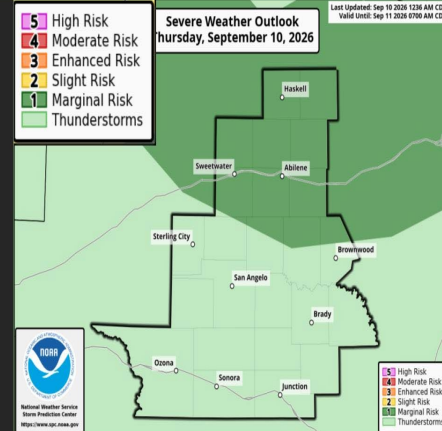
What You Should Do

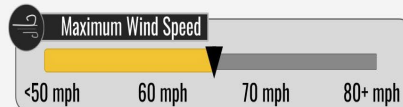

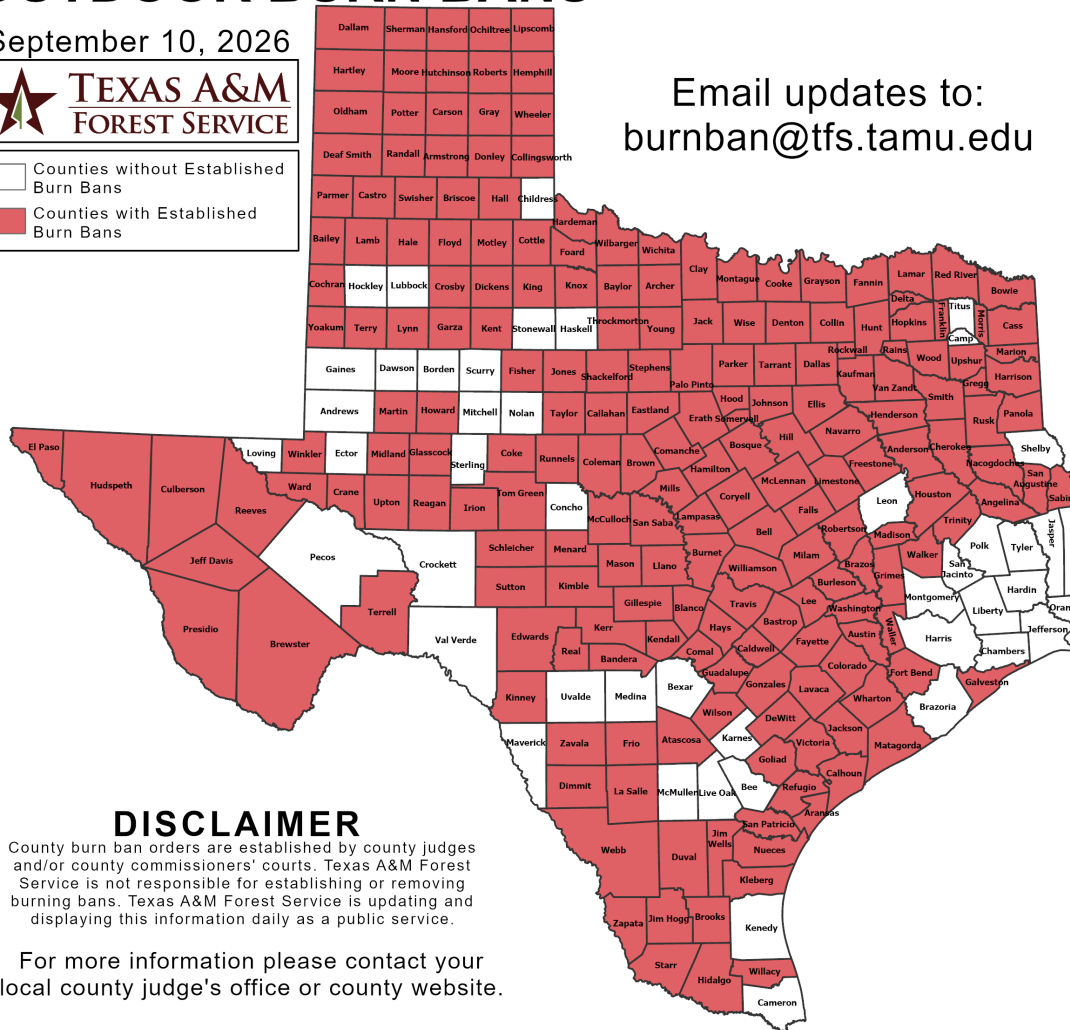

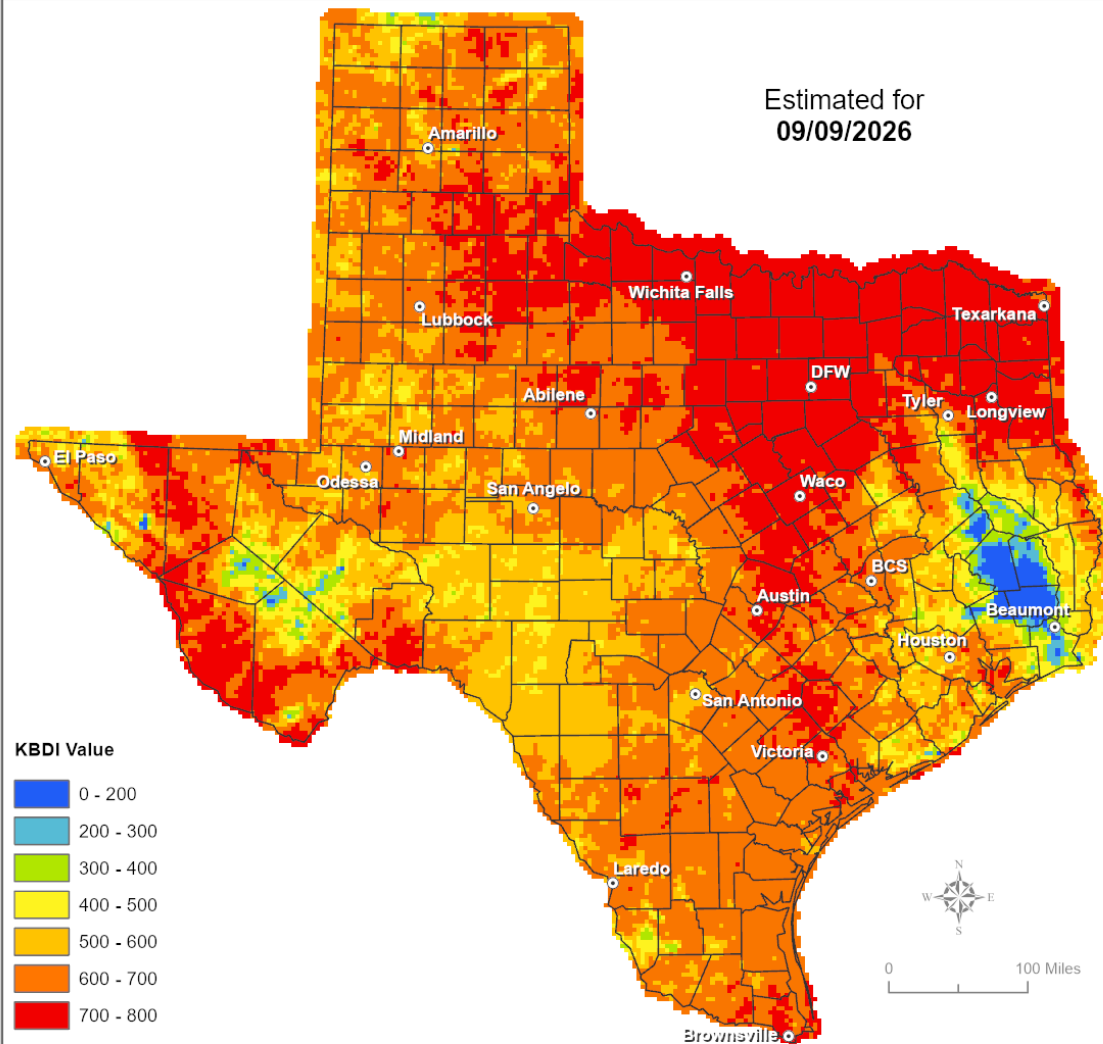

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

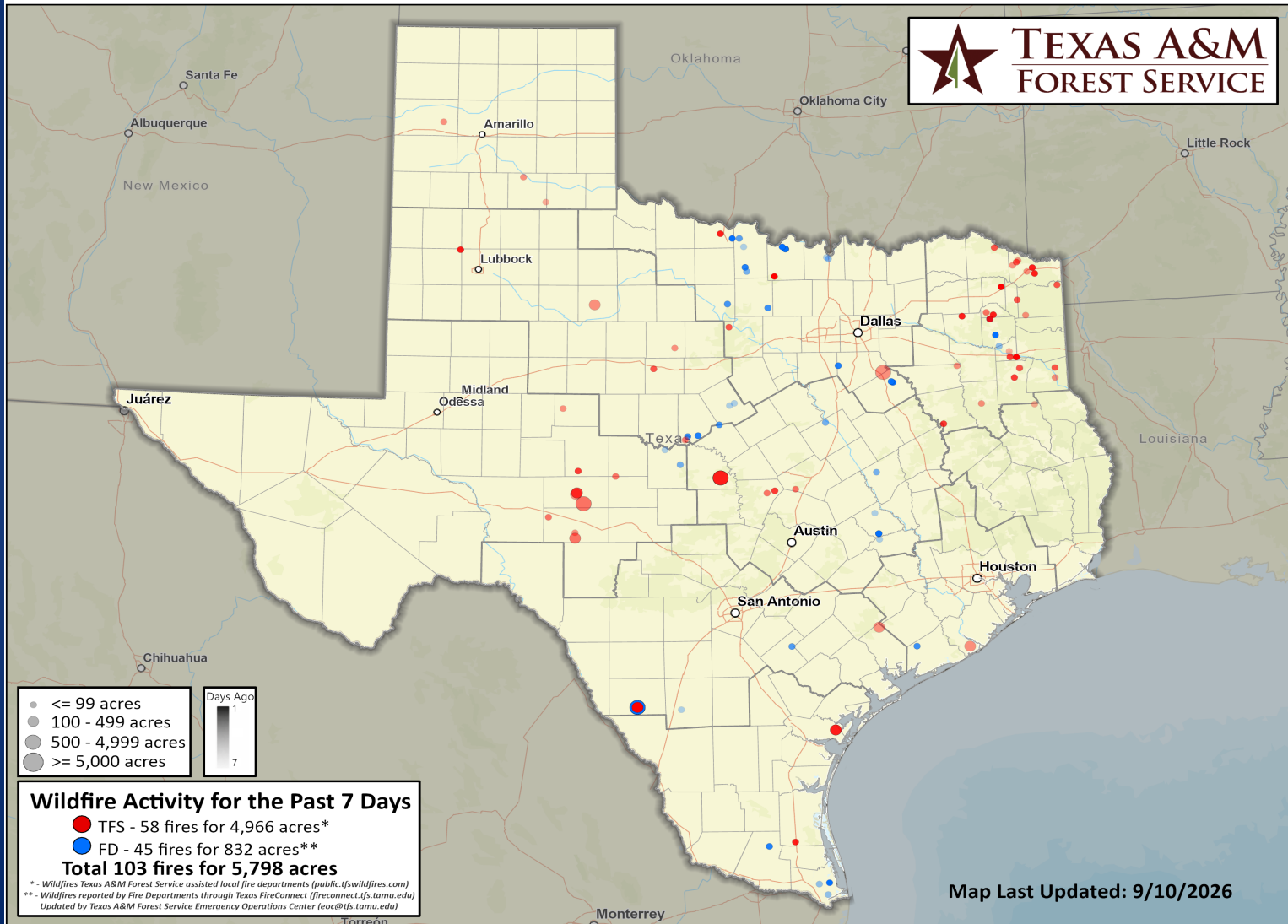
