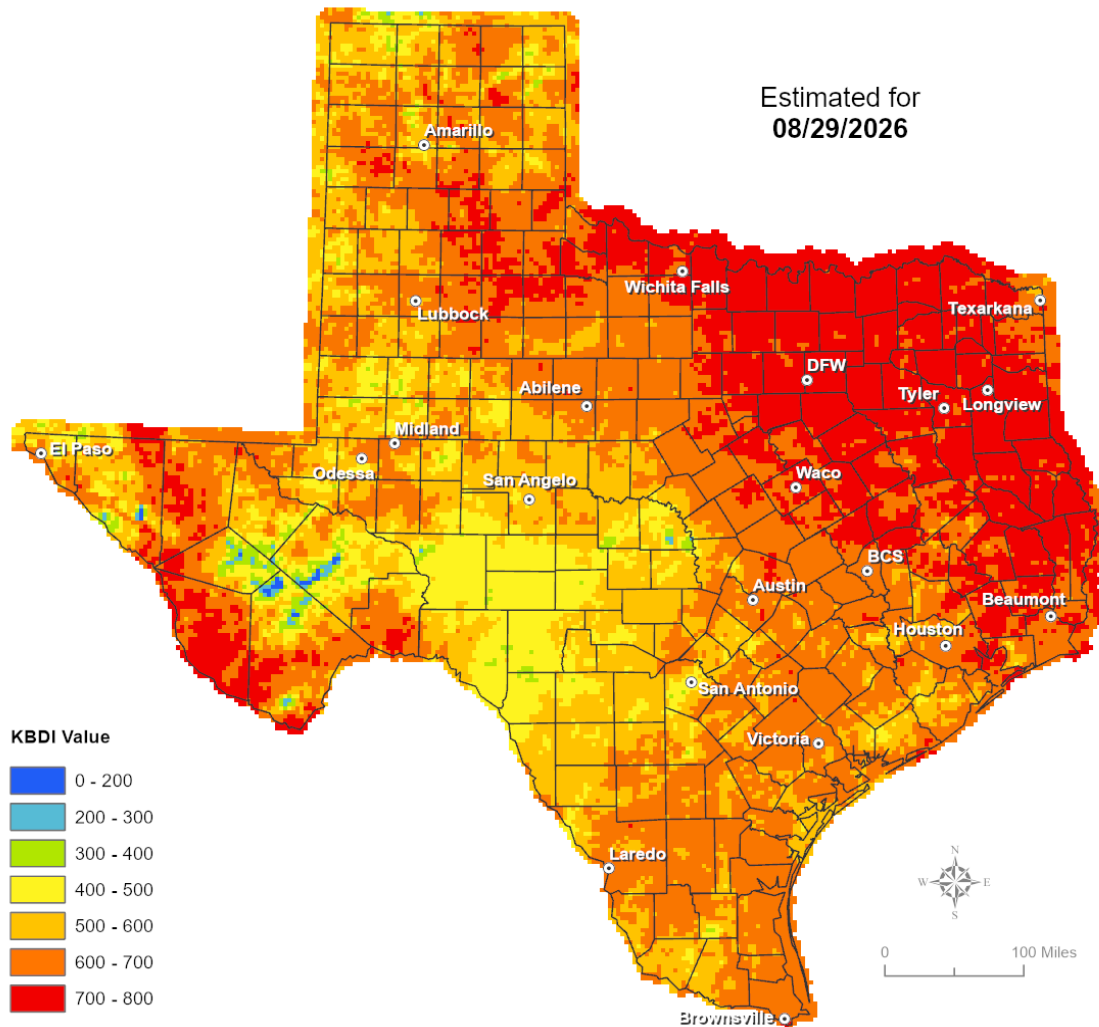

Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Report of 1,041 (No Change) fires and 183,681 (No Change) acres have been burned this year. There are 204 (No Change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 254 counties with an average over 400.
