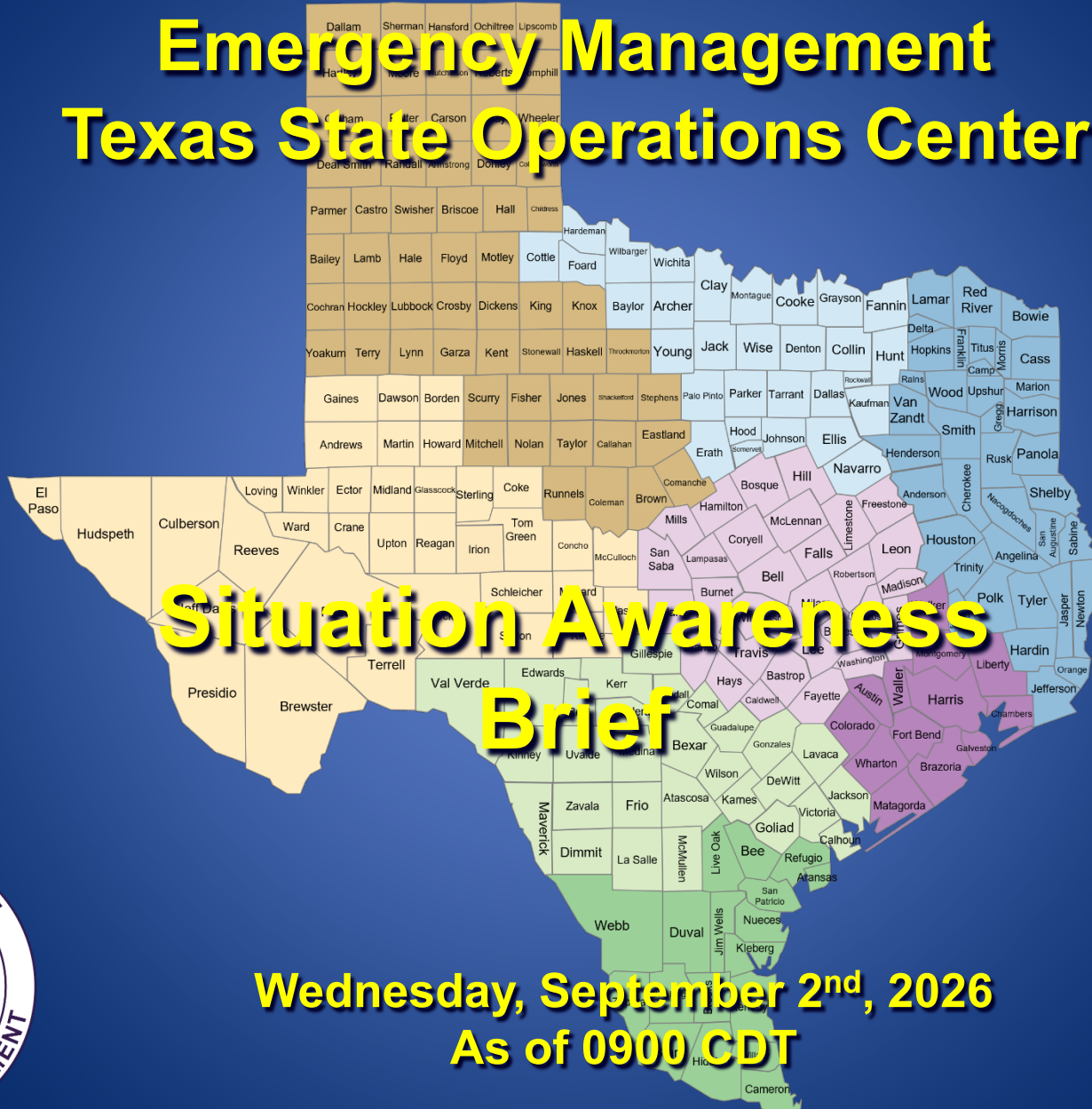

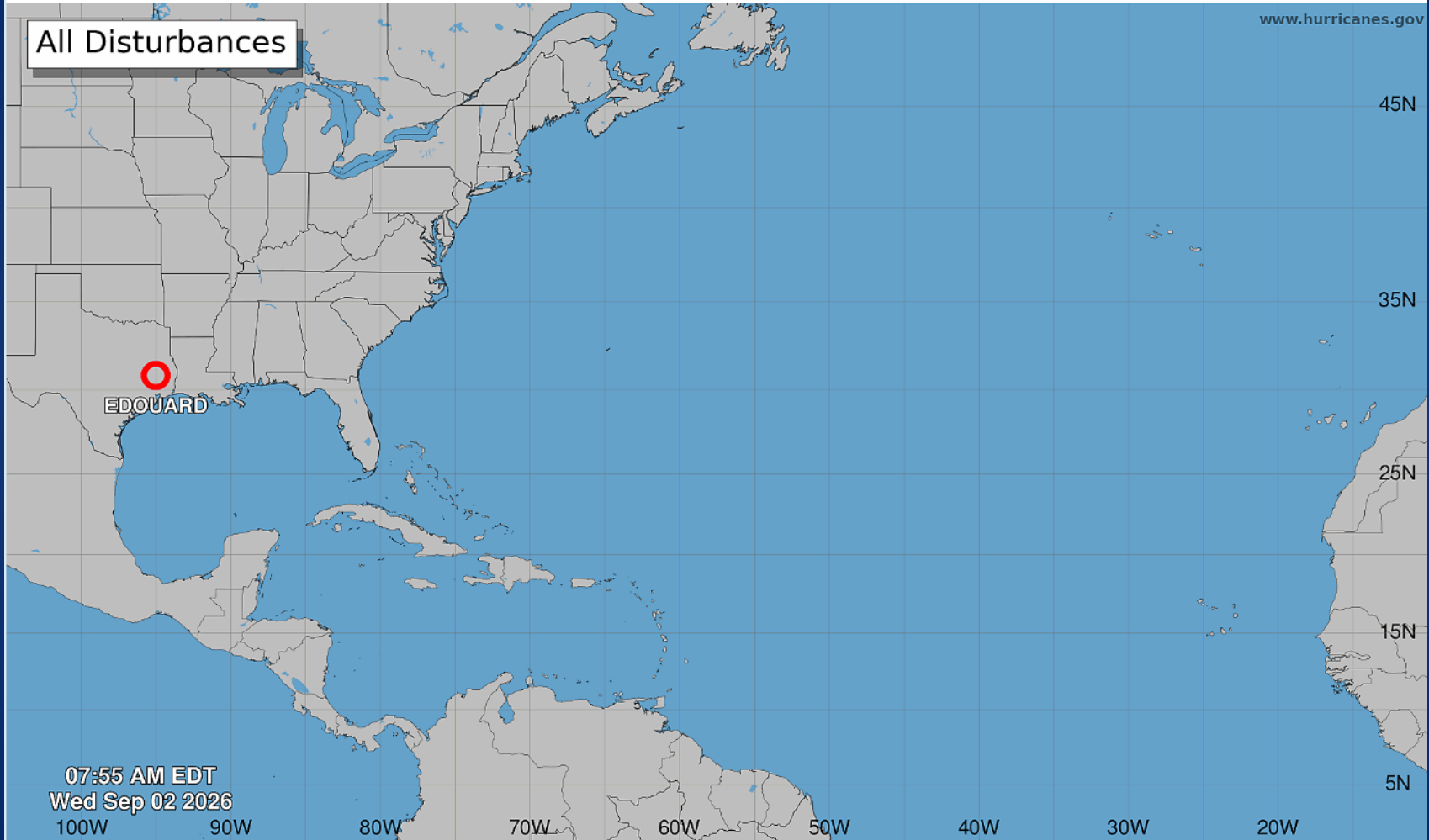
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

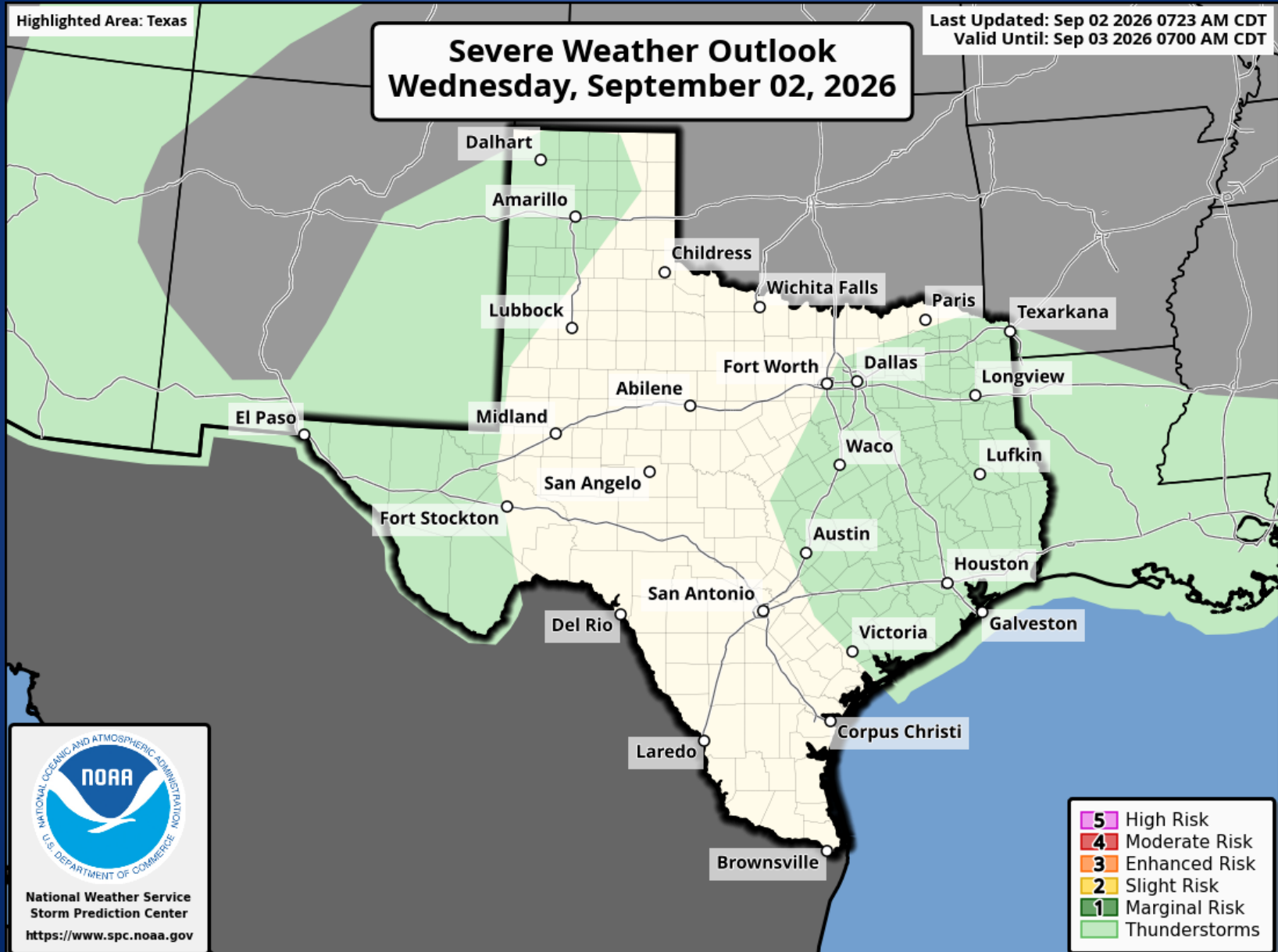

Temperatures are on the rise as we head into the second half of the work week, with high temperatures over 100°F across much of the eastern Panhandles. Low storm chances across the southwestern and central TX Panhandle this afternoon.

Low rain chances are in the forecast for areas generally along and east of a Llanito to San Marcos to Hallettsville line, with dry conditions elsewhere. Temperatures remain above normal with highs in the mid 90s to 105 degrees.

- **Major** (level 3 of 4) to **Extreme** (level 4 of 4) risk of heat-related illness

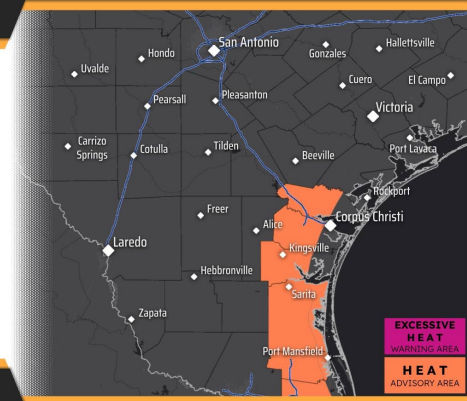

There is a Major Heat Risk across much of Deep South today with Extreme Heat Risk across portions of the Rio Grande Valley and the Rio Grande Plains. If spending time outdoors be sure to stay hydrated and practice heat safety. Visit weather.gov/heat for heat safety tips and resources.

Another scorcher of a summer day is in store for today. Heat index values will climb as high as 113°F for much of the afternoon over portions of the inland Coastal Bend. As such, a Heat Advisory has been issued from noon to 6 PM today.

Locally Heavy Rainfall Expected



Key Messages

- Periods of moderate to heavy rain and thunderstorms are expected today.
- There is a **Moderate Risk (level 3 of 4)** of Excessive Rainfall for the Piney Woods region, and a **Slight Risk (level 2 of 4)** extending further to the southwest today.
- Threat diminishes, but not eliminated, Thursday.



Timing

- Rain chances continue today with some banding precipitation on the outskirts of the low.



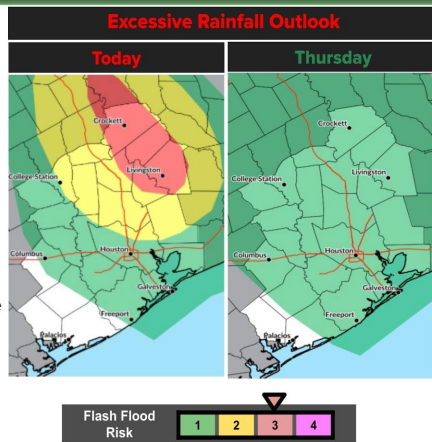
Impacts

- Flash flooding and localized rises on area watersheds where strong storms move over the same area.
- Rainfall rates 3-4"/hr are possible.

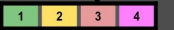

Locally Heavy Rain: Flash Flooding Possible



- As the day progresses, training rainbands will develop further away from the remnants of Edouard situated near the Piney Woods area.



- Brazos, Grimes, Houston, Madison, Trinity, Waller, Walker, San Jacinto, Polk, Montgomery, Liberty, Harris, and Chambers Counties



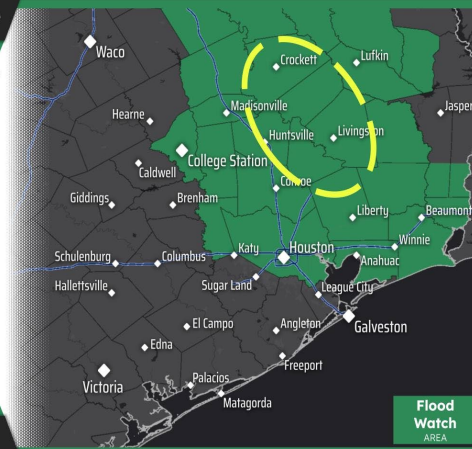
- Very high tropical rain rates of 3-4"/hr possible.

- Highest flash flood risk near the remnants of Edouard (yellow hatched area).

- Training feeder bands outside of that area are also likely. Flash flooding is equally possible with those too, but not as widespread of an area.

- Potential impacts: flooding of streets, low-lying areas, rivers/creeks, and roads.

- Do not drive across flooded roadways!

Key Messages

- There is a Marginal to Slight Risk for excessive rainfall and flash flooding today through tonight, mainly across Deep East and East-central Texas.



Amounts

- Rain amounts will vary, with higher totals of 1-3 inches with isolated higher amounts in excess of 4+ inches possible in the Slight Risk area.

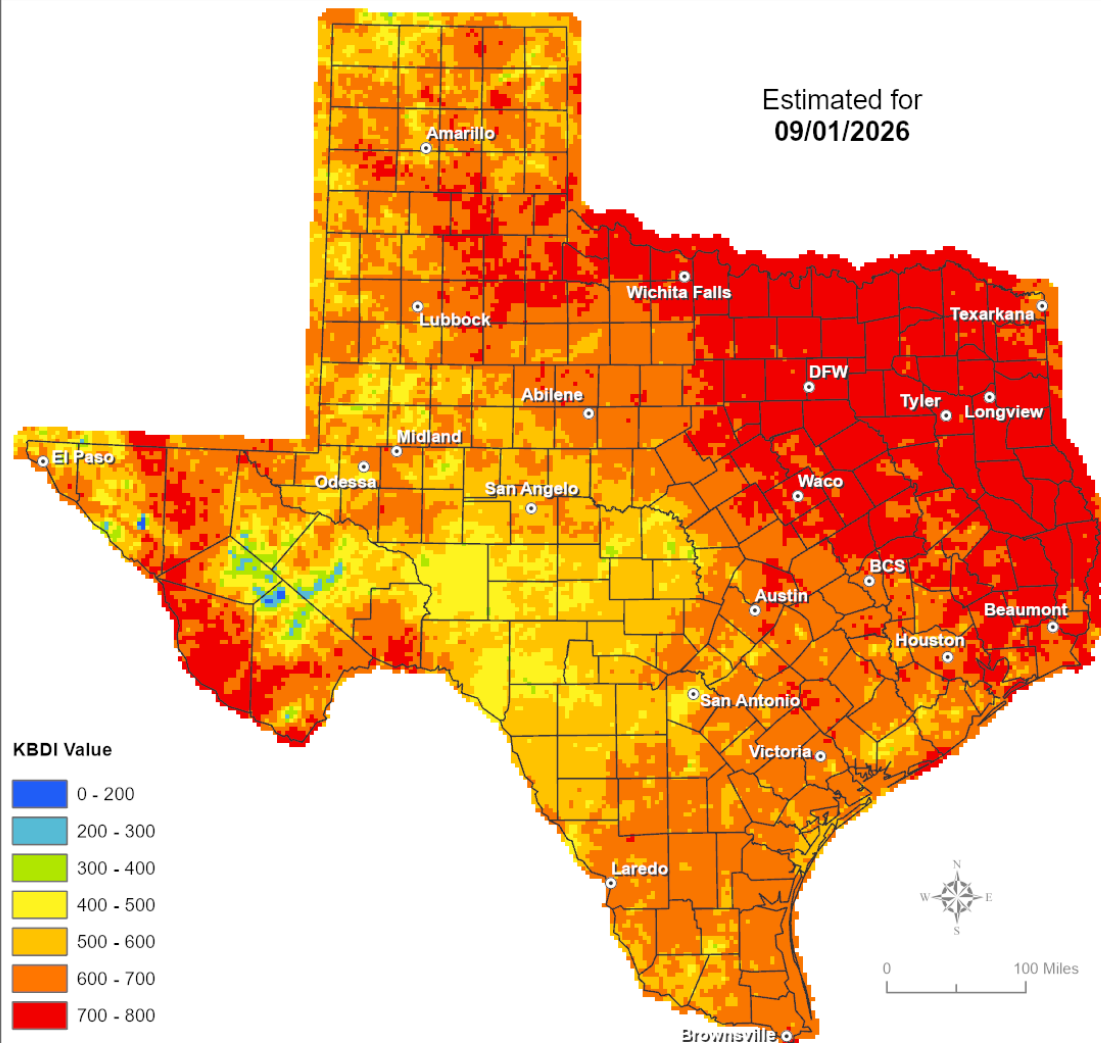
