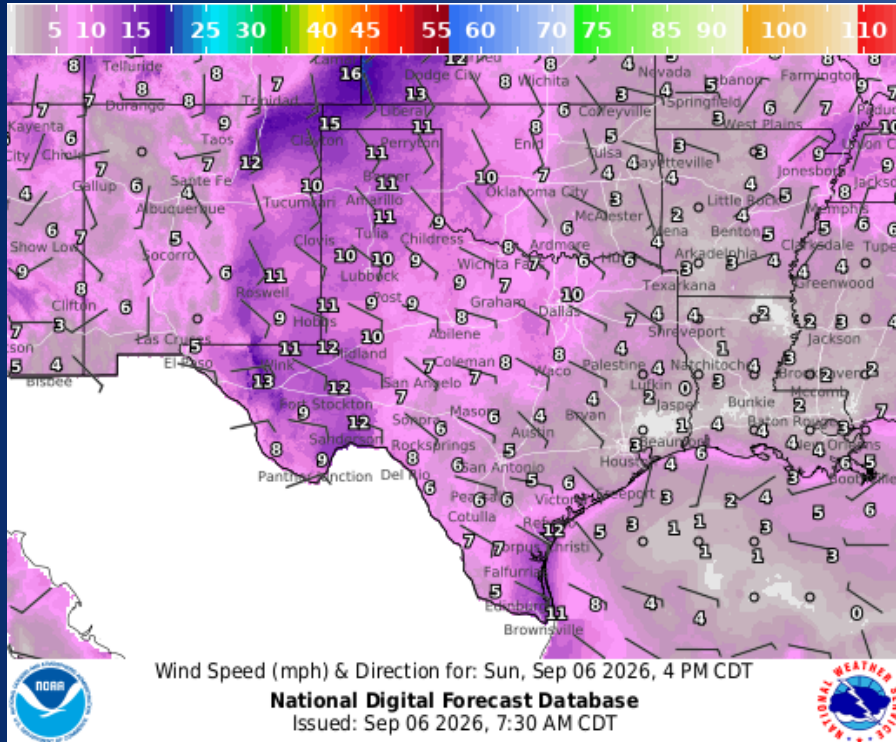

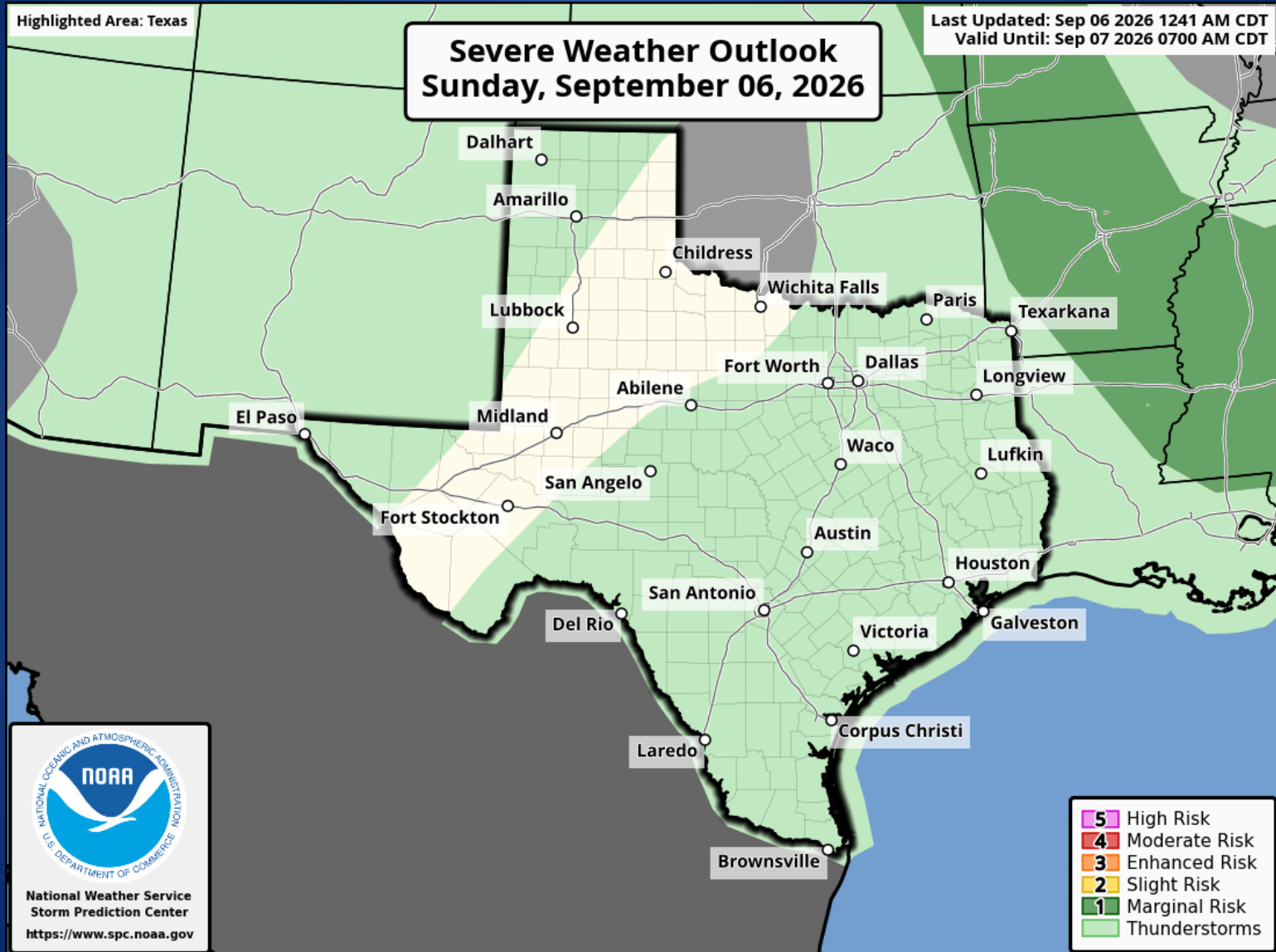

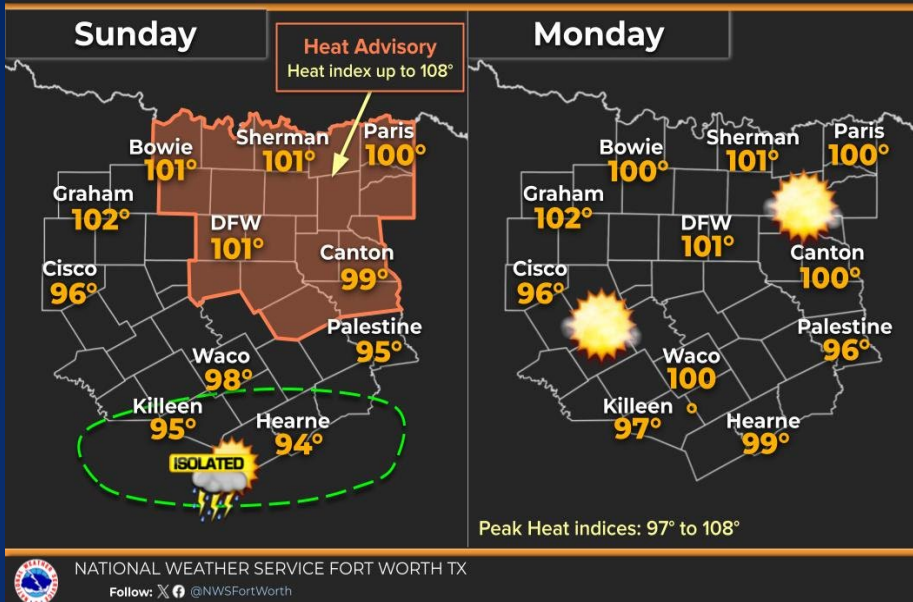

A Heat Advisory is in effect Sunday for much of North Texas where heat index values up to 108 degrees are expected. Isolated storms may develop again across Central TX (20-30% chance). It will be hot Monday (Labor Day) with highs in the upper 90s/triple digits and heat index values up to 108 degree. Rain chances are 10% or less Monday.

Locally Heavy Rainfall Possible



Key Messages

- Lingering tropical moisture combined with an upper level disturbance will lead to another round of scattered showers/storms today, especially near and south of I-10. Locally heavy rainfall is possible.
 - ◆ Grounds in areas east of I-45 remain very saturated from previous rounds of rainfall.
- There is a **Marginal Risk (level 1 of 4)** of Excessive Rainfall for most of Southeast Texas today.



Potential Impacts

- Localized instances of street flooding, especially in low-lying areas, areas with poor drainage, and areas already saturated from previous rounds of rain.
- Rainfall rates of 2-3+”/hr possible in the heaviest downpours.

- Have multiple ways to receive alerts!
- Remain weather-aware and stay tuned for forecast updates!

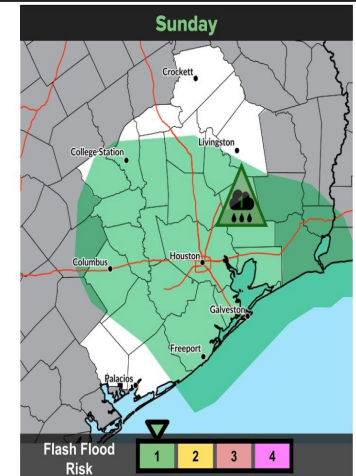

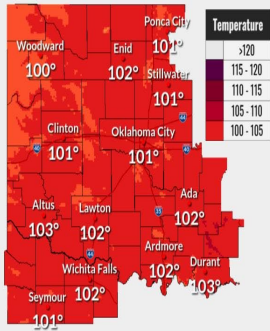

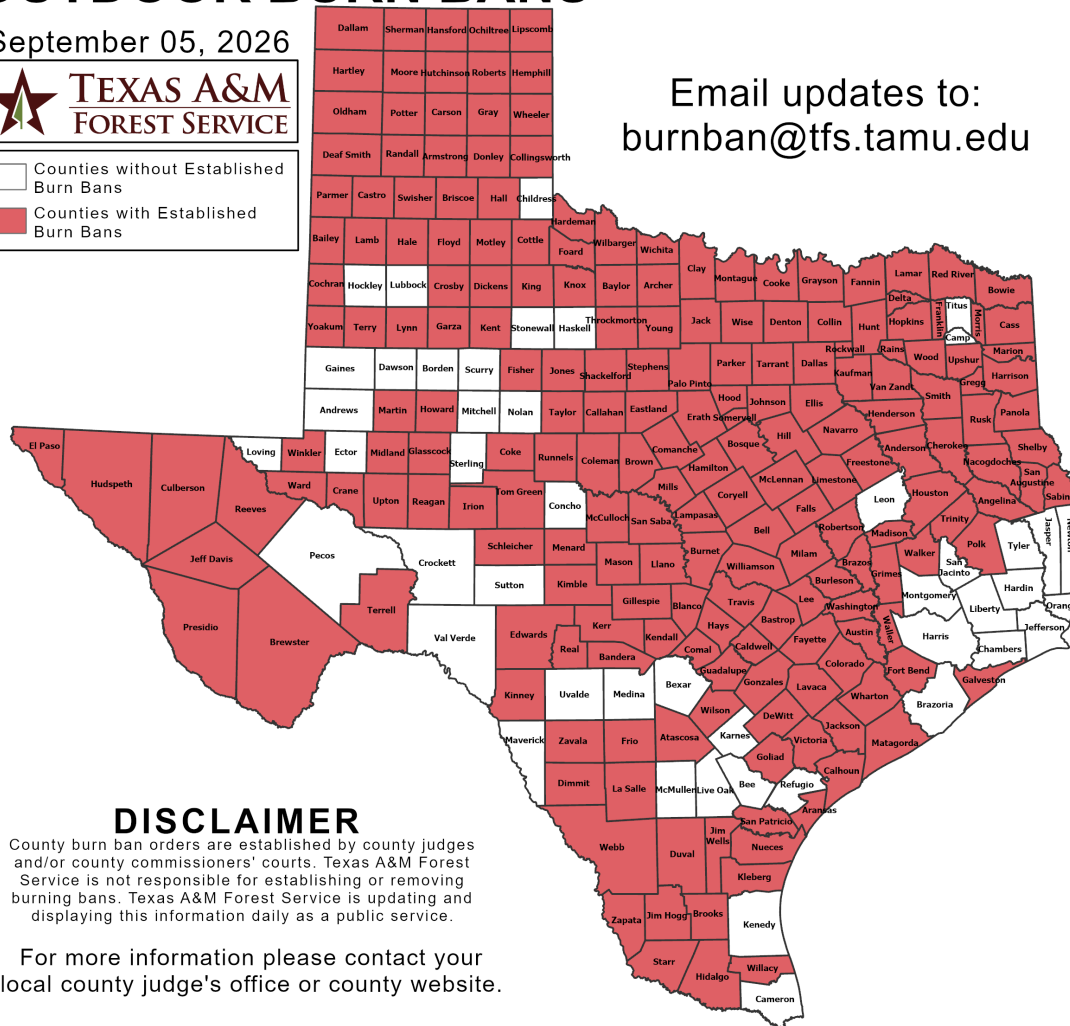

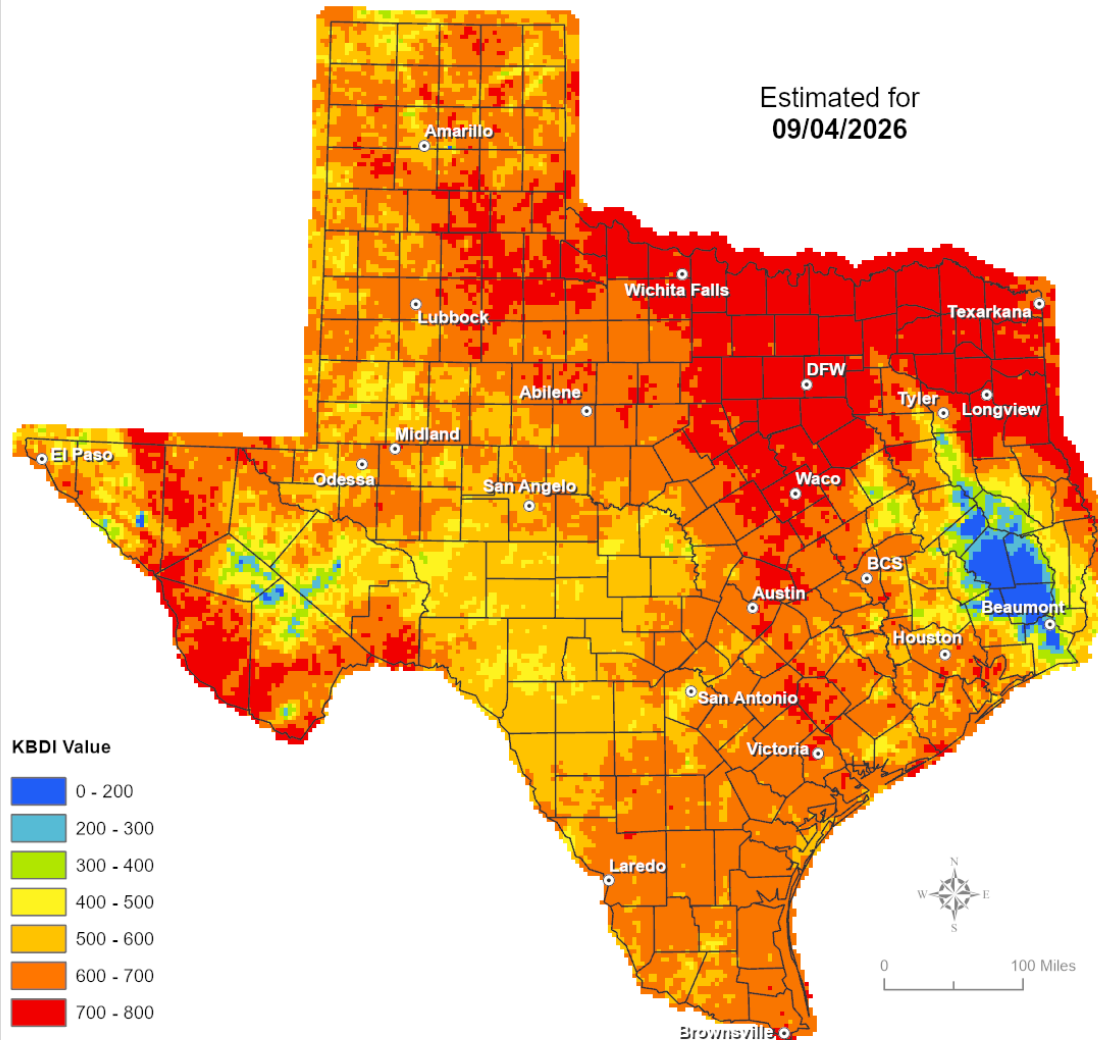

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

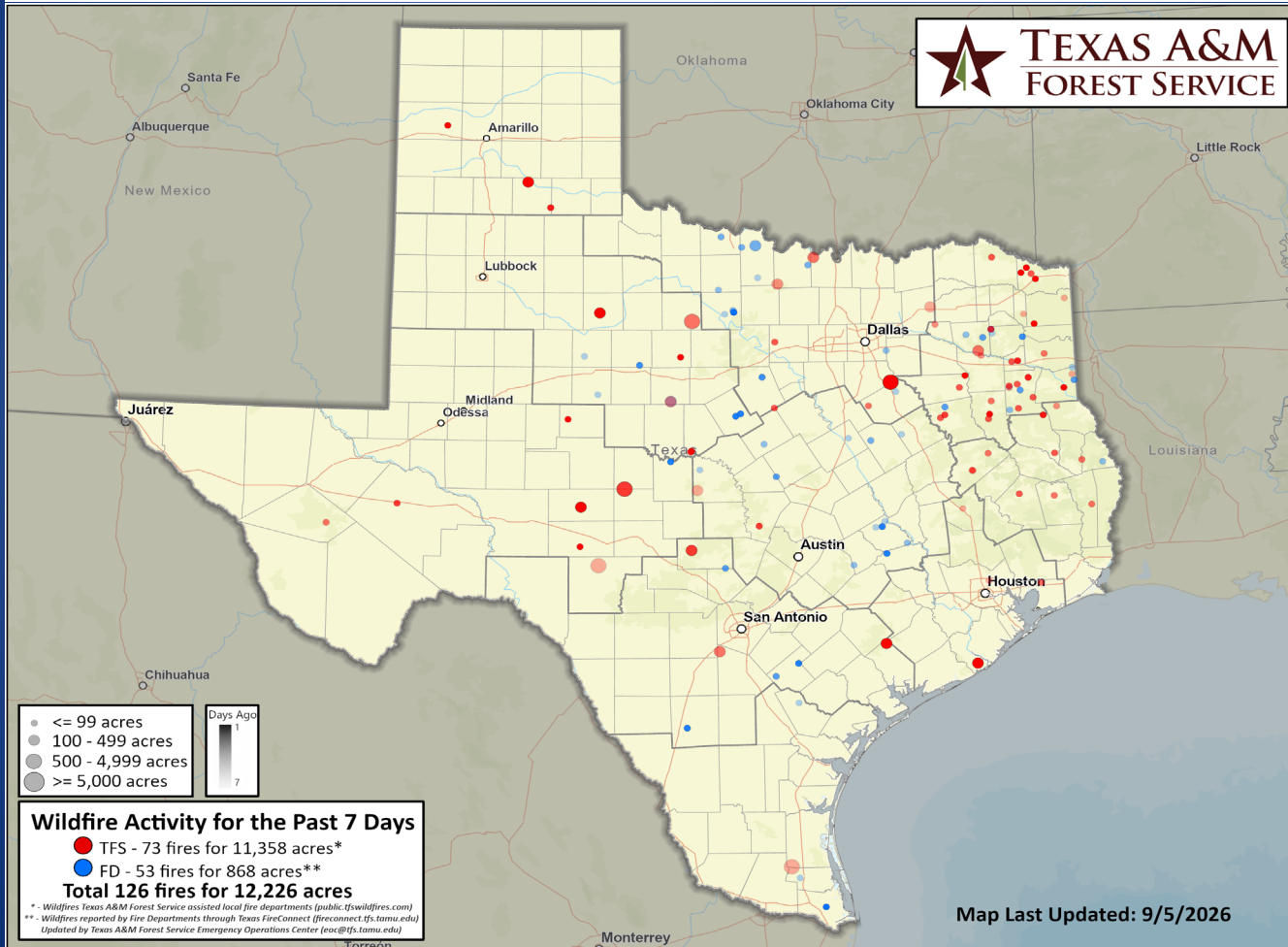
