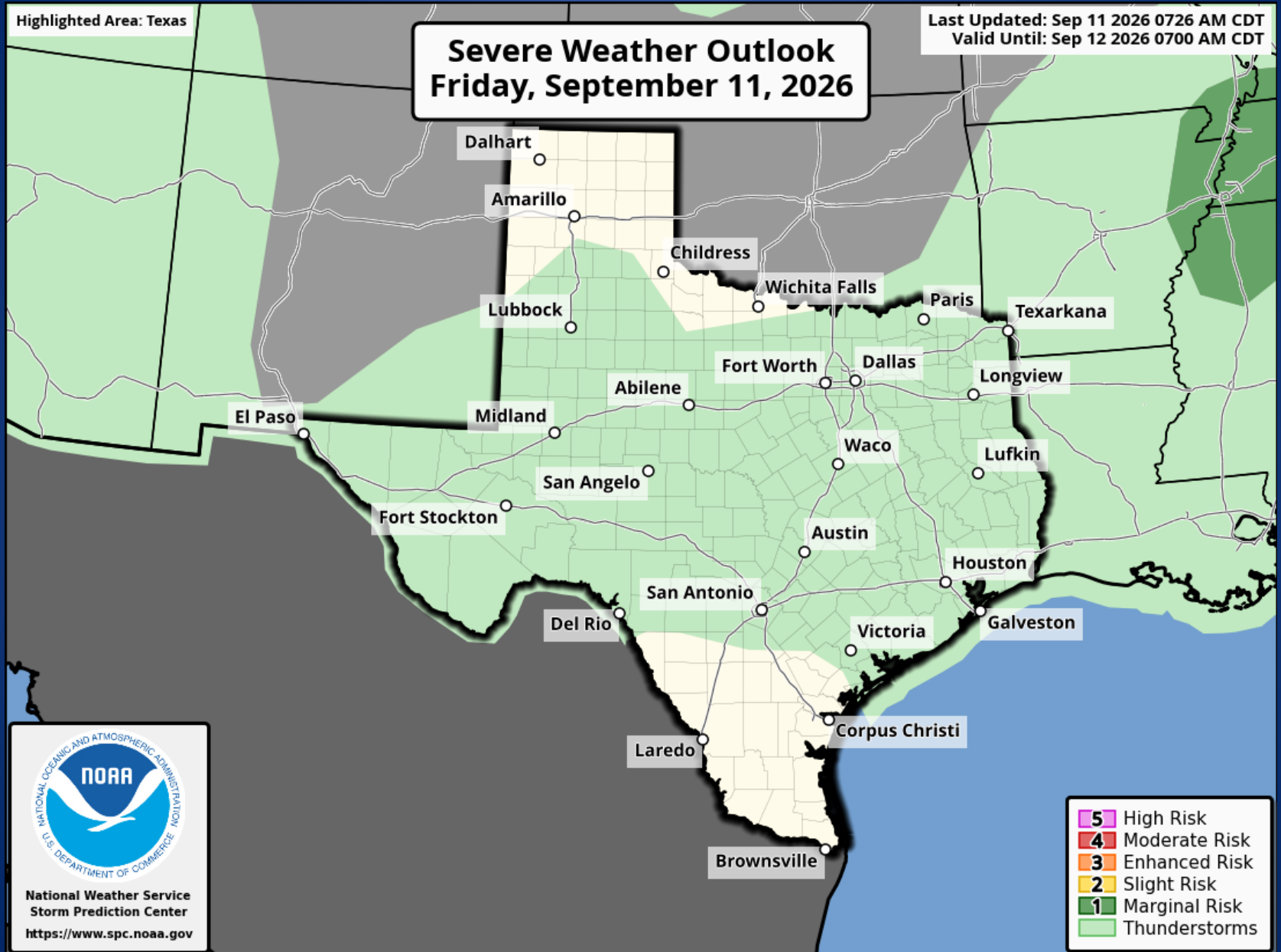

Heat index values could get as high as 104 to 108. Light south winds of 5 to 10 mph will prevail before gusty SE winds return from a sea-breeze in the evening.

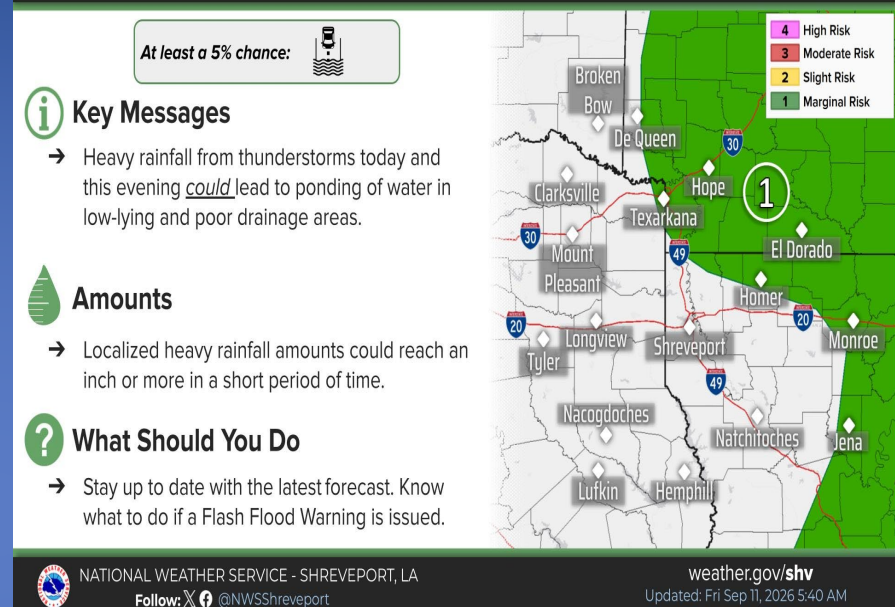

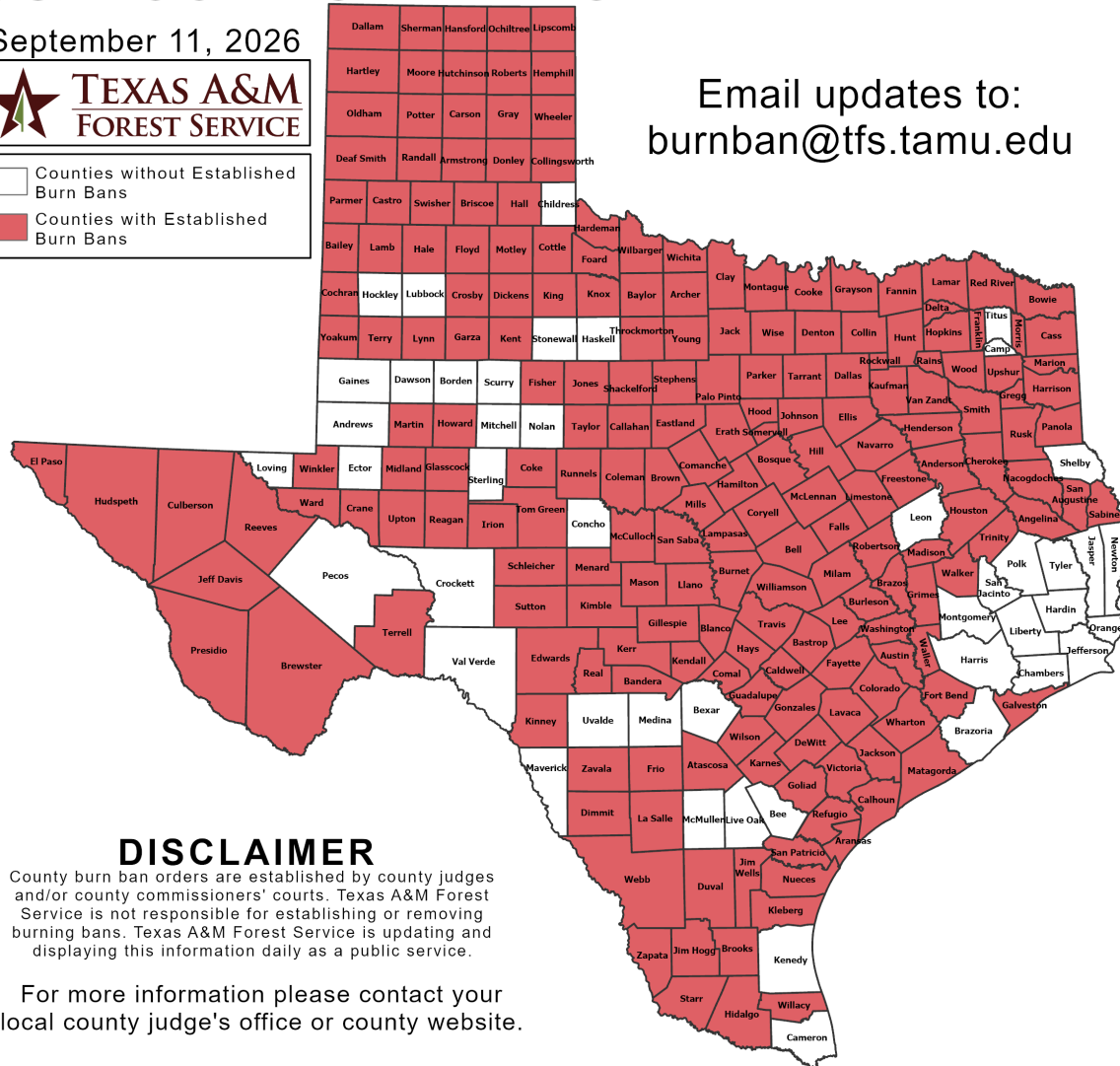

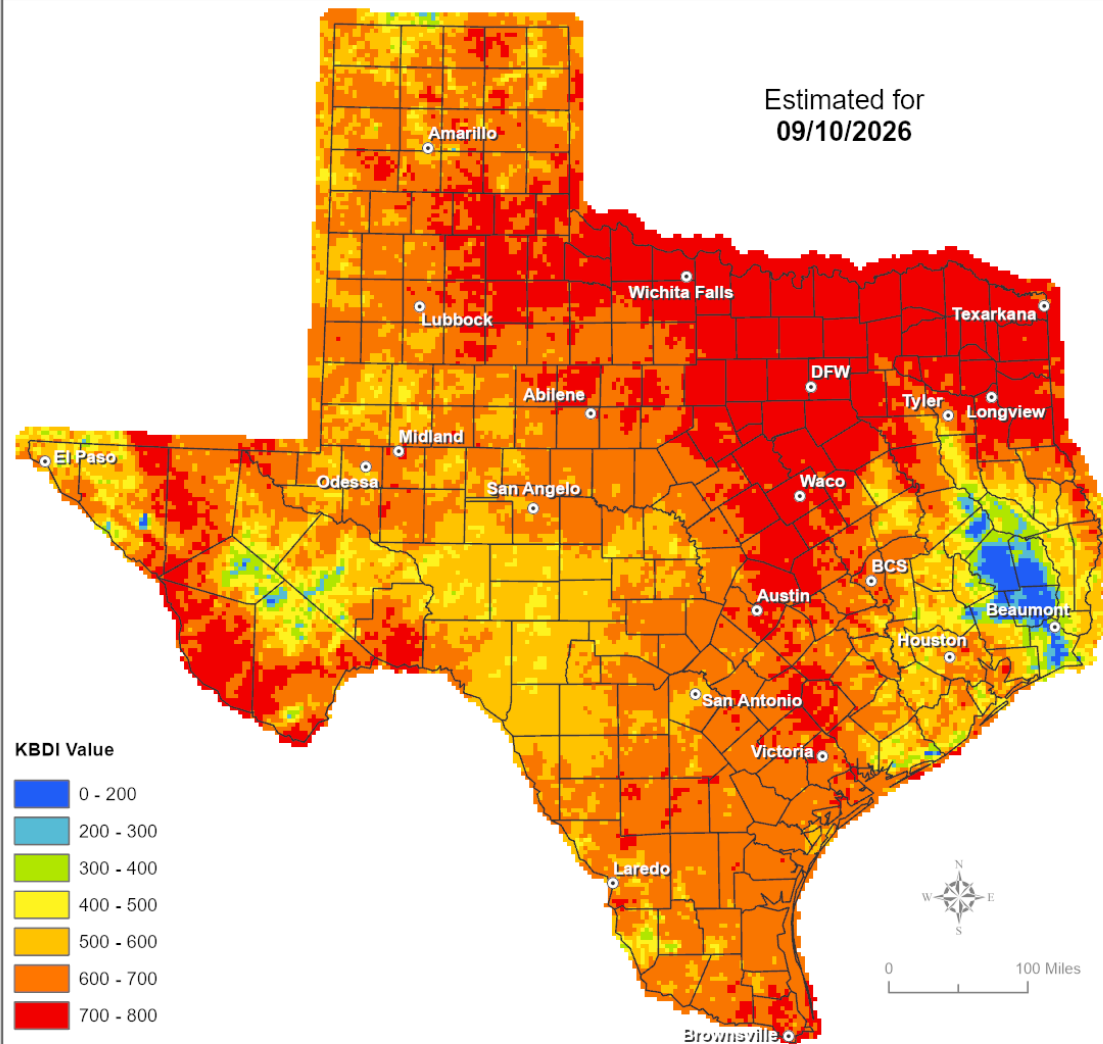
