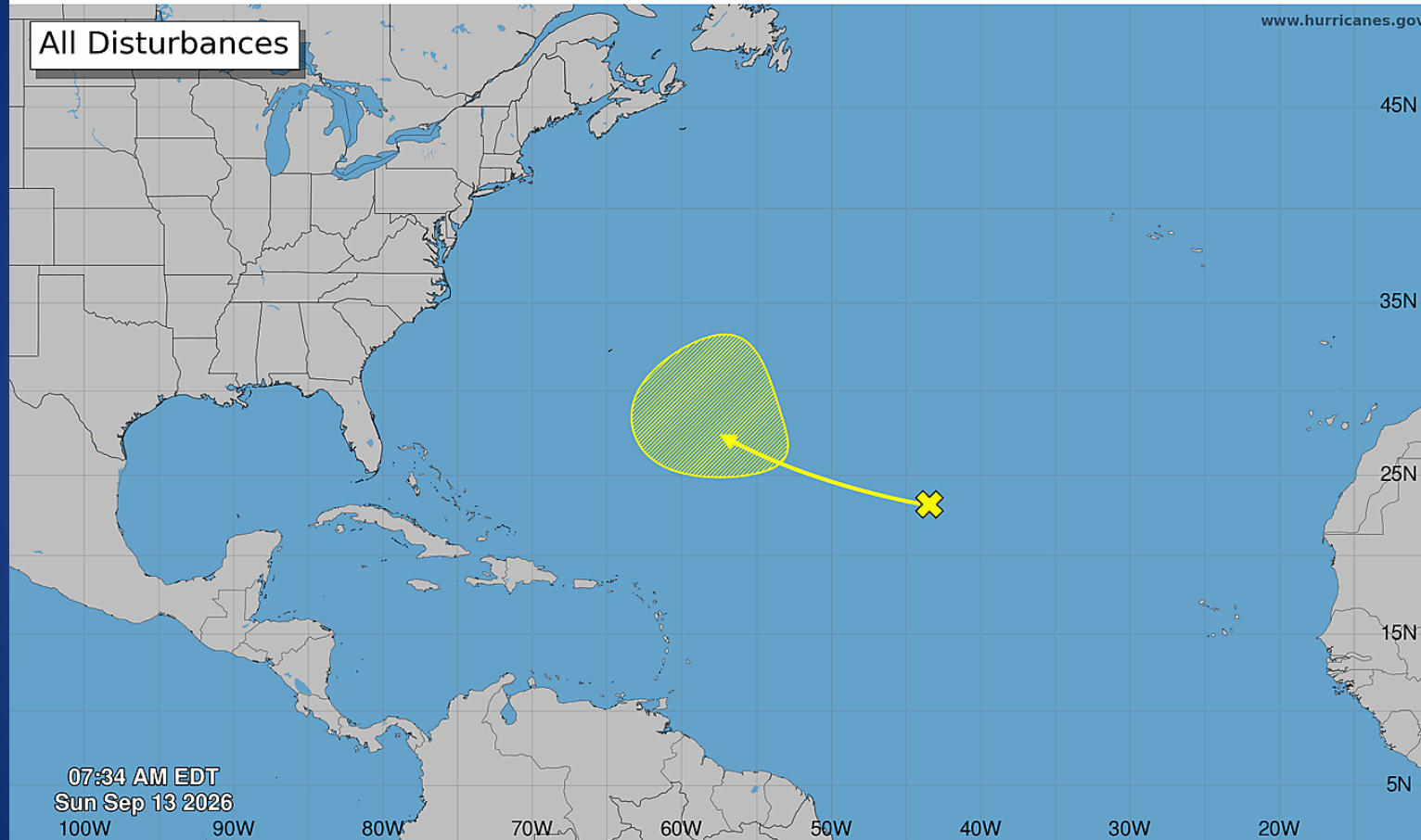


Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook National Hurricane Center Miami, Florida

If outside, take frequent breaks in the shade.



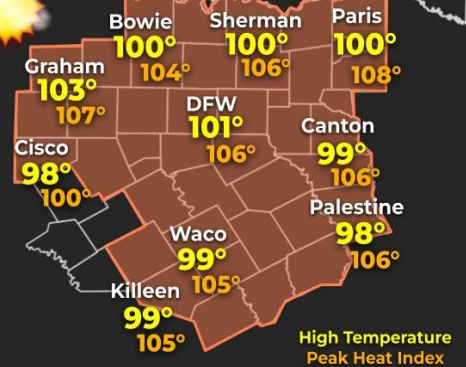

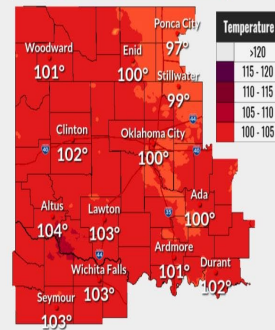

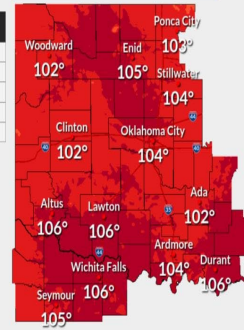

A heat advisory is in effect for inland portions of Southeast Texas today, September 13, 2026, from 11 AM to 6 PM due to very hot and humid conditions. High temperatures will range from 93 to 99 degrees Fahrenheit with heat indices between 108 and 110 degrees Fahrenheit. Safety precautions include using air conditioning, limiting strenuous outdoor activities during the afternoon, staying hydrated, and wearing lightweight, light-colored clothing. Affected areas include Houston, College Station, League City, Sugar Land, and surrounding communities.

Expect dangerous heat today, with heat indices up to 109 degrees this afternoon. A Heat Advisory is in effect from 12 PM to 7 PM today.

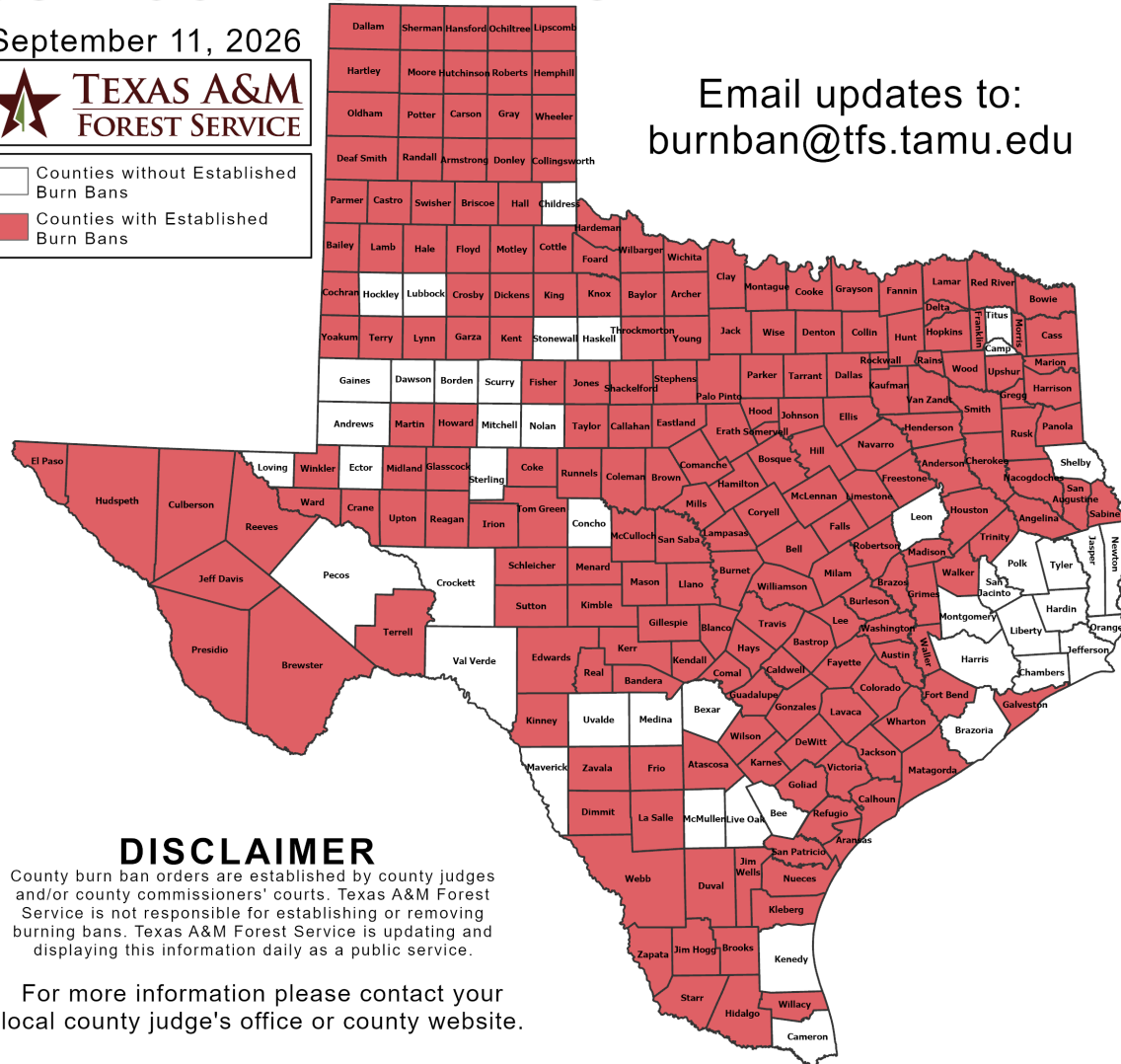

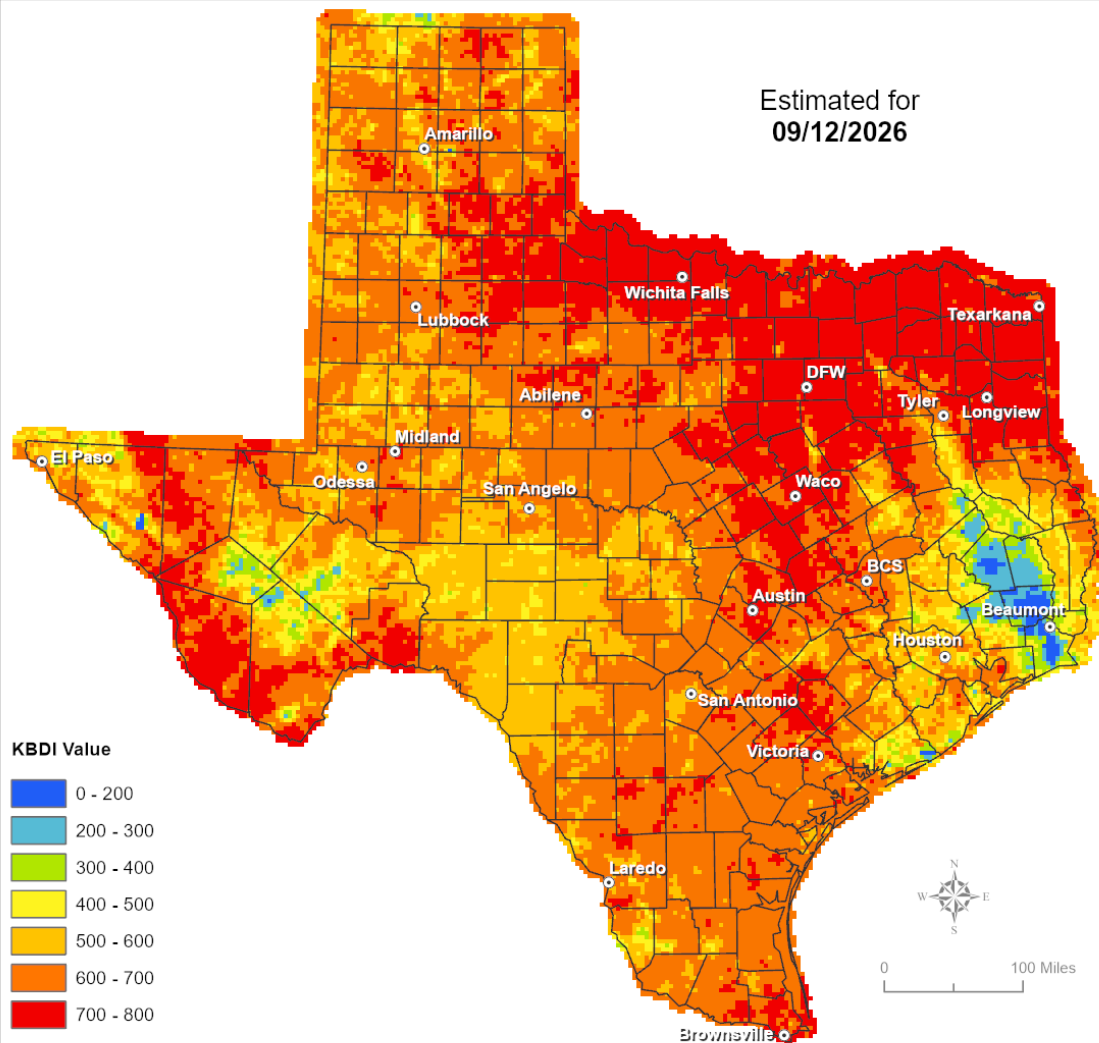

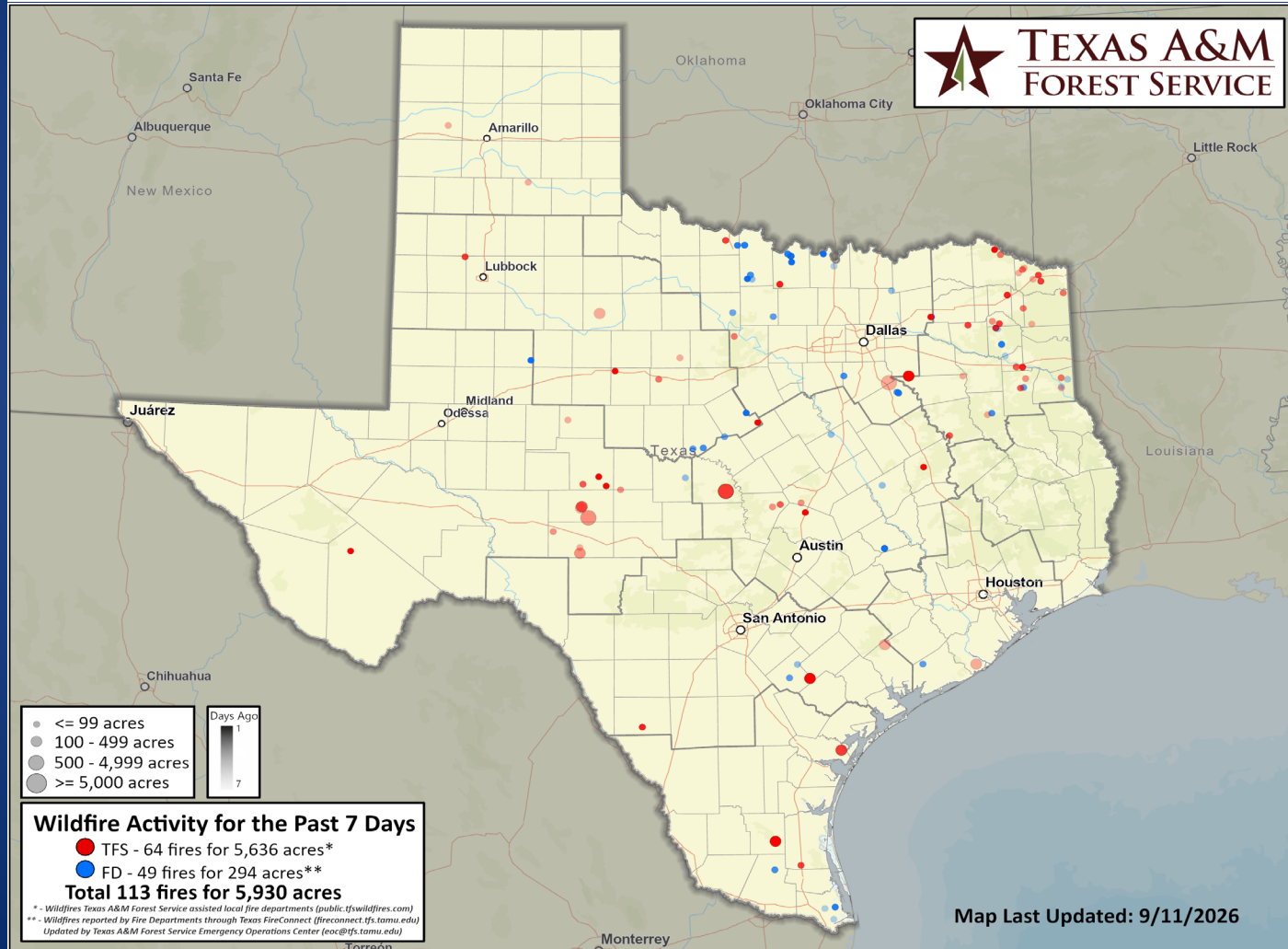
