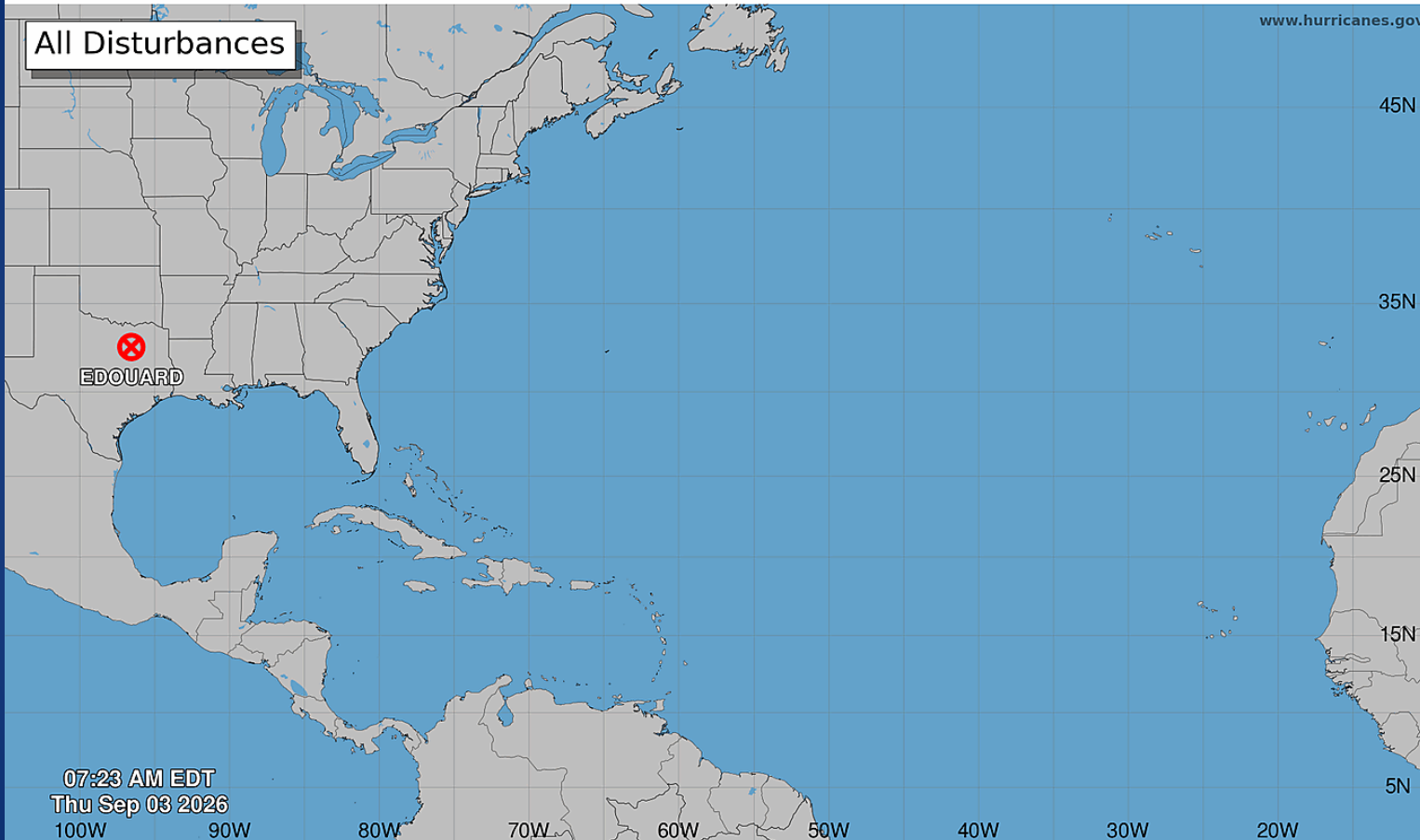


Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook National Hurricane Center Miami, Florida

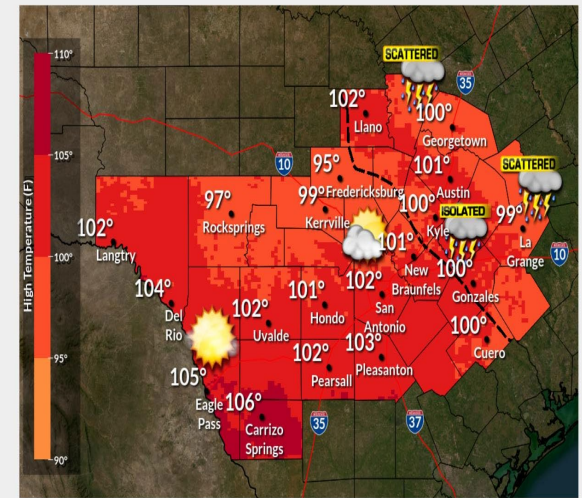

Elevated fire weather conditions expected today across much of South Texas. The combination of southeast winds 10-15 mph, afternoon relative humidity values as low as 24% and dry to critically dry fuels will lead to an elevated fire risk. Fires can ignite very easily in these conditions.

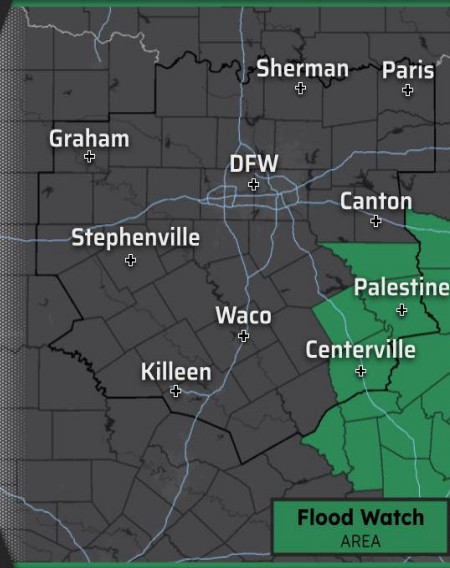

A Flood Watch is in effect for eastern portions of Central Texas until 1 PM Thursday. Localized heavy rain with the remnants of TS Edouard could result in instances of flash flooding. Widespread rainfall of 1-3 inches is expected in the Watch area, with isolated rain totals up to 6 inches possible.

Considerable Flash Flood Threat



- Through Thursday Afternoon.



- A swath of very high rainfall totals over portions of Liberty, Polk, San Jacinto, Montgomery, and Trinity Counties has saturated the ground. Periods of showers and thunderstorms are anticipated into Thursday in association with the remnants of Edouard.
- An additional 2-4 inches with localized higher totals of 6+ inches are possible over the next 24 hours.
- Very high tropical rain rates of 3-4"/hr possible.
- **Highest considerable flash flood risk in the yellow hatched area.**
- Potential impacts: flooding of streets, low-lying areas, rivers/creeks, and roads.
- Do not drive across flooded roadways!
- Have multiple ways to receive alerts.

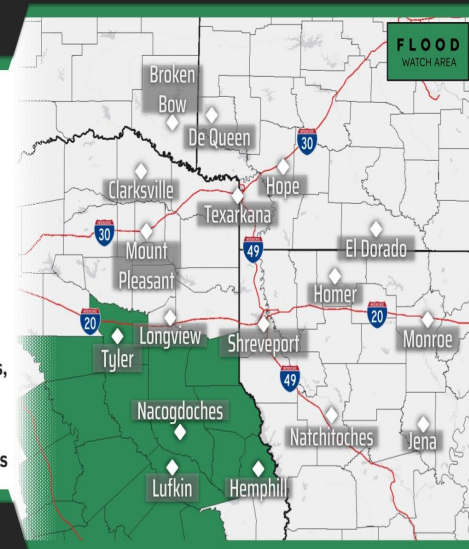

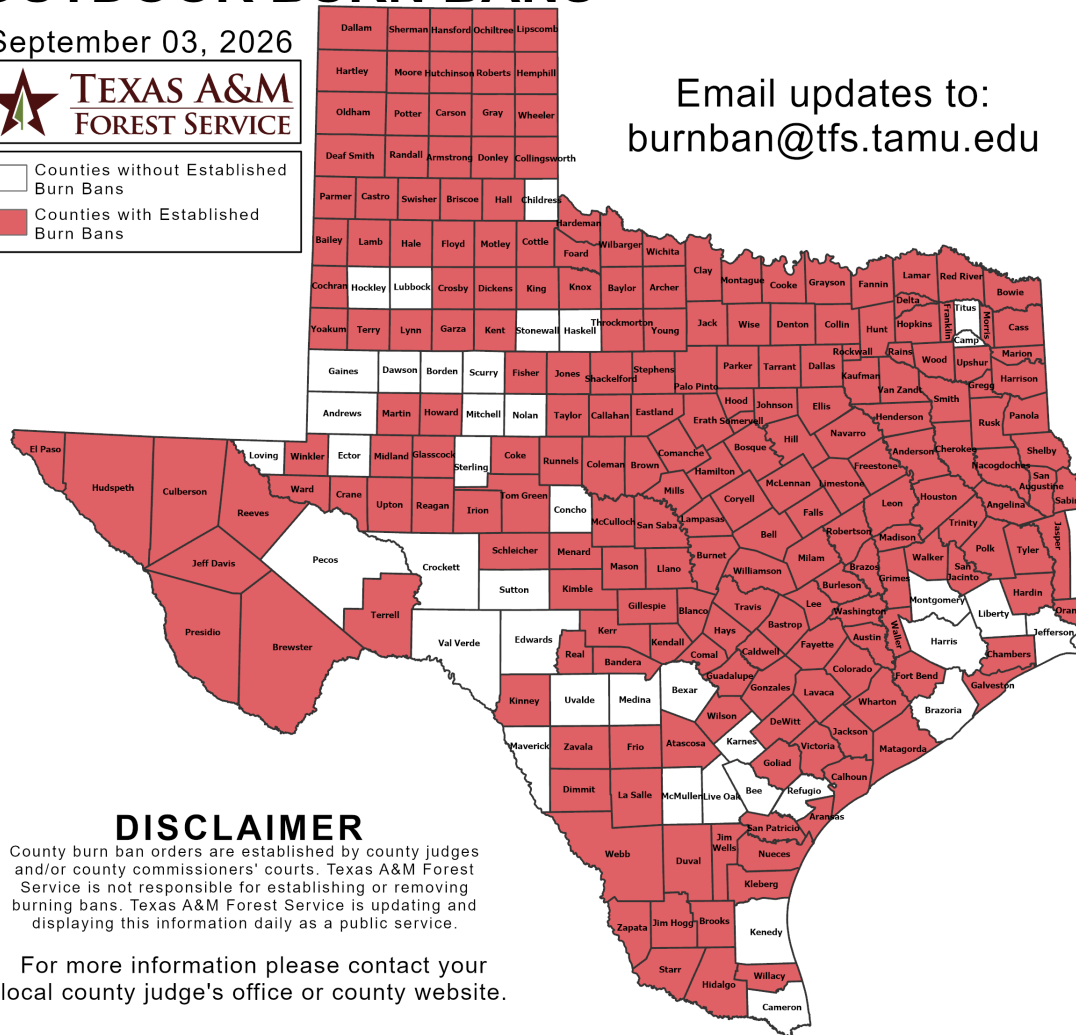

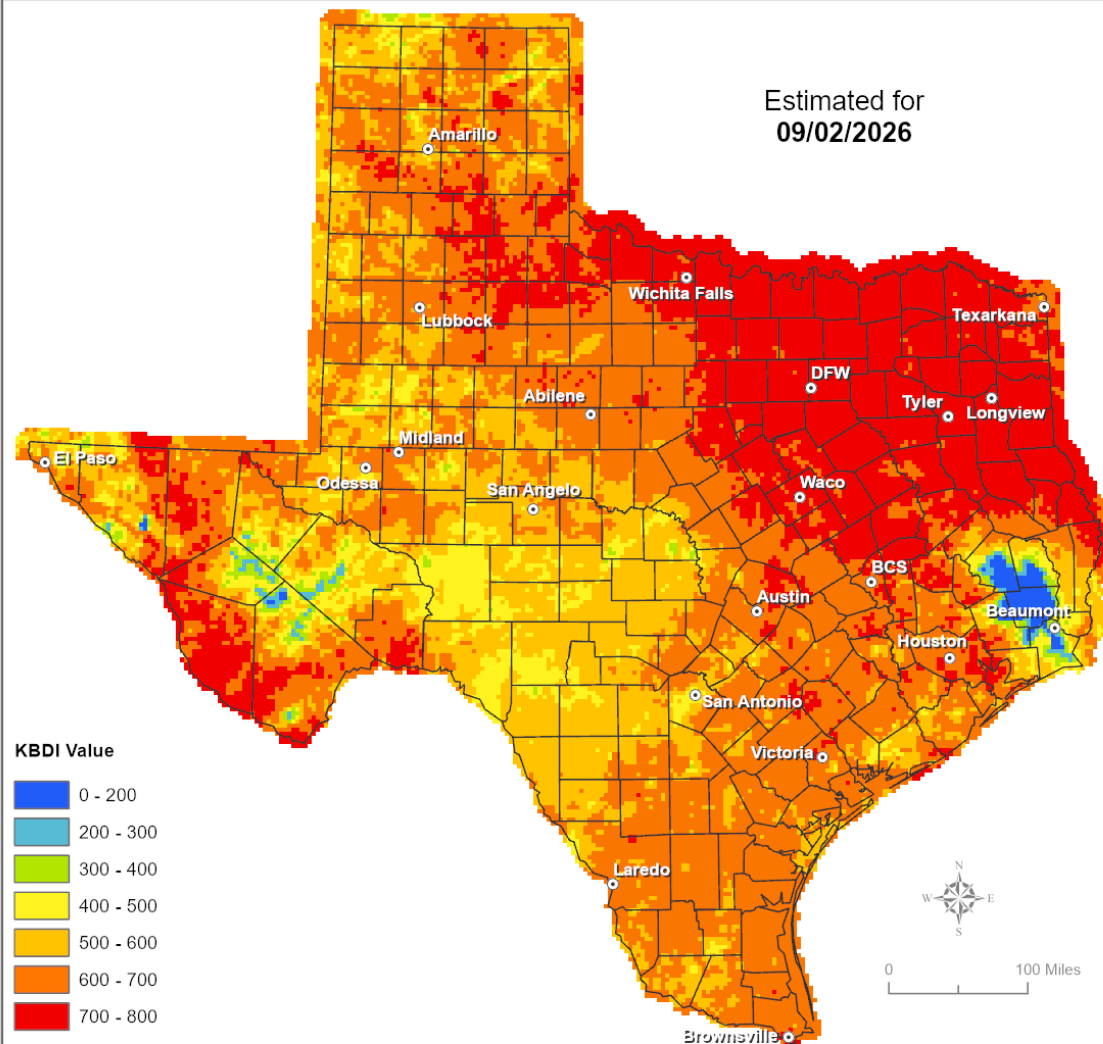

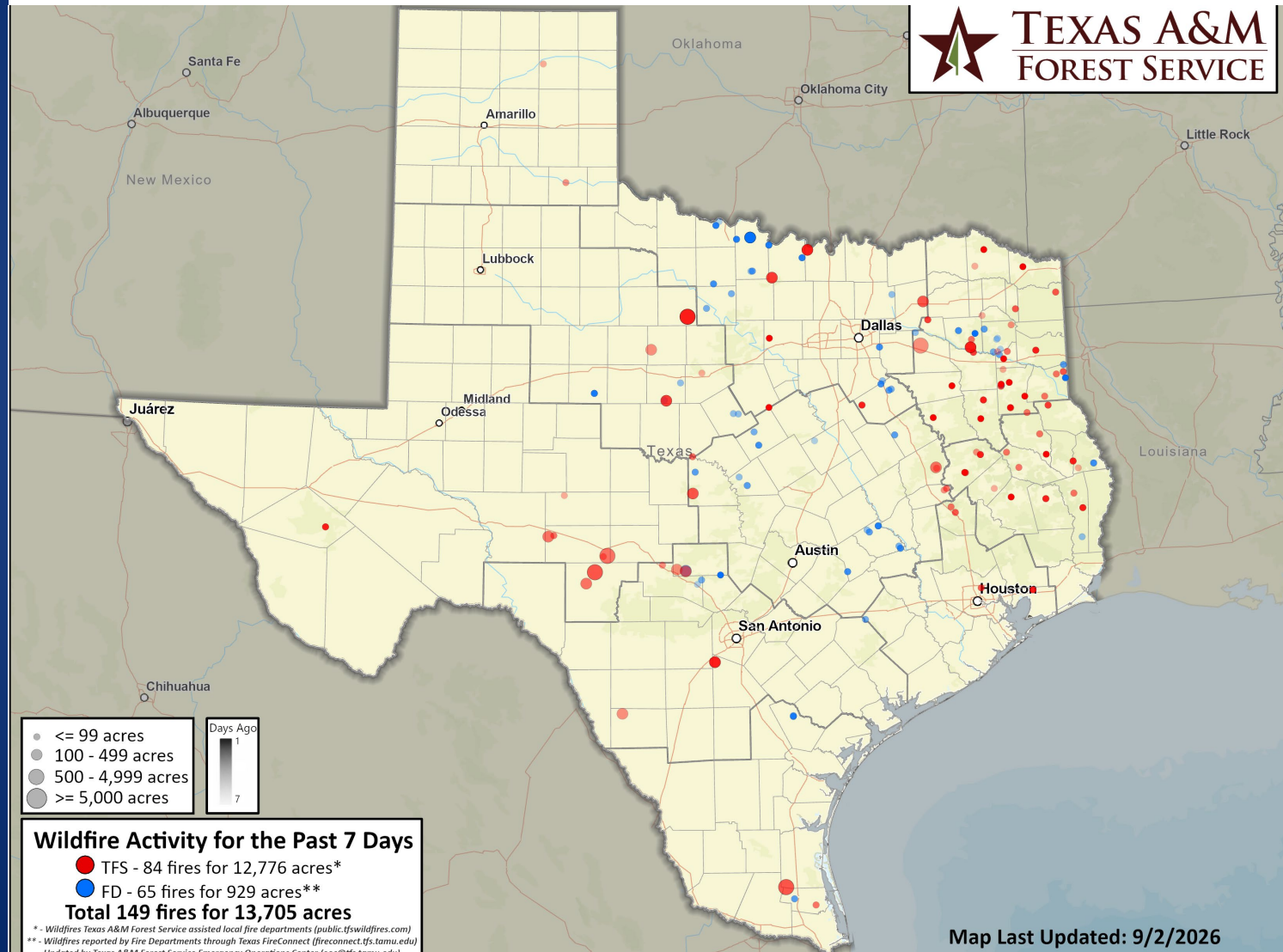
