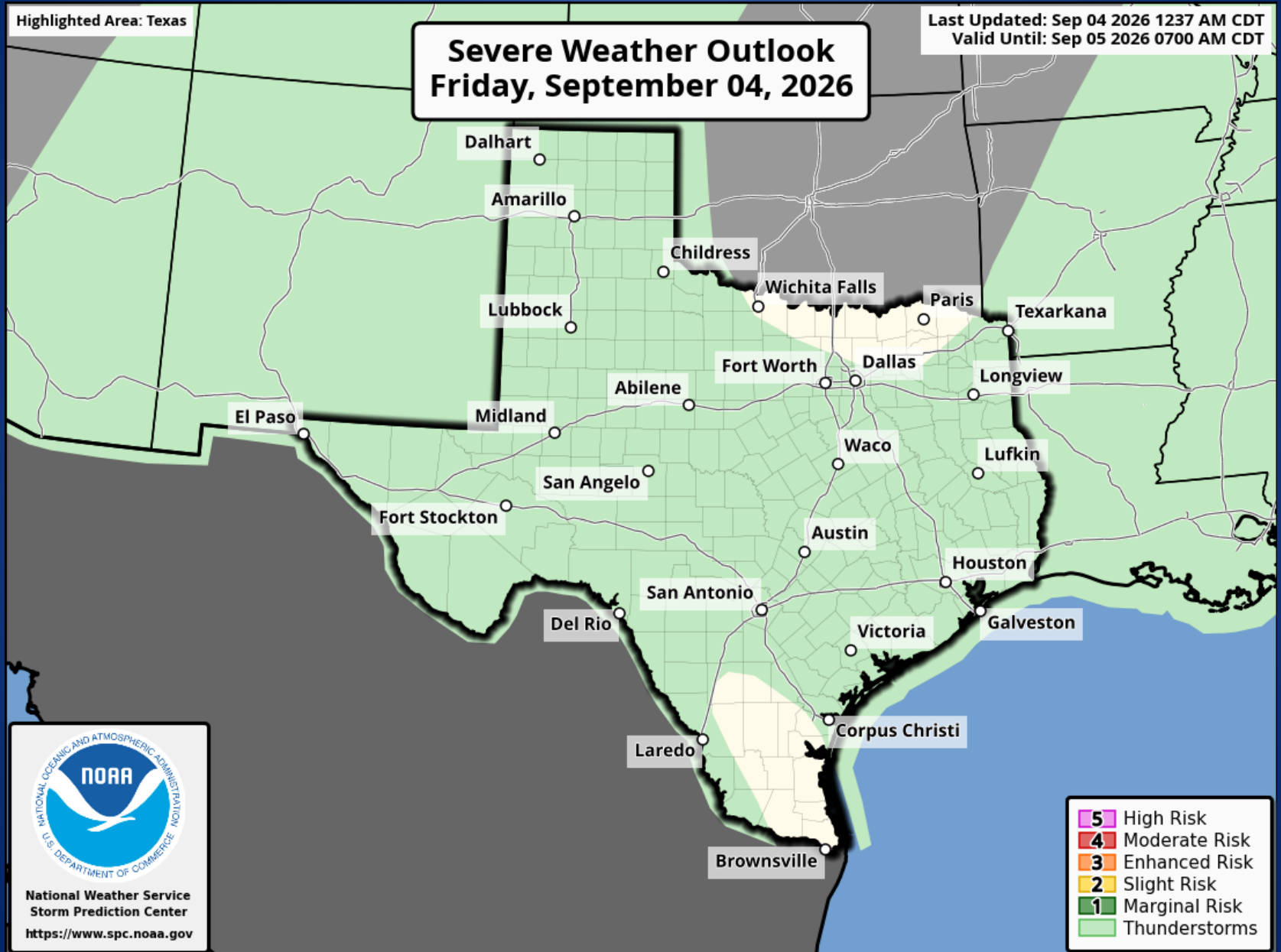

Brief moderate to heavy rain can be expected with any thunderstorm, and there will also be a potential for strong wind gusts. Shower and thunderstorm chances will decrease through the evening.

Highs should peak in the 90s to near 100° though triple digit heat indices will be common areawide.

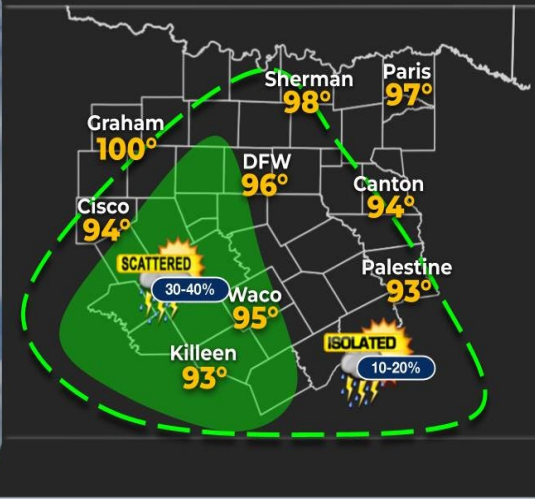


Any showers or storms that develop today should dissipate around or shortly after sunset.

Afternoon Highs & Rain Chances



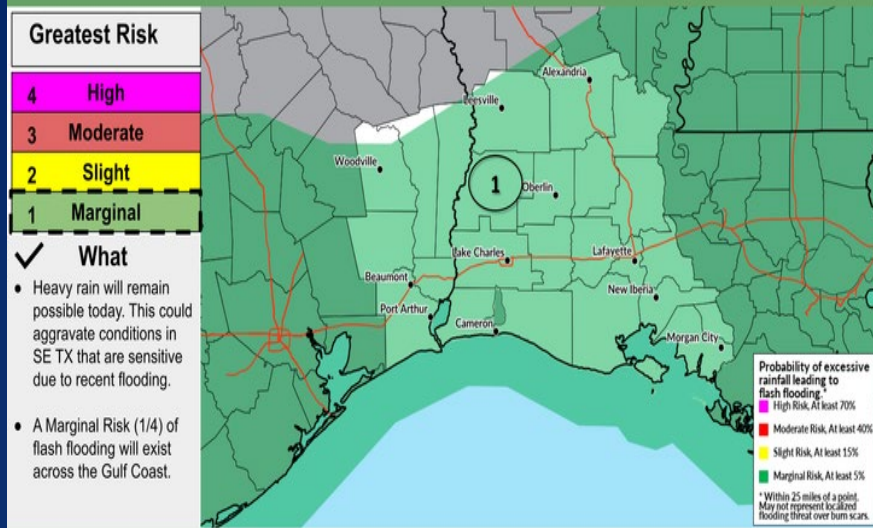

Isolated showers and storms will remain possible across parts of North and Central Texas today as the remnants of Edouard linger over the region. Any showers or storms that develop should dissipate within a few hours of sunset. Otherwise, it will be hot with highs mostly in the 90s though a few locations west of US-281 and north of I-20 could reach 100 degrees this afternoon. Additionally, triple digit heat indices will be common areawide this afternoon.

Locally Heavy Rainfall Possible



Key Messages

- Lingering moisture continues to bring daily chances of isolated to scattered showers/storms. Some of these storms may be capable of producing locally heavy rainfall in localized areas.
 - ◆ Grounds in areas east of I-45 remain very saturated from previous rounds of rainfall.
- There is a **Marginal Risk (level 1 of 4)** of Excessive Rainfall for most of Southeast Texas today and Saturday.



Potential Impacts

- Localized instances of street flooding, especially in low-lying areas, areas with poor drainage, and areas already saturated from previous rounds of rain.
- Rainfall rates of 2-3"/hr possible in the heaviest downpours.



Actions

- Have multiple ways to receive alerts.
- Stay up to date with the latest forecasts.

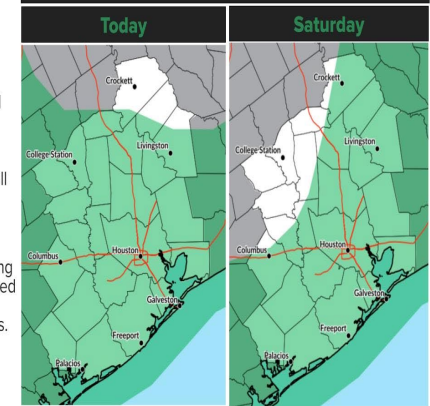

Today: Major to Extreme Heat Risk

Practice Heat Safety to Prevent Heat-Related Illnesses

Key Messages

- High temperatures ranging from 100-108°F this afternoon
- Peak heat indices ranging from 107-115°F
- **Major** (level 3 of 4) to **Extreme** (level 4 of 4) risk of heat-related illness

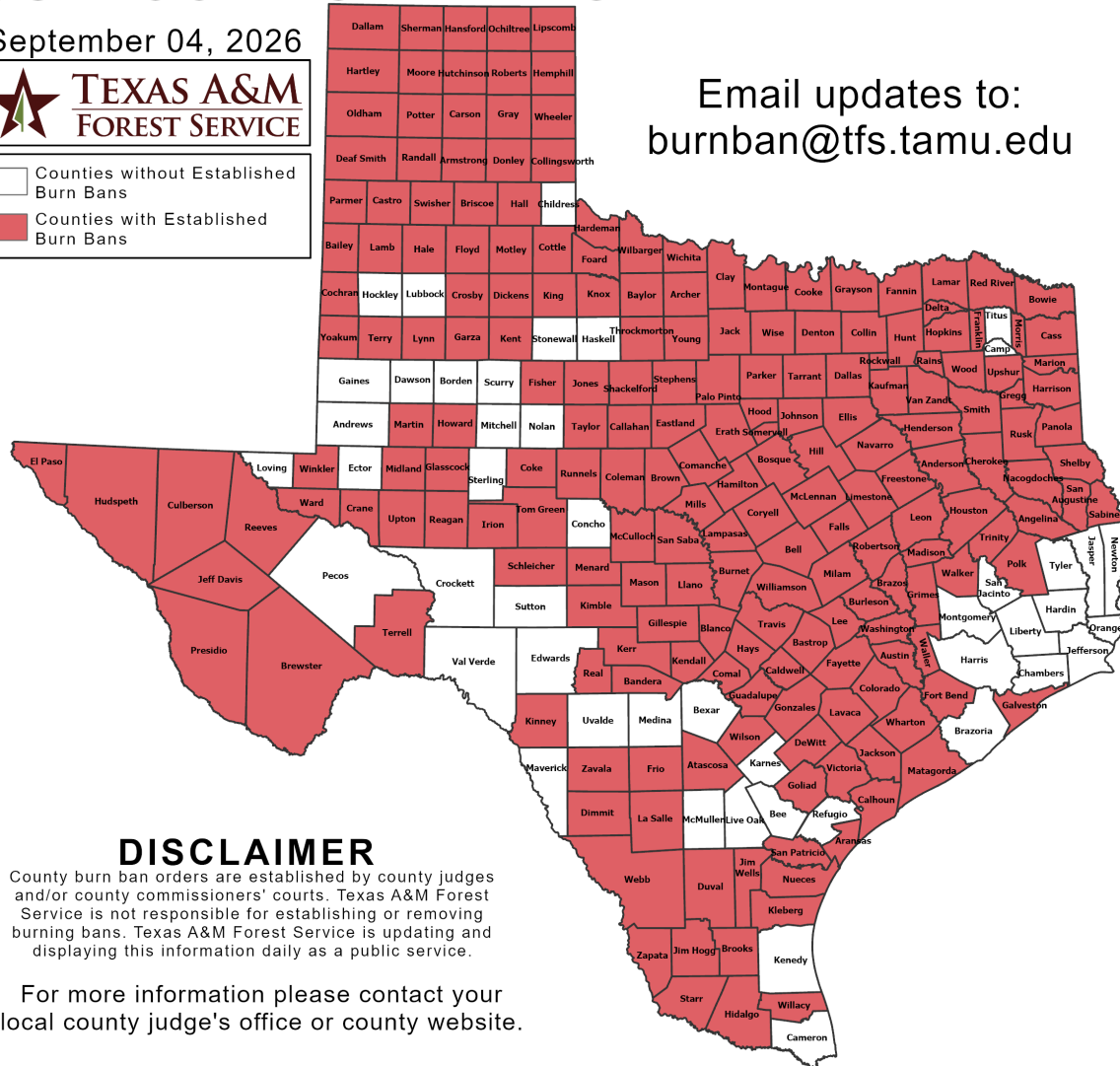

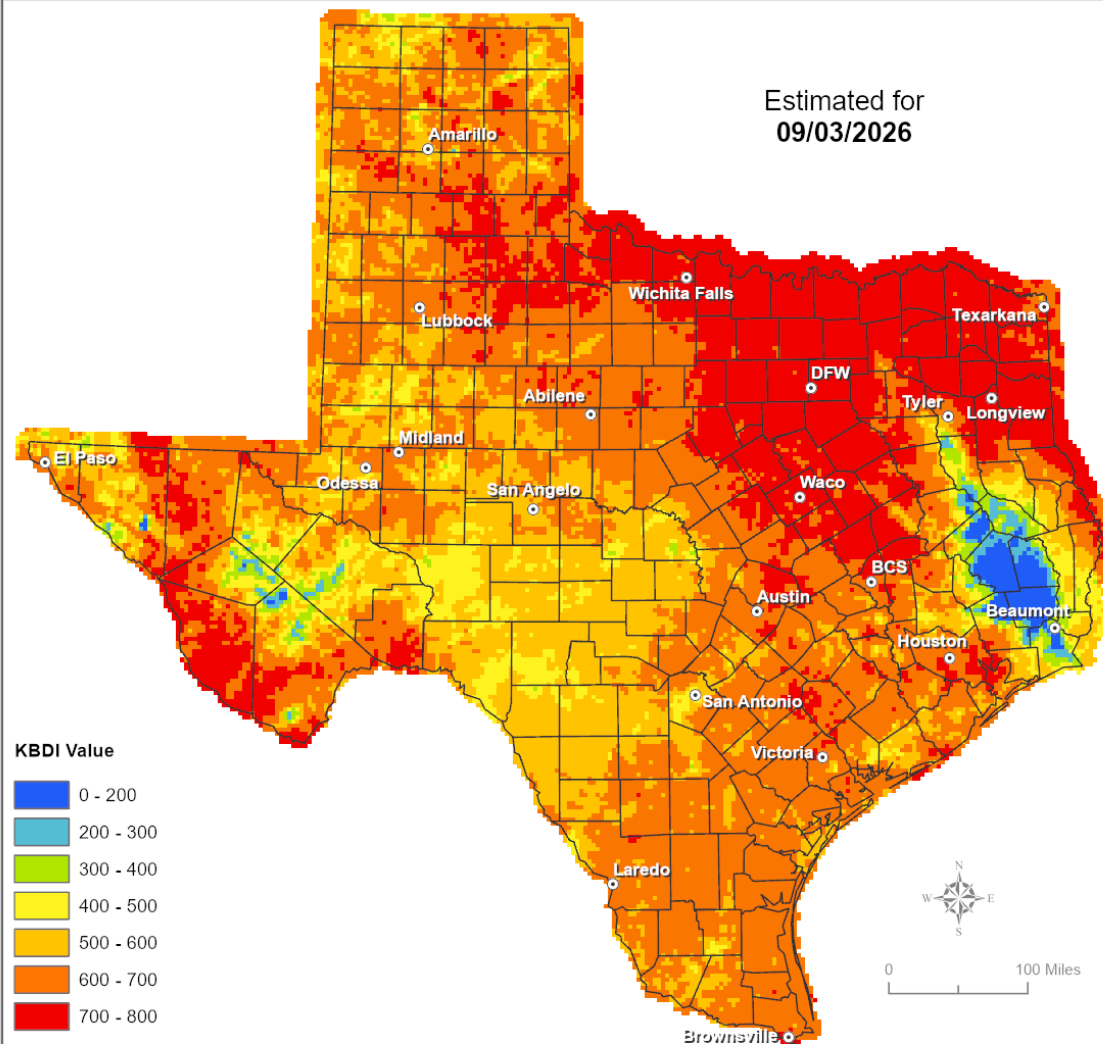

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

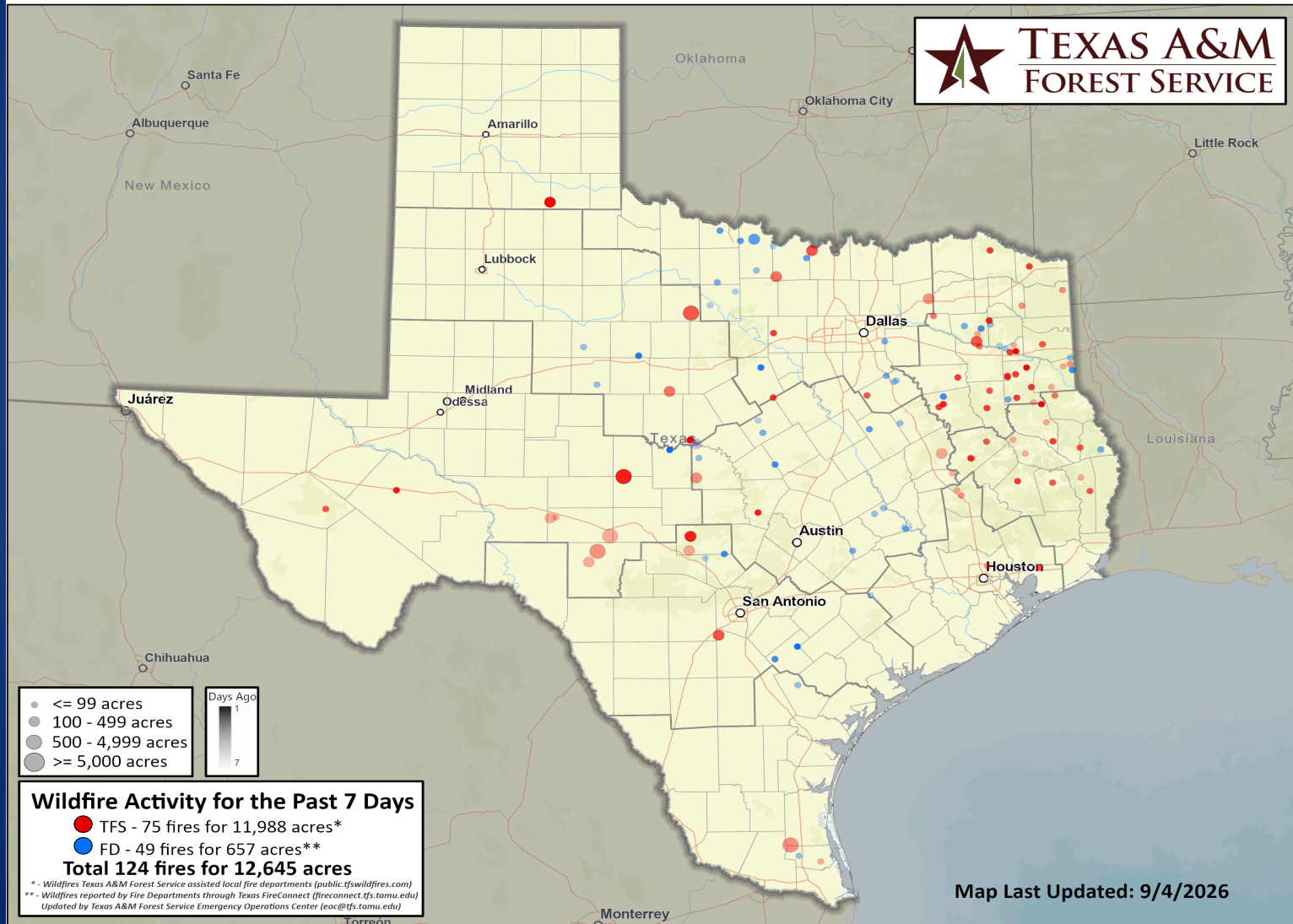
