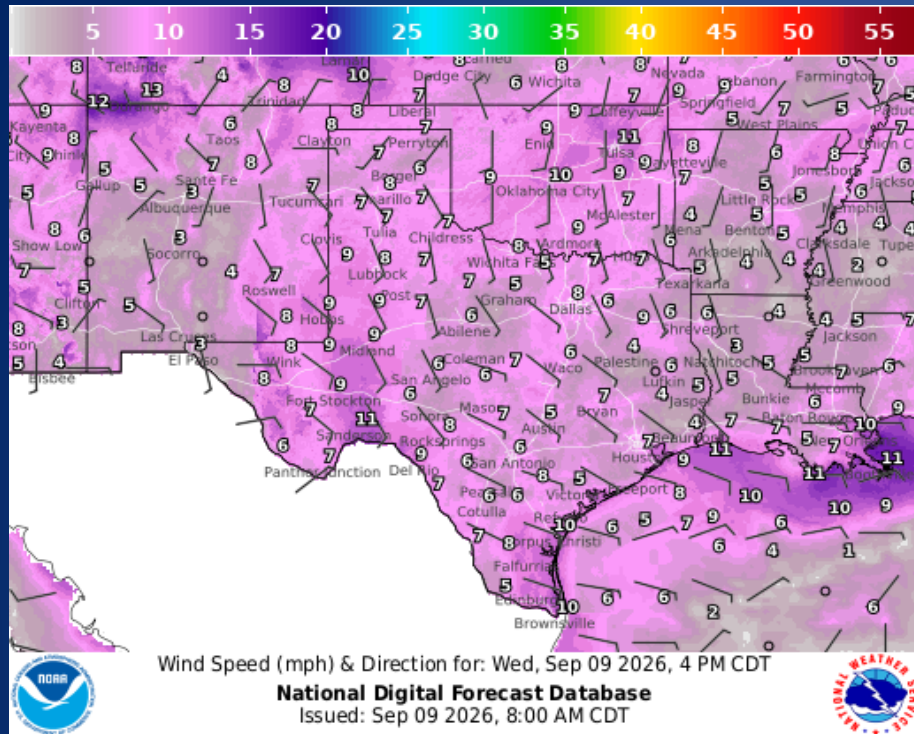

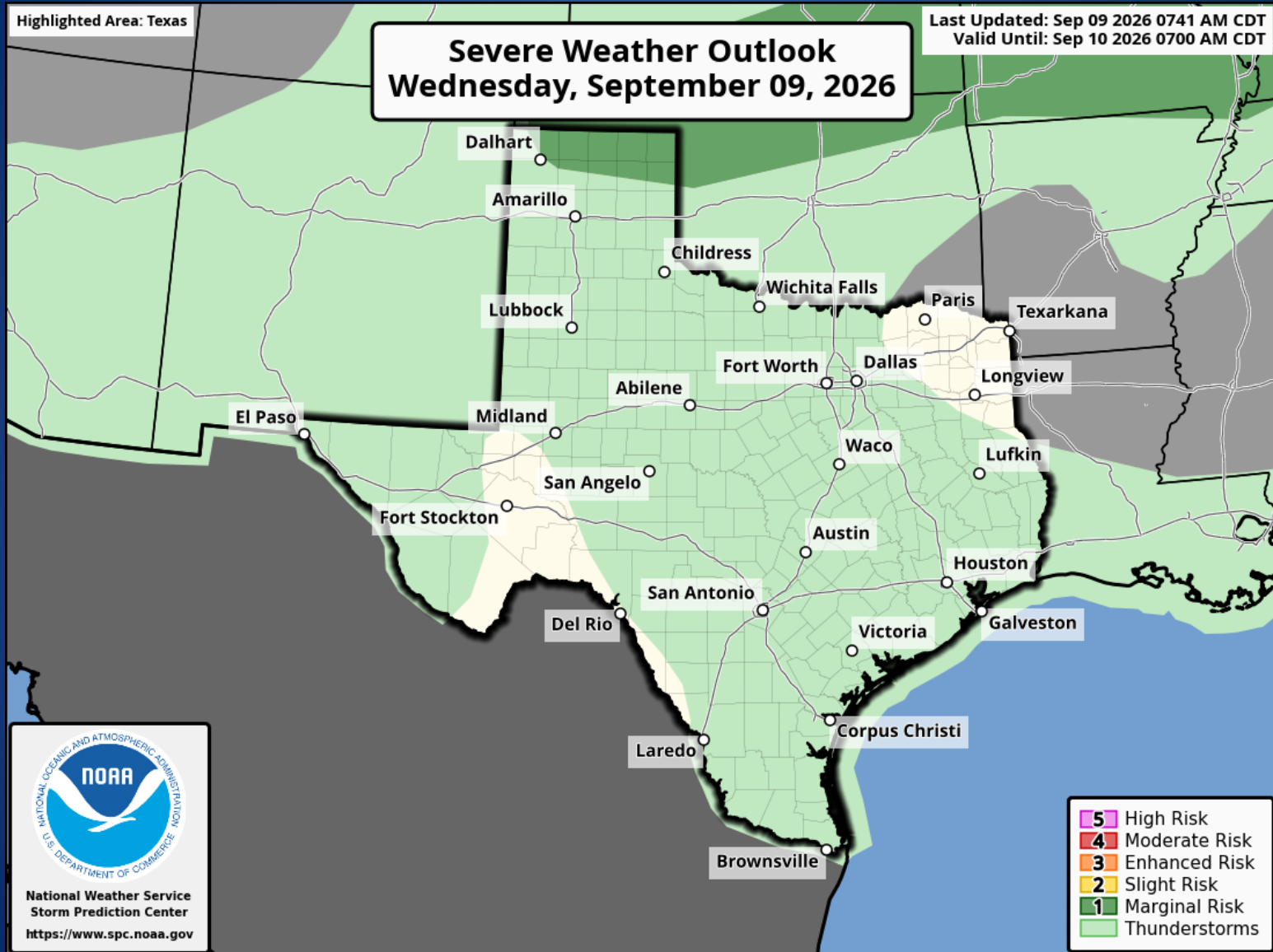

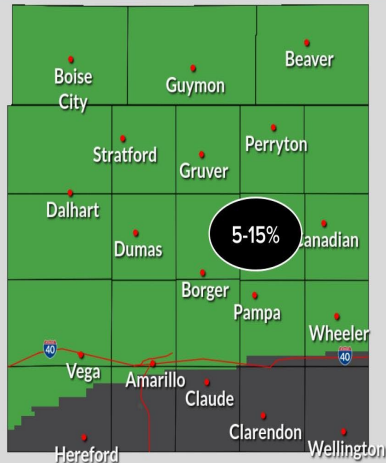

Information & Preparedness

- Heavy rain to torrential rainfall is expected with thunderstorms
- Highest localized flash flood risk will be urban areas and low-lying areas
- Turn around, don't drown!

Heavy to very heavy rainfall is expected from thunderstorms Wednesday afternoon and evening, which could lead to flash flooding if storms persists over the same area long enough. Present indication suggest the most favored areas for this heavy rain will be in northern and eastern areas of the panhandles, although any storm would be capable of dropping heavy rain. The highest localized flash flood risk will be in urban areas and Palo Duro Canyon mainly between 3-8 pm.

Today: Major to Extreme Heat Risk

Practice Heat Safety to Prevent Heat-Related Illnesses



Key Messages

- High temperatures ranging from 98-106°F this afternoon
- Peak Heat Indices ranging from 104-114°F
- **Major** (level 3 of 4) to **Extreme** (level 4 of 4) risk of heat-related illness

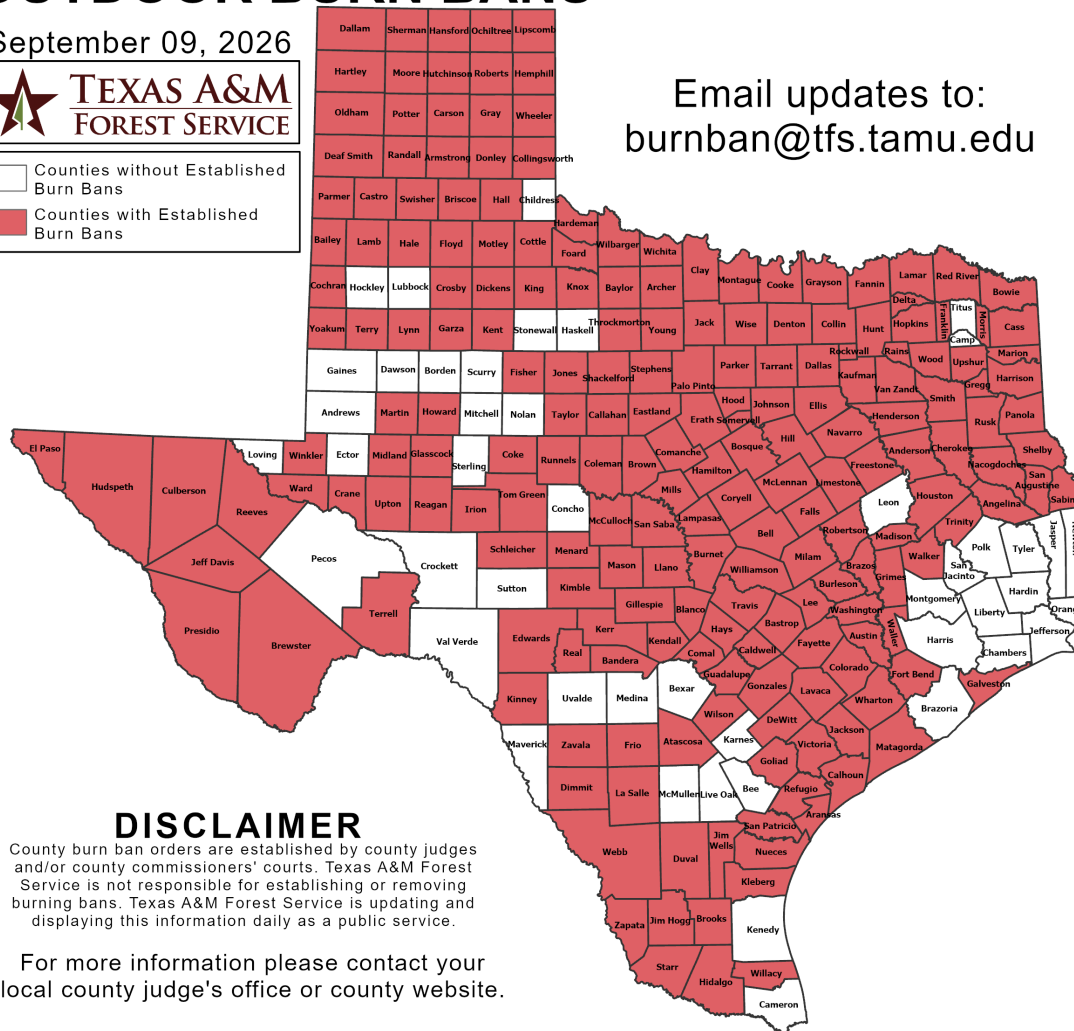

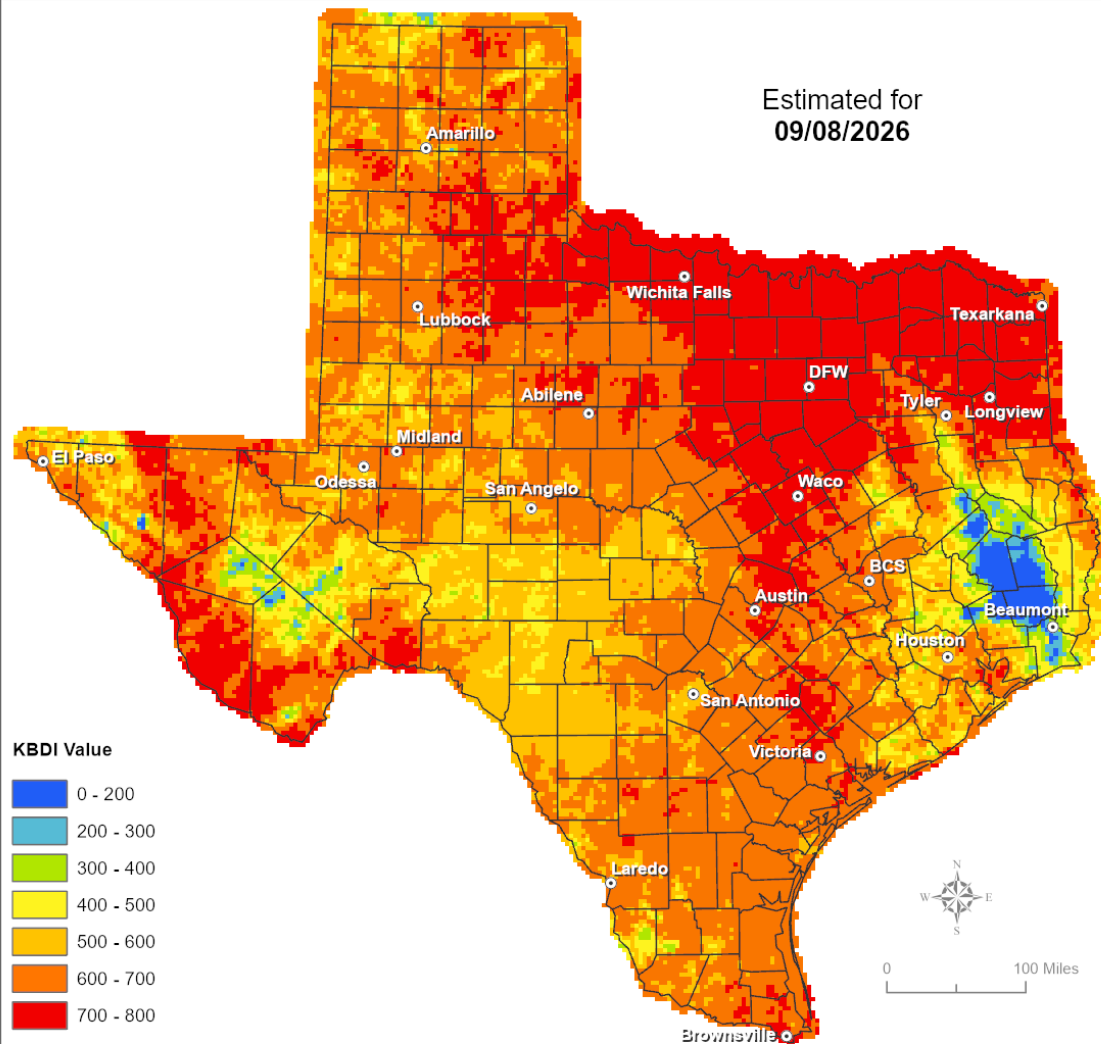

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

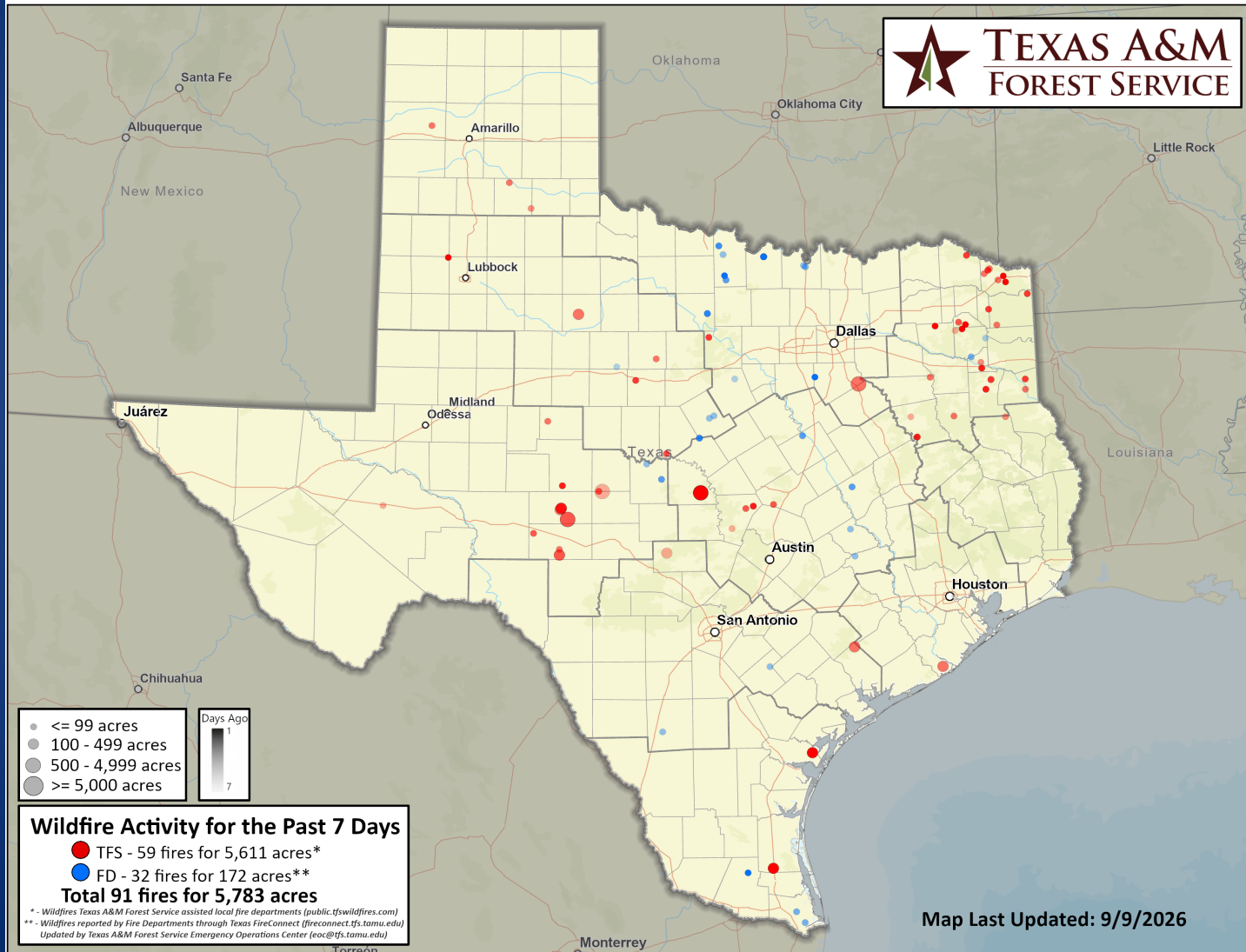
